LEBANON COAST TO BE CEDED TO PALESTINE BLOOD-RITUAL LIBEL IS ATTEMPTED BY WOMAN Police Prove.

Minsk, Apr. 1.-The consequences of a ritual murder accusation against the Jewish population here were prevented on the first day of Passover by the police.

Large crowds gathered on the streets of Minsk around a woman who was crying. The woman indicated her wounds which were bleeding. She claimed that she was dragged into a celiar by Jews who pumped her blood into bottles for Passover.

When taken to police headquarters it was found that the woman, whose name was Bital, was a professional beggar. During the first cross-examination she repeated her story, but later she confessed that she wished to die and slightly wounding herself she hoped to be executed by the authori-ties for spreading a blood libel against

JEWISH LABOR IN WARSAW DEMANDS RIGHT TO WORK First Jewish Workers Conference Opens Today in Poland

Warsaw, Apr. 1.—The creation of a national council of Jewish trade unions in the Republic of Poland was taken up at the first meeting of the Jewish Labor Congress, which opened here today.

Addresses and reports presented at the first session emphasized the need of the Jewish laboring class's fight for the right to work. It is planned that the national council of the Jewish trade unions will deal with this aspect and particularly with the great number of Jewish workers who were thrown out of the factories and enterprises when the changed ownership followed the introduction of government monopoly.

EXHIBITED IN NEW YORK Rare Manuscripts Tell of Lost Jewish Colony Kai-Fung-Foo

Prayerbooks, manuscripts, scrolls and tombstenes of the lost Jewish col-ony at Kai-Fung-Foo, China, the property of the Hebrew Union Col-lege Library of Cincinnati, are being shown for the first time in the East snown for the first time in the East at the exhibition of Jewish life in Oriental countries at the New York Public Library. The New York Public Library exhibition of which it is a part has been assembled from the part has been assembled from the literary treasures of the Jewish Theological Seminary, New York, Dropsie College for Hebrew and Cognate Learning, Philadelhia, as well as the Hebrew Union College and the Semitics Department of the New York Public Library.

The Chinese collection is probably

the most unique and valuable.

Kai-Fung-Foo was settled by Jews approximately 950 A. D. There is no approximately 950 A. D. There is no accurate knowledge of the origin of these wanderers, but among their writings are words in old Persian, and writings are words in old reislan, and it is believed that these Jews came to China via Persia and Turkestan after the destruction of the Temple by Titus. Chinese manuscripts of a very early date make reference to the colonists. and many theories have been advanced regarding them; one that they are regarding their; one that they are descendants of the lost ten tribes of Israel; another that they formed a portion of Alexander's conquering army, and a third, that they were traders in silks on the caravan routes. The first synagogue at Kai-Fung-Foo was built, it is believed, during the middle of the 12th century. The colony was discovered and rediscovered by historians from Marco Polo down to the librarian of the Hebrew Union College. The manuscripts were Union Conege. Inc manuscripts were first brought out of China by the London Society for Promoting Chris-tianity among the Jews Twelve tianity among the Jews. Twelve scrolls of the law and 63 smaller manuscripts were obtained from the synagogue at Kai-Fung-Foo by a Commisgogue at Kar-Fung-roo by a Commus-sion of Inquiry sent out by the mis-sionary society in the year 1850. All of these, with the exception of a few which were stolen from an exhibition in London several years ago, are now in the possession of the Hebrew Union College. The College also acquired the wooden Ark which housed the scrolls of the law in the old Chinese synagogue. According to present in-formation, all traces of the Jewish set-tlement have been lost, and nothing remains in China except a few tombstones on which is some sort of record of the strange community.

The acquisition of these manuscripts two years ago was made possible by a gift of \$50,000 from Ben Selling of Portland, Oregon, and other contributions.

#### S. O. S. APPEAL OF U. J. C BRINGS \$500,000 IN TEN DAYS

Close to a half a million dollars was received at headquarters of the United Jewish Campaign during the past ten days to be transmitted abroad immediately in order promptly to afford some measure of relief to the destitute Jews of Eastern Europe, David A. Warburg, hon-orary chairmen, David A. Brown, Na-tional chairmen. tional chairman, William Fox, chair-man and David M. Bressler and Jonah J. Goldstein, vice-chairmen of the United Jewish Campaign of New York. The appeal read:

There are no words in the human vocabulary which can overstate the ter-rific tragedy of the lews of Eastern Europe. As we have said time and time again, the lives of millions of Jews are in the hands of American Jewry and unless American Jewry acts quick-ly, acts in the most self-sacrificing man-ner possible, the last glimmer of hope will be gone.

"Thousands of hands are stretched out to us. Thousands of voices are raised in a piteous plea for help—the voices of babes, of old men and women, of orphans, of widows.

"Men who a short while ago were

rich and who were giving charity are now applicants for charity. Hundreds have been driven to suicide in Poland and in Germany because they are unable any longer to face the horrors of life. The Rabbis of Poland have been compelled to issue a ban against the burial of suicides on Jewish cemeteries, in the hope that in this way they may succeed in restraining many from selfdestruction. In Berlin a few weeks 200. a mass meeting was called at which the audience was asked to pledge itself not to commit suicide.

"During this week which commemorates Israel's release from bondage we call upon the Jews of New York, the largest and richest Jewish community in the world, to mobilize all of their forces for service in the \$6,000,000 United Jewish Campaign of New York, which begins on April 25th. Every congregation, every Jewish organization must be a recruiting station for volunteers who will, if necessary, go from door to door, in this city, in order to raise the neces-sary funds for the service of our people."
