ZIONISTS IN SOVIET RUSSIA AGAIN PER-Many Exiled, Are Not Allowed Warm Clothing

In Spite of Extreme Cold (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

London, Dec. 30.—New persecutions, arrests and
expulsions of Zionists, Zeire Zionists, Zionist Socialists and members of the Maccabee are taking
place in various parts of Soviet Russia, according
to reports received here today from Moscow.
A great number of Zionists were extled to Si-

A great number of Zionists were exiled to Si-beria. Larger numbers are kept in the prisons awaiting decision of their place of exile. Of the Zionists arrested in the city of Homel, six were exiled to Solovedkin, five to Turafan, one was per-mitted to proceed to Palestine. Two Zionist lead-ris were expelled from Moscow, one was ordered to Slavki and the other to Turafan. In the city of Kharkoff fifty-one Zionists are kept in jail awaiting decision of their place of exile.

London, Dec. 30—Thirty one members of the Zeire Zion party were exiled to Siberia during the month of December, according to a report received by the "Daily Telegraph" from Moscow. Two Zionists, Greenfield and Basevitch, were exiled to remote districts and, in spite of the extreme cold, were prohibited from taking along

warm clothing.
The Zionist leader Mikharek was exiled from Elisabethgrad and ordered to spend three years on the Solovetzky Islands in the White Sea.

ORGANIZATION OF 3000 JEWISH LAND SETTLING FAMILIES COMMENCES IN UKRAINE

Settlers To Form Companies, Including Workingmen, Farmers, Artisans, and Tradesmen (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Moscow, Dec. 30 .- All Jews who wish to settle on the land in the Ukraine are to organize into land settling companies, each of which is to comprise not less than ten families, according to a circular issued by the Ukrainian Agricultural Commissariat with regard to the colonization plans to settle three thousand Jewish families on the land during the year 1925.

Membership in the proposed land settling companies is open to workingmen who are employed or unemployed, to former farmers, to unemployed clerks, former tradesmen, artisans, "kustars' and small traders. Each company may be comprised of members belonging to any or all the categories.

The formation of the land settling companies The formation of the land settling companies and the division of the land among these companies will be completed not later than February 1st. According to the plan, 900 families are to settle in the district of Fodol; 900 in the district of Keift; 600 in the district of Wolyn; 250 in the district of Tehernigoff; 350 in the vicinity of Politava. PARTIES FIGHT WHEN VIENNA KEHILLAH CONVENES (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Vienna, Dec. 30 .- Representatives of all the Tewish parties urged the acceptance of their respective programs as the program of the newly elected Kehillah of Vienna at its first meeting held here vesterday.

Professor Pick, assimilationist, was elected president. Dr. Loewenherz, Zionist, and Mr. Ehrenstein, Assimilationists, were elected vice-presidents. Five Assimilationists, two Zionists and one neutral member were elected to the Board of Governors

A declaration read in behalf of the Zionist members of the Kehillah, demanded that the Kehillah be transformed into a Voelksgemeinde, which should participate in the reconstruction work of Palestine. Representatives of the Assimilationists urged the preservation of its previous character as a congregation. The representative of the Agudas Israel laid emphasis on the religious foundation of the Kehillah. The Mizrachi representative criti-cized the separatist tendencies of the Agudah.

Young Jew Who May Soon Control Germany's Financial Destinies

(By Our Berlin Correspondent)

Berlin, Dec. 21—Some time ago, when the late. Hugo Sinnes was at the zenith of his tremendous financial power in Germany, rumors were spread that he was of Jewish origin and, while there were no reliable proofs to that effect, the supposed Semitic aspect of his physiognomy led many people to believe in the truth of these reports. But if it was not substantiated that Stinnes was a jew, it is well known that the new financial wizard of Germany, who is today the strongest contender for the place which Stinnes occupied, is not only a Jew, but an orthodox Jew to boot. Jakob Michael is his name. Although he is but 32 years of age, they call him here the "King of the Boerse."

The story of Jakob Michael's rise to power reads like an absorbing novel. Like that other Jewish financial prodigy of this decade, Castigland of Austria, Michael started out as a comparised ground of Austria, Michael started out as a comparised ground the started out as a comparised ground the started and multiplied his first an article in a magazine here we learn that Michael is the son of a Jewish merchant on a small scale. When still a young boy he worked as a clerk in a counting house in Frankfort as the has a great dislike for publicity it has been impossible to find out where he was born. Some say he came from Galicia, others claim that his parents lived in Frankfort itself. Anyway, he was frankfort at an early age. He learned a great deal about the metal and from industries at the conting house where he was employed for some years. Later, spurred on by ambition, he ventured into business on his own with the 13,000 marks which his father and kinsfolk contributed. That was several years before the war.

At that time most of the important commodities were already controlled by large interlocking trusts. But there was one commodity which had not yet been cornered by the big money men, and that was radium. Young Michael dealt in radium. Before long he was supplying radium salts to laboratories as far apart as Paris and Tokio. It is said that he was the first man in the busi-

It is said that he was the first man in the business. If so he certainly has accomplished a big thing and fully deserves his success.

When the war came he took advantage of a breach in the system of organization of raw materials and got another running start. Ratheman's round-up of raw material had overdooked one metallic substance, tungsten, which is found in conjunction with chalk and lead oxide, and was required for the hardening of steel and the production of electric lights. In his way, her begants weave's net of banking cambinations and, by buying up block after block of shares in chemical and financial organizations, he became, according to the accounts given here, master of the money market.

FREE MASONRY GIVES ENDORSEMENT TO PALESTINE RECONSTRUCTION MOVEMENT

New York Masons Will Raise \$100,000 For Palestine Foundation Fund

A letter placing the stamp of official endorsement of Masonry on the rebuilding of the lewish Homeland in Palestine, was addressed by William A. Rowan, Grand Master of the New York State Masons, to Louis A. Sable, Chairman of a special committee organized by Jewish Masons to obtain encouragement for the Zionist movement from Free Masonry.

"My opinion having been asked as to the proper attitude of Masons toward the establishment of a Jewish homeland in Palestine", the Grand Master writes, "I have no hesitation in stating that I warmly approve of the movement which was initiated by the Balfour Declaration and endorsed by the Joint Resolution of the Congress of the United States and approved by the President.

"As establishing a place of refuge for the oppressed Jews of Central and Eastern Europe in a land enriched by the memories and traditions of the past and regarded as holy ground by Jew and non-Jew alike, it should appeal to the humanitarian impulses of all mankind, particularly to the Masonic Fraternity which traces its legendary origin to the Holy Land."

In March 1924, a special reception by Masons was tendered to Dr. Chaim Weizmann and since then the interest among Masons in the cause continued to grow until it culminated in the official approval by the Grand Master. Other Masons who have been active in this effort are: Moses Altman, Past District Deputy; Arthur Arkin, Grand Representative; Harry N. Simon, Grand Representative; Harry N. Judge Arthur S. Tompkins, Past Grand Master of New York, has also indorsed Masonic cooperation in the Zionist movement. New York Masons as a group expect to contribute the sum of \$100,000 to the Palestine Foundation Fund this year, according to Mr. Sable. He stated that the opening of the first departments of the Hebrew University on the Mount Scopus has had a marked influence in stimulating interest among Masons in cooperating in the rebuilding of the country.

LOUIS MARSHALL POINTS, TO PATRIOTISM OF SAMUEL GOMPERS AND JULIUS KAHN PLEADING FOR ADMIS-SION OF JEWISH REFUGEES

The figures of Samuel Gompers and Julius Kahn, emigrant Jews, who rose to great eminence in this country because of their patriotism and devotion, were painted by Louis Marshall, Chairman of the Emergency Committee on Jewish: Refugees in an appeal to members and worshippers rugees in an appeal to memoers and worsnippers of the Central and Free Synagogues on behalf of the 15,000 Jews stranded in various European seaports and in Cuba. Mr. Marshall declared. "We hope to succed. We may not. We hope that public opinion may be aroused to ask this act of justice. It may not. We cannot believe that those whose actions on. We cannot believe that those whose actions were shaped in reliance upon what they had the moral right to regard as official permission to enter the United States if they were mentally, morally and physically fit, will be condemned to die in despair," he stated.

"At all events there are those who must be cared for. Whether these unfortunates may be permitted to sail or not, we feel that we need Five Hundred Thousand Dollars to deal with this urgent situation", Mr. Marshall said.

22,384 TOURISTS VISIT PALESTINE DURING

SUMMER MONTHS (Jewish Telegraphic Agency Mail Service)

Jerusalem. Dec. 10 .- Twenty-two thousand, three hundred and eighty-four tourists, excluding immigrants, visited Palestine during the months of May, June, July, August and September, a good number spending over two months, according to a report published in the official Commercial Bulletin for December.

It is expected that the coming winter tourist season will be a record one, the estimated num-ber of tourists who will visit Egypt and Palestine according to tourist agencies, far exceeding those of any pre-war winter. The official report tor October shows that 4,327 travellers in transit, tourists and pilgrims, entered the country during that month.

In order to cope with the large number of tourists, many of them Jewish, expected in 1925, a non-commercial Jewish Information Bureau is being opened in Jerusalem to give information about tours, hotels, antiquities, etc.

DUARTE SANITORIUM FOR JEWISH CON-SUMPTIVES FACES DEFICIT OF \$75,000 (Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Los Angeles, Dec. 25.—The Hospital for Jewish Consumptives at Duarte in the foothills of Southern California, housing 150 patients, is facing a deficit of \$75,000, according to an appeal issued by Los Angeles Rabbis for support of the institution.

The sanitorium, which cared for 315 patients last year, is maintained through the Jewish Consumptive Relief Association of California and was founded ten years ago because two Jewish consumptive youths committed suicide when stranded in Los Angeles. This incident aroused the Jewish population and a meeting of workingmen laid the foundation for the institution which now occupies thirty modern buildings on vast grounds. Admission is restricted to penniless patients.

Moscow, Dec. 30.—A number of prominent conomists, agricultural experts and practical economists, workers in the field of colonization, including U. Larin, Abraham Bragin, Professors Fabricant and Margolin, experts on agriculture, and represent-atives of the Government Committee for Settling of Jews, as well as representatives of the Ort, participated in the conference held here last Monday with regard to the Jewish colonization plan.

The conference unanimously recognized the urgent necessity to take a census immediately and complete an economic investigation of the Jews in the small towns of the Union of Soviet Republics. Further work towards the solving of the Jewish economic problem will be based on the data procured by the census.
