"MVESTIA" REVEALS HENRY FORD'S CONNECTION WITH PUSSIAN MONARCHISTS

Agent Provocateur Was Hired to Sup-ply "Documents"; Brasol Acted as Ford's Representative

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Moscow, Aug. 12.-New sensational

revelations concerning Henry Ford's mest in Europe were made here by the "Isvestia," the official organ of the Soviet Government.

The revelations were made in connection with the affair of the agent provocateur Druszelowsky, who is now being tried in Moscow on a charge of fabricating anti-Soviet documents, intancating anti-Soviet documents, in-duding the famous "Zinoviev letter," because of which the Ramsay McDon-ald Labor Government in England fell.

The Isvestia states that Druszelowsky confessed that when he was arrested last year in Berlin he was visited in prison by Boris Brasol, well-known anti-Semitic monarchist Russian leader, who imported the infamous falsification, The Protocols of the Elders of Zion. into the United States, and who was in dose relations with Henry Ford's "Dearborn Independent." Druszelowsky stated that Brasol asked him in behalf of Henry Ford to "provide" documents which would clear the Russian monarchists from the charge of being guilty of anti-Jewish pogroms. Druszelowsky agreed to deliver such "documents," which would show that the pogrom charge against the Russian monarchists

SOCIETY TO PROMOTE JEWISH-ARAB PEACE IS FORMED IN PALESTINE (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Jerusalem, Aug. 12.—A new society called "The Peace Covenant" (B'rith Shalom) has been formed here, with the object of arriving at an understanding between Jews and Arabs as to the form of their mutual social relations in Palestine on the basis of absolute political equality of two culturally autonomous peoples, and to determine the lines of their cooperation for the development of the country.

Towards this end, the statutes of the Society state, the Association will promote the study of the problems arising out of the existence of the two peoples in Palestine, and out of the Man-date under the League of Nations; the spreading of verbal and written information among the Jews and Arabs on the history and culture of both peoples, and the encouragement of friend-ly relations between them; the creation of a public opinion favorable to a mutual understanding and the creation of institutions calculated to advance these ends.

Branches of the Society may be established throughout Palestine and also abroad.

PERMANENT MANDATES COMMISSION ISSUES REPORT ON PALESTINE SITUATION

Is Hopeful of Better Prospects for Jewish National Home: Approves Policy of Mandatory Power; Replies to Petitions of Arab Executive, Agudath Israel and Palestine Jewish National Council; Gives No Satisfaction to Jewish Demands

(Tewish Telegraphic Agency)

Geneva, Aug. 12.—An optimistic view and particularly for the establishment of the present situation in Palestine and the prospect of the future develop-ment of the Jewish National Home there, as well as agreement with the present policy of the Mandatory Pow-er, was expressed by the report of the Permanent Mandates Commission of the League of Nations.

The report, which expresses the opinion of the Commission following its examination of the various reports concerning Palestine at its last session in June, deals with the report of the British Government as the Mandatory Power, the report of the Zionist World Organization as the Jewish Agency and with the petitions of the Palestine Arab Executive, the Orthodox Jewish World Organization Agudath Israel, and of the delegation of the vaad Leum, the National Council of Palestine Jews. Agrees with Mandatory's Policy

The report dealing with the memor-

andum of the British Government maintains a general tone of agreement with the policy of the Mandatory Power, "which is doing its best in a difficult situation." Although the Jews are justified in demanding the support provided for by the Palestine Mandate, the Mandatory Power is acting wisely in its endeavor to avoid serious conflicts between the two sections of the population, the report observes. The Permanent Mandates Commission notes with satisfaction that political unrest in Palestine is decreasing, that order has been observed, and it is confident that the Mandatory Power is capable of preventing, by local forces, any trouble which would constitute a menace to any part of the population. The Permanent Mandates Commission follows with interest the measures to develop the electrical system and to encourage local autonomy. The Commission also trusts that every effort will be made to hasten the completion of the land survey, which is important for the general development of Palestine

ANTI-SEMITIC INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE IN OCTOBER

It is obvious, how-ever, that for the first time the Palestine-Arab Executive is not in total opposition to the Palestine Mandate. It merely complains of the alleged nonapplication of a part of the Mandate. Palacios states in his report.

In adopting the report of M. Pala-

cios, the Permanent Mandate Commis-sion expresses the hope that Jewish immigration to Palestine will be regulated in proportion to the country's power of absorption on land.

JEWS IN BESSARABIA RETURNING TO NORMAL CONDITIONS, J.D.C. HEARS

Disbanding Famine Relief Committee Marks First Beneficial Result of American Jewry's Assistance

David A. Brown, chairman of the \$25,000,000 United Jewish Campaign, today made public a cable from Dr. today made public a cane from Eller di-Bernhard Kahn, European relief di-rector of the Joint Distribution Com-mittee, confirming the Jewish Tele-graphic Agency despatch a few days ago that the famine relief committee for Bessarabia has been disbanded, and that 300,000 Jews in Bessarabia are now enjoying normal economic conditions there. In his cable, Dr. Kahn pointed to the Bessarabian situation as a "typical example of the good results of the Joint Distribution Committee's work in time of acute distress." Funds con-tributed by American Jews to the United Jewish Campaign, helped to tide the Bessarabian people over until the present harvest time, when good crops brought altered conditions. Less than six months ago, Bessarabia

was one of the horror spots of hungerridden Eastern Europe, due to two years of successive crop failures.

"Bessarabia is a typical example of the good results of the Joint Distribu-tion Committee's work in times of acute distress. Our Kassa (local loan society) work started five years ago, so far investing \$300,000, 80 per cent of which is Joint Distribution Committee money. In addition to this the regular Joint Distribution Committee and Founmoney. dation Kassas gave special relief for food supplies. Twenty-two thousand dollars for further palliative relief was given by the Joint Distribution Com-mittee for famine stricken people. Three hundred thousand Bessarabian Iews were tided over this period by these monies. After expressing deep-est gratitude to the Joint Distribution Committee, the special famine commit-tee announced its disbanding. Because of good crops our normal work will be sufficient.

In making public Dr. Kahn's cable, Mr. Brown said:

"All American Jewry should rejoice at the message that has come from Dr. Kahn. For months we have been pleading with our co-religionists in America, ing with our co-religionists in America, telling them—Thousands of your co-religionists are starving. Your dollars will give them life. The response of America has been an unprecedented flow of sympathy and generosity. Appears of the present more than \$15,000,000 has been raised in this country, and this autumn will, without doubt, see the completion of the \$25,000,000 fund which is required to accomplish the economic reconstruction of European Jewry.

From all the agricultural lands of Eastern Europe we are hearing reports of excellent crops garnered by a thankful people mercifully sustained until the harvest time.
