

BILL TO EXEMPT RABBIS' FAMILIES FROM QUOTA PASSED BY CONGRESS

Applies to Wives and Children of Ministers, Rabbis and Professors
(Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Washington, D. C., Apr. 20.—The bill, introduced by Congressman Dickstein, to admit outside the quota, the wives and minor children of ministers and rabbis, as well as professors, who arrived in America prior to July 1, 1924, was passed by the House of Representatives yesterday.

Extreme hardship has been caused these relatives due to the technical interpretation of the Immigration Law, which discriminated against them, while the relatives of rabbis who arrived since July 1, 1924, have, according to the provisions of the law, been allowed to enter as non-quota immigrants.

Washington, Apr. 20.—The Supreme Court rejected an appeal by the Government in the case of Rabbi Jacob S. Duner, whose family the immigration authorities had sought unsuccessfully to exclude from the country. Duner came from Poland prior to the passage of the quota law of 1924. His wife and children arrived after its passage. The authorities attempted to exclude them, but the Federal courts at New York city refused to sustain the Government's contention.

AGENDA IS PREPARED FOR COMING MEETING OF ACTIONS COMMITTEE

Berlin, Apr. 20.—A meeting of the praedium of the Zionist Actions Committee took place here. The praedium was in session for two days and debated the question of the holding of the forthcoming meeting of the Committee. Messrs. Motzkin, Farbstein and Levitz urged that the meeting take place in Jerusalem in accordance with the recent decision of the Committee when it met in London.

It was finally decided that the question will be determined following the return of Dr. Weizmann at the end of May, when a joint session of the Zion-

CONSTANTINOPLE HAS 57,532 JEWS, FIGURES AGENCY INDICATE

Constantinople, Mar. 27.—There are 57,532 Jews in Constantinople, according to the latest figures issued by the Government. The population is as follows: Moslems (Turks) 682,811; Greeks, 181,675; Armenians, 69,831; Jews, 57,532; Armenian Catholics, 102,888; Protestants, 1,302; Bulgarians, 1,049; Latino, 3,512; Syrians, 675 and Chalicians, 563.

PROPOSE COURT ACTION ON RELIGIOUS TEACHING IN THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS

To Test Legality Under Constitution
Guarantees

(Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Baltimore, Md., Apr. 20.—Active support of the movement for the erection of a new synagogue and social center in Jerusalem was decided upon Monday by the 400 delegates to the convention of the United Synagogue of America and the 300 representatives of the Women's League of the organization which are in convention here. The proposed project will cost \$500,000.

A resolution was adopted at Monday's session supporting court action, if necessary, to test the right, under the Constitution, to teach religion in any form in the public schools of the United States. A committee to confer with the leaders of the Seventh Day Adventists regarding the adoption of a five-day week was decided upon. Much attention was given to the problem of college students. The erection of Jewish students homes in college towns was urged by the women.

Division of the country into seven districts for administrative purposes was decided upon and also the employment of a field secretary at a salary of \$5,000 a year to carry on the work.

Monday night a joint banquet of both men and women was held, the principal speakers being Dr. Israel Herbert Levinthal, of the Brooklyn Jewish Center; Rabbi Max D. Klein, of Philadelphia, and Prof. Louis Ginsberg of the Jewish Theological Seminary, New York. Dr.

Czernowitz Community Asks for Release of Eleven Chalutzim

Czernowitz, Apr. 20.—A request to release eleven chalutzim, young Polish Jews on their way to Palestine, held in prison here, was made to the Roumanian Ministry of War by representatives of the Jewish community of Czernowitz.

A group of twelve Chalutzim were sentenced by the Roumanian court to two months imprisonment for crossing

DR. WEIZMANN, IN MESSAGE FROM JERUSALEM, URGES ZIONISTS TO WIDEN RANKS

Every Jewish Brain Should Think
Now of People's Greatest Need

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Jerusalem, Apr. 20.—A message to Zionists throughout the world, urging their intensive work during Zionist Organization month, from April 15 to May 15, was despatched from here. The message states:

"From the heart of Zion I wish to send to the farflung Zionist community the world over, my deepest and prayerful wishes for the success of the Iyar, Zionist Organization Month, which is intended to implant more deeply the Zionist faith, courage and determination in the hearts of our mobilized ranks and to stimulate the recruiting of our non-Zionist brethren for the work on behalf of our people's future and our people's Land."

"My present visit to Palestine has confirmed my earliest conviction that Palestine needs, above all, a strong Zionist Organization to give direction, guidance and sustenance to our growing Yishub and to provide moral supervision over the Jewish construction efforts, regardless of by whom they were begun or by whom they are being carried out. A stronger Zionist Organization means a stronger Jewish Palestine, a greater loyalty to the Zionist Organization spells a greater loyalty to the Jewish nation and the bearing of the corporate responsibility for the entire task. Our Organization does not desire control and certainly does not wish to monopolize the Jewish effort in Palestine. However, efforts in Palestine without the lighting of the way by our

JEWS MAY MIGRATE TO PORTUGUESE COLONIES, OFFICIAL DECLARES

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Lisbon, Apr. 20.—The opening of Portuguese colonies to Jewish immigration is a desirable possibility in the opinion of the Portuguese government, according to General D'Andrade, former Portuguese Minister for Foreign Affairs and a member of the Permanent Mandates Commission of the League of Nations.

When interviewed by the representative of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency, General D'Andrade stated that in view of the difficult economic position in which the Jewish masses find themselves in the East European countries, there would be an opening for emigration to the Portuguese colonies.

The Jews have never been driven out of Portugal on the initiative of the Portuguese people, General D'Andrade said. The expulsion was due only to the political factors which obtained in the Iberian Peninsula at that time.

EMINENT JEWISH SCHOLARS OF UNITED STATES RECEIVE GUGGENHEIM FELLOWSHIPS

(Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Baltimore, Md., Apr. 20.—Dr. David Simon Blondheim, professor of Romance philology at the Johns Hopkins University, who was among the thirty-seven new fellows appointed by the John Simon Guggenheim Memorial Foundation for further study and research, is the author of "Les Parlers Judeo-Romano et la Vetus Latina," for which he was recently honored by the Academy of Inscriptions and Belle Lettres of the Institute of France.

According to an announcement Dr. Blondheim was appointed to gather material for a series of works on the use of the Romance languages among the Jews of the Middle Ages. His work under the auspices of the Foundation will continue the study commenced in his book.

Philadelphia, Apr. 20.—Dr. Ephraim A. Speiser, who was among recipients of the Guggenheim Fellowships, is one of the foremost Orientalists in the country. He is said to be one of the two persons in the world who understand the Hittite language.

Dr. Speiser was awarded a Fellowship to make philological and historical investigations of the Mitanni-Hurri peoples of ancient Mesopotamia.

Dr. Speiser was born in Lemberg, Poland, in 1902, where he was educated at the Gymnasium and the University of Lemberg. The World War interrupted his studies, and he served four years in the army. He then came to the United States.

In 1921 he entered the University of Pennsylvania, winning a master of arts degree in 1923 and becoming a doctor of philosophy in 1924, at the age of 22.

In addition to his investigations to be made under the Guggenheim award, Dr. Speiser is to serve as annual professor at the American School of Oriental Research in Bagdad.

Dr. Speiser has been awarded the Fellowship of the Harrison Research Foundation at the University of Penn-

Wants a "Guggenheim Foundation" for Jewish Culture

Will some Jewish millionaire, suggests the "Day" of April 20, endow a special fund for Jewish culture similar to the Guggenheim \$3,000,000 Foundation.

Commenting editorially on the awards of the Guggenheim Foundation, the paper points out that the Jews are especially interested in the Fellowships announced not only because they are concerned about the cultural progress of America generally and because Mr. Guggenheim is a Jew, but also because the studies to be conducted by some of the scholars who received fellowships have a bearing on Jewish matters. Referring to Dr. David Blondheim, who will study the use of Romance languages among the Jews of the Middle Ages, and Isaac Fisher, who will study the subject of racial relations, the paper concludes: "The Guggenheim Foundation should serve as an example to other Jews who possess great wealth. When Jews will begin to distinguish themselves in supporting cultural institutions as well as they are supporting charitable causes, the Jewish name will be elevated along with the cultural level of America."

"And perhaps, in time, a Jewish millionaire will endow a fund for Jewish research, for those men who spend their lives suffering poverty and want in the cause of Jewish learning, which has so few admirers and friends?"

The Encyclopedia Britannica and the Jews

The appointment of James L. Garvin, of the London "Observer" as editor of the Encyclopedia Britannica should be welcomed by the Jews, declares Jacob Fishman in the "Jewish Morning Journal" (April 20), in view of the charges of an unfriendly policy to the Jews that have been made recently against this publication.

"Those in charge of the Britannica," Mr. Fishman writes, "have denied any bias against the Jews, and we do not care now to pass judgment between them and their accusers. But whatever may have been the case hitherto we expect a decisive improvement under M. Garvin's editorship. Mr. Garvin is a liberal who fully deserves the name. He is a fighter for justice and liberal ideas and as such he has had opportunity on a number of occasions to defend the Jews against the attacks of the "Morning Post" and other anti-Semitic papers. It is to be assumed that under Mr. Garvin's editorship such unfavorable characterizations about Jews as have hitherto appeared in the Britannica will not 'slip in' any more and important facts relative to the Jews will not be omitted."

TEXAS JEWS PLEDGE \$250,000 FOR PAVILION AT JEWISH CONSUMPTIVE SOCIETY

Dallas, Texas, Apr. 20.—Texas Jews pledged \$250,000 to the Jewish Consumptive Relief Society of Denver for erecting a Women's Pavilion, at the 22nd annual convention of the Society which opened here Sunday night. Harry Sigel presented a check for \$50,000 as the first installment towards building the Texas wing.

Godfrey Schirmer, a non-Jew of Denver, addressed the delegates at a banquet at the Adolphus Hotel here. Mr. Schirmer, who was chairman of the Building Campaign for the city of Denver, detailed first hand information as to what the sanitarium was accomplishing and commended the Jews throughout the country who are supporting it with both their money and sympathy.

Dr. Roy Goggans, medical director of the Tubercular Hospital of the county of Dallas and Dr. N. W. Andrews, head of the Dallas Health Department, addressed the convention. Dr. Philip Hillkowitz, President of the Society, presided, assisted by Dr. C. D. Spivak, Executive Secretary. The following trustees were elected at the concluding session on Monday: D. H. Krohn, S. G. Rosenthal, I. Rude, H. J. Schwartz, Meyer Neusteter, Ben Grimes, Hyman Robinson, all of Denver and Harry Sigel, Dallas.

MEXICAN EXPERT STUDIES AGRICULTURE IN JEWISH COLONIES IN ARGENTINE

Paris, Mar. 24.—M. Gomez Vallejo, the agricultural expert, has been entrusted by the Mexican Government with a special mission to the Argentine in order to study the condition of colonization there.

M. Vallejo has visited the Ica colonies in Entre-Rios in order to study the methods, the organization and the functioning of the cooperatives, etc. M. Vallejo was very favorably impressed with everything he saw and expressed his admiration of the great work which the Ica is conducting with so much success in the Argentine.

The colonists in the Ica settlements are in addition to the agricultural work developing dairy farming. In the groups at Entre-Rios the colonists obtain 40,000 litres of milk daily from their cows, from which they derive a profitable income.

JEWISH COMMUNAL ACTIVITIES

Plans for a Jewish Community Center Building in Peekskill, N. Y., were decided on at a joint mass meeting of the Y. M. & Y. W. H. A. and the First Hebrew Congregation. It is planned to purchase a piece of ground in the center of the Village and to erect a Jewish Community Center. There are about 175 Jewish families in Peekskill.

The project was launched by the Y. M. & Y. W. H. A. who had at first planned to erect a clubhouse of their own.

Preliminary work on the construction of the new \$150,000 Adath Yeshurun Synagogue in Minneapolis, Minn. has begun. The plans call for the erection of a school and community center in addition to the synagogue. In the school will be facilities for 12 class rooms, gymnasium, theater, auditorium, kitchen, dining room, lockers and showers, library, studies and lounging rooms.

British Chief Rabbi Sees Jewish Unity of God Endangered

(By Our London Correspondent)

London, Apr. 1.—The charge that the leaders of Liberal Judaism in England are prepared to abandon the pure monotheism of the Jewish religion, was made here by Chief Rabbi, Dr. Hertz, in a sermon delivered at the Brompton Synagogue on the first day of Passover. "Traditional Judaism," Dr. Hertz declared, "must defend the Unity of God against those whom we might call the Jewish Christians of our day; against those who altogether reject the Unity of God, or against such Jews and descendants of Jews who are not prepared to be unhesitating witnesses of unalloyed and undiluted monotheism."

"Thus, the founder of the Jewish Liberal movement in England, seems to be weakening in his stand for the absolute unity of the God-ahead. More than thirty years ago, he complained that the unity of God has occasionally tended to become a 'fetish' amongst us; while, in his latest book he does not consider that the doctrine of the Trinity necessarily involves an infraction of the Divine Unity. He writes:

'We have to re-examine and set forth afresh the doctrine of the divine unity. It will be needful for Liberal Jewish theologians to consider the new modern interpretations of the doctrine of the Trinity, and to discuss how far these are, and how far they are not, in accordance with Jewish views of the unity. Nor does it follow that because the doctrine of the Trinity has been, and even is, in frequent danger of degeneration into Tritheism, or has often so degenerated, it is therefore not true.'

"In other words, the Unity of God is still an open question. It seems Liberals should be prepared to subscribe to the doctrine of the Trinity, if they were permitted to put their own interpretation on it, or that of advanced Christian theologians. A man need be neither prophet nor son of a prophet to foretell that those who come after them will be less squeamish. One cannot help recalling David Friedlaender and his proposals to the Lutheran authorities at Berlin in the year 1799. And the experience of early-nineteenth-century Berlin is likely to repeat itself in mid-twentieth century London. Such is not only my view, but also the view of those Liberal guides who passionately desire to remain in Judaism. Dr. S. Schulman, one of the ablest of American Liberal ministers, recently reminded his congregation that some of the Protestant Churches which used to send missionaries to the Jews, now announce that they have given up doing so, because they no longer believe in 'conversion.' The fact is—says Dr. Schulman—that there is really no need for them to continue expending the vast sums which they did. Such sermons as one prominent Liberal rabbi has recently delivered on the Founder of Christianity—are doing the work for the Protestant and the Catholic Churches far better than their own missionaries

COL. BEWSHER APPOINTED COMMANDER OF FRONTIER FORCE IN PALESTINE

Jerusalem, Apr. 20.—Colonel Bewsher, Commandant of the Palestine gendarmerie, was appointed Commander of the Palestine Transjordanian force.

The director of the Palestine police, Mayvordata, when interviewed by the correspondent of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency, stated that Palestine Jews have no reason to complain against the Palestine government's frontier force ordinance. The frontier force is intended for Transjordan and conditions there are not suitable for Jewish soldiers, he said. If Jews want to serve their country they can do so through the police force, he stated. One hundred and ten Jews from the Palestine gendarmerie have already been transferred to the frontier force. In the police force, which numbers 1,000, there are at present 200 Jews, he said, declaring that he would be prepared to include a greater number of Jewish policemen in the force.

The Jewish constable is more capable than the Arab, he stated. The frontier force totals 750, including the 200 who are now stationed in Palestine.

ROUMANIAN STUDENTS STAGE ANTI-SEMITIC RIOT IN PRAGUE DORMITORY

Prague, Apr. 1.—The visit of a delegation of 30 Roumanian students from Cluj, members of the Roumanian anti-Semitic students' organization, to the Y. M. C. A. students' hostel here provoked a serious anti-Jewish disturbance at the hostel. The Roumanian students were wearing anti-Semitic badges and behaved in a manner which the Jewish and also the liberal students regarded as provocative and they made a demonstration against them. The warden of the hostel called in the police and two arrests were made. The warden also made some strongly anti-Semitic remarks and excluded from the hostel five Jewish students.

About 350 students attended a demonstration, at which a resolution was adopted demanding the readmission of the excluded students and the withdrawal by the warden of his anti-Jewish remarks. The warden's reply was to expel the members of the delegation who brought him the resolution. He has now declared his intention to enforce a numerus clausus against Jewish members of the hostel.

MEDICAL SECTION OF FRIENDS OF THE HEBREW UNIVERSITY FORMED

London, Apr. 10.—A medical branch of the society, 'Friends of the Hebrew University of Jerusalem,' was formed here at a meeting held yesterday of Jewish members of the medical profession.

Sir Philip Hartog, the president of the Society, who presided gave a brief survey of the present work of the University, which he recently visited. He emphasized the great importance of the research work conducted in the Biochemical and Microbiological Institutes, both for the advancement of science in general and for the sanitary and economic development of Palestine and the other countries of the Near East in particular. Sir Philip described the research work of the Institute of Jewish Studies, which is investigating afresh the history and literature of the Jewish people, in particular in its relation to Palestine. The University possessed a very valuable library of 100,000 volumes, which was well organized and equipped for the research work of the several departments. He emphasized the importance of the organization of societies of friends of the Jerusalem University in Europe and America, which he considered essential both for the material and the intellectual development of the University.

Dr. M. D. Eder, in moving the resolution for the establishment of the Medical Section, dealt in particular with the medical research work at present conducted at the University.

DR. COHN, FIRST RABBI OF BASLE, DIES AT 65

Berlin, Mar. 25.—Rabbi A. Cohn, the first rabbi of the Jewish community of Basle died in that city.

A little less than a year ago Dr. Cohn retired after 40 years of Rabbinical activity. In 1885 when the Basle community numbered only 150 members, Dr. Cohn, then a young man of 24, a pupil of Rabbi Hildesheimer, received the call to become Rabbi of the congregation. At the time of his retirement the community numbered 300 families.

Polish Jewish Chalutz Dies in Roumanian Jail

the Roumanian border without passports. One of the Chalutzim died in the jail in Jassy several days ago. The others are seriously ill because of the unsanitary conditions and the hard labor to which they are subjected.

The delegation of the Jewish community here urged the Minister of War to release the eleven Chalutzim in order that they may proceed to Palestine.

Jesse H. Brown, Chicago lawyer, was elected president of the newly-formed Sovereign Club in Chicago. The organization has just been formed by sixty young Jewish men here. It is planned to erect their own building in the Loop district. Betram B. Most of the Chicago "Daily News," was named vice-president; Alfred Stern, secretary; Samuel Zamen, treasurer, and the following directors: Howard Mayer, of the Chicago "American"; Marshall Schwimmer, Lester Furth, William Stein, Sidney Westerfield, David Milgrim and Maurice Fisher.

The annual Benefit Performance of the University Settlement Society will be held on Sunday evening, April 25th, at the Klaw Theatre, New York. Stairs from the Broadway way plays as well as from Keith and Loew Circuits will appear. A special event will be an exhibition by the children of the Settlement's "Interpretative Dancing Class."

The Settlement House, at the corner of Eldridge and Rivington Streets, in one of the most congested neighborhoods of the city, was the first social settlement in America and is now one of the foremost in the world.

Camp Tioronda at Mount Beacon, N. Y., is the summer home of the University Settlement. Last summer 1,800 children were accommodated at the camp.

Funds from Sunday's performance will go toward the erection of additional dormitories at the camp to accommodate 1,300 children.

ANTI-IMMIGRATION WAVE IN SOUTH AFRICA GROWS

Johannesburg, Mar. 10.—The agitation against the Lithuanian immigration into South Africa is growing. No sooner are the monthly figures on immigration and emigration published by the Director of Statistics, than the agitation is renewed in the press and elsewhere. The other day a question was addressed on the subject to the Minister of the Interior in Parliament and, in his reply, Dr. Malan stated that in the year 1925 practically a quarter of the entire immigration came from Eastern and Southern Europe to the number of 1,335. Of these, 839 came from Lithuania, the others from Poland, Russia and Latvia.

"The Cape Times," the leading newspaper in South Africa, has now joined the chorus and, while protesting against a possible charge of anti-Semitism, frankly refers to the influx of the large number of Hebrews. In 1925, it says, there was a net loss, by reason of the emigration figures exceeding those of immigration, in the white population of the Union to the extent of 337, whilst there was an increase of 1,282 in the Hebrew population for the same period.

"Our total population," the paper continues, "numbers barely 1,600,000, and of these 65,000 are Hebrews. Those 65,000 Jews have played their part and are playing their part in building up the resources of South Africa. They have proved themselves good South Africans."

This compliment notwithstanding, the paper proceeds to demand that the Government should introduce the quota system in the regulation of immigration and maintains that the large increase in the Jewish population "may have the effect of altering the whole character of the future race."
