## HUNGARIAN GOVERNMENT DRAFTS BILL TO SUPPRESS ALL SECRET SOCIETIES

Measure to Include Anti-Semitic  
Organizations

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Budapest, June 15.—A bill to suppress secret societies in Hungary has been drafted by the government, it was learned here today.

In January, following the discovery of the counterfeiting plot, the government issued an order suspending the activities of all secret societies. The societies, however, including the Awakening Magyars and all anti-Semitic and terrorist organizations, did not heed the government's order.

## NOVELIST'S WILL REQUESTS TO PUBLISH JEWISH STORIES

Moscow, June 15.—The last request of Andrey Sobol, the Russian Jewish novelist who committed suicide here last week, was that his Jewish stories be collected and issued in a separate volume, according to the novelist's will filed here.

Sobol stated in his will that he desired the volume to be issued under the title "Evrei" (Jews).

The Myssowedow Street in Odessa will be renamed Sholom Aleichem Street, in memory of the late Yiddish humorist, according to a decision of the Odessa municipality.

## FRENCH RABBIS MEET IN ANNUAL CONFERENCE

Paris, June 15.—The annual conference of the Association of French Rabbis opened here today.

The conference will formulate the attitude of the French rabbis toward the Keshills and toward the question of accepting into the Jewish faith apostates who desire to return to the fold. The agenda also includes the question of foreign Jews resident in France.

On the eve of the opening of the conference a banquet was given in celebration of the seventieth birthday of Dr. Israel Levi, Grand Rabbi of France.

## NEW CENSUS OF NATIONAL MINORITIES IN UKRAINE

Moscow, June 15.—A new census of the occupations of the national minorities in the Ukraine was decided upon by the Ukrainian Central Executive Committee of the Communist Party.

The census will aim at establishing the number of workers belonging to the national minorities, including the Jews. It will also gather data concerning their participation in the large industries, the smaller industries and in the crafts.

## SWARTHMORE COLLEGE SENDS EXPEDITION TO TEST EINSTEIN THEORY

Position of Stars To Be Determined  
In Sumatra

(Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Philadelphia, June 15.—An expedition whose purpose is to prove whether or not the Einstein theory is true, will depart in a few days from Singapore for a place in Sumatra called Benkoela. The expedition is headed by Professor K. W. Marriott of Swarthmore College, in a suburb of this city.

Upon a certain night next month, when the stars that were photographed by the same expedition during the total eclipse last January, will be in the same relative positions as they were then, the astronomer will take photographs that are expected to solve a great problem for the scientific world.

"If the photographs to be taken by Professor Marriott shall show the stars in the same positions as they are in the photographs taken last January," said Professor John Miller, director of the Sproul Observatory at Swarthmore, "the Einstein theory will be proved false.

"If the stars shall be shown to be apparently elsewhere in the firmament than they are shown in January's photographs, the truth of Einstein's theory will not be definitely proved, but it will have advanced measurably toward verification."

## LEBANON JEWS COOPERATE WITH NEW GOVERNMENT

Beirut, June 15.—A delegation representing the Jewish community in Lebanon, headed by the chief rabbi, called on Charles Debihas, newly elected president of the Lebanon.

The delegation assured the new president that the Jewish population will work for the welfare of the country. The president stated that he intends to accept Jews into the government service, just as members of any other community.

The new Syrian ministry, which is composed of the moderate elements, includes Ouassek Moyad, Minister of Interior, Shakhik Mouyassar, Minister of Public Works; Abdulkader Azim, Minister of Finance and Saker Hanbali, Minister of Education.

## PALESTINE IMMIGRATION DIRECTOR GOES TO MOSCOW

Warsaw, June 15.—Albert Hyamson, Immigration Director of the Palestine Government, arrived here today on his way to Moscow.

It is probable that during his stay in Moscow Mr. Hyamson will take up the question of immigration of Russian Jews to Palestine.

## AUSTRIAN ANTI-SEMITISM NOT VIOLENT, MGR. SEIPEL, FORMER CHANCELLOR, SAYS

Delegate to Eucharistic Congress  
Gives His View on Jewish Situation

That anti-Semitism in Austria has never assumed violent proportions was the contention of Mgr. Ignaz K. Seipel, ex-chancellor of the Austrian Republic, who arrived in New York on his way to the Eucharistic Congress in Chicago, in an interview with the representative of the "Jewish Daily Bulletin."

"The Christlich Soziale party," of which Mgr. Seipel is the leader, and the pan-Germans are the two anti-Semitic parties in Austria. Our anti-Semitism is directed against the Jew who does not wish to be known as such rather than the Jew who admits he is a Jew. In fact, we were glad when the Jews elected their own representative, Engineer Stricker, to the Austrian parliament. However, in the last election, many of the Jewish votes were cast for the Socialist deputies, Jews who are on the opposition benches in Parliament. Seeing the Jewish vote go to the Socialists does not, naturally, create a favorable impression in our party," he declared.

Asked whether it was not true that the Jewish citizens of Austria find themselves during the elections, "between the devil and the deep sea," being unable to vote for parties which openly declare their animosity to the Jewish population, Mr. Seipel admitted that this is the fact.

## CHAIM SALOMON MEMORIAL PLANNED IN PHILADELPHIA

Robert Morris' Note Given Salomon  
Found in Philadelphia

(Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Philadelphia, June 15.—A movement to erect a statue to Chaim Salomon, Jewish banker who helped finance the American Revolution, is being discussed in this city as a consequence of the preparations being made for the unveiling here on Friday of a statue of Robert Morris, Revolutionary War financier, who obtained a great deal of his funds from Salomon.

Salomon died in this city in 1788 at the age of 45, after he had given in excess of \$650,000 to Morris to aid the stricken colonies. At least \$400,000 of the sum never was repaid.

In connection with the proposal to erect a statue to Salomon a Philadelphia has revealed one of the few existing notes that were passed in the Morris-Salomon transactions. Many of the notes given to Salomon by Morris were unsecured, and many vouchers were lost in the destruction of records by the British when they invaded Philadelphia in 1777. Affairs were further complicated by the bankruptcy of Morris.

Few records of the transactions are extant, but Richard L. Bunker, of this city, is the possessor of a note that proves Salomon's career was not legendary. This note is for \$100,000, "thirty-two hundred \$700, negotiated through a French bank and signed with Morris's signature. It has never been honored, and of redeemed value, would bring with the accumulated interest a sum running well into six figures. It is yellow with age, and torn in a few places but the writing is legible.

Among other partners whom Salomon associated financially were Madison Jefferson, Lee, Sturges, Mifflin, St. Clair, Blood, Jones, Monroe, and Wilson, all of whom are mentioned as being indebted to the Jewish patriot, in a Senate report on the case submitted in 1865 by the Committee on Revolutionary Claims.

## FRENCH PRESS COMMENTS ON PETLURA ASSASSINATION

Paris, May 27.—The French Press devotes much space to the assassination of Petlura by Sholom Schwartzbard.

The "Petit Journal" publishes an interview with the Soviet Embassy here who told its representative that the time when Petlura was in power was also a period of terrible pogroms against the Jews.

The "Tribune," the Ukrainian paper here which Petlura edited, states that it is not true that Petlura was responsible for the pogroms. If there were ever anti-Semitic reports in the papers, it says, they were directed only against Jewish Bolsheviks and not against Jews as such.

Millerand's organ "L'Avenir" writes that the murder is a mysterious one and will be difficult to unravel. The question, it says, is whether the guilty man will be punished. We know the juries of the Seine Tribunal, the paper states.

"L'Humanite" condemns the murder as an act of individual terror but, it continues, it shows how strong is the thirst for vengeance among those who suffered from the acts of the terrorists of the Russian counter-revolution.

The press in general expresses itself in sympathetic terms regarding Schwartzbard, speaking of him as a brave man who fought with distinction under the French flag during the war.

The Yiddish daily here the "Hajnt" writes: "Only a naive, nervous young man could have imagined that a revolver shot could wipe out the rivers of blood which flowed in the Ukraine, would take vengeance for the lives of the hundreds of thousands of Jews who were tortured to death. If we Jews were to take vengeance on all those who in late years have poured out Jewish blood in streams, such assassinations would be daily occurrences.

"Our vengeance is a higher kind. An example was recently given us by Sholom Ash who told us of a Jew, the only one left of a whole town wiped out in the Ukraine, going about with a little girl, the child of the Araman who had fled, and making care of her. That is an example of Jewish vengeance."

Courtesy Judge Abraham L. Novak and Supreme Court Justice August L. L. were the principal speakers. The ceremonies were conducted by Rabbi S. Lein Horowitz.

Dr. Louis Finkelstein of the faculty of the Jewish Theological Seminary of America delivered the dedication address.

The privilege of holding the four parts of the "chuppah" in the ceremony was sold to four persons each of whom contributed \$25.

## DIGEST OF PUBLIC OPINION ON JEWISH MATTERS

### Explains Position of Liberal Judaism in England

The position of Reform Judaism in England was stated in an interview published in the London "Sunday Express," by Rabbi Israel Mattuck, rabbi of the Liberal Synagogue of London. Rabbi Mattuck's statement was in reply to the charge made on a number of occasions recently by Chief Rabbi Dr. Hertz that Liberal Judaism, which he described as "dry rationalism—in-reverent and disintegrating," will lead eventually "out of Judaism, and, ultimately, into Christianity."

Dr. Herz had also charged specifically that Liberal Judaism aims: To abolish the Rite of the Covenant and the Feast of the Passover; To substitute the Christian Sunday for the Jewish Sabbath; To abolish to all intents and purposes the Feast of Tabernacles; To abolish (in one instance) Yom Kippur, the Day of Atonement, and, in other instances, to cease to fast on that day.

"Orthodox Judaism," Rabbi Mattuck declared to the "Sunday Express" representative, "accepts the Biblical and rabbinic laws as having been divinely revealed, and therefore permanently authoritative.

"We, on the other hand, hold that revelation is progressive, and that all that the past has handed down to us in ideas and practices should be judged only in the light of present knowledge.

"We do not maintain all the old Jewish customs and observances. We are indifferent to the dietary laws. Our followers eat what they please. We do not regard the Bible as being true in all details.

"We stand for the religious future of the Jew who has emancipated himself from the Ghetto and is taking his place in the world today."

### The Jews in Japan

The Jewish settlements in Japan have participated in the rebuilding of their communities, which were recently demolished by the earthquake. We learn from an article by N. Ben Menachem, appearing in the current American Jewish press.

"Quite recently there has been a new appearance in the life of the Russian Jews in Japan: their emigration from one Japanese province to another. We read: 'In connection with the rebuilding of the demolished towns a revival has started of the Jewish community in Yokohama. There are also a couple of score of Jewish families in Tokyo. These two cities are being rapidly rebuilt.

"In the northern islands of Japan there are a number of preserves for the Jews and a few of the Jews owning them are Jewish.

"The Jewish settlement in Nagasaki has almost completely vanished. Emigration to Australia, the Philippine Islands and the British and Dutch Indies

# NEW YORK FEDERATION BUSINESS MEN'S COUNCIL REORGANIZED AT LUNCHEON

Percy S. Straus Elected President at  
Pennsylvania Hotel Meeting

Percy S. Straus was elected President of the Business Men's Council of the Federation for the Support of Jewish Philanthropic Societies, at a reorganization luncheon meeting at Hotel Pennsylvania, attended by more than five hundred representatives of 134 trades and professions. Speakers included Mayor James J. Walker, Sol M. Strock, President of the Federation, Solomon Lowenstein, Executive Director, and William Goldman, Chairman of the Executive Committee of the Council.

Mayor Walker, in the principal address, lauded those present for extending their civic interest beyond their own commercial affairs and congratulated the Federation on its extensive philanthropic program.

Other officers elected include Vice-President Frederick Brown, Arthur Lehman and Felix M. Warburg; Treasurer, Dudley D. Sicher; Associate Treasurer, Isaac Liberman; Secretary, Ralph E. Samuel; Ex-Officio, Solomon Lowenstein and B. M. C. Director, Joseph Willen. The directors elected include Messrs. Oscar Abel, David A. Ansbacher, Eli Bernheim, Z. D. Bernstein, Herman W. Mr. Solomon Lowenstein, executive director of the Federation, described the reorganization plan which will govern the Business Men's Council hereafter. The new plan provides that membership in the money-raising branch of the Federation be limited to those elected to the council and acknowledging formal acceptance of their choice.

Supervision of the Business Men's Council will be vested in the board of directors of forty-three members, selected this year from the councillors primarily and from among others added by the Board of Directors. In future years, the board will be elected by the membership.

# CHANGE SYSTEM OF ISSUING RE-ENTRY PERMITS TO ALIENS

New Procedure Announced by Immigration Commissioner Hull

Washington, D. C., June 15.—A new system of issuing permits has been evolved by the Bureau of Immigration, Department of Labor, which, according to a statement of the Bureau, has for its purpose the elimination of fraud in the re-entry into the United States of resident aliens traveling abroad.

The alien will be required to apply in person for identification, at an immigration office, instead of having the permit mailed to him on request, as has been the practice. Steps will also be taken to make the permit certificates less amenable to forgery.

The new system will be effective from July 1. The statement issued in the form of a general order, signed by Harry E. Hull, commissioner general of immigration, provides that beginning with July 1, 1926, the present practice of mailing return permits direct to applicants will be discontinued, and thereafter such permits when issued will be forwarded to the immigration office designated by the applicant, at which they must be secured in person by the applicant. Return permits issued to aliens, who are to call for them in New York City and San Francisco, will be delivered at the Bargo Office and City Office respectively, instead of at Ellis Island and Angel Island.

Permits are not to be delivered to one member of a family for other members thereof or to agents, unless the officer is personally acquainted with such applicants and can identify the photograph appearing on the permit as being a good likeness of the person for whom intended.

All permits should be indorsed partly on the photograph and partly on the permit by the officer in charge prior to delivery. The bureau's acknowledgment cards, where permits are delivered, will be taken up and destroyed or filed for reference purposes.

Applicants for return permits, who find it necessary to depart prior to the issuance of such permits, are instructed to call upon the officer in charge at the immigration office designated in their application and present the card acknowledging receipt of their application, together with an unmounted photograph, and give the foreign address to which the permits, if issued, should be mailed.

Officers to whom such cards and photographs are presented will indorse upon the reverse of the photograph the number appearing upon the card and the foreign address of the applicant, and forward the photograph to the bureau, the order declared.

Louis J. Block, principal of the Marshall High School of Chicago, will be honored at the commencement exercises of the school on June 23 when an auditorium bearing his name will be dedicated.

# SOUTH AFRICAN JEWS DISPUTE OVER RUSSIAN COLONIZATION WORK

Seceding Members Form Colonization Fund  
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency Mail Service)

Johannesburg, S. Africa, May 12.—A dispute concerning the colonization work feature in the relief of Russian Jews has been going on between the two leading sections of the Jewish community of South Africa.

Members of the South African Jewish Relief Fund, who withdrew when the annual conference held here in March rejected the resolution that the Fund should be devoted to assisting the Jewish colonization movement in Russia, decided at a meeting held in the Doornfontein section of Johannesburg to establish a branch of the Jewish Colonization Fund to assist in settling Jews on the land in Russia.

Mr. E. Rendel said that the first branch of the Jewish Relief Fund, eleven years ago, was established in Doornfontein. He criticized the Jewish Relief Fund Conference and the attitude towards the movement of Russian colonization that, he said, was being taken up by Zionists in this country.

The Chairman, Mr. I. M. Isaacson, said that he could not understand why a certain section of Zionists were opposed to the movement, especially as it would provide a grand training for Chalmutzim, and Russia was a country that provides most of the Jewish emigrants to Palestine.

Dr. W. Sachs spoke against the colonization plan.

A resolution to support the land colonization scheme was adopted, as well as a resolution deciding to form a Doornfontein branch to make monthly collections for this purpose. A committee of twenty was elected, most of whom were formerly members of the Relief Fund.

A donation of £100 from Messrs. Schneier and London was announced.

# SOUTH AFRICAN ZIONISTS RAISE £40,000 FOR PALESTINE

Johannesburg, May 29.—The Keren Hayesod campaign which was opened in Johannesburg, on May 18th, is meeting with success.

Two mass meetings were held in the largest Johannesburg theatres. Justice Greenberg presided and speeches were delivered by Nahum Sokolow and Dr. M. Hinds. A number of prominent persons declared at the meetings that they were officially joining the Zionist movement. Among these is Justice Greenberg, the Acting President of the Jewish Board of Deputies Mr. Raphael, and Sir George Albu, leading gold mine owner.

A banquet was given at which over £15,000 were raised.

The total raised in the general campaign up to the present is over £40,000. The campaign has set itself the task of raising a sum of £100,000.

Eighty-six Jewish students were among the 374 members of the graduating class who received degrees at the Fordham University School of Law yesterday.

# HUNGARY IS PLEDGED TO MODIFY NUMERUS CLAUSUS LAW, LUCIEN WOLF STATES

London, June 2.—A report on the intervention of the Joint Foreign Committee before the Council of the League of Nations against the Hungarian Numerus Clausus Law was issued here today by Mr. Lucien Wolf, Secretary of the Committee.

The final result of the intervention, the report stated, is that Hungary finds herself pledged to bring the numerus clausus Law into harmony with the Treaty of Trianon under pain of a decision by the League on the validity of the Law, the nature of which on that account has all along been most strenuously resisted by the Hungarian Government. The Jewish community loses nothing by the substitution of this decision for the reference to the Permanent Court which was originally asked for by the Joint Foreign Committee and the Alliance could not have done more than declare Clause 3 of the Law invalid, and even then action upon this decision could not have been more rapid than that which is likely to follow the present judgment of the Council. Moreover, the conciliatory form in which the Council has rendered its decision can only help the Hungarian Government to escape from a difficult position with dignity and without any undue excitement of popular passion. For this reason, as well as on account of the substance of the judgment the Joint Foreign Committee has good reason to be satisfied.

The Joint Foreign Committee will nevertheless continue to watch the case and will take such action as may be necessary to ensure the early amendment of the "Numerus Clausus" Law in the sense of the judgment of the Council of the League, the secretary's report stated.

## JEWISH COMMUNAL ACTIVITIES

# JEWISH COLONIZATION CONFERENCE IS HELD IN THE ARGENTINE

Buenos Aires, May 3.—The position of Jewish Agricultural Colonization in the Argentine was discussed at a conference of delegates from a number of Jewish colonies held this week at Dominguez.

There were sixteen delegates present from nine colonies, the members of the Executive of the Agrarian Federation, for the approval of whose Statutes the Conference was primarily convoked, and a big body of the general public.

Mr. Isaac Caplan, who was elected President, said in his opening address that the colonization work in the Argentine was striking root. They had present at the Conference the sons and the grandsons of colonists. It was at the same time a fact that their colonies were being cut down instead of being extended. There were colonies which were suspended in the air. If they attached importance to the colonization in Palestine, Russia and other places, they had to care, too, for the colonization in the Argentine.

After the opening address, the Conference honored the memory of the late Leon Chasnovitsch, lauded as a devoted friend of the agricultural colonization movement and of the Jewish land workers.

The report of the Executive Committee stated that the work had in certain of the colonies been conducted under favorable circumstances. But it had not been recognized by the Jewish Colonization Association (Ica). A resolution was adopted protesting against the Ica for refusing to receive the Executive Committee.

After a debate on the position of the colonies, especially of the colony of Montefiore, it was decided that the Council of the Federation should consider the position with the Ica and try to find a way out of the present difficulties.

## BREVITIES

Resolutions on the deaths by fire of Dr. Aaron Ember, his wife and son were adopted at a meeting of the Baltimore Zionist District Board. Dr. Ember was professor of Egyptology at the Johns Hopkins University. Their names are to be inscribed in the Golden Book of the Jewish National Fund. The resolution states that the Embers perished "that science and posterity might be served," and that they have "enhanced the heritage and glory that is Israel's."

The will of Meyer London, Socialist leader, who was killed in an automobile accident on June 6, was filed for probate, leaving an estate of \$4,000 equally to his wife, Mrs. Anna London, and his daughter, Miss Isabel M. London.

The size of the estate caused some surprise in view of Mr. London's supposedly wide law practice, but it was explained by his brother, Horace London, who was associated with him for fifteen years.

"He had been accustomed to contributing a large part of his income to the Socialist Party, to charity and to various socialist enterprises," said Mr. London. "Although he had a large law practice, much of the work was done for nothing and his income was not as large as was generally supposed."

The house of Mrs. Cornelius Vanderbilt, at Fifth Avenue and Fifty-Seventh Street, New York, was purchased by Frederick Brown, real estate operator. The property is valued at \$7,000,000.

# AUSTRIAN ANTI-SEMITISM NOT VIOLENT, MGR. SEIPER, FORMER CHANCELLOR, SAYS

tria is influenced by proximity of Hungary with its numerus clausus and other violent anti-Semitic tendencies. But the Austrian population is peaceful and except for occasional noise, there is nothing serious in the anti-Semitic movement in Austria.

"We are sympathetic toward the Zionist movement and its attempt to restore the Jewish state in Palestine. We hope that as the Zionists succeed and, as soon as a Jewish state will actually come into being, the Jewish question will find that solution and clarification which is in the interest of everybody. This does not mean that we would like all Jews to go to Palestine, but, just as many Germans and Austrians live in the United States and other countries as citizens of those countries, so will the Jews, after the Jewish state is established in Palestine be able to live as citizens of other states," Mgr. Seiper declared.

"I was very pleased to learn that Dr. Koerner and his Hakoah had such great success in America. The Jews lately are achieving much in the field of sports," Mgr. Seiper concluded.
