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'JEWISH ISSUE' FIGURES IN MICHIGAN PRIMARY ELECTIONS HELD TODAY

Libel Bill Which Could Prevent Ford's
Anti-Semitic Propaganda. Its Issue

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Detroit, Mich., Sept. 13.—A "Jewish issue" was projected into the Michigan primary elections which will be held tomorrow.

Governor Alex Groesbeck, running for re-election, is charged with responsibility for the defeat of a bill in April, 1921, which would have prohibited the sale of the "Dearborn Independent" in Michigan. While the bill did not mention Henry Ford or his "Dearborn Independent," it provided for a new libel law aimed against publications with religious or race prejudice or discrimination. The bill passed the Legislature, but action was reconsidered the following day when Governor Groesbeck interceded, causing its defeat. It is stated.

ANTI-SEMITIC INTERNATIONAL RESUMES ITS WAR AGAINST "ENSLAVEMENT BY JEWS"

Vienna, Sept. 13.—The office of the Anti-Semitic International here has issued a statement in which it says that between August 8th and the 11th a meeting was held in a town in Denmark of anti-Jewish representatives from most of the countries of Europe. The name of the town is not given. Representatives from Denmark, Germany, Austria, England, France, Poland, Italy, Holland, Sweden, Switzerland, Czechoslovakia, Hungary and of the Russian Emigrants were present.

The representatives reported on the fight against international high finance in their respective countries. The Dawes Plan was examined by the Conference and it was established to what extent the enslavement of the economic life of the peoples is being effected in one country after another. The meeting expressed itself unanimously against the gold standard which in its view is nothing but a method of high finance to make all States dependent upon it. The meeting further discussed ways and means of conducting propaganda against the "enslavement of all peoples by International Jew-directed High Finance."

WORKERS CRITICIZE SOVIET GOVERNMENT FOR ADMIT- TING JEWS TO FACTORIES

Ukrainian President Seathes Complai-
nants' Anti-Semitic Tendencies

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Moscow, Sept. 13.—Ukrainian workers who charge the government with giving preference to Jewish apprentices were rebuked for their anti-Semitic tendencies by Parrowsky, president of the Ukrainian Walk, the Central Executive Committee.

The case centered around the decision of the Ukrainian National Commissariat of Trade to allow 304 of the 816 vacancies in the Ukrainian mills and factories to Jewish apprentices. As a result of this, the "Jewish daily communists" papers received numerous letters from their readers, expressing hostile surprise at the decision of the Commissariat.

"Narrow-minded persons and contra-revolutionists are spreading rumors on the one hand that the government is favoring the Jews and, on the other hand, that the government is hostile to the Jews, is hindering their settling in the land, etc.," Mr. Parrowsky declared. "I categorically deny both. The three hundred vacancies were given to the Jews, not because of special favor to them, but because of the fact that there are almost no Jewish apprentices in our mills and factories. This must be corrected by giving at the same proportionately more places to the Jews."

"It is time to remember that the policy of the Soviet government is to give to all nationalities equal conditions of existence," he stated.

RUDOLPH HAAS BRINGS LIBEL SUIT AGAINST HIS ACCUSER

Berlin, Sept. 13.—The second act of the case of Rudolph Haas, who was vindicated of the charge of having murdered his brother-in-law, Helling, was enacted yesterday when Haas filed a libel suit against Springer, the confessed murderer of Helling.

It was at the instigation of anti-Semitic leaders in Magdeburg that Springer originally made malicious statements which he later repudiated, but which were the basis of the charges against Haas. It is expected that the trial will disclose interesting details of the intrigue which led to the scandal.

JEWS DISMISSED FROM PALESTINE RAILWAYS

Jerusalem, Sept. 13.—Seventeen officials of the Palestine railways were discharged from their posts by the railway administration of Haifa.

The reason for the dismissal was stated to be a curtailment of expenses. Fifteen of the seventeen officials were Jews.

POGROM REFUGEES CAN BE EXEMPT FROM LITERACY TEST, WASHINGTON RULES

Religious Persecution Clause Can Be
Applied to Jewish Woman

Refugees can be exempt from the literacy test on the ground that they are fleeing from religious persecution. This was the latest ruling of the Department of Labor, according to an announcement made yesterday by Max J. Kohler, prominent New York attorney, who with a Warner Parker of Washington, acted as counsel for a Jewish woman and her three daughters coming from Russia.

Mrs. Szejna Waldman and her three daughters arrived in the United States at the end of August, 1922, having escaped from Proskurov in the Ukraine at the end of 1920, where they had lived through the worst of the terrible Ukrainian pogroms, in which 1,200 Jews were killed and 200 wounded, including twenty-five of Mrs. Waldman's relatives. After six months' temporary stay in Lemberg, she reached Warsaw, and remained there a year until 1922, pending visa application and securing places under the quota.

On arriving at Ellis Island, she was included as an illiterate, and her children with her, particularly as the youngest was also illiterate. On appeal to the Secretary of Labor he directed a new test in both Hebrew and Yiddish, and on the mother's failing to pass these, all were ordered deported. Habeas corpus proceedings followed, which the District Court decided against them, but on appeal to the Circuit Court of Appeals they were admitted into the U. S. on the ground that the test had been improperly administered in both languages and a new right of appeal to the Secretary denied. The U. S. Supreme Court, on the government's appeal, held, however, that while it agreed with the lower court as to the irregularities in procedure

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UKRAINIAN POGROM ARCHIVES SENT TO PARIS BY SOVIET EMBASSY

Vienna, Sept. 13.—The entire pogrom archive in the possession of the Soviet government was transmitted to Paris by the Soviet embassy at Vienna, and placed at the disposal of the lower court which will try Slesien Schwabard for killing Semion Retman. The archive contains documents and photographs and a list of 3,000 names of Jews who were killed in the pogroms in the towns of Proskurov, Zhytomir, Lman, Bolezker, Polystyn and Lubawa. The rabbi of these towns and officials of the Hebrew Kadishah, the Jewish burial societies, have testified to the accuracy of the names of the victims.

**Jews Gave America Spirit Which
Should Be Emulated, He Says; Senator

Washington, Sept. 13.—"The people of the Jewish race have been of immeasurable advantage to us in our form of Government. They have brought to our people a spirit that can well be emulated by us all," declared President Coolidge in a New Year message to the Jewish people through the "Jewish Advocate" of Boston. The president's message read:

"I am very glad indeed to say a word of New Year greeting through the 'Jewish Advocate,' which represents such a splendid spirit in our community. There is always something about the New Year which affects us all. It is a season when we try to attain the ideals that we hope for. The people of the Jewish race have been of immeasurable advantage to us in our form of government. They have brought to our people a spirit that can well be emulated by us all. I hope that the New Year will hold much of good for the readers of this paper, and my sincere wish is that the coming year will find the Jewish people contributing as much to the welfare of our Nation as they have in the year past. My sincerest and best wishes go to each and every one of you and I wish for you all a prosperous and happy New Year."

Senator Butler of Massachusetts, prominent Administration leader, in a New Year message to the "Advocate," predicted humanization of our immigration laws, under the leadership of President Coolidge and pledged his efforts to permit wives and children to join their husbands and fathers in America. Senator Butler also congratulated the Jewish people on their success in redeeming Palestine as the Jewish National Homeland. His message read:

The complaint that Polish Jewry is being neglected in the distribution of the relief funds of the United Jewish Campaign, was dealt with by Dr. Bernard Kahn, European director of the joint Distribution Committee, during his recent visit to Poland. Preceding Dr. Kahn's address, at a meeting in Warsaw on Aug. 9, M. Grodzinski, who is at the head of the Jewish relief committee in that city, describing the state of affairs, pointed out, we read in "Der Moment" (Aug. 13) of Warsaw, that there is such a shortage of funds that his committee "has been unable to offer relief in the case of thousands of destitute Jews."

Replying to this complaint, Dr. Kahn stated, according to "Der Moment": "The J. D. C. 'drive' in America has been scheduled for three years, so that at this moment it is impossible to say how much money the 'drive' will bring and how much of it will go for the Polish Jews. Furthermore, it must be borne in mind that the funds of the 'drive' are to be distributed to a number of countries besides Poland, hence it is difficult to make any special promises. On the other hand, the charge that Polish Jewry is being neglected by the present 'drive,' is utterly false. I personally never underestimated the needs of Polish Jewry. On the contrary, I understand your difficult position; moreover, I believe that the present crisis may last for years. The idea of credit Kassar must be given full support, as it is possible through the

method of non-interest loans to rehabilitate the impoverished Jewish masses in Poland.

"The work of the relief committees has my strongest sympathy, and on my visits to America, I convinced my American friends that the assistance to you should and must be increased, especially since Polish Jewry is the only great heir of the former Russian Jewry, which has now stepped off the arena. For the present, however, there can be no increase in the relief of the J. D. C."

There are a million Jews in Poland today whose condition is completely hopeless, declares S. Rosenfeld in the "Day" of New York. Writing in the issue of Sept. 13, M. Rosenfeld, after depicting the tragic plight of Polish Jewry, concludes thus:

"Emigration! This must be the fate of a full million Jews in Poland. This is the second million of destitute Jews with no foundation under their feet. The first million is to be found—according to optimistic figures—in Russian Jewry. But this million has those in Russia and America who, thank God, have taken it under their care, and it will no doubt be helped. But how about the million in Poland? These indeed are real orphans, who rely on 'Klal Israel,' Jewry in general, without a specific address. Where, then, can the Polish Jewish misery turn? Who will succor it?"

A New "Via Dolorosa"

That Arabs have recently been attacking Jews in Jerusalem, as part of a conspiracy on the part of the anti-Zionist element among the Arabs, is the complaint made in an article entitled "Via Dolorosa for Jerusalem Jews," appearing in the "Davar" (Aug. 20 issue), Tel Aviv Hebrew labor paper.

"Somebody has apparently decided to convert the road between the Yeshiva building, Torah Chaim, and the Western Wall (Wailing Wall) into a new Via Dolorosa," the paper writes. "Late last year there has not been a Jew who passed on this road who did not suffer. We hear daily of attacks and acts of terror. At the beginning they were satisfied with throwing stones at every Jewish passerby. Later they began to use their fists and sticks. To this were added insults and vulgar and low behavior toward old and weak men. It even reached the point where knives were used. Last week a Jew was mortally wounded. This week a forty-year-old Jew, who walked to the Wailing Wall with a book under his arm, was hit over the head and his skull fractured. These acts are being carried out with unusual cruelty in full daylight."

These acts are not perpetrated for the purpose of robbery, we are told by the paper, which believes that "an organizing and encouraging hand is visible," and declares "it is thought that the intention of those who organized these attacks is to 'convince' the world that the opinion of Col. The Jews in the Kingdom of Serbs, Croats and Slovenes

(By Our Belgrade Correspondent)

Belgrade, Aug. 15.—If Jugoslavia, a "synthetic" state produced by the world war, still remains a puzzle to the average person, the present condition of the Jews in this newly created state is perhaps even less known.

To understand the situation properly, it is necessary to distinguish at the outset between the position of the Jews in Serbia and those in Croatia, entirely different socially, politically and economically.

In the ancient confines of Serbia the Jews are relatively few in number, about 18,000, of whom the great majority are Sephardim and almost all of them make their homes in Belgrade. More completely assimilated than the Croatian Jews, they observe strictly, however, the old Jewish traditions and rites. They have erected in Belgrade several synagogues, one of which is distinguished by its architectural beauty and magnificence.

Although few in number, the Jews of Serbia have contributed largely to the commercial and industrial development of the country. Their preponderance in the commercial field is especially noticeable on the day of Yom Kippur, when almost half the total number of the shops in Belgrade are closed, thus giving the impression of a national Jewish holiday. In science and the arts, the Serbian Jews, like those of Croatia, occupy a place no less important. There are men of letters and scholars among the Jews who evoke both respect and admiration. Anti-Semitic feeling appears as little in Serbia as, for example, in Italy. The people of Serbia, who by their traditions and national character are essentially democratic and liberal-minded, esteem the Jews, for their energy and industry. A few groups of nationalists, however, have tried to waken an anti-Semitic movement among the people, by repeated attacks in the press which they control, but their attempts have always been doomed to failure, and they have never passed "from words to acts."

In Croatia conditions appear otherwise. The Jews number approximately 65,000 and the great majority are Ashkenazim. In this part of the Kingdom anti-Semitism is highly developed and has taken root firmly among the people. The dominating position of the Jews in the realm of finance and commerce is regarded in Croatia with malvolence. Hostility against the Jews is openly shown. They are attacked by the press, insulted in the speeches of political orators, ostracized from Christian society, and at times even subjected to physical violence.

The "Hanaos" (members of the Croatian nationalist organization, on the occasion of the festival of Passover, invaded the synagogue at Zagreb, and maltreated the worshippers.

The head of the peasant party, M. Stjepan Raditch, noted for his anti-Semitic sentiments, once declared in a

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KLANSMEN GATHER FOR PARADE AT CAPITAL; MASKS WILL BE BARRED

"Admit Nothing; Give No Figures; Divulge No Program" Their Slogan (Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Washington, D. C., Sept. 13.—"Admit nothing; give no figures; divulge no program," is the slogan of the Klansmen with regard to the parade of the Ku Klux Klan to be held here today.

Incoming regular and special trains were bringing thousands of Klansmen to the Capital, for the parade on Pennsylvania Avenue at 5 o'clock this afternoon. Among the arrivals are great numbers of women, many of them in the uniform of the organization.

The first special train arrived yesterday evening from Florida and points in the South. In the city camping parks, where private signs are not permitted, the distinguishing Klan markers are not displayed. The motor vehicles do not bear "K. K. K." or "Klgy," but hundreds of American flags fly from radiator caps or other parts of the machines. In privately owned tourists' camps the Klan markers are displayed.

The streets were well filled with Klan cars coming from half the States in the Union. Many of them were of the most costly makes. Local residents were struck with the character of the automobiles.

The attitude of Washington people toward the Klan demonstration is much more friendly than it was last year. People not directly interested consider it a harmless sort of demonstration that brings money to town. Hotels are

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TWELVE INJURED IN HAKEN-KREUZLER RIOT IN VIENNA

A Hakenkreuzler demonstration in Vienna on Saturday resulted in a riot in which twelve Jews and policemen were injured, according to a despatch from Vienna to the "New York Times."

The trouble started when the police interfered with an attempt of Hakenkreuzler manifestants either to go to the Jewish quarter to attack the Jews or to City Hall.

The demonstrators got as far as Ring Boulevard, where they broke windows in one of the big cafes, beat several Jewish patrons and rescued from the police the ringleader of the rioters, who, however, was soon rearrested. Sixty-five arrests were made. All but sixteen of the young men arrested were released later.

The object of the meeting was to protest against the alleged action of the Socialist municipality in subsidizing the Socialist athletic meet here this Summer, while charging the Pan-German track meet 7,000 kronen entertainment tax.

The meeting also denounced the municipality, which practically has a monopoly on billposting, for refusing to post the Pan-German placards containing their protest on the athletic meet.

Three thousand took part in the meeting, but only a small fraction of the youngest element was involved in the rioting.

PALESTINE ARAB CONGRESS TO PROTEST AGAINST GOVERNMENT LOAN

Intend to Ask for Invalidation of All Laws Since British Occupation

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency Mail Service)

Jerusalem, Aug. 20.—A protest against the Palestine Government loan because Palestine Arab leaders were not consulted in the matter is contemplated by the forthcoming Palestine Arab Congress. This was learned following a meeting of twenty-five Arab notables held at the home of Musa Kazem Pasha Al-Husseini, President of the Palestine Arab Executive. The notables represented Jerusalem, Jaffa, Haifa, Nablus, Safed, Gaza, Hebron, Bethlehem, Ramleh, Tulkeram and Jenin, and were delegates of the various parties. The speakers dealt with the mode by which it was desired to convene the Congress, and it was decided that delegates of all parties should participate. The Arab Executive would send fifty per cent of the delegates, and the rest would make the membership up to 120 the total strength. All the Muftis of Palestine are to be invited, while Arab Chambers of Commerce will each send a delegate. The Congress will probably meet in September.

"Al Yarmuk" reports that among the items for discussion will be opposition to all laws promulgated by the Government since the Occupation until now, as representatives of the public did not express their opinions on such legislation. Criticism will be made of Col. Symes' declaration at the meeting of the Permanent Mandates Commission of the League of Nations to the effect that the silence of the Palestine Arab population is proof that they are satisfied with the administration. A proposal will be made to reject the \$4,500,000 loan to Palestine, as the inhabitants were not consulted.

from which it is evident that the Arabs have reconciled themselves to the status quo, is unfounded. It is also possible that they purpose to frighten the Jews in the Old City, to make them move and to reduce their numbers in Jerusalem as much as possible. However, whatever the reason may be, one thing is clear. The scores of accidents which occurred in the last weeks are not accidents.

In conclusion "Davar" charges that the police are not taking any energetic measures to stop the outrages. "The attitude of the Arab policemen to the Jews who submit their complaints to them is evident from the Jerusalem police reports; the insignificant number of the arrested assailants, the release of those who used knives under a bail of £20, the persistent refusal to station a few Jewish policemen in that neighborhood, whose presence would compel both the inhabitants and the Arab policemen to behave differently, the lack of any special steps in this matter, despite the increased number of attacks. The indifferent attitude of the police encourages the hooligans. It is, however, clear that such acts of terror can only bring forth similar acts and the danger will grow greater," the paper says.

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having taken place, this did not give these aliens a right of entrance, without an affirmative finding that they were eligible, but that the fundamental question was whether they were fugitives from religious persecution, before a literacy test was authorized, and it could not be inferred that this question had been decided against them, in the absence of a finding to that effect on their claim of exemption.

The Secretary was directed by the Court to pass on that question and if his ruling was adverse, to decide as to a new test. Meantime Mrs. Waldman was subjected to a new test in her home in Providence, while the case was awaiting Supreme Court action, and it was announced that she had passed the test and deportation proceedings against them had been dropped, but the immigration authorities declared that this determination was reached merely because the Supreme Court decided to entertain the Government appeal, and that the Secretary had not adopted the new test. Judge Bondy sustained this claim. Mrs. Waldman declined to take a new literacy test, until the main question had been decided as to her exemption, and the Secretary has finally decided that she and her daughter were religious refugees, when they landed here, but the youngest daughter is required to give a bond against becoming a public charge and that she will continue her schooling until 16 years old.

The case is interesting not merely because of the extreme unwillingness of the immigration authorities to exempt aliens from the literacy test, but because the provision of the law was availed of, to introduce new evidence as to religious persecution to the Secretary of Labor direct, which was not before the Board of Special Inquiry. In the interim between the Ellis Island tests, and the one in Providence, new reading matter for testing was furnished, in consequence of a determination of the United States Circuit Court of Appeals that tests based on the use of difficult and unusual Biblical passages were illegal.

KLANSMEN GATHER FOR PARADE AT CAPITAL; MASKS WILL BE BARRED

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bidding for their patronage. No hostility is manifested.

The only formal protests came from Negro organizations, and they were perfunctory. The discarding of the mask has made the order less dangerous, its opponents argue.

The parade which police officials say will exceed the Klan's parade of last January, will mark the opening of the third biennial "Klonvokation" to be held here Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday. The meeting will bring here state and city delegates from all parts of the United States, Alaska and Panama. The chief purpose is to formulate policies for the ensuing year and to elect an imperial wizard and other national officers. The re-election of Dr. Wesley Evans is said to have been settled on months ago in secret conferences of the leaders.

It was also stated that one of the purposes of the conclave is to present to the national capital a demonstration which will rival the recent gathering of the Eucharistic Congress in Chicago.

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speech: "Righteousness is foreign to the Jews. Their very character and nature is wicked!" Propaganda against the Jews has often been employed for political purposes, and not without success. The anti-Semitic movement, however, has never taken the proportions of a popular uprising, and acts of violence have never assumed the character of a pogrom.

The difference between the position of the Jews in Serbia and in Croatia is especially explained by the fact that this last-named country is still under the influence of the old Austro-Hungary, aristocratic and feudal, where anti-Semitism was always pronounced. In addition, the Croats are Catholics, and unlike the Serbians, very devout.

The Jews resent bitterly the hostility to which they are subjected. In all Jugo-Slavia they are united in a Zionist organization, whose president, Dr. David Alcalay, enjoys extreme popularity. Hundreds of Jews have departed for Palestine as colonists.

There are in Jugo-Slavia three Jewish publications: two political weeklies—"Zidor," and "Zidovska Svijest"—and one literary monthly—"The Gideon."

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
