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CAIRO MOSLEMS PLAN TO CHOOSE CALIPH AT COMING CONFERENCE Syrian Press Protests Against "British Influence"

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Jerusalem, Apr. 24.—The Syrian Press comments widely on the coming Congress which is to be held at Cairo in May for the purpose of electing a Caliph of all the Moslems, a post which, except for the ill-fated proclamation in 1924 of the ex-King Hussein who was forced to abdicate soon after, has been vacant since the Turkish Government at Angora abolished the Caliphate.

The present state of Syria, the Press complains, makes it impossible for the Syrian Moslems to participate in the Congress as at present arranged. The Congress should therefore, be postponed until conditions in Syria have returned to normal. In any case, it is objected, the Caliphate Congress ought not to be held in Cairo because there it will be under British influence. The idea of electing King Fuad of Egypt as Caliph should be abandoned, because King Fuad would as Caliph not be in a position to carry out the prime function of the Caliphate—the conduct of a policy of union of all Moslems throughout the world, because that would be against British interests.

When conditions in Syria are again normal, the papers states, the All-Islamic Congress should be called in Mecca, where it would be free from foreign influence.

JEWISH ORGANIZATIONS TO SUBMIT MEMORANDA TO MIGRATION CONGRESS Jewish Emigration Problems Will Be Emphasized

London, Apr. 24.—Two Jewish memoranda will be submitted to the World Migration Congress, which will open here on May 18 under the auspices of the International Federation of Trade Unions and the Labor and Socialist Internationals.

The Poale Zion will submit a memorandum in which emphasis is laid on the immigration to Palestine. Another memorandum will be that of the Jewish Labor Emigration Bureau of Poland.

John W. Brown, secretary of the International Federation of Trade Unions, visited Palestine last year to investigate the situation there.

BUCHAREST STUDENTS URGED TO REREGISTER

Bucharest, Apr. 24.—All students who joined the anti-Semitic strike at the University of Bucharest, will have to be reregistered at the University by April 27. If they are not reregistered, by that date, they will not be admitted to the examinations, according to an announcement of the Senate of the University.

The first and second courses in the medical college of the University are still closed due to the absence of students. The question of excluding the striking students still remains open.

ROUMANIAN JEWS RECEIVE HONORS FROM GOVERNMENT

Bucharest, Apr. 24.—Over one hundred Roumanian Jews received decorations from the government during the last week. These decorations were for service to the country and included the highest Roumanian distinctions of Korono Rominia and Stautia Rominia.

ICA WILL SETTLE 300 FAMILIES IN UKRAINE

Paris, Apr. 24.—Plans for settling 300 additional Jewish families on the land in the Ukraine were announced by the Ica, the Jewish Colonization Association.

The district in which the settlement will be established is in the Saparajie region.

HEBREW UNIVERSITY GETS 100,000 KRONEN FROM PRAGUE

Prague, Apr. 24.—The amount of 100,000 Czech kronen was donated to the library of the Hebrew University in Jerusalem by the B'nai B'rith lodge here.

THE TENTH ANNIVERSARY OF SHOLOM ALEICHEM'S DEATH IS OBSERVED House Where Writer Was Born Will Be Preserved

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Moscow, Apr. 24.—The tenth anniversary of the death of Sholom Aleichem, the Jewish Mark Twain, was commemorated yesterday in Perislov.

Sholom Aleichem, who was born in Perislov on February 18, 1859, died in New York on May 13, 1916. It has been decided by the people of Perislov to convert the house in which Sholom Aleichem was born 67 years ago, and which is still preserved as at the time of his birth, into a library and reading room to be known as the Sholom Aleichem department, to arrange for the local general library a special Sholom Aleichem department, to arrange for the local Yiddish school and one of the streets in the town to be renamed after Sholom Aleichem, to organize a series of reading and lectures among the local masses and the youth on Sholom Aleichem's life and works and to distribute among the poorer population free popular editions of Sholom Aleichem's works.

Although Sholom Aleichem lived in Perislov until he was 19 years of age, the town has no Sholom Aleichem relics. The letters which he wrote from Nervi to his friends in Perislov were destroyed by bandits during the civil war.

Throughout the Soviet Union, especially in Odessa, Kiev, Minsk, and Moscow, similar ceremonies were held.

Special memorial meetings were held in all the educational institutions throughout the Ukraine by order of the Ukrainian Ministry of Education and Fine Arts.

DECREASE IN SACRAMENTAL WINE WITHDRAWALS 50%

Washington, Apr. 24.—The Treasury Department's new regulation governing sacramental wines already has resulted in a 50 per cent reduction in withdrawals of such wines. Gen. Lincoln C. Andrews, Assistant Secretary in charge of prohibition enforcement said.

General Andrews indicated that there is no present intention to change the method of handling sacramental wines.

"Our present regulation concerning these wines, after a three months' trial, is working very satisfactorily," he said. "We have not considered changing it."

GERMAN PARTY EXCLUDES JEWS FROM MEMBERSHIP

Berlin, Apr. 24.—Patriotic German Jews sympathizing with the program of the nationalistic party, Deutschnationale Partei, will not be accepted as members of the party, according to a decision of the party leaders.

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RABBI LIPSCHITZ, PRESIDENT OF POLISH RABBIS, ARRIVES

Seeks Relief for 18,000 "Agunoth"

Rabbi Ezekiel Lipschitz, of Kalish, Poland, President of the Union of Rabbis of Poland, an organization including 800 rabbis, arrived here Friday on the Mauretania. The purpose of his visit is to attend and address the Union of Orthodox Rabbis of America and Canada at their convention to be held at Far Rockaway on May 4.

Rabbi Lipschitz is 65 years old. He speaks English and French fluently, and is the author of twelve books. He has brought with him the names of 18,000 Polish Jewish women who are "agunoth," or women whose husbands had been lost track of during the war.

In many cases the husbands are dead, but in others the husbands have neglected to communicate with their wives.

Swindlers in America have represented themselves as rabbis and have notified some of the wives in Poland that divorces will be arranged on payment of a fee, or that divorces already had been arranged, contingent upon the payment of a nominal sum.

Rabbi Lipschitz said that when he returns after investigations here, he hopes to find relief measures through action of rabbinical authorities to give freedom back to the women whose husbands had disappeared. While in America he will try to locate as many husbands as possible.

At the pier Rabbi Lipschitz was met by one hundred orthodox rabbis of New York City.

ELECTION COMPLAINT OF PRAGUE JEWS REJECTED

Prague, Apr. 24.—The complaint of the Jewish representatives against irregularities in the recent elections in Carpathia Russia were rejected by the elections court, a special court dealing with election questions.

The court found it impossible to investigate the details of the election.

SECRETS OF ANTI-SEMITIC

INTERNATIONAL REVEALED

Former Associate Tells Story of Budapest Congress

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency Mail Service)

Hamburg, Apr. 15.—Today's issue of the "Israelitische Familienblatt" publishes interesting material on the plans of the anti-Semitic International (a cabled excerpt of which was published in the Jewish Daily Bulletin of April 19). The revelations were made by one of the leaders who was associated with the work. He writes:

"What were the conditions prior to the holding of the anti-Semitic congress in Budapest? The Russian anti-Semitic movement, as it developed in Germany since 1908, suffered a definite defeat during the November Putsch in 1923. Also, abroad, the anti-Semitic movement was in complete retreat. Henry Ford, the man who gave money for European anti-Semitism, who a year ago gave to Theodor Fritsch the sum of \$5,000, stopped giving. No begging helped. At that time of collapse, the Austrian Consul-General, Dr. Pottere, whose secret name is Olier, undertook to form an anti-Semitic world congress and to lay the foundation for a "racial international." The slogan was "Free the enslaved people of the world from the domination of international Judaism."

"However, the opening of the Congress took place under an unfavorable star. One group, which represented the racial anti-Semitic attitude and which confessed openly the necessity of "propaganda for action," was composed of the German delegation, of whom Theodor Fritsch was one of the loudest leaders, the Hungarians, the Roumanians, represented by Prof. Cuza, and the Austrian National Socialists, represented by Hattermeier and Haubenberg.

"The Austrian Schager group, recognized the racial anti-Semitism, but its leaders, Baron Schager, Dr. Wolff and State Secretary Teufel, protested sharply against a resolution introduced by the German Voelkische to initiate a movement of pogroms. Another group, in which the Latin element had the upper hand, fought the racial theory in a categorical manner. To this group the most prominent representatives belonged. Monsignor Benigni, delegate of Italy, Abbe Dupperon, as delegate of France, two delegates of the Czech Christian Peoples Party and, in a certain sense, also the representatives of the Russian monarchists, Dr. Nemirovitch Datschenko. Dr. Datschenko frequently voted for the proposals of the German delegation. The Latin group was charged with being Jesuits and "servants of the Jews."

"The congress was threatening to collapse at the first sessions were it not for the intervention of the Hungarian delegate, Goemboes, and Consul General De Pottere.

"The definite results of the congress were:

1. The creation of a Bureau of the Anti-Semitic International, with headquarters in Vienna. Representatives of Germany, France, Austria and of the Russian emigres are to be sent annually to this bureau. Two seats are to be

"Dearborn Independent" Objects to Jewish Participation in Sesqui-Centennial

An anti-Semitic attack on the ground that among the concessionaires at the Philadelphia Sesqui-Centennial Exhibition are a number of Jews, is made by the "Dearborn Independent" in an article entitled "Jews Grab Sesqui-Centennial Plums."

Referring to some unpleasant developments in connection with the arrangements for the Sesqui-Centennial the paper dwells on the recent reorganization of the committee in charge of the concessions and observes:

"The committee remained in office only a short time, but its members performed one great public service. They made public the following list of concessions granted by Abrahams."

Which statement is followed by the names of 62 firms and individuals, 22 of whom are apparently Jews.

Further the "Dearborn Independent" writes:

"The Sesqui idea was launched by John Wanamaker many years before his death, and initial steps were taken early in 1920. Since then administrations have been changed as a whole at least three times, and virtually all the original promoters are out.

"All are out except Albert M. Greenfield, the largest real estate speculator in Philadelphia, who is chairman of the Finance Committee, the Mastbaums and the Gimbels and other patriotic Americans."

Sir Joynson-Hicks' Apologia

While it was not necessary, writes the London "Jewish Chronicle" (April 2), for Sir Joynson-Hicks, British Home Secretary, to repudiate, in the recent interview given to Mr. Meer Grossman, the notion that he is influenced by anti-Semitic bias in dealing with aliens, "he has notoriously failed to recognize in any practical form how the Aliens legislation in England affects Jews with especial hardship, because of their world position."

JOINT DISTRIBUTION COMMITTEE MAY APPEAL TO NON-JEWS IF AMERICAN JEWRY DOES NOT RESPOND, BROWN TELLS COMMITTEE

Describes Tragic Meeting of J. D. C.; Urges Immediate Action for Relief Before Any Other Movement; Outlines Program of Action to Accelerate Campaign

A new call to American Jewry to take immediate steps to make available a large sum to be sent abroad for relief in Central and Eastern Europe was issued yesterday by David A. Brown, National Chairman of the United Jewish Campaign. In a letter to the National Committee of the United Jewish Campaign, Mr. Brown stated:

"In view of the situation of the Jews of Eastern Europe, as it reveals itself to me in the great mass of cables, letters and petitions which pour into this office daily, I feel it to be my solemn duty to say to you and to the Jews of America that the effort we are making to raise a minimum of \$15,000,000 for the relief of the suffering millions who look to us as their last hope, is and must be the only and sole activity of the Jews of this country until the entire sum has been raised.

"With all of the solemnity and sincerity of one who is facing the truth, I say to you that this campaign transcends in importance any other movement, any other appeal that is now before the Jews of America for whatever purpose, collectively or locally.

"I am moved further to make this statement because of a meeting held a few days ago by the Joint Distribution Committee. It was a meeting called for the purpose of passing the budget for April, May and June. It was a tragic meeting because there were brought to this meeting, in addition to the reports I have received, reports from hundreds of Jewish communities in Eastern Europe, which indicate that the tragedy of our people has assumed staggering proportions.

Describes J. D. C. Meeting

"I repeat that the meeting of the Joint Distribution Committee, which should have been a merely formal session, was a tragic meeting. This great organization, which only a few years ago stood out before the world as the savior of European Jewry, this organization which has disbursed \$60,000,000 with which it rebuilt the lives of tens and tens of thousands of Jews, who had been stricken by the war; which had rebuilt hundreds of communities; which had re-established hundreds of schools; which had established hundreds of new schools; which had successfully combated epidemics in a score of countries; which had made it possible for thousands of Jewish young men and young women to become self-supporting; which, in short, had kept the soul and the body of Israel alive during the ten terrible years beginning with 1914—saw, now, at this meeting, the whole of that wonderful structure that it erected in Europe crumbling in the face of a terrific economic cyclone.

"And, this Committee, composed of leading bankers, great financiers, lawyers—the outstanding individuals in American Jewry—found itself helpless

in this hour of crisis. This Committee found itself with an empty treasury—yes, with a deficit running over two million dollars. When the meeting was called to order it was brought face to face with its inability to pass the budget. It was brought face to face with its own indebtedness, with the fact that it had already borrowed for relief purposes to the uttermost limit of its resources—and that many members of the Joint Distribution Committee were personally obligated to the extent of personal notes which they had signed when over three months ago the Joint Distribution Committee borrowed a million dollars in order to rush help across the seas. And these men, face to face with the helplessness of the situation, with the inability to carry on, are looking to the Jews of America to quickly replenish their depleted treasury.

"To avert the necessity of appealing to the non-Jews of America—I must ask each of you the very promptest action in order that the largest sum of cash possible may be obtained for this campaign in the very shortest possible time. To do this it will be necessary:

Brown Outlines Program

1. "That immediate steps be taken to organize drives in those communities where no action at all has been taken.

"There are many Jewish communities in America which, so far as this campaign is concerned, have until now been dead. Dead to the cry for help. Dead to the cry of tragedy which has stirred the rest of the world with horror and with sympathy. Rouse these dead communities. Rouse them into living action for the sake of those who cry out loud to the world for a chance to live. Make it your business to list the communities in your State where nothing has been done; where no steps whatever have been taken. List the communities that are dead, go into these communities, galvanize them into action, shame them into action, if need be.

"They must come to life. They must swing into action. If all of the 'dead' communities in the United States—communities that are responding neither to this nor to any other appeal, are aroused, the total that can be rolled up for this campaign would treble the amount of our quota.

2. "That immediate steps be taken in those communities where drives are not under way, and that they be put on as speedily as possible.

"A great deal of time is being lost in organization. While all these preliminary steps are being taken, men, women and children are dying. A little more speed. A little more devotion. A little more sacrifice of comfort on the part of local leaders will speed up drives which, according to present schedules, are not to take place for some time to come. Sephardic Jews In Uruguay Typify Israel's Dispersion

(By Our Montevideo Correspondent, Israeli)

Montevideo, Uruguay, Mar. 25.—The presence of a small community of Sephardic Jews here in Montevideo illustrates again the proverbial dispersion of Israel. Here are a group of Jews who left their homes in far away lands of Asia, Africa and Europe and came to this country to settle and become part of it. They originate from Spain, Syria, Palestine, Egypt, Greece, Morocco, Tunis, Italy, Kurdistan and Crimea.

It is easy to discover the Sephardic Jews for they do not assimilate as easily as the Ashkenazim with their environment, in language, their outward appearance and their customs. One can tell their presence in the so-called "Turkish" and the "Small Quarter" of the city where they have their cafes, restaurants and schools, bearing signs with distinctly Jewish inscriptions. The Sephardim cannot be accused, as the Ashkenazim sometimes are, of trying to hide their Jewish origin. On their schools one can see signs reading "Fanson Israelita," and they display their original Jewish names over their stores and shops. Thus, the names Isaac, Samson, Peretz, Mizrahi, etc., are frequently encountered along the streets where the Sephardim live.

Ninety-five per cent of the Sephardic Jews are merchants who sell chiefly dry goods. Some are engaged in the export and import business, dealing in coffee, etc.

It is a deplorable fact, however, that the cultural level among them is very low, the majority of them not even being able to read the prayers in Hebrew. If one of them reads the Hebrew prayers fluently he is regarded as an accomplished person and called a

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month or more when the need exists now.

3. "In those communities where campaigns are already under way, every effort must be made to secure the largest possible amount of cash at once.

"The pledges that have already been made in those campaigns—bona fide pledges which in due course will be translated into cash—already amount to millions of dollars, and undoubtedly in due course, these millions will come in. But, unfortunately, the Jews of Europe cannot wait. Hunger will not wait. Typhus will not wait. Death will not wait. Hunger, disease and death are threatening the Jews of Europe now. Hunger, disease and death are claiming thousands upon thousands of victims from the Jews of Europe now.

"If our campaign is to be a means of salvation for the lives of the Jews of Eastern Europe, we cannot content ourselves—we dare not content ourselves with pledges, just as we cannot content ourselves with the promise of action in the future. Action and cash are needed now, and the Jews of America must act now," Mr. Brown's letter concluded.

\$1,100,000 SENT TO PALESTINE FOR COLONIZATION WORK SINCE DECEMBER FIRST

Remittances totaling over \$1,100,000 have been sent to Palestine for the extension of Jewish immigration and colonization work since the organization of the United Palestine Appeal December 1st, according to a report made public by Dr. Stephen S. Wise, National Chairman of the Appeal.

This constitutes a new high record of contributions from Jews of America for the upbuilding of Palestine, according to Dr. Wise who said that in response to urgent requests from the Palestine Zionist Executive in Jerusalem, it would be necessary to remit \$500,000 to Palestine during April to meet present needs of the budget so that the flow of immigration from Eastern and Central Europe could be maintained uninterrupted. Of the required April total, \$200,000 has already been forwarded to Palestine.

Philadelphia, Apr. 24.—Leaders in the Philadelphia Jewish community last night announced they would devote their entire time, starting May 2, to raising \$375,000, which is this city's part of the \$3,000,000 fund of the United Palestine Appeal.

Three hundred Jews promised Judge William M. Lewis, chairman of the drive, that they would lay aside their personal business until Philadelphia's quota had been pledged.

CONFERENCE OF SOCIAL WORKERS TO BE HELD IN CLEVELAND IN MAY

The National Conference of Jewish Social Service will hold its annual sessions at Cleveland, May 23 to 26, according to an announcement from the national offices, New York City, by Samuel A. Goldsmith, secretary of the organization.

Attending will be individuals from 210 social service organizations, representing 91 cities in 36 states, and 4 organizations in Canada. Headquarters will be at the Hotel Cleveland.

BREVITIES

Arthur Lehman, of the firm of Lehman Brothers & Co., bankers, has been chosen a member of the Board of Directors of the Merchants' Association of New York, to succeed W. H. Walker, resigned. His term will expire in 1927.

The Union of Orthodox Jewish Congregations of America has established a fresh air fund for vacations for poor children, under strictly Orthodox supervision and kosher dietary laws.

Mrs. Bella Hermonet Schneer, artist; Meyer Levin, artist, playwright and critic, and Emil Armin, artist, were elected directors of the Chicago No-Jury Artists' Society. Armin is the only Jew who held office in that organization before and was re-elected. Mrs. Schneer, who is exhibiting some of her work at the Jewish art exhibit now being held in Chicago, and Levin are the only two new directors named by the society.

Walter A. Rosenfield, of Rock Island, Ill., was elected secretary of the Illinois State Republican convention at its session at Springfield, Ill.

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MRS. SPORBORG NEW PRESIDENT OF JEWISH WOMEN'S COUNCIL

Mrs. William D. Sporborg of Port Chester, N. Y., assumed the presidency of the National Council of Jewish Women, as successor to the late president of the Council, Rose Brenner. Prior to her election at the St. Louis Triennial, as First Vice-President, Mrs. Sporborg was one of the National Directors and President of the New York City Section.

Mrs. Sporborg is president of the New York City Federation of Women's Clubs and is Chairman of the Port Chester Branch of the League of Women Voters.

"chacham." As for religious observance, the community is divided into groups, those who pray on the Sabbath only and those who pray every day in the week; the latter group consisting, of course, of the older element who have preserved their pious spirit from their old homes.

The Sephardim increase rather rapidly and new immigrants are coming in considerable numbers, so that in time their community will grow to large proportions. They still maintain the custom of very early marriages. In a number of cases young brides were imported from their native homes.

But the growth of the community physically is not accompanied by a similar cultural development. The young generation is utterly ignorant of things Jewish as well as of general education, and there are no leaders to direct and inspire the Sephardim.

the same extent," the "Chronicle" points out, "migrate from their native lands, compelled by the persecution there meted out to them, over and above other reasons that impel them in common with their fellow-nationals, to seek the hospitality of some other country. Sir William assures us that he orders the deportation of aliens only in the case of those guilty of some crime. But as a lawyer he must realize how unsatisfactory is such a statement."

As regards the matter of naturalization, the paper remarks:

"It is gratifying to learn from the Home Secretary that Naturalization has of late been far less restricted than it was a little while ago. It is not surprising, having regard to his evident desire to be just and fair to those desirous of becoming British citizens, that he has seen right to modify somewhat the erstwhile rigid and unamenable attitude of his department on the subject."

115,000 PUPILS IN JEWISH SCHOOLS IN SOVIET UNION

Moscow, Apr. 1.—There are at present 115,000 pupils studying at the Jewish schools in the Union of Soviet Republics, it was reported to the All-Russian conference of Jewish teachers which has just been concluded here. Representatives were present from Russia, Ukraine, White Russia, Crimea and the Tartar Republic. According to the reports submitted, the network of Jewish schools in the Soviet Union is growing. At present Russia has 110 schools with 15,000 pupils; the Ukraine 470 schools with 75,000 pupils, and White Russia 170 schools with 25,000 pupils.
