CAIRO MOSLEMS PLAN TO CHOOSE CALIPH AT COMING CONFERENCE

Syrian Press Protests Against "British Influence

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Jerusalem, Apr. 24.-The Syrian

Press comments widely on the coming Congress which is to be held at Cairo in May for the purpose of electing a Caliph of all the Moslems, a post which, except for the ill-fated proclamation in 1924 of the ex-King Hussein who was forced to abdicate soon after, has been vacant since the Turkish Government at Angora abolished the Caliphate.

The present state of Syria, the Press complains, makes it impossible for the Syrian Moslems to participate in the Congress as at present arranged. The Congress should therefore, be postponed until conditions in Syria have returned to normal. In any case, it is objected, the Caliphate Congress ought not to be held in Cairo because there it will be under British influence. The idea of electing King Fuad of Egypt as Caliph should be abandoned, because King Fuad would as Caliph not be in a position to carry out the prime function of the Caliphate—the conduct of a policy of union of all Moslems throughout the world, because that would be against British interests. When conditions in Syria are again

normal, the papers states, the All-Islamic Congress should be called in Mecca, where it would be free from foreign influence.

BUCHAREST STUDENTS URGED TO REREGISTER (Tewish Telegraphic Agency)

Bucharest, Apr. 24.—All students who joined the anti-Semitic strike at the University of Bucharest, will have to be reregistered at the University by April 27. If they are not reregistered, by that date, they will not be admitted to the examinations, according to an announcement of the Senate of the University.

The first and second courses in the medical college of the University are still closed due to the absence of students. The question of excluding the striking students still remains open.

ROUMANIAN JEWS RECEIVE HONORS FROM GOVERNMENT (Tewish Telegraphic Agency)

Bucharest, Apr. 24.—Over one hundred Roumanian Jews received decorations from the government during the last week. These decorations were for service to the country and included the highest Roumanian distinctions of Korono Rominia and Stuauta Rominia.

ICA WILL SETTLE 300 FAMILIES IN UKRAINIA (Tewish Telegraphic Agency)

Paris, Apr. 24.—Plans for settling 300 additional Jewish families on the land in the Ukraine were announced by the Ica, the Jewish Colonization Association.

The district in which the settlement will be established is in the Saparojie region.

HEBREW UNIVERSITY GETS 100,000 KRONEN FROM PRAGUE ((Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Prague, Apr. 24.-The amount 100,000 Czech kronen was donated to the library of the Hebrew University in that 11 pupils of the evangelical school Jerusalem by the B'nai B'rith lodge of the party, according to a decision of the party leaders.

THE TENTH ANNIVERSARY OF SHOLOM ALEICHEM'S DEATH IS OBSERVED House Where Writer Was Born Will Be Preserved (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Moscow, Apr. 24.—The tenth anniversary of the death of Sholom Aleichem, the Jewish Mark Twain, was commemorated yesterday in Perioslav. Sholom Aleichem, who was born in Perioslav on February 18, 1959, died in

New York on May 13, 1916. It has been decided by the people of Perioslav to convert the house in which Sholom Aleichem was born 67 years ago, and which is still preserved as at the time of his birth, into a library and reading room to be known as the Sholom Aleichem department, to arrange for the local general library a special Sholom Aleichen department, to arrange for the local Yiddish school and one of the streets in the town to be renamed after Sholom Aleichem, to organize a series of reading and lectures among the local masses and the youth on Sholom Aleichem's life and works and to distribute among the poorer population free popular editions of Sholom Aleichem's works. Although Sholom Aleichem lived in

Perioslav until he was 19 years of age, the town has no Sholom Aleichem relics. The letters which he wrote from Nervi to his friends in Perioslav were destroyed by bandits during the civil Throughout the Soviet Union, espe-

DECREASE IN SACRAMENTAL WINE WITHDRAWALS 50% (Jewish Daily Bulletin) Washington, Apr. 24.-The Treasury

Department's new regulation governing sacramental wines already has resulted in a 50 per cent reduction in withdrawals of such wines, Gen. Lincoln C. Andrews, Assistant Secretary in charge of prohibition enforcement said. General Andrews indicated that there

is no present intention to change the method of handling sacramental wines. "Our present regulation concerning these wines, after a three months' trial, is working very satisfactorily," he said. "We have not considered changing it."

speaks English and French fluently, and is the author of twelve books. He has brought with him the names of 18,000 Polish Jewish women who are "agunoth," or women whose husbands had been lost track of during the war.

Rabbi Lipschitz is 65 years old. He

In many cases the husbands are dead, but in others the husbands have neglected to communicate with their wives.

Swindlers in America have represented themselves as rabbis and have notified some of the wives in Poland that divorces will be arranged on payment of a fee, or that divorces already had been arranged, contingent upon the payment of a nominal sum.

Rabbi Lipschitz said that when he returns after investigations here, he hopes to find relief measures through action of rabbinical authorities to give freedom back to the women whose husbands had disappeared. While in America he will try to locate as many husbands as possible.

At the pier Rabbi Lipschitz was met by one hundred orthodox rabbis of New York City.

ELECTION COMPLAINT OF PRAGUE JEWS REJECTED

SECRETS OF ANTI-SEMITIC INTERNATIONAL REVEALED

Former Associate Tells Story of Bu-dapest Congress (Jewish Telestraphic Agency Mail Service)

Hamburg, Apr. 15.—Today's issue of the "Israelitische Familienblatt" publishes interesting material on the plans of the anti-Semitic International (a cabled excerpt of which was published in the Jewish Daily Bulletin of April 19). The revelations were made by one of the leaders who was associated with the work. He writes:
"What were the conditions prior to

the holding of the anti-Semitic congress in Budapest? The Russian anti-Semitic movement, as it developed in Germany since 1908, suffered a definite defeat during the November Putsch in 1923. Also, abroad, the anti-Semitic movement was in complete retreat. Henry Ford, the man who gave money for European anti-Semitism, who a year ago gave to Theodor Fritsch the sum of \$5,000, stopped giving. No beg-ging helped. At that time of collapse, the Austrian Consul-General, De Pottere, whose secret name is Olier, undertook to form an anti-Semitic world congress and to lay the foundation for a "racial international." The slogan was "Free the enslaved people of the world from the domination of inter-national Judaism."

"However, the opening of the Congress took place under an unfavorable star. One group, which represented the racial anti-Semitic attitude and which confessed openly the necessity of "propaganda for action," was composed of the German delegation, of whom Theodor Fritsch was one of the loudest leaders, the Hungarians, the Roumanians, represented by Prof. Cuza, and the Austrian National Socialists, represented by Hattermeier

cialists, represented by Hattermeier and Haubenberg.

"The Austrian Schager group, recognized the racial anti-Semitism, but its leaders, Baron Schager, Dr. Wolff and State Secretary Teufel, protested sharp against a resolution introduced the seminary of the upper hand, fought the racial theory in a categoric manner. To this group the most prominent representatives belonged. Monsignor Benigni, delegate of Italy, Abbe Dupperon, as delegate of France, two delegates of the Czech Christian Peoples Party and, in a certain sense, also the representatives of the Russian monarchists, Dr. Nemirovitch Datschenko. Dr. Datschenko frequently voted for the Dataches requestry voted for the proposals of the German delegation. The Latin group was charged with being Jesuits and "servants of the Jews."
"The congress was threatening to col-

lapse at the first sessions were it not for the intervention of the Hungarian delegate, Goemboes, and Consul General De Pottere.

"The definite results of the congress

1. The creation of a Bureau of the Anti-Semitic International, with headquarters in Vienna. Representatives of Germany, France, Austria and of the Russian emigres are to be sent annually and to this bureau. Two seats are to be du."

JOINT DISTRIBUTION COMMITTEE MAY APPEAL TO NON-JEWS IF AMERICAN JEWRY DOES NOT RESPOND. BROWN TELLS COMMITTEE

Describes Tragic Meeting of J. D. C.; Urges Immediate Action for Relief Before Any Other Movement; Outlines Program. of Action to Accelerate Campaign

rope was issued yesterday by David A. Brown, National Chairman of the United Jewish Campaign. In a letter to the National Committee of the United Jewish Campaign, Mr. Brown stated:

"In view of the situation of the Jews of Eastern Europe, as it reveals itself to me in the great mass of cables, letters and petitions which pour into this office daily, I feel it to be my solemn duty to say to you and to the Jews of America that the effort we are making to raise a minimum of \$15,000,000 for the relief of the suffering millions who look to us as their last hope, is and must be the only and sole activity of the Jews of this country until the entire sum has ben raised.

"With all of the solemnity and sincerity of one who is facing the truth, I say to you that this campaign transcends in importance any other move-ment, any other appeal that is now before the Jews of America for whatever purpose, collectively or locally.
"I am moved further to make this

statement because of a meeting held a few days ago by the Joint Distribution Comittee. It was a meeting called for the purpose of passing the budget for April, May and June. It was a tragic meeting because there were brought to this meeting, in addition to the reports I have received, reports from hundreds of Jewish communities in Eastern Europe, which indicate that the tragedy of our people has assumed staggering proportions.

Describes J. D. C. Meeting

"I repeat that the meeting of the Joint Distribution Committee, which should have been a merely formal session, was a tragic meeting. This great organization, which only a few years ago stood out before the world as the savior of European Jewry, this organization which had disbursed \$60,000,-000 with which it rebuilt the lives of tens and tens of thousands of Jews, who had been stricken by the war; which had rebuilt hundreds of communities; which had re-established hundreds of schools; which had established hundreds of new schools; which had successfully combatted epidemics in a score of countries; which had made it possible for thousands of Jewish young men and young women to become self-supporting; which, in short, had kept the soul and the body of Israel alive during the ten terrible years beginning with 1914—saw, now, at this meeting, the whole of that wonderful structure that it erected in Europe crumbling in the face of a ter-

rific economic cyclone.

OUR DAILY NEWS LETTER Sephardic Jews In Uruguay Typify

Israel's Dispersion (By Our Montevideo Correspondent, Israeli) Montevideo, Uruguay, Mar. 25 .- The presence of a small community of Sephardic Jews here in Montevideo illustrates again the proverbial dispersion of Israel. Here are a group of Jews who left their homes in far away lands of Asia, Africa and Europe and came to this country to settle and become part of it. They originate from Spain, Syria, Palestine, Egypt, Greece, Mo-rocco, Tunis, Italy, Kurdistan and

Crimea. It is easy to discover the Sephardic Iews for they do not assimilate as easily as the Ashkenazim with their environment, in language, their outward appearance and their customs. One can tell their presence in the so-called "Turkish" and the "Small Quarter" of the city where they have their cafes, restaurants and schools, bearing signs with distinctly Jewish inscriptions. The Sephardim cannot be accused, as the Ashkenazim sometimes are, of trying to hide their Jewish origin. On their schools one can see signs reading "Pansion Israelita," and they display their original Jewish names over their stores and shops. Thus, the names Isaac, Samson, Peretz, Mizrachi, etc., are frequently encountered along the streets where the Sephardim live.

Ninety-five per cent of the Sephardic Jews are merchants who sell chiefly dry goods. Some are engaged in the export and import business, dealing in

coffee, etc.

It is a deplorable fact, however, that the cultural level among them is very low, the majority of them not even being able to read the prayers in Hebrew. If one of them reads the Hebrew prayers fluently he is regarded as an accomplished person and called a
