BUCHAREST DEMONSTRATION OF ANTI-SEMITIC STUDENTS IS DISPERSED BY THE POLICE

Revolt Against Cuza Expected at Jassy Anti-Semitic Congress (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Bucharest, Aug. 20.—An anti-Semitic demonstration of 200 students through the principal streets of Bucharest assumed such threatening proportions yesterday that the police took measures to disperse the crowd. A group of anti-Semitic students attacked Dr. Greenberg, a Jewish physisian of Braila, and beat him with clubs.

While marching through the streets, they gathered numbers. At Roschiori-devede they insulted the Jewish inhabitants. The "Curierul Israelite," Roumanian Jewish newspaper, today criticizes the Roumanian government in connection with the recent attacks on Jews in Roumanian trains. "What has hap-

pened to the circular issued by the

government to the railway officials, in-structing them to prevent disturbances

on the trains?" the paper asks, urging the government to take measures to prevent such disturbances and to punish the guilty ones. Much excitement is evident in Roumanian public opinion in connection with the forthcoming congress of the Cuzists which will be held in Jassy. It is expected that the Congress will witness a revolt against Alexander Cuza. It is stated that although Cuza may remain president of the Christian League, he will have to pledge himself to abandon his rapprochement policy toward the Averescu government and resign his actual leadership to Zelea Codrianu, another of the rabid anti-Semites.

#### ARGENTINE APPOINTS FIRST JEW TO PROFESSORSHIP (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Buenos Aires, Aug. 20.-Dr. Alexander Jabotinsky was appointed profes-

sor in the Dental College of the University of Buenos Aires, by a decree of the Argentine Minister of Education, countersigned by the President of the Republic. Dr. Jabotinsky, who is the first Jew-ish scholar to be appointed to a professorship in an Argentine university,

was associate professor at the university since 1920. He is a specialist in dental surgery. Dr. Jabotinsky is one of the active leaders in Jewish life in the Argentine

and is president of the Jewish aid society, Ezra.

Some objection was raised to his ap-pointment in view of the fact that he is not a native Argentinian. The ap-pointment was made, however, in recognition of his service to science. #### RUSSIAN JEWISH COLONY NAMED FOR DAVID A. BROWN Billikopf Continues Report on Observations in Russia

A farm colony in the Crimea has taken the name of David A. Brown of Detroit, chairman of the United Jewish Campaign, in appreciation of his service to the Jews of Eastern Europe and Russia in organizing and directing the United Jewish Campaign. This was made public today by Joseph C. Hyman, executive secretary of the United Jew-ish Campaign, following receipt of a cable from Jacob Billikopf, director of the Philadelphia Federation of Jewish Charities and impartial chairman of the men's clothing industry, who is touring Russia, as an unofficial investigator of conditions among Jewish agriculturists there.

The colony which now bears his name, was visited by Mr. Brown a year ago, when it had just been started. At that time it contained a single rough dug-out, sheltering a pioneer family; today it has, according to Mr. Billikopf's cable, numerous dwellings, and 350 individuals. "David Brown" is the second farm colony in Russia to bear the name of an American. The other has the name of Julius Rosenwald, of Chicago, who gave \$1,000,000 to the United Jewish Campaign.

In his cable, Mr. Billikopf emphasized In ms cane, air. Billikopi emphasized the fact that the "back to the soil" movement, by which thousands of poverty stricken Jewish city dwellers are being restored to economic independence, has been demonstrated to be highly successful. The colonists are being settled for agricultural pursuits on land made available to them by the Russian government; tools, seeds, advice of agricultural experts, aid and counsel is supplied by the Joint Distribution Committee, and funds to carry on this enterprise raised in America through the \$25,000,000 United Jewish Campaign for relief and reconstruction.

Status of Religious Education in Pales-

That part of the report which deals with Jewish religious education has been received

religious education has been received with especial interest in Jewish circles, for it presents for the first time a comprehensive survey of the number of Jewish religious schools as compared with general Jewish schools, the num-ber of pupils in each category, etc. Jewish religious education in Pales tine falls under two heads: Purely religious education, and mixed religious education, i.e., education by means of learning from the Scriptures and holy tomes without any other form of teaching, except perhaps a small quantity of Hebrew, grammar and arithmetic: and education comprising equal parts of learning from the Scriptures and gen-eral knowledge. The second type of education is almost entirely controlled by the Palestine Zionist Executive, and is under the supervision of the Religious Education Board of the "Mizrachi Association. The Palestine Zionist Fro cutive furnishes the following figures showing that there are 45 schools of this type, with a total of 4,534 pupils. compared with 123 schools with 11,698 of the general knowledge kind under the direction of the Zionist Executive The figures may be apportioned as follows: 12 religious kindergartens with 661, as compared with 57 general kindergartens, with 2,351 infants; 31 religious schools with 3,761 children, as against 55 general schools with 6,952 children. The religious type of education does not obtain at secondary schools with 1,365 students. Of teachers' colleges there is one re-ligious seminary with 87 students, compared with 2 seminaries with 306 students of the general type, and one com-mercial school run by the religious au-thorities, with tuition for 25 students, as against the six general schools with

724 students.
These figures show that religious education obtains widely amongst the public schools sphere, and the Government statistics for 1925 show that these schools number 50 with 4,345 pupils fewish religious for 1925 show that the schools number 50 with a series of the series attended to 1925 compared with 123 general-knowledge schools, having an attendance of 11,698, these being under the control of the Palestine Zionist Executive and private bodies.

The number of mission and religious schools run by non-Jewish bodies is 71, with 5,350 pupils, according to the Government report.

Praises Present Democratic Government's Policy

Paris, Aug. 10.—Oscar Grouzenberg,
well-known Russian Jewish jurist, sum-

well-known Russian Jewish jurist, summarized his impressions of a recent tour of Lithuania, in an interview with the representative of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency here.
"The Lithuanian masses contrary to

"The Lithuanian masses, contrary to the information of some political adventurers, do not know what it is to be intolerant toward the minorities that live side by side with them," Mr. Grou-zenberg stated. "A Jewish physician, attorney, merchant, manufacturer or artisan cannot complain that the Lithuanian Christian population boycotts him. Nor do the Lithuanian intellectuals who, for the most part, originate from the people, deserve, with few exeptions, to be charged with intolerance and national isolation. This is fair, particularly as far as the population that belongs to the peasant workers is concerned. The leaders of this last party: the First Minister of the Government, Mr. Sluzevitch and the President of the Republic, Dr. Grunius, have proven by their lives and activity that the democratic principles are for them an expression of their conscience and not a means of electoral struggle.

"I remember a letter from M. Sluzevitsch which was addressed to me two years ago and in which, in connection was addressed to me two years ago and in which, in connection unfavorable political tendencies of this period, with a youthful faith, he foretold the coming victory of the Lithuanian democracy. His prediction proved true, for he and his comrades have fought energetically for it," Mr. Grouzenberg stated.

M. Sluzevitch and his collaborators are not demagogues and declamers, but men of creative work who are capable of holding power between their hands and to impose power on others.

"I believe it would not be indiscreet on my part, if I quote here some lines of a letter from Mr. Sluzevitch which I have just received. This letter characterizes the noble nature of the President of the present government of Lithuania. The following is what he writes:

"Yes, my warm worthy, and dear sole."

"You, my very worthy and dear colleague who, during your entire life, have fought for a better future of your people and humanity, you understand better than anyone else the joyous sentiments of every Lithuanian democrat who loves his country sincerely and who has given a part of his soul to the fight of the Lithuanian democracy against the clerical reaction. Evidently, each of us is happy every time that a canonic content of the country of a young people which is being born to a new life of independence. Lithuania will be independent only in case that it will be perfectly democratic and if it will be a real mother and not a step mother" to all the nationalities

# ZIONIST EXECUTIVE OUTLINES PROGRAM FOR THIS YEAR; ASKS SUPPORT FOR PLANS (Jewish Telegraphic Agency Mail Service)

London, Aug. 12.—The program of the Zionist Executive for the Palestine rebuilding work this year was outlined in a statement issued by Dr. Weizmann and Nahum Sokolow, for the Executive of the Zionist Organization, and Dr. Leo Motzkin for the Praesidium of the General Council (Actions Committee).

The statement read: "The Zionist Organization, which has taken upon itself the responsibility for rebuilding the Jewish National Home, has adopted a Budget which barely meets the crisis from which Palestine now struggles to emerge. The difficult situation of the past year was not the consequence of insuperable conditions or inherent obstacles either in the land itself or in the quality of the Jewish immigration. It was due to the inadequate returns yielded by the Keren Hayesod and the Keren Kayemeth.

"The task that confronts us is the absorption of at least 30,000 Jewish immigrants a year for the next ten years. Our work in Palestine since the Balfour Declaration was proclaimed proves that the absorption of 30,000 immigrants annually is by no means an exaggerated number. The goal is within our reach if the proper conditions are only cre-ated. There are necessary, first and foremost, land; second, an adequate colonization fund; third, credit facili-ties; and fourth, cultural opportunities and adequate protection of health. "The Actions Committee therefore

appeals to all Jews to supply the Zionist Organization with a budget of two million pounds for 1926-1927, to be utilized for land purchase and agricultural settlement, for immigration and labor, for education and health, and for the establishment of the necessary credits in industry and commerce; and it furthermore calls upon all those interested in building the Jewish National Home to mobilize their energies in the direction of assembling reserves of private capital for investment purposes under public control.

The two million pounds which Jewry is urged to out at the disposal of the Zionist Organization should be expended in the following way: Land £500,000; Agricultural Settlements and Labor, £500,000; Credits, Industrial and Commercial, £300,000; Engineering Enterprises, £100,000: Health and Hospital Buildings, £200,000; Education and School Buildings, £150,000; Religious Work, £50,000; Building Operations, £100,000; Contingent and Administrat-

ive, £100,000.
"This represents the urgent task of the Zionist Organization for the coming year. During the last few years the dormant conscience of Jewry has, to a certain extent, been aroused. Everywhere Jews are beginning to support the funds that are to make Palestine the Jewish National Home. We stand, however, only on the very threshold of the national redemption. More conwe have yet seen. All our forces must be stimulated and mobilized. No Jew may withdraw himself from the duty of contributing to the work of rehabilita-

Mexico is described as follows: "The old Jewish population in Mexconducted. Hospital though meagerly

ico consists of some five thousand persons. Many of them have been caught in the stream of assimilation. If they or their children have not become completely mixed with the Christian ma-jority they have nevertheless been greatly estranged from Judaism. The lewish question which arose in Mexico during the last few years (since the arrival of the Jewish refugees) has brought many of the old Jewish residents to realize their Jewish origin and to regain in a measure their Jewish nationalism and a large number have responded warmly when called upon to give to Jewish causes.

In view of the fact that Jewish na-tionalism and Zionism are not looked upon as religious movements, the Mexican government, we are told, is very friendly to these activities.

"Since the Jews," we read further, constitute such a small part of the population the new law regarding religion will not affect them much.
"Of course, the situation is not very

pleasant. No doubt there will be mo-ments of strained relations. But the friendly attitude of the heads of the Mexican government to the Jewish na-tional movement gives grounds for feeling undisturbed in general."
