aggregating eighteen months or more. An alien who, after the enactment of the deportation bill violates or conspires to violate narcotic and white slave laws.

An alien who is found practicing prostitution or is an inmate of or connected with the management of a house of prostitution or who receives shares in or derives benefit from any part of the earnings of any prostitute or who manages or is employed by, in or in connection with any house of prostitution or music or dance hall or other place of amusement or resort habitually frequented by prostitutes or where prostitutes gather, or who in any way assists any prostitute or protects or promises to protect from arrest any prostitute, or who imports or attempts to import any person for the purpose of prostitution or for any other immoral purpose or who enters for any such purpose; at any time after entry.

An alien who willfully conceals or harbors, attempts to conceal or harbor or aids, assists or abets any other person to conceal or harbor any alien li-able to deportation, if the Secretary of Labor after hearing finds that he is an undesirable resident of the States; at any time after entry.

An alien who willfully aids or assists in any way any alien unlawfully to enter the United States at any time after entry.

The bill was passed on Monday, June 7. under suspension of the rules, whereby amendments are prohibited and debate limited to forty minutes. Congressman Bergen, in his speech, declared that under the bill it would be possible to deport aliens who had been convicted abroad of political offenses and thus, for example, men imprisoned for opposition to the Fascisti regime or communism in Russia or participation in the British strike, would be subject to deportation since the bill makes no distinction between political prisoners and and LaGuardia also spoke against the

#### CULTURAL AUTONOMY FOR JEWS IN POLAND DEMANDED BY BLOC OF LEFT PARTIES

Demand Is Feature in Program for National Minorities

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Warsaw, June 11.—Improving the political situation of the national minorities in the Republic of Poland is one of the features in the program of the bloc of left groups in the Polish Sejm, according to a number of resolutions adopted by the bloc today.

At a meeting of the left groups bloc the following resolutions were adopted: 1. To demand the immediate dissolution of both houses:

2. To urge the government to grant, within the borders of the Polish Republic, a territorial autonomy for the White Russians and the Ukrainians;

3. To urge the government to grant to the Iews and Germans cultural autonomy under which the Jewish population in Poland would be in a position to regulate by its own elected representatives the religious, educational and cultural questions.

#### WORLD CONGRESS OF JEWISH MUSICIANS WILL BE HELD IN PALESTINE (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Jerusalem, June 11.—A concert hall will be rected in Tel Aviv through the efforts of Palestinian Jewish musicians as a commemoration of the twenty-fifth anniversary of the musical work of the composer Engel. The site for the proposed hall was donated by the Tel Aviv municipality.

A world congress of Jewish musicians is planned to take place in Jerusalem during Passover of 1927. Frominent musicians from various European countries and America have announced their intention of participating in the Congress.

# ROUMANIAN PREMIER PROMISES TO FIGHT ANTI-SEMITIC PARTIES

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency Mail Service)

Czernowitz, May 30 .-- General Averescu, the Premier, speaking at an election meeting here at which Dr. Joseph Bierer and Dr. Meyer Ebner spoke on behalf of the Jews, declared:

"My hand will never be extended towards those groups which include in their programme the incitement of peoples one against the other and the fostering of hatred and enmity. Against groups and parties of this kind I know of only one method-war to the end. If there is anyone who loves a certain religious community, class or nation more than another, he can show his affection by stimulating that country's share in the cultural or economic activity of the country, but under no circumstances can it be permitted that it should be made the basis of acts of violence.

Dr. Ebner in his speech said that as a citizen and a Jew he welcomed General Averescu's Government. "The lews still retain happy memories of his previous Government. Under your Government," he said, "there were no excesses against the Jews, no Cuzist agitations, no official anti-Semitism. and no secret support of the movement against the Jews. God grant that there may be a new epoch of peace and friendship opening for all the peoples of this country."

Bucharest, May 25.-The Minister of the Interior, M. Octavian Goga, in an interview with the representative here of the "New York Times," replying to the question of what measures the Government had taken to put down the anti-Semitic agitation in the country, said:

"The anti-Semitic movement has never assumed in Roumania those dimensions which have been reported returned quietly to their studies.

#### DEPORTATION BILL Bili Passed Under Suspension of Rules (Tewish Daily Bulletin)

Washington, June 11.-The deporta-tion bill passed by the House and now referred to Senate where early action is expected provides for the time limit and offense for deportation of aliens as follows:

An alien who entered the United States at any time or place other than as designated by immigration officials, or who eluded examination or inspection or who obtained entry by a false or misleading representation at any time after entry, unless the entry was

before July 1, 1924 in which case at any time within three years after entry. An alien who at the time of entry was a member of one or more of the classes excluded by law from admission to the United States, such as anarchists, at any

An alien who remains in the United States for a longer time than authorized by law or regulations made under authority of law, at any time after entry unless the entry was before July 1, 1924, in which case, at any time within three years after entry.

time within five years after entry.

An alien who, at any time within seven years after entry, is a public charge from causes not affirmatively shown to have arisen subsequent to entry, at any time after entry.

An alien who at any time within seven vears after entry from causes not affirmatively shown to have arisen subsequent to entry is an idiot, imbecile, feeble minded person, epileptic, insane person, person of constitutional psychopathic inferiority or person with chronic alcoholism, at any time after entry.

An alien who is convicted of any offense committed after the enactment of the Deportation Act of 1926 and within ten years after entry, for which he is sentenced to imprisonment for a term of one year or more at any time after entry, but not after the expiration of three years after the termination of the imprisonment. The three important changes effected by this provision are the extension of the five year time limitation to a ten year limitation for a single offense, the substitution for test of moral turpitude, the test of a sentence to imprisonment for a term of one year or more and the elimination of the provision for a recommendattion of non-deportation by the court or judge sentencing such alien.

An alien who has been convicted of a second felony; without any time limitation except that the deportation proceedings must be begun within three years after the termination of the imprisonment.

# Upton Sinclair Explains His Charges, Against the Jews

The charge made recently by Upton Sinclair, noted American novelist and Socialist, that the Jews have "commercialized sensuality in art" and that through the medium of the stage and the movies they exert a corrupting in-fluence, which has aroused resentment in Jewish circles, is explained by him in a letter to the editor of the "Jewish Tribune," which appears in the June II issue of that paper.

Mr. Sinclair made his charge in a contribution to the "Yudenhass-Eim Anthologie" (Jew Hatred-A Symposum) a German book published in Viénna.

In his present explanation to the Jewish Tribune," Mr. Sinclair de-"Jewish clares: "I cited the Jewish racial defects as

I conceived them, and I went on to cite the Jewish racial virtues as I conceived them.

"I thought that I could render a service to all Jews by trying to think of the reasons given to me by Americans for disliking Jews, and I stated these rea-

"One of the most prominent reasons is because members of the Jewish race are giving us a great deal of commercialized sensuality in art. Mr. Hurwitz asks for 'scientific data' on the subject of the Jewish sexual instinct. My answer is that he can get the data in question by attending Broadway shows put on by Z (here he mentions a Jewish play producer), and Hollywood moving pictures put on by Y (here he mentions a Jewish film producer)-to name but two where I might name a score. Decent Americans loathe these produc-tions, and they blame the Jewish race. I think that the Jewish race has a remedy at hand; they do not have to rest under the disgrace which these black sheep' of the Jews put upon them. They can reprobate and ostracize these persons, and they can make it plain that the decent Jewish people are as much in revolt against commercialized sensuality as are the American people. think that an American friend of the Jews is rendering them a service when he points out the facts in this matter. I will not need to point out how many times in Jewish history the people took to worshipping sensual gods, and how prophets arose who were not mealy-mouthed, but who looked the facts in the face, and laid about them with a vigorous lash. I think we need a Jewish prophet right now on Broadway. and we need another one in Hollywood!"

### APPOINT JEWISH SCIENTIST ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR AT POST GRADUATE COLLEGE

Work of Dr. Morris Levine in Practical Otology Attracts Attention

An appointment of considerable interest to Jewish and non-Jewish physicians in the United States was made by the New York Post Graduate Medical School and Hospital, one of the largest medical colleges in the United States, several days ago.

Dr. Morris Levine was appointed associate professor of the Otological Department of the New York Post Gradnate College.

Dr. Levine, who is the author of a book, "Practical Otology," which is to be published shortly, has been associated with the New York Post Graduate C. ege, being also one of the head

geons in the Post Graduate Hospital. Attention was focused on the work of Dr. Levine due to the great populaity of his lectures to post graduates at the College, consisting of physicians from all parts of the country. It was because of this interest in his lectures that he was induced to publish them in book form. Dr. Levine is considered an authority on eye, ear, nose and throat diseases. He is the first Jewish physician to be appointed associate proiessor in the Otological Department of the College.

Dr. Levine, who was born in Vilna, was brought to this country when he was six years old. He made his way through college, having won a scholar-ship for Cornell University. Later he studied at the Long Island Medical

Dr. Levine, who is the son-in-law of the late Rabbi Abraham Eber Hirschowitz, is an observant Jew and a devoted Zionist. # OUR DAILY NEWS LETTER

London, June 1 .- To those who are familiar with the important role played by Jews in British politics, as exemplified only recently by the successful termination of Lord Reading's term as Vicerov of India and Sir Herbert Samnel's mediation of the general strike, it may be a surprise to be told that there are only a handful of lews in the House of Lords—the Marquis of Reading, Lord Rothschild, Lord Swaythling, Lord Michelham, Lord Bearsted, Lord Jessel-and only about a dozen in the House of Commons.

One of the Jews on the front Government bench is Mr. A. M. Samuel, who hails from Norwich, and it is interesting to note that it was Mr. Robert Grant, then member from Norwich, who in 1830 originally moved for leave to bring in a Bill to allow British-born Jews to enjoy all the rights of the British subject without having to profess the religion of the State. It was on this motion that Macaulay delivered his maiden speech-a powerful plea for emancipation.

Lord Bearsted is now the first Vis-count of Maidstone. That was one of the first constituencies ever contested by a Jew and he-Mr. David Salomons -made history. Although unsuccessful at Maidstone, he was elected for Greenwich in 1851-for although a professing member of his faith could not then sit in the House of Commons, there was nothing to prevent the electorate from selecting him. He presented himself at the table in order to take the oath, but he declined to pronounce the then obli-gatory words, "On the true faith of a Christian." He was ordered to with-dray, and he obeyed—but only temporarily. The circumstances were interesting.

Major Astor, the giant member for Dover in 1924, voted in a division without taking the oath, thereby forfeiting his seat-there was a by-election-and rendering himself liable for a penalty Well, Mr. David Salomons did wittingly what Major Astor did unwit-

tingly. A fellow member of the House asked the Government whether they would sue him for the penalties provided by the Act if Mr. Salomons took his seat without taking the oath. Lord John Russell replied in the negative. So Mr. Salo-mons, to the general disconcertment, calmly walked into the House and sat There was an uproar. What was to be done with this quiet and respectable gentleman, who claimed to be where he was at the bidding of his constituents? Matters were complicated by the fact

that probably a majority of the House of Commons thought the restriction ridiculous, and on many occasions had so decided. It was the House of Lords that always imposed a blank negative to the wishes in this matter of the Lower House. All that could be done was to debate the matter, and on the

Eventually the Speaker ordered Mr. Salomons to withdraw. Mr. Salomons in effect answered politely that they had better throw him out-and this theoretically they did. But Mr. Salomons had virtually won his battle and emancipation was carried shortly afterwards.

Even before Mr. Salomons began his battle the City of Lendon had began electing Rothschilds to the House of Commons, and their connection with that assembly had only recently been

Similarly, the Disraeli connection was broken only when Mr. Coningsby Dis-raeli ceased to be a member in 1906. This nephew of the great Benjamin—he is a son of Mr. Ralph Disraeli, who was clerk of the House of Commons-still lives in the family manor of Hughen-

With no Rothschilds and no Disraelis in the House of Commons we must look to what is virtually a younger parlia-mentary generation of Jews. Sir Philip Sassoon does, however, continue the tradition of his father, who represented the same constituency-Hythe.

Major Brunel Cohen's name has been prominent during the past week in connection with the meetings of the British Legion, of which he is honorary treasurer. He is a nephew of Sir Herbert Samuel. In the House of Commons he specializes in putting forward the case of the ex-service men, and always speaks from a sitting position—he had the misfortune to lose both his legs in the war-from the corner seat by the
