SOKOLOW HAS AUDIENCE WITH KING FERDINAND OF ROUMANIA

King, Queen and Crown Prince Show Sympathy With Rebuilding of Palestine.

(Tewish Telegraphic Agency)

Bucharest, Dec. 24.—Nachum Sokolow, Chairman of the Executive of the World Zionist Organization, was received today by King Ferdinand. Following his audience with the King, Mr. Sokolow was presented to Queen Marie. He lunched with the royal family and suite. After luncheon the King conversed with the Zionist leader for overwood hours, inquiring about the rebuilding work in the facility of the Control of the Palestine and the situation of the Zionist move-

ment in general.

The King and Queen were greatly interested in the conversation and showed a very cordial and sympathetic attitude toward the problem.

Mr. Sokolow was also received by the Crown Prince.

PERCENTAGE OF JEWISH POPULATION RECORDED BY GERMAN STATISTICIAN (Tewish Telegraphic Agency)

Berlin, Dec. 24.—Interesting figures with regard to the percentage of the Jewish population in various countries are contained in a new book by Dr. Julius Rotholz just issued under the title, "Deutschen Juden im Zahl und Bild."

According to the statistics given in the book, the Jews in France constitute. 4% of the population; in Great Britain, 7%; in Belgium, 9%; in European Russia, 2.3%; in German Austria, 4.5%; in Turkey, 4.5%; in Hungary, 6.3%; in Poland, 125%. In Siberia they constitute .5% of the population, in Syria, 1%; in Palestine, 11%; in Algeirs, 1.3% in Morocco, 3%; in Australia, 3%; and in Germany less than 1%. and in Germany less than 1%.

Jerusalem, Dec. 24.—Eugenjusz Bielinski, a native Pole who covered 20,00 kilometers of Europe and Asia Minor, in a successful attempt to go by automobile from Warsaw to Jerusalem, died in the French hospital here from injuries received

in an accident with his automobile.

The trip was successful all the way along.
However, two days after arriving in Palestine, on
the road to Bethlehem, he met with an accident in which all the occupants of the car, including

the owner, were injured.

Members of the Polish colony attended services held in the chapel of the French hospital.

PALESTINE TEACHERS THREATEN STRIKE TO ENFORCE REGULAR PAYMENT OF

SALARIES

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Jerusalem, Dec. 24.—The teachers of the Hebrew school system in Palestine will strike unless their salaries will be paid regularly, according to a resolution adopted today at a conference of Hebrew teachers.

The Hebrew Teachers Association of Palestine has recently taken an oppositional attitude to-ward the Board of Education and the Zionist Organization because at the last meeting of the Zionist Actions Committee the educational budget was considerably reduced.

PROPOSAL TO SHORTEN HOURS OF SERVICE IN GERMAN REFORM TEMPLES SHORTEN HOURS OF

Weihestunde to Substitute Gottesdienst (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Berlin, Dec. 24.-A proposal for further change in the divine services of the reform temples of Germany was brought up for discussion in an anonymous article published in the organ of the anonymous article published in the organ of the Verband der Nationaldeutscher Jueden. The proposal made in the article advocates the substitution of the divine services now called "Gottesdienst" by a "Weihestunde" which would result in limiting the services on all Jewish holidays, including Yom Kippur, to one hour and removing the standardized prawer. the standardized prayers.

In pleading for the acceptance of his proposal, the author appeals on behalf of the highly cultured Jews in Germany who lay greater stress on the quality than on the quantity of their prayers. The author also urges the abolition of the

stereotype sermon and asks for the introduction of a large number of oratoriums.

While the Verband der Nationaldeutscher Jueden does not identify itself with all the points of the proposal, its organ says that the proposal is published in order to create further discussion.

IL HASSAN, ARAB LEADER, ARRESTED IN TRANSJORDANIA

Jerusalem, Dec. 24 .- Emir Bashir II Hassan, famous Arab leader and Chief of the Gazamiga tribe, was arrested in Il Gar by the Transjordanian Government, according to a report of the Secretary of the Moslem-Christian Association in Beisan, published in the Arab paper, "Alef-Ba". The Chief and his son were taken to Arbab.

"Emir Bashir was one of the leaders devoted the Arab-Syrian Government in the days of ing Feisal", the report states. "When Emir King Feisal", the report states. "When Emir Abdullah arrived at Amman, the Emir preferred to be a subject of Transjordania rather to be a subject of Transfordania rather than Palestine, despite his connections with Palestine, half of his property being here. He served the Transfordanian Government faithfully and devotedly. He refused to sell land to Zionists although they offered him large sums of money. He was a very active leader in oppos-ing the Zionists in II Gor and was elected member of the Executive Committee at the fifth Arab Congress", the report concludes.

STEIGER ILL IN PRISON; DATE OF TRIAL NOT DETERMINED (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Lemberg, Dec. 24—Stanislaw Steiger, who is still in prison on the accusation of having thrown a bomb at the Polish President, Wojciechowski, is seriously ill. The prison authorities have refuged to release him on bail, in spite of his illness.

It was at first expected that the second trial would take place in February. However, District Attorney Lutke declared that it is not yet known when his trial will be called.

ONE HUNDRED HOUSES CONSTRUCTED MONTHLY IN TEL AVIV (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Tel Aviv, Dec. 24.—The building boom continues unabated in Tel Aviv, where an average of 70 to 100 houses a month are being constructed. The unprecedented demand for bricks compelled the Silicate factory in Tel Aviv to try to double its output of bricks by working on day and night shifts.

GOVERNMENT UNITED STATES RECEIVE COPY OF GREAT BRITAIN'S REPORTS ON PALESTINE ADMINIS-TRATION

Details of Anglo-American Negotiations on

Mandate Given (Jewish Daily Bulletin Mail Service)

London, Dec. 18 .- The terms of the convention signed in London on Dec. 3 between Great Britain and the United States, with reference to the protection of American rights and interests in Palestine have not yet been published. It is understood, however, that it confers on citizens of the United States the same rights in Palestine that they would have possessed had the United States been a member of the League of Nations.

The history of negotiations leading up to this treaty, which has been sent to Washington for ratification, goes back to the period immediately following the submission of the draft mandates for the former Ottoman territories to the Council of the League of Nations at the end of 1920. American Government stipulated that neither these nor other mandates, whether for former Turkish or former German territory, should take effect until the United States had been consulted.
The League Council invited the American Gov-

ernment to take part in its proceedings, so far as they related to the terms of the various mandates. This invitation, however, was declined. United States stood firmly by the view though remaining outside the League of Nations. they had, nevertheless, a right to be consulted by their associates in the war as to the fixture of the detached territories, and the American Government accordingly entered into direct negotiations

with the various mandatory powers. So far as Palestine was concerned, these negotiations were not brought to a head until May, 1922, when the British and American governments reached an agreement satisfactory to both parties-an agreement based upon the general theory, that the United States should have all the rights in mandated territories which they would have had had they entered the League of Nations.

In the case of the Palestine mandate, for ex-

ample, it is provided that the commerce and navigation of all the state members of the League gation of all the state members of the League shall be on as favorable a footing in Palestine as those of the mandatory. The American Govern-ment was naturally anxious that American ab-stention from the League should not put the United States at any disadvantage in these re-

It was at first suggested that American interests should be expressly safeguarded in the mandate itself. It was, however, eventually decided that the better course would be for appropriate assurances to be given by Great Britain to the United States, with a view to their eventual incorporation in a treaty to be concluded between the two (Continued on Page 4)

Gompers Embarrasses "Dearborn Independent" The "Dearborn Independent", of Dec. 27, writing about the late Samuel Gompers, finds itself in a predicament. Gompers seems to be one Jew whom Ford's mouthpiece cannot find fault with, but it finds itself hard put to it to discover the proper words for praising a Jew, the result being a number of incoherent statements. In its attempt to eulogize Gompers the "Dearborn Independent" tries to distinguish him from other Jews by calling all other Jews "half-breeds", the meaning of which is known to Mr. Ford alone.

"Samuel Gompers was a Jew who did not seem to have inherited certain traits which the influx of Asiatic Jews have given the public to consider as characteristically Jewish", says Ford's paper. "He was English born and was probably a purer type than the half-breed hordes which swarm this country. His ethical strain was strong and encountry. His ethical strain was successful a very during. He mingled a strong idealism with a very practical ability. He maintained his leadership, not by strong-arm methods, but by the steadfastness of his character.

"Mr. Gompers' influence prevented in large degree the American trades union movement being deceived or outwitted by the Russian Jewish facdeceived or outwitted by the Russian Jewish fac-tion. It is to be hoped that his successors will be as wise. In Russia, at the Red International of Labor Unions, held last November, one of the streamers across the convention hall read—"THE TRADES UNIONS ARE THE SCHOOLS FOR COMMUNISM." It reads like the statement of a fact, but it is not a fact; it is the expression of the Red Russian Jewish program. Directly it be-comes a fact, American trades unionism is dead. Samuel Gompers saw this most clearly, and doubtless he has left disciples who will keep the vision alive.

Calls Dr. Eliot's Theory Brash

Contrary to the general approval given Dr. Charles Eliot by the Jewish press, some of the non-Jewish papers have taken him to task for opposing inter-marriage and saying that this country needs "a number of races, with various gifts, etc". Thus, the "Fall River (Mass.) News" of Dec. 16, taking an attitude similar to that of Rabbi Schulman, calls Dr. Eliot's theory "brash and alto-gether wrong". This paper says:

"What this country needs, we maintain, is one people, with common ideals, a common background, a common tradition. If this country does produce at last, not one people but many intensely racially conscious groups, this country will fail to achieve its destiny.

"This country cannot exist, one-twentieth American and nineteen-twentieths foreign, or one per cent American and ninety-nine per cent foreign. "You cannot be a good American and still de-

vote any large part of your thought to the land of your ancestors. No man can serve two masters, was said two thousand years ago. It is as true today as then. 'A house divided against itself cannot stand', is another wise saying.

"Dr. Eliot has given aid and comfort to a good many who will grab at his sayings. In the interests of true Americanism, in the best interests of our fellow citizens of foreign ancestry, it had better been left unsaid."

ATMOSPHERE STOPS POGROM BACK TO LAND MOVEMENT IN RUSSIA. IS REPORT

Cossacks, Ukrainians and Tartars Against Jewish Settlement

The "Back to Land Movement" of Jews in Soviet Russia is now greatly hampered, owing to the severe opposition and even pogrom atmostne severe opposition and even pogrom atmosphere which is prevalent among the peasants in the neighborhoods where Jewish settlements were started, according to a despatch from Leningrad to the "Jewish Morning Journal" today. This state made itself particularly apparent in Kuban, the district of the Cossack settlements.

The Cossacks are indignant at the attempt of the Jews to settle on the land and term this a "Jewish invasion", according to the despatch. The Land Settlement Commission of the Government, as a result of this, stopped sending Jewish settlers to the Kuban District.

The state of affairs in White Russia and Uk-The state of affairs in White Russia and Ukrainia is hardly better with regard to the Jewish settlement movement. In one locality in the government of Ekaterinaslay, 274 Jewish settlers from Rashkoff, Government of Podol, who went to settle there with the permission of the government, were driven away by the Ukrainian population. The "Emess", the organ of the Yevseksia, the Jewish section of the Communist Party, which is mainly responsible for the land settlement movement, published a protest against the hostile atti-

tude of the peasants.

The Jewish Colonization work in Crimea was stopped in view of the fact that a great number of Tartar refugees, who lately returned from Turkey, are now receiving land on which to settle.

HEBREW SCHOOL SYSTEM IN PALESTINE EXPANDS TO MEET GROWING NEEDS (Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Jerusalem, Dec. 3 .- Six new schools have been added to the chain of Hebrew schools under the Palestine Zionist Executive. Twelve new teachers Palestine Zionist Executive have been engaged and the enrollment in the have been engaged and the enrollment. The schools shows an increase of 666 pupils. The schools which opened in October this year numbered 128, as compared with 122 last year, 450 to the 430 teachers last year, and 12,200 to the 11,524 pupils of last year.

In reporting these figures the Treasurer of the Palestine Zionist Executive notes with satisfaction that the Tel-Aviv Municipality increased their mat the length of the hebrew School budget from f1.20 last year to £3.500 this year. The Jewish Community of Jaffa also voted a subvention, while Petach Tikvah for the first time decided to contribute £300 towards the Education Budget of the

Zionist Organization.

In order to cope with the great number of children who have come with the new immigration stream, the Education Department of the Zionist stream, the Education Department of the Education Executive decided to open twelve new classes in Jaffa, two in Haifa, in addition to new schools in Beth-Shaan, Neve Shaanan, Haifa, Ruchama, Hittin, Gideon and Bnei Brak. The cost of these schools totals £3,500.

OSCAR S. STRAUS CONGRATULATED ON 74TH BIRTHDAY

Oscar S. Straus, former Ambassador to Turkey, was 74 years old on Dec. 23. His birthday was celebrated quietly at his residence, 5 West Seventy-sixth Street, New York, by an informal gathering of his relatives and intimate friends during the afternoon and a family dinner last night. Con-gratulatory messages were received by Mr. Straus during the day from many parts of the world. He is now enjoying very good health, having recovered from the serious operation of last Fall.

TOBACCO INDUSTRY GIVES EMPLOYMENT TO MORE CHALUZIM (Tewish Daily Bulletin)

Jerusalem, Dec. 3.—Cultivation of tobacco on Jewish estates in Palestine continues to be one of the greatest employment providers and a shortage of workers in baling the leaf is as noticeable as it was during the planting and packing seasons. The Treasurer of the Palestine Zionist Executive, in his October report, pointed out that the baling of tobacco which was soon to commence would require 1,000 Jewish workers. As this number was not available the Palestine Zionist Executive decided to bring 700 Chaluzim to Palestine immediately.

of all engagements contracted by Great Britain under the Palestine mandate. American citizens were to have the right to be tried by courts containing a majority of British judges, or, in trivial cases, the right to appeal to such courts. Should the mandate at any time be terminated, the rights enjoyed by the United States under the Turkish capitulations would at once be revived unimpaired. American citizens and companies were to be guaranteed freedom from discrimination, equality of commercial opportunity, and the full enjoyment of

their existing legal rights.

On this point, it may be explained that certain oil concessions in Palestine had been obtained before the war by the Standard Oil Company, and bulked large in the Anglo-American negotiations. American missionaries were to be free to pursue their lawful activities. Finally, no alteration was to be made in the terms of the mandate without the consent of the United States, and the American Government was to be furnished with a duplicant Government of the Government o cate of the annual report on the administration of Palestine to be presented by the British Gov-ernment to the League of Nations.
