LIBERAL POLICY TO JEWS EXPECTED IN ROUMANIA Cabinet Members Showed Sympathy for Jewish Problems

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Bucharest, Apr. 6.—A more liberal policy toward the Jewish population is expected of the Averescu government, according to Mr. Fisher, president of the Jewish National Federation in Transylvania, in an interview with the representative of the newspaper, "Ujkelet."

Notwithstanding the fact that the government has issued no declaration on its attitude toward the Jewish population, it is believed that its policy will be liberal, Mr. Fisher stated, recalling that Prime Minister Averescu's party joined in the protest sent to the senate by Roumanian Jews against the school law introduced by former Education Minister Angelescu.

The new Education Minister, N. Negulescu congratulated the conference of the Jewish National Federation, expressing his full sympathy with the Jewish National idea.

MOND EXPEDITION DISCOVERS NEW GOLD FIELD IN PANAMA

London, Apr. 6.—The discovery of a new gold field by three Jewish financiers is reported by the London "Daily News." The parties responsible for the discovery are Sir Alfred Mond, his son, Henry, and Solly Loeb of South Africa.

Two years ago an expedition, headed by Engineer Calderwood, and guided by natives, travelled through Panama until they discovered gold bearing rocks. A concession for the exploitation of the territory has been secured and a syndicate has been formed for this purpose.

FRENCH OCCUPY STRONGHOLD OF DRUZE FORCES IN LEBANON

Jerusalem, Apr. 6.—Majdal Shems, the most important rebel center in southern Lebanon, was occupied by the French forces yesterday, according to despatches received here. Vadi Hajam, another important centre of the rebels, was also occupied by the French.

Prince Hamad Atrash, son of Sultan El Atrash, leader of the Druzes, was killed in battle at Maarba, despatches state.

JEWISH STUDENTS INVITED TO GENEVA CONFERENCE

Geneva, Apr. 6.—An international students conference for the purpose of promoting intellectual cooperation will be opened here on April 8.

Among the eight student organizations invited to participate in the conference which was convoked by the League of Nations Committee for Intellectual Cooperation, is the World Union of Jewish Students.

SMYRNA JEWS COMPLAIN AGAINST ANTI-JEWISH RIOTS Angora Government Promises Action to Protect Jewish Community

Constantinople, Apr. 6.—The occurrence of anti-Jewish outbreaks in Smyrna came to light when Ismet Pasha, Prime Minister of the Angora government, received a delegation of the Jewish community of Smyrna, complaining against the outbreaks.

Property belonging to Jews resident outside of Smyrna was seized on the pretext that the property was abandoned by the owners, the delegation related.

The Prime Minister promised to take measures in this regard, despatches from Angora stated.

Concerning the message of loyalty alleged to have been sent by Sephardic Jews to Spain, which caused great anti-Semitic agitation in Turkey, the Prime Minister stated he was certain the allegation had no foundation whatever.

According to the latest figures, the Jewish population in Constantinople amounts to 57,532.

SYRIAN HIGH COMMISSIONER CONCLUDES PALESTINE VISIT

Jerusalem, Apr. 6.—Henri de Jouvenel, French High Commissioner of Syria, left Palestine on Saturday.

During his visit the French High Commissioner was the guest of Lord Plumer, High Commissioner of Palestine. He was given a state reception at the Government House here.

Many important questions concerning cooperation between Syria and Palestine were discussed and satisfactory results were reported to have been reached.

It was also stated that during his visit the question of the cession of the Lebanon coast line to Palestine was taken up, although in an official interview, the French High Commissioner made no reference to this matter.

ACTIONS COMMITTEE TO MEET IN JERUSALEM DURING JULY

Jerusalem, Apr. 6.—The meeting of the Zionist Actions Committee, the legislative body of the Zionist movement which functions during the period between Zionist Congresses, will take place here the end of July, it was learned here today.

The meeting was scheduled to be held earlier, but has been postponed.

REUBEN BRAININ ORGANIZES JEWISH WRITERS FOR J. N. F.

Vienna, Apr. 6.—Reuben Brainin, American Hebrew writer, is now touring various European countries and arranging conferences of Jewish writers and intellectuals for the purpose of enlisting their support for the Jewish National Fund.

ROSE BRENNER, JEWISH WOMEN'S LEADER, DEAD Was President of National Council of Jewish Women Since 1920

Miss Rose Brenner of Brooklyn, N. Y., President of the National Council of Jewish Women since 1920, died on Monday at the home of her brother, Arthur B. Brenner, 169 Fenimore Street, Brooklyn. Only forty-two years old when her career came to an end, she had been called to responsibility in organized Jewish work at an unusually early age. She had only graduated from Adelphi College when she was asked to assume a chairmanship in the Brooklyn Council Section, of which she served as President for a period of six years, from 1912 to 1918.

When she was stricken she was spending the afternoon of the Passover holiday with her friend and fellow-officer, Mrs. Estelle M. Sternberger, Executive Secretary of the National Council of Jewish Women.

During the presidency of Miss Brenner, the National Council of Jewish Women attained a world wide influence that was unparalleled in its history. Its membership in the United States and Canada grew from 30,000 to 52,000 during the six years of her leadership. The Council's work during this period inspired Jewish women in other lands to adopt its program with the result that Councils of Jewish Women were formed in Europe and in Australia.

Miss Brenner directed the Council's Department of Farm and Rural Work through its experimental stage to its present position of the second largest department of the Council's program, reaching Jewish women on the farms of the six states of Connecticut, New York, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Michigan and California.

For twenty years she taught a class in the religious school of Beth Elohim Temple, Brooklyn, whose sisterhood she had also served as President. She held the distinction of having been the first woman elected to the Executive Board of Beth Elohim Temple.

She summarized the duty and responsibility of the National Council of Jewish Women in the following statement which she had presented before the Board of Managers of the Council when it met in Boston in 1921, and which she asked the same body, when it met in New York City in November, 1925, to reaffirm:

"The Council concerns itself with the Jewish woman in America, and on her way to America; in the city and on the farm lands; in need of adjustment to her environment and capable of contributing to the enrichment of her environment."

Miss Brenner was the daughter of the late Judge Jacob Brenner of Brooklyn, and is survived by three sisters, the Misses Selma, Rica and Carolyn, and two brothers, Mortimer and Arthur B.

against aliens, is Section 19 (a) and (d), according to Dr. Darby.

"The item in the bill which seems to call for gravest anxiety," Dr. Darby declared, "is the power which it is proposed shall be vested in individuals authorized by the Commissioner General of Immigration to issue warrants of arrest and conduct the deportation hearings. The safeguards provided appear wholly inadequate. The issuer of the warrant of arrest may, so far as appears in the bill, be the local immigration inspector himself, who is to take the evidence and submit it to the Secretary of Labor, whose decision on the evidence solely as submitted will decide the fate of the individual concerned."

"I submit that this provision of the law is seriously defective. It opens the door to blackmail and abuses of many kinds, and subjects the inspector himself to temptations. Such important responsibilities should not be vested in a single lower, and too often insufficiently paid, official. The person accused should be guaranteed by the law the right of competent counsel and advice. The fate of a man should not be entrusted to a single individual's judgment, however honest and sincere he may be. There should be no taint of a 'star-chamber' in connection with deportation proceedings. This provision of the proposed law is too reminiscent of the universally condemned practice of the Czarist Government of Russia of banishing to Siberia objectionable individuals by secret bureaucratic procedure."

"I trust that, if the bill is enacted, Section 19 (a) and (d) may be carefully revised, in order to safeguard more adequately the natural human rights of aliens either to a complete and exhaustive hearings of the evidence, or to a judicial procedure."

Professor Peter Strouwe was elected president of the Russian Emigrés Congress which opened in Paris for the purpose of organizing a "Monarchist group of political exiles from Russia into a body capable of treating with the League of Nations and individual States, with the overthrow of the Bolshevik rule, as their ultimate object."

Among the principal questions which the congress will consider before closing Friday are official representation of the emigrés at the League of Nations, aid to Russian students and examination of the condition of refugees in various countries.

The extreme right, the leaders of the Congress, are under former Premier Trepoff, General Deneghev, and former Chief of the Imperial General Staff; Alexandre Krupensky, former Marshal of the Czar's court and former Ambassador to Japan, and Prince Gortchakoff.

Although Grand Duke Nicholas did not wish to have his name mentioned by the congress, it was clear that he was the recognized leader of those Russian exiles who met in the Congress.

Nicholas will not attend the meetings nor accept leadership, because he hopes that his self-denial may result in the rallying of the emigrés under a single banner, it was stated.

During last year, which was the 110th year of its service, the American Bible Society issued 9,669,120 Bibles. These volumes were in more than 150 languages, says the annual report which was issued from the Bible House. The Soviet Government has given permission to print the Bible in Russia, the report asserts.

The number of Bibles distributed represents an increase of nearly 2,500,000 over 1924, and in any previous year. The largest number issued in America and its possessions was 738,255 volume and in foreign lands 1,677,966 volumes.

Vladimir Jabotinsky, leader of the Zionist Revisionists, addressed a large audience at the Repertory Theatre in Roxbury, Mass. The meeting was arranged by the Boston Avukah Society, the student Zionist organization. Mr. Jabotinsky presented the program of the Zionist Revisionists.

Joseph Shubow presided at the meeting. Jewish students of the University of Chicago, Northwestern University, Crane College and many of the professional schools of the city, comprising the Chicago Chapter of the Avukah Society held their first meeting at the Congress Hotel on Sunday.

Prof. Heubin Freedman of the John Marshall Law School, addressed the meeting on "A Student's View of Zionism."

\$200,000 was left to the Jewish Institute of Religion and \$23,000 to the Free Synagogue by the will of Mrs. Hannah Heyman, according to an announcement made by the Jewish Institute of Religion.

Until six months before her death, the announcement stated, Mrs. Heyman was in modest circumstances, and while taking an active interest in communal affairs was never able to make large contributions. When her brother, Jacob Seimel, died she was left almost \$1,000,000.
