CHURCH BELLS PROCLAIM ANTI-SEMITIC VICTORY
IN BUDAPEST ELECTIONS

Excitement Prevails in Capital As Race Purifiers Celebrate (Tewish Telegraphic Agency)

Budanest, Oct. 2.-Hungary's capital seethed with excitement today when church bells proclaimed the victory of the anti-Semitic organization, Race Purifiers, in the municipal elections. The contest for city mayor was waged between Sipoecz of the Race Purifiers and the democrat, Barczy, who was

supported by the government. Barczy received thirty votes less than Sipoecz. All the forces of the government and of the anti-Semitic parties were thrown into the battle. It was stated that the outcome of the contest would determine the future course of events in Hungary. Count Bethlen came to Budapest expressly to aid in the election campaign.

When the new city council opened its session today large crowds of members of anti-Semitic organizations assembled outside to celebrate their victory.

Noise and tumult accompanied these demonstrations during which outcries of "Down with the Jews" were made. The police intervened, preventing violence.

JEWS ATTEND INAUGURATION OF FIRST MOSQUE IN LONDON (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

London, Oct. 2.- Jewish dignitaries and representatives of the Jewish press were present yesterday at the inauguration of the first mosque erected in England.

The mosque was erected in South-fields, a suburb of London, and was built under the patronage of Emir Feisul, son of Ibn Saud, victorious leader of the Wahabis and ruler of Mecca.

170 REFUGEES RELEASED FROM EASTLEIGH CAMP AFTER 3 YEARS INTERNMENT (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

London, Oct. 2.—The Feast of Ta-bernseles was indeed a Season of Joy for 170 Jewish refugees stranded in England because of the enactment of the United States quota law three years

The refugees, who have been held in Eastleigh Camp, were permitted by an order of the Home Office to settle tem-porarily in London. The permission was granted on the condition that the refugees proceed to America or elsewhere as soon as possible and that they enter no employment unless such em-ployment would in no way displace British labor.

Great joy prevailed among the refugees who were released after three years of a life confined to the barracks of Eastleigh Camp.

INTERNATIONAL CONGRESS SUGGESTS SPECIAL COUNCIL TO DEAL WITH MINORITIES

Proposal for League Protection of Minorities Is Outlined (Tewish Telegraphic Agency)

Salsburg, Austria, Oct. 2.—A new proposal with regard to how the League is to protect the interests of the national minorities in European countries was formulated at the Interna-tional Congress of the Union of League of Nations Societies which opened here last Tuesday. The congress will be in session until October 4th.

At yesterday's meeting of the Con-gress Herr Kunz reported on the proposal concerning the protection of the national minorities by the League. He suggested that a special council of three delegates with headquarters in Geneva be appointed by the president of the League of Nations to deal with this matter. The council would have to make the decisions concerning the protection of the minorities whenever a question arises. The draft of the pro-posal which was submitted to the congress also suggests that the right of the national minorities to submit petitions should not be as limited as it is now, on condition, however, that no petition of the national minorities submitted to the League can demand a change in the frontiers of the state in which the minority is resident.

As soon as this necessity disappears the numerus clausus will become of itself superfluous. "That is clear enough!" the paper adds. "The Jews must wait until Trianon and the conditions created by it are removed from the world. Until then there can be no abolition or amelioration of this anti-Jewish law. MIAMI JEWS ISSUE APPEAL FOR FURTHER RELIEF

I.O.B.B. to Raise Special Fund for Florida Sufferers

Daniel Cromer, chairman of the Miami Jewish Rehabilatation Committee, on a visit to New York City, when interviewed by the representative of the "Jewish Daily Bulletin", stated, "My latest advices from my associates on the Relief Committee from Miami, are to the effect that the sum of \$100,000, a call for which was issued to bring succor to the stricken Jewish community, is inadequate, because of the further distress revealed by actual

"The Jews of Miami have but recently oversubscribed their quotas in the recent campaigns for the United Jewish Campaign and the United Palestine Appeal and we sincerely hope that at this moment of affliction, the American Jewish community will rally to our support.

Cincinnati, Ohio., Oct. 2.-The Independent Order B'nai B'rith will raise a special fund among the constituent lodges of the Order for rehabilitation of the Jewish flood and hurricane sufferers in Miami, it was announced today by Alfred M. Cohen, international president of the Order. Mr. Cohen also announced that the Constitution Grand Lodge, which includes the national executive body and officers of the organization, today contributed \$5,000 to the Jewish Rehabilitation Committee of Miami. Mr. Cohen also said that the appeal of the Miami Rehabilitation Commit-

tee had been sent to the five hundred

constituent lodges, and that their indi-

vidual contributions would make up a

special B'nai B'rith fund for Miami reconstruction. Mr. Cohen stated that the contribution of the I. O. B. B. was based on the report of Dr. Boris D. Bogen, executive secretary of the Order, who went to Florida immediately after the catastrophe to survey the situation and decide how relief could best be rendered by his organization. Dr. Bogen found that two thousand Jewish families in the Miami district had been affected in some way by the disaster, and that two hundred Jewish families were completely destitute. It was determined that a minimum of \$500 would be required to make each of these families self-sustaining, making the total required by the Jewish Rehabili-tation Committee \$100,000. The con-stituent lodges of the I. O. B. B. are

expected to make up a considerable part of the fund. Jewish people. IS OPENED FOR FIFTH YEAR Other Jewish Schools Are Opened for New Term

JEWISH RELIGION INSTITUTE

The Jewish Institute of Religion, New York's only liberal school for the training of rabbis and Jewish com-munal workers, will hold its formal opening exercises for the fifth academic year this evening at the Institute. The main address of welcome will be de-livered by Dr. William Rosenau, Asso-ciate Professor in Post-Biblical Hebrew, Johns Hopkins University, and member of the Board of Governors of the

Hebrew Union College, who will speak on "The Call for Readjustment."
Judge Julian W. Mack, vice-chairman of the Board of the Jewish Ir.titute of Religion, and Dr. Stephen S. combating the socialist and communist parties. Psychologically, the mainstay of Cuzism was anti-Semitism which Wise, acting president of the Institute,

will also speak.

The Hebrew Union College School for Teachers in New York City will open for its fourth year of work on October 13th, at Temple Emanu-El. The School prepares men and women for religious school teaching, offering a two years course of training, which includes a comprehensive survey of Judaism and its institutions, the Hebrew language and Literature, the History of the Jewish people, and the Pedagogy of religious school subjects.

The ` School also conducts a Placement Bureau through which graduates and qualified undergraduates are placed in teaching positions in the religious schools of this city. There are twenty-nine affiliated Religious Schools in this city which give preference to the grauates of this School. All applicants for admission to the School must be High School graduates. The School pursues an intensive curriculum in Hebrew for those who enter

with a knowledge of the language. Beginners classes are also organized. Tuition at the Hebrew Union College School for Teachers is free. A nominal registration fee of \$2 per semester is charged. With a student enrollment of 220, the New Jersey Normal School for Jewish

Teachers, the first of its kind in the state, will formally commence its sessions tomorrow night, October 5, with public exercises in Temple B'nai Jeshurun, in whose building the school will be housed. The speakers at the opening exercises will include Dr. David Corson, City Superintendent of Schools, Dr. Wilson Farrand, Headmaster of the Newark Academy; Abraham N. Franz-blau, principal of the Hebrew Union College School for Teachers in New York; Rabbi Solomon Foster, president of the new school and Dr. Leon Mones, director. A musical program has been arranged by Cantor Maurice Cowan of the temple. The new institution is privately supported and will be governed by a board of directors and a Students' Advisory Council. The instructors will be Rabbi Foster, Dr. Mones, Dr. Henry M. Gold-stein and Charles Rubens. The subjects taught will include History, Hebrew, Religion, Pedagogy, etc. An advanced course in Hebrew and supple-

mentary lectures will be given.

Some of the most prominent Jews in England have acquired shares in the Judea Industrial Corporation, which is chartered in the State of New York and is the owner of the Judea Insurance Company, Ltd., with the home office in Jerusalem, Judge Strahl declared.

Dictatorship is in the air and the name of the Premier, General Averescu -the favorite of the army-is very much to the fore in this connection. The Roumanian Fascists have been spurred on by Mussolini who seeks to destroy the "little Entente" and promises that instead of it he will get Russia to recognize the Roumanian annexation of Bessarabia. Averescu is at present in Italy and the Roumanian press is full of praise for Mussolini and Italy.

The young Cuzists have accurately sized up the feeling of the moment and they are in a hurry to put on black shirts. This has been made clear enough in a speech delivered for the Parliamentary tribune by Deputy Valerian Pon who demanded the establishment of a dictatorship. "All Latin States," he declared, "had dictators at one time or another. A striking ex-ample is Mussolini in Italy. From among our own ranks, too, a dictator will arise who with his mailed fist will bring justice to the Roumanian people!" On whose head the mailed fist of this dictator savior is to fall first, that goes without saying. The anti-Semitic fascists make no bones about their hatred of the Jews and do not try to conceal their intentions.
