JEWISH DEPUTIES URGE POLISH GOVERNMENT TO EFFECT JEWISH EQUALITY

Present Measures To Prime Minister
For Restoring Jewish Rights
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Warsaw, June 16.—Measures to restore equal citizenship rights to Polish Jews, as guaranteed to them by the provisions of the Polish constitution, were presented by the Club of Jewish Deputies to Prime Minister Bartel at a conference today.

The president of the Club, in conference with the Prime Minister, urged the government to take measures to meet the economic and cultural demands of the Jewish population and to see to it that in the practice of the government machinery in the Republic of Poland, the use of the Czaristic "Kromye Yevreyev" (except Jews) principle be eliminated.

The Prime Minister was said to be in favor of the measures proposed by the Jewish deputies.

DELPHINER REOPENS SILK FACTORY IN TEL-AVIV

Tel Aviv, June 16.—The Delphiner silk factory, the closing of which recently attracted wide attention and criticism against the Palestine administration for its tariff policy, will be reopened.

Max Delphiner, Viennese silk manufacturer, informed his representative here of his decision to reopen.

The Palestine government recently promulgated a new law exempting cotton, wool and silk yarns from import duty.

The promulgation of this law was welcomed by manufacturers as it is expected to result in an improvement of the position of the textile industry in the country.

FRITSCH SENT TO PRISON FOR INSULTING JEWISH RELIGION

Berlin, June 16.—Theodor Fritsch, leader of the German anti-Semites, against whom a libel suit brought by Max Warburg of Hamburg is pending, was sentenced to one month's imprisonment.

The sentence was imposed upon Herr Fritsch for publishing insults to the Jewish religion.

WARSAW KEHILLAH COUNCIL WITNESSES STORMY SCENES

Warsaw, June 16.—Yesterday's meeting of the Council of the Warsaw Kehillah, the first democratic body elected on the basis of greater participation in the elections, ended in turmoil and disorder. The disturbance was caused by the delegates of the labor parties, Bund and Poale Zion, and the people's party, Voelkspartei.

NEWS OF SCHWARTZBARD TRIAL WILL BE RELEASED BY COUNSEL THROUGH J.T.A.

Film Re-enacting Petlura Pogroms in
Ukraine Completed
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Paris, June 16.—Information concerning the proceedings in the trial of Sholom Schwartzbard for the assassination of Semion Petlura, will be issued by Henri Torres, Schwartzbard's counsel for defense, through the Jewish Telegraphic Agency, M. Torres stated today.

He complained that many conflicting and inaccurate stories concerning the life and activities of Schwartzbard were published in certain European and American newspapers, which might prove harmful.

Riga, June 16.—A moving picture depicting the fights between the Bolsheviks and the Petlura forces in the Ukraine has been completed by the scenario writer, Lipschitz.

The film was based on historic documents and statements of those who participated on both sides of the struggle. The scenes were enacted in the actual places where the pogroms occurred. Petlura, Tituniuk and other leaders of pogrom bands are pictured in the film.

SIR HERBERT SAMUEL TO PRESENT JERUSALEM SYNAGOGUE WITH HOLY SCROLLS

Jerusalem, June 16.—A Sefer Torah, the Holy Scrolls, will be presented to the Yeshurun Synagogue of Jerusalem by Sir Herbert Samuel, former British High Commissioner of Palestine.

Sir Herbert informed the synagogue board of his intention in a letter received here today.

Professor Albert Einstein expressed his hope of revisiting Palestine in a communication to the Palestine Teachers' Federation.

In sending them his portrait Professor Einstein writes that he hopes soon to join them as a member of the faculty of the Hebrew University.

MESOPOTAMIAN JEWS ARE EMIGRATING TO PALESTINE

Bagdad, June 16.—Emigration of Mesopotamian Jews to Palestine is increasing, according to figures made known here.

The movement to emigrate to Palestine is particularly strong among the wealthy Jewish families of Iraq, who are selling off their property. Last week ten families left for Palestine.

A plague is raging in Bagdad where 37 cases were reported during last week.

JEWISH SCHOLAR'S WORK ON SEMITIC ORIGIN OF EGYPTIAN MAY BE SAVED

Dr. Aaron Ember Died in Attempt to
Rescue Record for Science
(Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Baltimore, June 16.—The life work of Dr. Aaron Ember, noted Johns Hopkins University Egyptologist, in which he proved the Semitic origin of the Egyptian language, thus repudiating the assertion of philologists dividing the languages into Semitic and Aryan, may yet be available.

Dr. Ember's vain attempt to rescue his research records caused the death of himself, his wife and six year old son and a maid when fire destroyed his home in the early morning of May 31.

Dr. Ember had planned to issue the book in four volumes, the first to come out next year. Parts of the manuscript and notes have been recovered from the ruins. Dr. F. R. Blake, newly appointed head of Baltimore City College, who worked with Dr. Ember in some of his researches, said:

"While I have not gone into the matter thoroughly enough to speak positively, I think it may be found that the four volumes may be built up from the remaining manuscript and notes," Dr. Blake said.

Only the centre of the pages of part of the first volume of manuscript remained, he said.

JEWS SHOULD LEARN ENGLISH PATIENCE, WEIZMANN SAYS

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Berlin, June 16.—That Jews acquire the virtue of patience in the same degree as exercised by the English in dealing with the resettlement of Palestine was the advice given by Dr. Chaim Weizmann, president of the World Zionist Organization, in an address delivered last night at a huge reception given in his honor at the Philharmonic Hall.

"We must learn from the English the virtue of patience and continue to live peacefully with the Palestine Arabs, as well as with the neighboring countries. Only the pressure of work will extend small Palestine into Transjordan and Syria," Dr. Weizmann declared.

BUKOWINA ANTI-SEMITES BOMB JEWISH HOUSES

Bucharest, June 16.—Anti-Jewish excesses occurred last night in the town of Arbora, Bukovina. The excesses were perpetrated by the followers of the Cuza party.

Bombs and hand grenades were thrown at houses in the Jewish quarter. Several houses were demolished. A number of Jewish residents were injured.

**JEWS ARE BEST PUPILS,
FIGURES IN TORONTO
SCHOOL SURVEY SHOW**
(Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Toronto, Can., June 16.—"In intelligence the Jewish boys surpass the non-Jewish boys, while the non-Jewish girls surpass the Jewish girls," according to Inspector P. E. Munro of Toronto public school inspectorial staff, who was awarded the Ph. D. degree at the university on his thesis "An Experimental Investigation of the Mentality of the Jew in Ryerson Public School."

Inspector Munro was for some years a principal at Ryerson and had opportunities to study the Jewish pupils. In making the tests, 505 Jewish children and 130 non-Jewish were studied. "Taken as racial groups, the Jews are slightly superior," he declared, in his thesis.

"In spelling ability the Jews are superior to the non-Jews in all age groups, and in all grades except the seventh. Both Jews and non-Jews are, on the whole, below the Ontario standard, but above the United States standard."

**I. O. B. S. REFLECTS KRAUS
AS ORDER'S GRAND MASTER**

Atlantic City, N. J., June 16.—Solomon C. Kraus of Philadelphia was re-elected Grand Master of the Independent Order B'nai Sholem at the close of the twenty-first annual convention of the Order here.

Martin O. Levy of Philadelphia was re-elected Grand Secretary. Other officers elected were Adolph Rosenblum, Philadelphia, assistant secretary and Jacob Edelstein, Philadelphia, treasurer.

The Texas Zionist Association met in Houston for their twentieth annual convention. Over one hundred delegates attended. An increased interest in Zionism was reported from the various districts.

Rabbi Morris N. Taxon of Dallas, was elected president. The convention next year will meet in Waco.

**JEW IN POLISH TOWN
ENDANGERED AS FALSE
ACCUSATION SPREADS**

**Destruction of Cross By Vandals
Causes Trouble; Police Check
Excesses**

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Warsaw, June 16.—What is termed in Poland "anti-Jewish excesses" occurred in the town Ryki, district of Warsaw, last night.

The trouble began when the Christian population learned that a wooden cross erected on the outskirts of the town was demolished by unknown vandals. Immediately the accusation was spread that Jews were the perpetrators. At midnight panic prevailed among the Jewish population of the town when various persons started out on an anti-Jewish "crusade", breaking the windows in all Jewish houses, invading the homes and threatening the lives of the inhabitants. Many Jewish residents were beaten, many being seriously injured.

The police took energetic measures to put an end to the excesses, despatches received here state.

**BROWN INVITES LEADERS TO
SURVEY WORK IN EUROPE**

**BERLIN JEWISH COMMUNAL
ELECTIONS MAY BE ANNULLED**

Berlin, May 28.—Eight protests against the validity of the recent elections to the Berlin Jewish community have been lodged with the police headquarters here, according to a report in the "Juedisch-liberale Zeitung" here. The paper is of the opinion that the elections will in consequence be annulled.

Among the protestors are the Election Committees of the Jewish Liberal Party and the Federation of National German Jews.

**United Kingdom Gets One-Seventh of
Its Oranges From Palestine**

Jerusalem, June 16.—One seventh of all the oranges imported into the United Kingdom come from Palestine, according to a report of the Imperial Economic Committee issued here.

Of every seventy oranges imported, ten come from Palestine, the Committee's report states.

Henri Torres—Sholom Schwartzbard's Lawyer

A description of Henri Torres, the noted Paris lawyer who has undertaken the defense of Sholom Schwartzbard, is given by the Paris correspondent of the "Day," N. Franck, who, writing in that paper of June 16, observes among other things:

"Torres is a Jew from Algeria. Politically he belongs to the left-Socialist party. He is a mixture of the Orient and European culture—a Semite and a European in one. The several great trials which he conducted recently have put him in the very front rank of great lawyers. Those who saw him at the trial of the anarchists will not forget him so soon.

"A speech by Torres is like a poetic creation. His chief weapon is temperament. He is also a keen psychologist, and he feels himself at home among the twists and intricacies of law.

"Torres' greatness," we are told further, "consists in his ability to relate his client to the cycle of all mankind and to prove that the action of the accused was a result of the social-economic conditions or the moral environment. He always blames society and absolves the individual or extenuates his guilt."

**Polish Anti-Semitic Organ Blames
Pilsudski Coup on Jews and
"Manchester Guardian"**

The charge that the Jews, the Masons and the "Manchester Guardian" are responsible, among others, for the recent Pilsudski coup and the new regime in Poland, is made by the "Dwa Groznie," the Polish anti-Semitic organ of Warsaw.

Asking who is pleased with the Pilsudski coup, the paper answers: "the 'Manchester Guardian,' the 'Masonic Jewish' organ, which, since Poland has again become independent, has been at the head of the anti-Polish press abroad and has been describing Poland as a land of pogroms, of persecution and oppression of the national minorities. The Germans are satisfied, and the Communists rejoice. In short, all our enemies, the Jews, the Masons, the Germans, the Communists, are now hoping for Poland's ruin."

Seventy-nine years after its inception, Congregation Adath Israel of Cincinnati, Ohio, will place the corner stone of its new synagogue next Sunday. The new synagogue, when complete, will cost \$400,000.

At the cornerstone exercises Mayor Seasongood will deliver an address. The principal address will be by Dr. C. H. Kauvar, of Denver, Colorado.

Samuel Rosenberg is president of the Congregation, and Louis Weiland, secretary.

The congregation was organized in 1847.

**ENGLISH ZIONISTS DISCUSS
POLITICAL ISSUES AT
ANNUAL CONFERENCE**
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency Mail Service)

London, June 8.—Resolutions on the political situation in Palestine were adopted by the conference of the English Zionist Federation held in Leeds.

The conference adopted a resolution expressing satisfaction with Dr. Weizmann's statement expressing the view that His Majesty's Government "desires faithfully to discharge its obligations as the spirit of the Mandate."

The conference, appreciating the endeavour of His Majesty's Government, the resolution states, "to give effect to the spirit as well as the letter of the Palestine Mandate, expresses the earnest hope that His Excellency the High Commissioner for Palestine will take the necessary steps as speedily as possible to accede to the representations of the Jewish Agency in regard to the allocation of State and waste lands for close settlement by Jews, as provided in Article 6 of the Mandate and for adequate grants in aid of the maintenance of Jewish schools in the country."

"The Conference further begs to urge upon the High Commissioner the desirability of putting into effect the Communities Ordinance 1926, in so far as the Jewish population of Palestine is concerned, and to accord to the Vaad Leumi the legal recognition due to it as the elected National Council of Palestine Jews."

"The Conference urges also the necessity of safeguarding the status and the moral prestige of the Jewish people giving them the opportunity to share in defence of the Jewish national home."

"This Conference places upon record its strong disapproval of the action taken by the Agudath Israel in its action against the unity of the Jewish people in relation to Palestine," the resolution reads.

During the debate Mr. Paul Goodman, Chairman of the Political Committee, reported on the Zionist political situation, in the course of which he said: "The mandate remains the fundamental basis not only of the Jewish claims in Palestine but of the whole position of the Mandatory Power in that country. In so far as the Samuel-Churchill White Paper has interpreted the Mandate and modified certain views held by Jews as to their place in Palestine, much will depend on our own development and on the strength of our resources how those interpretations will affect the rights and privileges of the Jews guaranteed under the Mandate. It is finally just to remember that the League of Nations, which is the final arbiter of the destinies of Palestine, only recognizes its Mandate to Great Britain as the authority on the lines of which the country is to be administered."

"Yet, it is only too painfully obvious to all who are conversant with the local administration that not all officials realize the fundamental basis on which the government of Palestine has to be carried on."

Mr. Goodman spoke of the relations between the Jews and the Arabs of Palestine, saying that Zionists can recog-

**Canada Jewry Prepares for Arrival of
350 of the Stranded Jewish Refugees**

(By Our Montreal Correspondent,

Montreal, June 10.—A number of the Jewish refugees, who have been stranded in various ports in Europe and elsewhere for some years now, will soon find a haven in Canada. The Jewish Immigration Society here, which several years ago brought over some five hundred Ukrainian refugees and settled them in this country, is making arrangements to bring over three hundred more of these unfortunate wanderers.

According to the immigration laws in force here at the present time, three categories of immigrants are admissible: farm laborers, domestic servants and near relatives, i.e., parents, wives and children under eighteen years of age. The Jewish Immigration Society, however, is entitled yearly to certain concessions, which permit of the entry of a limited number of other, more distant relatives, such as brothers, nephews and nieces. Three thousand Jewish immigrants are admissible during 1926 under the terms of this concession. Moreover, the government has granted permission for the entrance each year of 300 to 350 refugees, even if they have no resident relatives in Canada, on condition that their status as refugees will be vouched for by the United Evacuation Committee of Paris.

Thus, the chief problem confronting the Jewish Immigration Society is the bringing over and settlement of the group of refugees admissible under the terms of the agreement with the government, for the other immigrants, coming to relatives already settled here, will be taken care of by their kin.

Arrangements are being made, with the promise of a number of foreign Jewish organizations to contribute part of the expense that will be required. A united committee is being formed here, on which there will be representatives of the Ica and the Jewish Immigration Society, who will be in charge of the arriving refugees, the first group of whom are expected to reach Canada a few weeks from now.

**DISCOVERIES NEAR KISH
PROVE ORIGIN OF CIVILIZATION WAS IN MESOPOTAMIA**
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

London, June 16.—The great historical importance of the discoveries made at Jemdet Nasr, seventeen miles north-east of Kish, Mesopotamia, where fine polychrome pottery and pictographic tablets were found, was emphasized by Professor Langdon in a lecture before the Royal Society of Arts on the discoveries of Herbert Weld and the Field Museum expedition in Mesopotamia.

Professor Langdon rejected the recent attempts to derive the origin of the civilizations in Sumer, Elam and Egypt from Northern Syria and Anatolia. The painted ware and seals of the later area, he said, appear to be more than 2,000 years later than similar ceramic and glyptic designs of Sumer and Elam. The latest date for the magnificent polychrome thick ware of Jemdet Nasr is 3500 before the Christian era, and the preceding period of thin ware now known to have been manufactured in Sumer must go back to 4000 before the Christian era or earlier.

The lecturer maintained that the painted ware and the animal motif of decoration on seals and button seals originated in lower Mesopotamia and were borrowed by Elam. All the evidence to be drawn from the revolutionary discoveries of the expedition tended to prove, he declared, that the Sumerian people, an Armenoid race, arrived in Mesopotamia before 4000 before the Christian era, and founded their city. They owed nothing whatsoever to any contemporary culture, he said. None existed at that time in Western Asia. A similar contemporary culture in Syria cannot be proven, said Professor Langdon, and arguments for its existence are fallacious.

**PALESTINE MORTGAGE BONDS
SAFE, OHIO BANKER STATES**
(Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Cleveland, O., June 16.—The safety of Palestine mortgage investments was emphasized by Solomon Umer, well known mortgage banker of this city, speaking at a luncheon given at the Hotel Hotel yesterday, in honor of Judge Bernard A. Rosenblatt of New York, president of the Palestine Securities, Inc.

Mr. Umer, who subscribed \$5,000 of the mortgage bonds of the company stated in his address:

"I am absolutely convinced of the safety of these first mortgage bonds of Palestine. I am talking now not merely as one who sympathizes with the work done in Palestine but as a man who understands mortgages and who has a reputation to sustain on recommendations for investments."

"I have examined the underlying security behind these mortgage bonds and am convinced they are gilt edged and as safe as the best first mortgage bonds in Ohio. It is for that reason I now subscribe for \$5,000 of these mortgage bonds and I am willing to act as chairman of the committee that shall sponsor these mortgage bonds investments in Ohio."

of Palestine and Transjordan, but did not think that the Mandatory would for the present consent to a reversion to the original administrative unity of the whole of Palestine. East as well as West of the Jordan.

It was also not likely that they would be able to form a Jewish Legion for the protection of the Jewish national home, as was advocated not only by the Revisionists but also, in view of recent events in Palestine by a part of the Jews in Palestine.

"We must admit," Mr. Goodman declared, "that there is good ground for the contention of the Revisionists that the Land Problem in Palestine calls for urgent representation. There are moral as well as political reasons why Zionists are not in favour of displacing Arabs from the lands cultivated by them, and the complaints of Arab agitators to the contrary have been recognized to be without foundation. But it is altogether a different matter when Article 6 of the Mandate—which provides that the British Administration shall facilitate the close settlement by Jews on the land, including State lands and waste lands not required for public purposes—has, for political purposes, so far remained a dead letter."

Mr. Sol. Goldberg criticised Sir Herbert Samuel for his policy of yielding to the Arabs during his period of office in Palestine, and the Zionist Executive for not pressing their demands more strongly.

Mr. Morris Myer, editor of the London Yiddish Daily, "Der Zeit," said that he thought Mr. Goodman had given too much attention to the Zionist Revisionists. He was opposed to the Revisionists because their program was impracticable. It was built on illusions and therefore could only lead to difficulties in the attempt to carry it into effect, he said. The Zionists in drawing up their political program had to take into consideration not only what they wanted but also what it was possible to get.

Dr. Eder said that it was not true that the Zionist Executive had neglected to press the demand for the allocation of the State lands. Unfortunately they had not obtained the lands, but that was not the fault of the Zionist Executive, he said.
