London, Dec. 19 .- "I believe that no important party and no important nation really desires the reversal of the policy with regard to the establishment of a Jewish National Home in Palestine so ment of a Jewiss National Frome in Facesine so long as it bears good fruit for the Jews and the world. "Those who come back from Palestine bring me reports that although the movement, like all other movements in their beginning, suffers from expected and unexpected difficulties, the prospects of this great and novel experience give hope to all who, like myself, are deeply concerned in the efwho, he mysel, are deeply concerned in the ci-fort which is being made, that the cooperative efforts of the Jews of Europe and America, com-bined with the energy and self-sacrifice of the lews in Palestine will overcome the obstacles. I believe that those who have so far been hostile to the movement for the rebuilding of Palestine, will be converted and will see the immemorial hiswill be converted and will see the influencial his-toric connection which exists between Palestine and the Jewish race. Of all the religions in the world, Christianity should be the first to recognize this fact and view with sympathy the growth of the Jewish National Home which the nations of the world, at Versailles, handed over to Britain (Continued on Page 4)

ORGANIZATIONS BRING LIBEL CHARGES AGAINST RABBI **JEWISH**

Rabbi Scholom Eliezer Rogozin, 70 years old, of 642 Monroe Street, Brooklyn, was arrested on a warrant issued by Supreme Court Justice Lazansky on a charge of libel. The rabbi was held at the Raymond Street jail until midnight, when he was released on \$2,500 bail.

was released on \$4,500 ball.
Four organizations brought charges against Rabbi Rogozin. The warrant was issued at the request of Leon Kamaiky, publisher of the "Jewish Daily News" and chairman of the Central Relief Committee, and Rabbi Israel Rosenberg, vice-president of this committee. The complainants demand \$100,000.

The legal steps were taken by the organizations Rogozin during the last seven months in which he attacked the orthodox Jewish leaders and rabbis who were active in the war relief work. It was stated that hundreds of orthodox Jewish contributors to these funds demanded that action be taken against Rabbi Rogozin.

Rabbi Rogozin was called to a rabbinical court several times in order to submit evidence in support of his charges or to withdraw them. How-

ever, he continually refused to do so.

Attorney J. L. Holzman is the lawyer for the organizations.

POLISH GOVERNMENT IGNORES PARLIA-MENT IN APPROVAL OF BILL AFFECT-ING 32,000 JEWISH FAMILIES

Jewish Deputies Leave Parliament As Sign of Protest.

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Warsaw, Dec. 19 .- The bill concerning the withdrawal of the concession on monopolized articles. which threatens the existence of many Tewish families, was approved today by the Polish Cabi-net without being submitted to a vote in Parliament. The bill will become a law on the approval of the President.

This action of the government was taken in spite of promises given to Jewish and Polish represent-atives of merchants that the bill would be modified in such a way that it would not immediately

affect the present concessionaires.

Deputy Reich, in behalf of the Club of Jewish Deputies, read in parliament today a protest against the decision of the Cabinet and pointed out the fact that the bill will ruin thirty-two thousand Jewish families, who will be added to the who were economically ruined by the taxation policy of the present government.

The Jewish deputies will therefore vote against

the preliminary budget, Dr. Reich declared.

The Jewish deputies left the meeting as a sign of protest, followed by the laughter of the members of the Right and Left parties.

JULIUS KAHN, AUTHOR OF DRAFT BILL, BRILLIANT FIGURE IN AMERICAN JEWRY, DEAD

San Francisco, Dec. 19 .- Julius Kahn, for twentyfour years representative to Congress for the Fourth California District, one of the leading figures of American Jewry, Chairman of the House Military Affairs Committee and author of the Draft Bill during the war, died yesterday at the age of sixty-three.

Julius Kahn was born in Kuppenheim, duchy of Baden, Germany, February 28, 1861. He was brought to America in 1866, when his parents settled in San Francisco. After leaving school he went on the stage and acted with Edwin Booth, Joseph Jefferson and Clara Morris. In 1890 he re-turned to California where he studied law and in 1892 was elected to the California legislature. He was elected to the Fifty-sixth Congress on the (Continued on Page 4)

Immigrants Kept Judaism Alive in America

The "Canadian Jewish Chronicle", of Dec. 12, dwelling on a statement made recently by an American Jew to the effect that the restriction of immigration will be beneficial to the Jews in America because it "will help release the resources America because it will help release the resources in effort and money that can well be spent in religious and cultural work', expresses its indig-nation that Jews should hold such a point of view.

nation that Jews should note stem a point of view. "The money that American Jewry spent on Americanization work amongst immigrants and even the vast sums contributed to the relief of European Jewry, has not made any very serious dent in its resources. There was still enough money to be raised in America to supply the needs of American Jewry for a Jewish education. The great need for Jewish knowledge in America was from drying up by the constant influx of Jews from Europe.

"By this stream of European immigration, Orthodox Judaism was kept supplied with man-power to carry on its work. Reform Jewry de-pended for its members upon those Jews who were beginning to be somewhat assimilated and who stepped into the breach created in the ranks of Reform by those Jews who had become wholly assimilated. European Jewry was keeping Judaism in America alive", says the "Jewish Chronicle".

Assimilation vs. Americanization

Recurring to Professor Charles W. Eliot's address before the Harvard Zionist Society, of which it treated editorially a few days ago, the "Jewish Daily News" of Dec. 17, dwelling on the protest of the Irish against Professor Eliot's statement that they and the Jews do not assimilate in this coun-

try, says:
"So far no Jews have protested against the famous educator, though we are certain there are some Jews who are displeased with his statement. Many will assume that Professor Eliot's assertion that the Jews and the Irish do not assimilate was an implication that they are not as good Americans as others are. This is certainly not what Professor Eliot meant. Americanization and assimilation are two distinct terms which are frequently, and regrettably, confused. Professor Eliot employed these terms in their true conception, the conception which liberal minded persons should have.

The Late Professor Neumark

The death of Professor David Neumark is being commented on editorially and in feature articles in all Jewish papers. The "Day" of Dec. 18 considers Professor Neumark's passing a national loss to the Jewish people.

"Professor Neumark gave his whole life to the work of research in the realm of Jewish spiritual life, of Jewish philosophy and Jewish religion. It is more than the work of a scholar. It is the work of national culture. If with other people research work in the field of culture is merely an additament, a beautifying of the actualities of life, it is a necessity, an absolute prerequisite for us Jews.

"We do not possess too many great men of spirit in American Jewry, we are not blessed with too many builders of culture. The place occupied in American Jewish life by Professor Neumark cannot be filled."

Bucharest, Dec. 8-Prince Antoine Bibesco is a successful and popular young man. He is sidely known and liked in English and American Society. In England he is the son-in-law of the famous Liberal ex-Premier, Mr. Asquith, the husband of Mr. Asquith's very witty and accomplished authoress daughter. In America he is the wide-awake, anxious-to-please Roumanian Minister at Washington, a pleasant-mannered, clever young diplomat with democratic ideas and the ability to make himself at home and loved in all circles.

But here in Roumania Prince Bibesco is a symbol. The Roumanian newspapers have all of them got in stock a good cut of his portrait, and the first thing we know as soon as an anti-Semitic disturbance has taken place anywhere in Roumania, every newspaper in the country is carrying Prince Bibesco's portrait on the front page, with a report at its side telling us that Prince Bibesco has been at a meeting of Roumanian Jews in America and has assured them that everything will be all right, that the Government is taking steps or is going to take steps to put a stop to the anti-Semitic agitation.

As soon as we hear that there has been trouble anywhere in Roumania in which Jews are involved, we rush off to get a look at the paper, and sure enough, Prince Bibesco's portrait is there, smiling as usual, with the customary reassuring message at the side. One day we read that Prince Bibeson has attended a service at the Roumanian Syna-gogue in Chicago or Washington or New York. and has delivered a sermon there, another day he has attended the wedding of the daughter of a prominent Jewish resident somewhere in Philadel-phia, etc., and always and everywhere he has been pitching the same yarn about the good times coming in Roumania, and always the yarn seems to have gone down great. As to his Zionist sympathies Lord Balfour stated, "I am a Zionist of long standing. I first became interested in the project when Chamberlain sponsored the plan of settling the persecuted Jews under the British flag in Africa. Later, Dr. Chaim Weizmann convinced me of the impossibility of a plan for settling the Jews anywhere except in the historic land of the Jewish people. Since my conversations with Dr. Weizmann I have been a Zionist and consider lamentable any attempt in this direction in Africa, South America or elsewhere. When the results of the war indicated that Palestine would finally be in the hands of the Allies, I was not least forward among those who were anxious to make it a home for the Jews. The Balfour Declaration embodies an aspiration to which the Jewish people have always remained faithful. This reason for the declaration is more important than the fact that it bears my name", Lord Balfour stated.

Joints Kann took an active part in Jewish alians. Twenty-five years ago he was one of the charter member who, with Rabbi Jacob Voorsanger of Temple Emanu-El, San Francisco, established the Jewish Educational Society of San Francisco, the first of its kind on the Pacific Coast. In 1919 he was a member, together with Henry Morgenthau, of the commission of the Union of American Hebrew Congregations, which attempted to have a universal religious liberty clause introduced into

the Covenant of the League of Nations.

During his long residence in Washington he was ever ready to serve any Jewish cause and occupied a position similar to that of the late Simon Wolf.

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
