12.000 JEWS IN VIENNA LEFT JUDAISM DURING TWELVE
YEARS, STATISTICS INDICATE

2,239 Entered Faith During the Same Period

(Tewish Telegraphic Agency)

Vienna, Aug. 26.-About 12.000 Tews in Vienna abandoned Judaism to be converted to other faiths, during the period 1911-1923, according to figures made known here today.

The figures were compiled by Dr. Goldhammer, a Viennese statistician. According to these figures, 9,550 Jews were converted to other faiths during that period. As this figure does not include children under seven years of age, it was estimated that the figure approaches 12,000. Forty-eight percent the converts adopted Catholicism. and twenty-five percent Lutheranism.
Seventy-five percent of the converts
were of a marriageable age and belonged to the intellectual class. In recent years, the majority of those who

INTERESTING DISPUTE ARISES BETWEEN CHICAGO JEWISH WELFARE INSTITUTIONS

Orthodox Hebrew School Wants to Preserve Its Tradition: Opposes Modernization

(Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Chicago, Aug. 26.—The Moses Mon-tenore Hebrew Free School here has summoned the Chicago Jewish Charities to a "Din Torah" (rabbinical trial) because the latter withdrew financial support from the school when it failed to alter its course of studies to conform to the requirements of the Jewish Education Committee.

Some fifteen years ago the Orthodox Jewish charitable organizations here first took measures to support the pub-lic Hebrew schools. When the Ortho-dox charities were later merged with the Reform charities to become the existing Chicago Jewish Charities, stipulation was made that the principles of Orthodoxy were to be respected, and that the internal organization of various institutions which the charities supported were not to be interfered with.

Several weeks ago the Jewish Education Committee, which is part of the Chicago Jewish Charities, withdrew financial support from the Montefiore school because of differences over methods of teaching the Talmud. The school has refused to conform with the requirements of the committee and is asking its supporters to contribute funds to the school direct instead of transmitting them through the United Charities as heretofore.

This is the first time that the Jewish Education Committee has brought pressure to bear on institutions which have not complied with its policy of standardization and modernization. The outcome is being watched with interest as it may affect a number of Orthodox schools which have also declined to abandon their existing methods and studies.

Were this not so we daresay that the Jews of Turkey would not have renounced rights which would have made life

easier and more secure. "There are still several Christian nations of Europe-Roumania and Hungary in particular-which could follow the example of Turkey to the mutual benefit and profit of all concerned. From most recent advices it seems that Poland has learned this lesson from the pain and travail of a serious economic crisis and revolution. We believe that a dose of equality would prove, an excellent medicine for many of the ills of Europe. The present experiment ... Turkey will be watched with much interest and hope."

LLOYD GEORGE URGES JEWS CONTINUE CONTRIBUTIONS TO WORLD CIVILIZATION Recalls Reception By American Jews: Lauds Dr. Weizmann For Helping Save Britain in World War

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Bangor, Wales, Aug. 26.—Recollec-tions of his American trip, the recep-tion accorded him by American Jews and high praised for the Jewish patriotic qualities were contained in the address of David Llyod George, former Prime Minister of Great Britain, at a garden party given by the summer school of the Interuniversity Jewish Federation. "You belong to a great race which has made the deepest impression on the

destinies of humanity," Lloyd George stated. "The influence of your race has been great through the ages, and the impressions created by Jewish ideas and teachers will deepen further. Welsh like you, are a small race. You number fifteen million, while we number four million. However, the quality is good.

"Your prophets, kings and heroes are better known to Welsh boys than the names of our own heroes.

"I have never met a people with greater patriotism than the Jews for the country in which they live," Lloyd George declared. "It is a mistake to imagine that an international race cannot be deeply national." Mr. Lloyd George reiterated his pre-

vious statements with regard to the role of Dr. Chaim Weizmann in the issuor Dr. Chaim Weizmann in the issu-ance of the Balfour Declaration. He paid high tribute to Dr. Weizmann's work at that time, stating, "In the Zi-onist Declaration I was guided and directed by Dr. Weizmann, than whom there is no more noble and unselfish man whose discovery of an ingredient essential in the production of high ex-

plosives helped to save the nation. "I received great kindness from your race in America. I think the most eloquent short speech I heard in America was made by a young Jewish doctor of Philadelphia," he said.

"The responsibility of guiding is that of your race. Hitherto you have had the spiritual leadership of western civ-ilizations and it is still in your keeping. It is essential that you continue the great guidance you gave humanity, especially as a great international race. It lies in your power to extend in the future your contribution to humanity, which is incalculable.

Anti-Semitic Movement Appears China Under Influence of "Dearborn Independent" Propaganda

(By Our Shanghai Correspondent) Shanghai, China, Aug. 6.—The influence of the "Dearborn Independent's"

propaganda has made itself felt even here in far away China. Strange as it may seem, agitators, who very obviously derive their inspiration from Ford's organ, which they quote copiously, have been at work for several months now trying to stir up racial hatred by preaching anti-Semitism and linking the Yews with Bolshevism. These agitators have not had easy

columns to them and in a number of communications, one of which alone took almost three columns, all the scurrilous charges of the international anti-Semites, chiefly that of the infamous "Protocols of the Elders of Zion," have been reiterated and rehashed. A Jewish resident of Shanghai took up the cudgels in defense of his people

and his letter was published by the Hankow "Post." The writer ably disproved all the false accusations, but this was followed by further contributions from the anti-Semitic propagandists. Other communications from a Jew of Shanghai, signing himself "Mentor." appeared in the "North-China Daily News." Of particular significance is the attitude of this paper, one of the leading corner in China. leading organs in China, on the whole matter, as expressed in an editorial evoked by one of "Mentor's" letters.

"There are signs in Shanghai of an attempt to work up a wave of anti-Semitism," the paper wrote. "They Semitism," the paper wrote. "They may mean nothing; we phoe they do. But in these days when passion and prejudice run so high in all directions, we wish to make the "North-China Daily News" position clear. The anti-Semitic party need expect no help from us. Letters containing reflexions on Jews occasionally reach us. They go back to the writers and will continue to do so. The whole movement, which plasters an entire race with the misdoings of a few, is so grossly unfair. That is not done with any other people. The Italian colony of New York, for in-stance, used to have a bad name for turbulence, probably because most of them came from Southern Italy where, for climatic reasons, blood is hot and quarrels fierce. standings brought about by correspondence and comments published on the 17th inst., in the local press, my Com-mittee desire me to state that the Constitutional Defense League is not concerned in any way whatsoever with proposals or arrangements for the publication locally or in any other place of the book 'The Protocols of the Wise men of Zion' or with any other anti-Semitic propaganda."

In a lengthy article appearing in to-day's issue of "Israel's Messenger" of this city, we read in connection with the foregoing: "The Constitutional Defence League was formed in December last year, with a view to combat Bol-shevism in China. It is unfortunate that a member of its staff, who poses himself as an authority on Bolshevism, has

started an actual anti-Jewish propa-ganda in the local press and abroad accusing the Jewish people as being responsible for the present Soviet regime in Russia, thus lending color to the belief that the League is shielding this traducer of the Jews and supporting his policy. We are, however, pleased to note that this is not the case, and this assurance coming as it does from the President of the League, who has done much to popularize the objects of the latter in Shanghai, should remove all misunderstandings."
