#### KLEBELSBERG REASSURES ANTI-SEMITES NUMERUS CLAUSUS LAW IS INTACT

Hungarian Minister Replies to Memorandum of Anti-Semitic Students

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Budapest, Sept. 28. - Anti-Semitic leaders in Hungary were reassured yes-terday by Count Klebelsberg, Minister of Education, with regard to the nu-

merus clausus. The Minister published a reply to the memorandum of the anti-Semitic student Race Purifiers complaining against the recent modifications of the numerus

clausus law.

It is not true, the Minister wrote, that the Hungarian government plans to set aside the numerus clausus. As to the modification providing that the numerus clausus is not applicable to baptized Jews, the Minister states that the faculties will inquire into each particular case of a baptized lewish student applying for admission to the universities, so that the numerus clausus will not be evaded by a mass baptism of Jewish students.

#### SIR SASSOON JACOB DAVID. MERCHANT-PHILANTHROPIST DIES IN BOMBAY, AGED 77

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Bombay, India, Sept. 28.-Sir Sassoon

Jacob David, leading cotton merchant and founder of the Bank of India, died here yesterday at the age of seventy-

seven.

Sir Sassoon David was born in Bombay in December 1849. He was the son of J. David, prominent member of the Jewish community and one of the first to come to Bombay. He married Hannah Sassoon, niece of the late Sir Albert Sassoon

He joined the firm of E. D. Sassoon and Company doing business in China and Bombay. In 1885 he started his own firm and became agent of the David and Standard Mills. He was the founder of the firm of Sassoon J. David & Co., Ltd. of which he was the

#### POLISH CABINET REINSTATED PRESIDENT MOSCICKI (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Warsaw, Sept. 28 .- The Bartel cabinet, including Minister of Education Sojkowski and Minister of the Interior, Professor Lodlianowski, in whom the Sejm voted lack of confidence, was re-

instated by President Moscicki.

A mood of depression was apparent in parliamentary circles when the presi-dent's action became known. It is stated that at Thursday's session of the Sejm, the parties will again vote lack of confidence, this time in the entire cabinet, following which the only solution will be the dissolution of the Seim and the holding of new elections.

#### AUSTRIAN SCIENTIST'S SUICIDE LAID TO ANTI-JEWISH DISCRIMINATION

Prof. Kammerer's Jewish Origin Prevented His Attaining Professorship (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Vienna, Sept. 28 .- The suicide of Dr. Paul Kammerer, noted Austrian biologist, was traced to the anti-Semitic attitude maintained in the Austrian col-

Friends of the late scientist disclosed today that Kammerer was despondent because of the fact that the Vienna university had refused to grant him a professorship because he was not of purely Aryan origin, his mother having been Jewish.

Dr. Kammerer belonged to the unorthodox school of science of which his friend, Professor Eugene Steinach, was one of the leading representatives. The orthodox scientific circles did not accept his theories, frowned on his socialism, opposed his aim of popularizing scientific knowledge, and for these reasons prevented fulfillment of his dream of becoming a professor in

Last year Dr. Kammerer accepted a Moscow University. He returned to purchase equipment in Vienna and killed himself when the time came for him to return to Moscow. He left his rich library to the University of Moscow and his body to the Vienna Anatomical School.

The best known work of Dr. Kammerer is "The Law of Series" in which he sought to explain why one disaster such as a wreck, is usually followed by a series. He was generally interested in the study of the workings of chance and the mechanism of evolution.

The press of Vienna paid warm tribute to Dr. Kammerer, lamenting that Vienna's scholars are no longer able to gain a livelihood here.

### JEWISH RELIGIOUS COUNCIL

IN LITHUANIA, BACKED BY AGUDAH, IS ABOLISHED (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Kovno, Sept. 28.-The Jewish Religious Council of Lithuania, set up by the former Lithuanian government, was

abolished by an order of the present Liberal cabinet. The previous government established the Council with the support of the

Agudath Israel elements of Lithuania. The Hebrew Culture Congress, which opened here yesterday, is, it was declared here today, an impressive demonstration of the growth of the Hebrew movement in Lithuania. Three hundred delegates are attending the conference.

Dr. Robinson, member of the Lithu-anian Sejm, stated in his address before the Congress that in case the cabinet will oppose the Hebrew school system in the country, the Club of Jewish Deputies will oppose the cabinet.

#### BRITISH ATTITUDE TO MANDATES COMMISSION

LORD CECIL EXPLAINS

Criticism Merely a Warning Against Possibility of Exceeding Powers (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Geneva, Sept. 28.-Lord Robert Cecil, British representative to the Seventh Assembly of the League of Nations, issued a statement here yesterday to the press on the differences of opinion between the League Council and the Permanent Mandates Commission fol-lowing the action of the League to support the Commission.

In his statement, Lord Cecil declares that the criticism directed against the Permanent Mandates Commission was merely a warning against the possibility of the Mandates Commission exceeding its powers. In reality, the Permanent Mandates Commission was not the object of any criticism. Its work and its attitude were warmly appreciated, but it was necessary to call the attention of the members of the Mandates Commission to the difficulties which might arise in certain circumstances which would make the position of the Mandates. Commission more delicate and c more difficult.

#### BRITISH ARCHAEOLOGIST TO CARRY ON EXCAVATIONS IN SOUTHERN PALESTINE

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) London, Sept. 28. - The School of Archaeology will carry on

excavations in the south of Palestine during the coming winter, according to Sir Flinders Petrie, famous British archaeologist, in a letter to the London "Times.

Southern Palestine is of great historic interest, he says. The vicinity has numerous ancient mounds of the earliest barbarian civilization. Every facility for the excavations is cordially accorded by the Palestine authorities.

#### REPORT SOFIA SYNAGOGUE ATTACKED ON YOM KIPPUR (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Sofia, Sept. 28.-Anti-Jewish excesses took place here on Yom Kippur, according to a report of the Bulgarian paper, "Narod."

The paper states that members of the nationalistic organization, Rodna Sastila, attacked the synagogue in Sofia on the Day of Atonement, bombarding it with stones and smashing all the windows. Many of the worshippers includ-ing the rabbi were injured.

#### DAVID YELLIN DECLINES EDUCATION DEPT. POST

#### ECONOMIC CRISIS WILL HAVE BENEFICIAL RESULTS FOR PALESTINE, DELPHINER SAYS Unsound Economic Factors Will Be Removed While Sound Ones Will

Be Preserved, He Asserts

The opinion that the present eco-nomic crisis in Palestine will have beneficial results for the country was expressed by Max Delphiner, Viennese industrialist and owner of the Tel Aviv silk factory, who arrived in New York several days ago.

The crisis in Palestine is just like a crisis on Wall Street. It is well for the sound bonds and shares which are increasing in value on Wall Street that they should fall from time to time. Due to the crisis the unsound in Palestine will be removed and the sound will become sounder, he declared, when interviewed by the representative of the "Jewish Daily Bulletin.

Mr. Delphiner, who is the first Jewish industrialist to make investments in Palestine industry on a large scale, expressed his great confidence in the future of the silk industry there

The industrial prospects for Pales-tine are indeed very bright and the prospects for the silk industry are much brighter. There are great possibilities for exporting silk to the neighboring countries and there are raw materials to develop the industry. The average Jew cannot properly estimate the possibilities for this development. he said.

The Palestine government, Mr. Del-phiner continued, has now removed the custom duties on raw material necessary in the textile industry. This gives greater opportunity for the development of industrial enterprises.

#### BULLETIN NEW YORKER ENDOWS JUDAICA DEPARTMENT OF JERUSALEM LIBRARY An agreement to maintain and extend

the Department of Judaica of the Jew-ish National and University Library in Palestine, has been made by Emanuel Hertz of New York to Mrs. Sophie A. Udin, special representative of the library, now in this country. Mr. Hertz's pledge involves furnishing funds for the upkeep of the physical requirements of the Department, including the rental and salary of the special librarian, as well as additional funds for the yearly expansion of the Department.

The Department of Judaica is the most important branch of the Library which is attached to the Hebrew University at Jerusalem. The shelves of this department already include a collection amounting to 45,000 volumes, among them works of rare interest, such as incunabula, manuscripts, complete files of periodicals of Jewish interest, as well as a comprehensive col-lection of books on Jewish history. The volumes to be added are expected to make this department the most complete of its kind in the world.

Mr. Hertz, who is the brother of Chief Rabbi Joseph Hertz of England, is a New York attorney who has been interested in the cultural activities in connection with the rebuilding of Palestine for many years and recently contributed a collection of 7,000 volumes to the library.

#### OFFICIAL DISMISSED FOR FAILURE TO STOP RITUAL MURDER AGITATION

Warsaw, Sept. 28.—The district governor of Wolbrzeg was dismissed from his position by an order of the Polish Minister of the Interior yesterday.

The governor was charged with failure to take steps to stop the anti-Jewish excesses during the recent ritual murder tale agitation which developed in the town of Dobrzyn because of the death of a gypsy child, Julia Gomann.

#### BOYCOTT PROPAGANDA EXTENDED TO POMERANIA

In its issue of Sept. 28 "Dos Yiddishe Folk" writes:

'It has become habitual of late, even in the Zionist press, to speak of the Jewish Agency plan as of something hopeless. This opinion is absolutely ialse. The Jewish Agency idea lives in the Zionist movement, and is ceaselessly striving to attain this or that form of realization. The Agency plan is not a product of a casual notion, it is a product of Zionist reality. The positive decision of the last Zionist Congress regarding the Jewish Agency is still alive and in full force. It is a mandate through which the Congress authorized the Zionist Organization to act and we are all bound by this mandate. Those who believe that, because of the controversies which have arisen in the course of the last year owing to the Crimea colonization, the Jewish Agency plan has disappeared from the program or has seriously been weakened, have put a false interpretation on the situation. We take this opportunity to emphasize again the falsehood of the opinion that American Zionism is combating the Russian Col-onization as a relief measure. Our fight is directed only against the mis-leading and groundless Yevsektzia 'redemption idealogy' which is unscrupul-ously employing the Colonization plan as a weapon against the reconstruction of Palestine. Our fight, however, has no relation to those elements in America and in Europe who see in the relief work a necessary general-Jewish activity everywhere, in the Golus and in Palestine. From this point of view Palestine is a splendid work-field for relief and reconstruction for all Jews who are willing honestly and conscientiously to fulfill their duty to our peo-ple at the present time. #### The Jewish Hero of Miami

The story of the sexton of the Beth David Synagogue in Miami, who braved the storm at the risk of his own life in order to rescue the Holy Scrolls, is compared by the "Jewish Morning Journal" of Sept. 26 to the story of the sexton in a Kishineff synagogue who was killed in the performance of a similar act during the tragically famous Kishineff pogrom.

"The symbol of devotion and self-sacrifice," the paper writes, "is to be observed in the American shames (sexton) no less than in the Russian. . . We must all admire the heroism and the determination to risk one's life for something that is regarded as sacred. That is the kind of courage which helps us to live until we see the downfall of such murderers as the Kishineff pogromists and to contribute to the reconstruction of the Florida ruins.

Palestine Corporation, Ltd., for the establishment of a mortgage credit institution for the purpose of advancing credit loans to Jewish and Arab orange

growers. It is intended with this sum to develop an area of about 700 dunam The Palestine Corporation aims at assisting established farmers who have recently gone into orange growing, as well as established orange growers. Corporation intends to release larger sums for additional loans in this new field of activity. It is estimated that 5,000 dunams of land were acquired during the past year to be developed as

orange groves, of which about one-

fifth has been acquired by persons new-

ly arriving in the country without ex-

perience in agriculture or orange grow-

In the absence of such Government assistance as is rendered in South Africa by the Land and Agricultural Bank, the Corporation has decided to step in, believing that the importance of orange growing to the country cannot he over-estimated. Oranges have reached the high percentage of 40.8% of the total exports of Palestine, as compared with 25-30% of other agricultural produce, which has remained more or less stationary for a number of years. At present some 30,000 dunams of land are under orange cultivation, of which

12.000 dunams belong to Jews.

by the Palestine Jewish Colonization Association last year is to be partly cultivated. 1,509 dunams are to be planted with orange groves for the youths of Rishon-le-Zion and Ness-Ziona at the rate of 25 dunams per family. Pica tractors are now ploughing the land, and cultivation is to commence shortly. The Arab Chamber of Commerce in Taffa reports that the area of orange

groves in Palestine is now 18,000 dunam. Prior to the war the orange crop amounted approximately to 1,750,000 boxes, but this was decreased after the war owing to the destruction of some of the orange-groves. Now the crop has prospered, and there are approximately 2,000,000 boxes annually. 18,000 workingmen are engaged in the annual

IN JERUSALEM ON ROSH HA-SHANAH SPREAD IN WARSAW (Tewish Telegraphic Agency Mail Service)

FALSE RUMORS OF POGROM

Warsaw, Sept. 14.—The Second Day of Rosh Hashanah was one of tremendous excitement for the Jews of Warsaw by reason of the publication of a report issued by the Polish Telegraphic Agency dated from Jerusalem stating that a pogrom had taken place in Jerusalem on the First Day of Rosh Hashanah, that Jews had been attacked by Arabs, and three Jews had been killed and many seriously wounded.

The police had with great difficulty restored order, the report stated On Saturday night when the Jewish papers of Warsaw were going to press, their editorial offices were besieged by

crowds of Jews anxious for further particulars of the alleged pogroms in Jerusalem. Tens of thousands of Jews in Warsaw and other parts of Poland in Warsaw and other parts of roland have relatives in Palestine and were anxious to know what had happened, apart from their interest in the general safeguarding of public order in Palestine. They wanted details, the names of the killed and wounded, for fear lest their own relatives might be among the wounded.

Cables were sent to the Jewish Telegraphic Agency offices in London, Berlin and Jerusalem; to the Zionist Organization Headquarters in London and Jerusalem and to private persons in Palestine, by the Jewish Press, Zionist institutions and private individuals, asking for further particulars. No one thought that the whole story might be invented. The area of 3,000 dunams acquired The Berlin office of the J. T. A. cabled to Warsaw that neither the

Wolff Official Telegraphic Agency, nor any of the German dailies with representatives in Jerusalem had received any information of such disturbances in Jerusalem. A similar reply was re-ceived from the J. T. A. office in Lon-don. The Palestine Office of the J. T. A. cabled that no disturbances had taken place. The Warsaw J. T. A. office supplied these denials to the Polish Jewish press and on Sunday morning the newspapers carried the denials and somewhat calmed the feeling

among the Jewish population. The report appears to have emanated from London in a message issued in Berlin by the United Press and repeated by the Polish Telegraphic Agency giv-
