**PASTOR MUENCHMEYER,  
THE ANTI-SEMITIC LEADER,  
FORCED TO LEAVE MINISTRY**

Court Found Him Guilty of Immoral Behavior

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Berlin, May 20.—Pastor Muenchmeyer, leader of a campaign of bigotry in Borkum, the popular German summer resort on the North Sea, was compelled to leave the ministry following a court sensation in Germany where Pastor Muenchmeyer is noted for his anti-Semitic agitation in connection with the Borkum hymn, an anti-Semitic song over which a legal fight developed among various authorities.

The pastor was sued for breach of promise and for fraud. He was found guilty of seducing girls.

**ANTI-SEMITIC INTERNATIONAL  
CONGRESS WILL BE "ARYAN  
CHRISTIAN" DEMONSTRATION**

Copenhagen, May 20.—The anti-Semitic World Congress, called by the Viennese headquarters of the Anti-Semitic International created at the last anti-Semitic conference, will take place in July at Springforbi near Copenhagen.

Delegates from 28 countries are expected to attend.

The Congress is planned as an "Aryan Christian demonstration" for the creation of a united anti-Semitic front.

**SOVIET WZIK ALLOWS  
RELIGIOUS MINISTERING  
TO HOSPITAL PATIENTS**

Moscow, May 20.—Administering to the religious needs of hospital patients was legalized by a decision of the Wzik, the Central Executive Committee of the Communist Party.

The decision of the Wzik declared that if patients who are inmates in the city or government hospitals desire to attend religious services or carry out other religious ceremonies, their relatives are entitled to bring clergymen to the hospital on the condition that the services will be performed in separate rooms and not in the general wards.

**JEWISH POPULATION FAVORS  
PILSUDSKI COUP, OFFICIAL  
REPORT IN WARSAW STATES**

Jewish Commercial Circles in Poland View Situation with Optimism

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Warsaw, May 20.—The attitude of the Jewish political leaders in the Republic of Poland toward Marshal Pilsudski's coup d'etat was outlined in an official report submitted to the Marshal by his aides.

The report, describing the attitude of the various parties toward the events, states that the Jewish population is satisfied with the resignation of Stanislaw Wojciechowski and of the Witos cabinet, because by this they were rid of Stanislaw Grabski, the Minister of Education, who was hated because of his attitude toward the cultural needs of the national minorities, including the Jews, the report states.

The Jewish population would gladly see Jozef Pilsudski at the head of the state if his administration would include men who have an understanding of the cultural and religious needs of the Jewish population.

The Jewish commercial circles view the situation with optimism, particularly because of the stabilization of the Zloty, the report states.

**CAUCASIA MOUNTAIN JEWS  
RUINED BY WAR AND REVOLU-  
TION, CONFERENCE HEARS**

Moscow, May 20.—The first conference of the mountain Jews in Caucasia was opened in Naltchik, Caucasia, on May 16.

The purpose of the conference is to consider the economic and cultural problems of the mountain Jews and also the question of their settling on the land.

Moscow, May 20.—Ninety per cent of the mountain Jews in Caucasia are paupers, according to reports submitted to the conference of Caucasian Jews being held in Naltchik.

The number of the Caucasian Jewish community is, altogether, 10,000. Prior to the war and revolution they were mainly engaged in the tobacco, fruit growing and vineyard industries. Only 40 per cent of the children attend schools, the report states.

**JEWS ELECTED TO SOVIET  
LABOR DEFENSE COUNCIL**

Moscow, May 20.—Messrs. Sokolinnoff, Kamenieff, Frumkin and Scheinman were elected to the new Supreme Council of Labor and Defense in the Union of Socialist Soviet Republics.

The Council is considered one of the highest institutions in Soviet Russia.

**FILDERMAN GOVERNMENT  
CANDIDATE FOR SENATE  
ELECTIONS IN BESSARABIA**

Nicholas Jorga, Anti-Semitic Leader, Threatens Jews

Bucharest, May 20.—Dr. William Filderman, president of the Union of Roumanian Jews, will be the government candidate in Bessarabia for election to the Roumanian Senate, instead of Rabbi Zirelsohn, in accordance with an agreement concluded between the government and the Union.

Professor Nicholas Jorga, anti-Semitic leader, in an article published in the "Namu! Romania" warns Roumanian Jewry against inviting intervention from abroad. Referring to the journeys of Roumanian Jewish leaders to America, he declares that "some time ago it was a mistake, now it is a circumstance which will only aggravate the position of the Jews."

**WESTERN FASHION ADOPTED  
BY ARABS IN PALESTINE**

Replace Fez by Straw Hats with Bands of Islam Colors

Jerusalem, May 20.—Western fashion is beginning to invade the life of the Palestine Moslems. With the arrival of the spring season, young Moslems in Jerusalem are enthusiastically replacing the Turkish fez with straw and felt hats with bands of red, white and green, the Islam colors.

At a meeting in Jerusalem of Moslem notables, it was decided that the fez was not part of the Arab national costume but was introduced by the Turks.

**BERLIN KEHILLAH ELECTIONS  
MAY AFFECT ICA POLICY**

Berlin, May 20.—The result of the new elections to the Berlin Kehillah, where the liberal majority was broken and a greater number of Zionist delegates were elected, may affect the policy of the Jewish Colonization Association (Ica).

According to the provisions of the will of the late Baron de Hirsch, founder of the Ica, the council governing the Jewish Colonization Association is to include representatives from the Berlin Kehillah. With the election of a larger number of Zionist delegates, the possibility arises for the first time that a Zionist may be delegated as the representative of the Kehillah on the Ica council.

**JOLSON, FAMOUS COMEDIAN, RESIGNS FROM WESTCHESTER-BILTMORE COUNTRY CLUB**  
Resignation Is Protest for Discrimination Against Jews

Al Jolson, Broadway comedian, resigned from the aristocratic Westchester-Biltmore Country Club at Rye, N. Y., because of the club's policy of discrimination against Jews, according to a report published yesterday in the "Daily Mirror."

Jolson has long been a member of the club. Ever since his application for membership was accepted he has been welcomed on his occasional visits to the club.

Early this Spring Mr. Jolson invited Harry Richman, a cabaret entertainer, and one of his best friends, to the club. Mr. Richman was introduced to the members of the club. One of them, Richman says, urged him to put in an application for membership.

When the club was formally opened for the season two weeks ago, Mr. Jolson invited Mr. Richman.

"I was given a note from Roy Jackson, manager of the club, requesting me to call him on the telephone as soon as possible. When I called him, Jackson requested me to cease bringing undesirable guests to the club. He meant Harry Richman, he explained, when I asked what he meant.

"I demanded to know what was undesirable about Mr. Richman. Harry is an old friend of mine, one of the finest, cleanest, straightest fellows I have ever known.

"If you want it straight," responded Jackson, "I'll tell you. Mr. Richman is undesirable for the simple reason that he's a Jew." Mr. Jolson is quoted by the "Mirror."

"That flabbergasted me. I asked him if he didn't know that I, too, am a Jew.

"Of course, I know it," Jackson said. "But you are an exception."

"Well, I told him then and there that I was most certainly not an exception. I've always been a Jew and

**CORNERSTONE FOR YIDDISH ART THEATRE IN NEW YORK WILL BE LAID ON SUNDAY**

The cornerstone of the new Yiddish Art Theatre, on Second Avenue and Twelfth Street, New York, will be laid Sunday afternoon at three o'clock, according to an announcement made by Mr. Louis N. Jaffe, who is financing the building which will house the Yiddish Art Theatre Players, headed by Mr. Maurice Schwartz, next season.

Civic leaders and prominent members of the theatrical profession will participate in the exercises. The cornerstone will be laid to the immediate right of the entrance doors, and in it will be placed a plaque of Abraham Goldfaden, father of the Yiddish Drama. A portrait of Peter Stuyvesant will be included in the items to be deposited in the cornerstone, because of the fact that the builder was led to undertake the venture of the Yiddish Art Theatre when he learned that the property was part of the ancient Peter Stuyvesant Estate.

**WILL ERECT MONUMENT TO GOLDFADEN, FOUNDER OF YIDDISH THEATRE**

**Says All Parties in Poland Rejoice at Jewish Support**

The most unfortunate feature of the Jewish situation in Poland is that there is not a single political party that country, neither in the middle class nor in the proletarian groups regard favorably the political and cultural demands of the Jews, we read in "Der Moment," Warsaw Yiddish daily (May 4 issue), in an article by S. Hirshhorn, former member of the Sejm. As an example of this situation Mr. Hirshhorn tells of the party organized some time ago by the radical workers under the name of "Independent Socialists" with the avowed purpose of admitting to its ranks workers of all shades of racial or Socialist opinion, regardless of race, a certain number of Jewish workers joined the organization, we read, and the program of principles and proposals issued by the party spoke favorably of the demands of the national minorities, especially those of the Jews. "But this was merely theory," we read. "In practice, the 'Independents' are beginning to imitate the methods of the Polish Socialist Party, P. P. S. All sorts of ridiculous charges are invented against the Jews and published in their party organ.

"The 'Independents' are as yet small and weak party and would not deserve to be discussed, were it not that their behavior is typical of the general attitude in this country to the Jews. Every party, as soon as it begins to seek support among the Polish masses, tries to promote its ends through anti-Semitic propaganda."

Mr. Hirshhorn challenges the Jewish members of the "Independent Socialist Party," who claim to be loyal Jews, to declare their stand in regard to the anti-Jewish activities of the organization.

**The New Goal**

The increase of Jewish immigration to Palestine which has taken place simultaneously with the decrease of Jewish immigration to the United States owing to the quota laws, is emphasized by Jacob Fishman in the "Jewish Morning Journal."

"The immigration statistics for the last nine months show that only 300 Jews entered this country in this period," Mr. Fishman writes. "This small number will be reduced even further next year when the new quotas based on the census of 1920 will become effective.

"During the same period over 2000 Jews entered Palestine. Who would have believed some ten years ago that Jewish immigration to Palestine would exceed that to America?"

At the first meeting of the newly elected officers of the Federation of Polish Jews in America, Mr. Z. Tygel was elected Executive Director of the Federation.

## UNITED JEWISH CAMPAIGN IN N. Y. NEARS ITS TOTAL AFTER SH'VOOTH APPEAL

Appeals Were Made from Pulpits of  
500 Synagogues and Temples  
in New York

Appeals were made from the pulpit in 500 synagogues and temples of New York at the services of the Sh'vuoth holiday in an effort to raise the \$230,000 still needed to complete the \$6,000,000 New York City quota in the United Jewish campaign, of which a total of \$5,761,000 was reported on Monday night by the workers of the various trade and sectional canvassing divisions.

Additional contributions announced by Acting Chairman David M. Bressler added \$11,000 to the fund, bringing the total up to \$5,772,000. Of this \$6,000 represented a collection following an address by Jonah J. Goldstein, vice-chairman of this campaign, at the opening of Libby's Hotel on Monday evening. The other \$5,000 came from the Bronx section of the drive, of which Albert Goldman, Commissioner of Plant and Structures of New York City, is chairman.

An appeal was made by Rev. Christian F. Reiser, pastor of the Chelsea Methodist Episcopal Church (formerly Broadway Temple) who wrote to Acting Chairman David M. Bressler as follows:

"I approve most heartily of the United Jewish Campaign of New York. It is worthy of warmest support, and should inspire not only Jews but others to sacrificial giving.

"As John well said: 'Whoso hath this world's goods, and seeth his brother in need, and shutteth up his bowels of compassion from him, how dwelleth the love of God in him?'"

"America's prosperity is the product of God's blessing, and none of us can claim independent ownership, but we must use our resources as the stewards of the Great Father of all humanity. The depressing need, the heart-rending suffering, should awaken any human heart with a desire to help. The practical plans and characterful leaders back of the plans should carry confidence and encourage all to give to your movement in a large way. Such whole-hearted giving will develop the individual and enable him to enjoy prosperity, while otherwise he would lose life's real values and find things but wooden to his taste.

"Your movement not only helps genuinely needy folks, but at the same time is building larger citizens who will get more joy out of life."

## WORLD MIGRATION CONGRESS WILL HEAR A REPORT ON PALESTINE IMMIGRATION

Amsterdam International Voices Com-  
plaints of Palestine Jewish Labor  
Federation

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

London, May 17.—The question of Palestine is dealt with in the report submitted to the World Migration Congress to be held here on June 22.

The report, which is entitled "World Migration and Labor," was drawn up by Mr. John W. Brown, the Secretary of the International Federation of Trades Unions.

The statistics of immigration into Palestine since 1920, he reports, are as follows: 1920, 4,111; 1921, 8,517; 1922, 9,286; 1923, 9,769 or 7,991; and 1924, 17,372, making a total for the five years of nearly 50,000, of whom about 18,650 were unmarried, and over 21,000 dependents. The Jewish population of Palestine, which was about 55,000 in November, 1918, is now about 108,000.

The countries whence the immigrants come are very numerous, but the chief sources of supply are Russia and Poland. The Soviet Government gave no permits for leaving Russia before the end of 1923, therefore Russian Jews came in illegally from other countries, being reckoned with those of these countries. For 1924, the respective proportions were: Poland, 6,670; Russia, 3,112; other countries, 7,560. It has now become more difficult for Jews to leave Russia. The present immigration to Palestine is said to be about 3,500 Jews per month. The immigration into Palestine during the first nine months of 1925 was 27,604. Only those Jews may leave Russia who are expelled for their membership of the Zionist or Zionist-Socialist Labor Party. The Polish immigration rose considerably on account of the difficult economic and political situation of Jews in Poland. In general, there has been during 1925 a large increase of family immigration, especially from Poland, the report states.

Immigrant Jewish workers know before entering Palestine that in all probability they will be unable to find work in their own trades; for the great demand of the country is for land-workers and building workers, and comparatively few Jews are engaged in these trades in other countries. A very large percentage there-

## SPECIAL FUND OF \$50,000 TO RELIEVE PALESTINE UNEMPLOYMENT VOTED

U. P. A. Leaders Striving to Make  
Good Reduction of Income from  
European Countries

A special remittance of \$50,000 to the Palestine Zionist Executive was voted by the Finance Committee of the United Palestine Appeal, Emanuel Neumann, National Secretary of the Appeal, announced yesterday.

The special appropriation, which has already been remitted to Palestine, is in addition to the regular monthly commitment of the United Palestine Appeal and is to be utilized for the purpose of relieving unemployment in Palestine through loans to municipalities and cooperative labor groups for the construction of public and private works in cities and colonies. It is estimated that these loans will help considerably to reduce the unemployment which, according to cables that have recently come from Palestine, has been caused by the rainy season and by a reduction in the number of immigrants of independent means. Both these causes have led to a curtailment of the building industry in Tel Aviv and other cities.

The special appropriation of \$50,000 which has just been announced, is the second extra appropriation made by the United Palestine Appeal to the Palestine Zionist Executive. The first, the sum of \$100,000, was made last April in response to a special request from the Palestine Zionist Executive, a large part of whose income has been stopped as a result of the serious economic situation in Eastern Europe.

The United Palestine Appeal is now making an effort to cash in the pledges that have been made in order that the work of immigration and colonization may proceed without interruption.

## LIPSKY SAILS FOR LONDON; TO ATTEND EXEC. MEETING

Louis Lipsky, chairman of the Zionist Organization of America, sailed on the Mauretania for London.

Mr. Lipsky will attend the meeting of the Zionist Executive in London which will last three days. He will immediately return to New York. The meeting of the Executive will prepare the agenda for the forthcoming meeting of the Zionist Actions Committee.

## HAKOAH WINS DISTINCTION IN VIENNA BOXING MATCH

fore, give up their own, even skilled, trades in order to do unskilled manual work. Only within the last three years are arrangements being made for workers' organizations to send over thousands of experienced workers in the constructional trades and in farm-work. Clothing workers, in particular, who are very numerous among the Jewish communities in other countries, are often compelled either to train for other skilled work or to do unskilled work.

The report outlines the new immigration Ordinance issued in June, 1925. The general Federation of Jewish Labor (in Palestine) it states, complains that in this legislation the Jews are treated as foreigners in disregard of the Balfour Declaration. It also points out that Jews in Poland and Roumania give up their citizenship of those countries to come to Palestine, and then even after long training for the new occupations which they will have to adopt in Palestine and after having obtained a visa, they are liable to be refused admittance. This is a very serious hardship, which ought not to be inflicted: for the immigrant often borrows money for his journey, and has perhaps, spent years of his life in preparing for it. Various other complaints are made by the General Federation of Jewish Labor concerning the working of the Immigration Act. On account of these grievances, the Zionist Organization passed a resolution at its congress of 1925. It is declared that the Mandate for Palestine expressly stipulates for the facilitation of Jewish immigration by the Mandatory authorities, and that the earlier Jewish immigration had with infinite effort laid the foundations for the establishment of a Jewish National Home in Palestine. But the present law is in contradiction to the provisions of the Mandate, so that the Congress demanded its repeal. The General Federation of Jewish Labor therefore calls upon British comrades and comrades in the International by their influence to secure the abolition of the law.

The Council of the General Federation of Jewish Labor expected a strong immigration from Russia and called upon all organizations to promote this Russian immigration. There should be an increase in the quota allotted to Russia: Russia should receive half the quota given to the He'Chalutz.

The Jewish population of Palestine has more than doubled in five years, and is growing at the rate of 30%. It is showing great activity in many fields, partly as a result of the vast resources placed at its command by outside Jews, partly as the result of the policy of good will towards the Arabs, partly to become the most important industrial centre in the Middle East. If a good harbor is constructed, Palestine will also become a centre of commercial activity. The Jewish agricultural colonies are expected to be-

**600 KILLED DURING FRENCH BOMBARDMENT OF DAMASCUS**  
**French Statesmen Favor Withdrawal from Syria**

London, May 20.—Six hundred persons were killed during the bombardment of the Midan quarter of Damascus on May 11, according to a cable report from Damascus to the London "Daily Express."

Among those killed, 500 were civilians, including many women and children. Three hundred houses were destroyed during the French attack which lasted 15 hours. One hundred and ten rebels succeeded in escaping.

London, May 20.—The withdrawal of the French troops from Syria is advocated by Aristede Briand and Paul Painleve, according to reports from Paris to the "Daily Herald."

Briand and Painleve favor the removal of Syria from the category of mandated territories, the report states.

**WORK ON THREE BUILDINGS AT HEBREW UNIVERSITY TO BEGIN DURING JUNE**  
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Jerusalem, May 20.—The erection of three large buildings at the Hebrew University, which was dedicated on April 1, 1925, will be begun on Mount Scopus during the month of June.

The buildings on which the work will commence are the Hebrew National Library, for which a fund was donated by Mr. David Wolfsohn, the Einstein Institute of Physics and Mathematics, for which Mr. Philip Wartenburg of New York donated a fund, and the Institute for Jewish Studies, the building to be erected in memory of Mr. Sol Rosenbloom of Pittsburgh, Pa., with a fund created by his widow. The total cost of the three buildings will be \$700,000.

The budget of the Hebrew University for the current year amounts to £3,430.

**JEWISH COMMUNAL ACTIVITIES**

How charity has given way to social service, which is now making room for welfare work, is told in the annual report of the Henry Street Settlement and its Visiting Nurse Service. The report, written by Miss Lillian D. Wald, President, was made public Sunday.

"Looking back over the years, it is evident that the standards of living, the comprehension of the needs of children have marched ahead and this may be said despite the devastating effects of the World War," Miss Wald's report stated.

A special report of the Visiting Nurse Service, which covers three boroughs, Manhattan, Bronx and Richmond, showed that in 1925 it ministered through its staff of 25 persons to approximately 50,000 individual patients, to whom were paid \$46,810 visits, and the nurses gave 10,567 hours at clinic and cared for an attendance there of 18,330 patients.

Mr. and Mrs. Max Blumberg were honored Sunday night at the Brooklyn Jewish Centre for their philanthropy in giving away several hundred thousand dollars in the last few years, not only to their own faith, to the needy, but to all unfortunates who came to their notice. The dinner at the Jewish Centre, on Eastern Parkway, was attended by 550 persons.

Jacob Rosen was Chairman; Rabbi Maxwell L. Sacks, toastmaster. Among the speakers were Justice Mitchell May, of the Supreme Court; Grover M. Moskowitz, Judge of the United States District Court; Rabbi Israel H. Levinthal, Joseph Barondess and Rabbi Aaron D. Burack.

The conservative congregation of Daytona Beach, Florida, dedicated its new synagogue, which was erected at a cost of \$40,000. Rabbi T. Ravitch is rabbi of the congregation. Mr. Harry Pepper is president.
