Many individual European Jews are furthering the Pan-European movement by giving it financial support.

Among the messages received from various countries were those from Luigi Luzzatti, Leon Blum, Georg Brandes, Georg Bernhard, Harry War-burg and Max Rheinhardt. Count Coudenhove Kalergi, who is

INTERNATIONAL CONGRESS URGES SPEED IN REGARD TO MINORITIES COMPLAINTS (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Salzburg, Oct. 4.-The procedure of the League of Nations in dealing with the complaints of the national minorities was discussed at Saturday's session of the International Congress of the Union of League of Nations Societies being held here.

The congress, in a resolution adopted, urged the League of Nations that the investigation of the complaints of the national minorities submitted to the League should not exceed a period of six months. When the efforts to reach a peaceful settlement between the majority government and the minorities fails, the Council of the League of Nations is to have the right to decide the matter without an appeal. If the par-ties resist, the Council is to enforce its decision, the resolution urged.

PASMANIK DENIES REPORTS OF COMMUNIST PRESS; WILL NOT AID PETLURA GROUP (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Paris, Oct. 4.—Reports of the Communist press in Russia concerning D. Pasmanik, Russian Jewish leader affiliated with monarchist circles, were denied by Mr. Pasmanik in a statement issued to the Jewish Telegraphic Agency here.

The Communist press reported that Pasmanik will appear as an attorney at Schwartzbard's trial, representing the Petlura group. Many articles in the Soviet press were devoted to a discussion of this report, in which Pasmanik was attacked. Mr. Pasmanik declared in his statement that there is no foundation in these rumors as he is taking no part whatsoever in the case.

35,000 AMERICAN JEWS IN PATRIOTIC DEMONSTRA-TION AT SESOUI EXHIBIT

Jewish Contributions to America

Lauded by Speakers (Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Philadelphia, Pa., Oct. 4.—Thirty-five thousand Jews participated in a huge patriotic demonstration in the grand auditorium of the Sesqui-Centennial, Sunday afternoon. The celebration was arranged under the auspices of the Independent Order B'rith Abraham.

The group, representing a colorful assembly of Jews of American birth and adoption, commemorated the birth of the United States and paid tribute to the part played by American Jews in its development.

Large delegations were present from many sections of the country, including New York, Massachusetts, Maryland and Delaware. Thousands, it is estimated, were turned away, after every inch of available standing room had been occupied.

The climax of an evening of laudation which began with the address of Mayor W. Freeland Kendrick, who welcomed the audience to the Sesqui, came with the address of Senator Edward I. Edwards, former Governor of New Jersey, who delivered a scathing ar-raignment of intolerance.

After reviewing the Jewish contribution to the development of the American nation, he declared that discrimination against the Jew has no place in a country which takes its principles of freedom from the Bible.

He decried the Nordic Conception of Americanism declaring that "No man is un-American because he is not 100 per cent Nordic. The Jew who comes (Continued on Page 3)

CAUCASIAN OFFICIAL TRIED FOR EXTORTION OF JEWS (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Moscow, Oct. 4 .- A trial reminiscent of medieval practices was opened in Kuban, Caucasia. The main figure in the trial is a certain Dr. Adamiantz, a Caucasion official against whom charges were brought that he terrorized the Jewish population in the Caucasian mountain regions by applying medieval methods of extortion. Evidence sub-mitted by the Jewish workers club showed that Dr. Adamiantz demanded fifty roubles from Jewish couples apbeing merely an introduction, plying for marriage licenses.

OPPENHEIMER, AGRICULTURE EXPERT, DEMANOS CHANGES IN PALESTINE COLONIZATION

Is Hopeful for Outlook, But Indicts Kvutzoth System (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Oct. 4. — An indictment against the Kvutzoth, the Socialist co-operative form of farm settlement largely employed by the Zionist Organization in its colonization work in Palestine, was made by Dr. Franz Oppenheimer of the University of Frankfurt, Germany, in a lecture he delivered here at the Konzerthaus on his impressions of Palestine. Dr. Oppenheimer, who recently re-

turned from Palestine, where he studied the agricultural settlements, declared: "The fight of armed labor against capital in Palestine is senseless for the simple reason that there is no capitalism in Palestine. In the field of colonization in Palestine, the Moshav, that is the farm operated on a basis of individual ownership, is in the majority of cases sound and even capable of being taxed. There is also hope for the small Kyutzoth, on the condition that reforms are introduced in these settle-However, so far as the large ments. Kvutzoth are concerned, they spell The large wasted labor and money. Kvutzoth produce only thirty per cent a waste and represent a terrible mockery of farming. In them, lack of dis-cipline is the rule, based on a misun-derstood and false conception of free-

"It is the holy command of the hour to immediately disband the large Kyutzoth. Only the Moshay type of settlement and the cooperatives, if placed under the management of a strong hand and iron discipline, for a period of five years, will make possible further colonization work. The communes waste men and money," he stated.

As to the general political outlook for Palestine, Prof. Oppenheimer stated his opinion that "in Palestine the Jewish people will never be the master people. There is only the alternative of a

The Index, which is arranged alphabetically and according to subject, has been compiled by a staff of workers headed by Miss Frieda R. Bienstock. It is provided with a foreword by Mr. Jacob Landau, managing director of the "Jewish Daily Bulletin."

The Index, which is the first attempt at a systematic arrangement of Jewish news items, presents a key to contem-porary Jewish history. It is obtainable from the "Jewish Daily Bulletin" office and the price is \$2.50.

Professor Oppenheimer's Criticism

The statement of Professor Franz Oppenheimer, noted Zionist and originally the proponent of cooperative colonization in Palestine, that following his recent visit to Palestine he is disanpointed with the state of colonization there because of the Socialist tendencies prevailing in the colonies, is discussed editorially by the "Jewish Daily News" of Oct. 3. "It is true Prof. Oppenheimer does

not mention the cooperatives, but when he speaks of the Jewish colonization settlements in Palestine he certainly cannot be referring to such colonies as Petach Tikwah, Rishon l'Zion, Reboboth and the other settlements where Socialism never had any influence, has none today and never will have," the paper observes.

"It was Prof. Oppenheimer and none other who inaugurated in Palestine the experiment of colonies on a cooperative basis. It was under his influence that the Zionist organization invested large sums of money in these experiments about which there is still considerable difference of opinion today as to whether they will have any results or not. Hitherto they have all suffered deficits. It is therefore surprising to hear from Oppenheimer himself that Socialist tendencies are bad for colonization, exactly what the opponents of Oppenheimer's Socialist Zionism have contended right along. In other words, if the reports are correct, Oppenheimer has confessed that Socialist tendencies are a handicap to colonization. would mean that he admits that the cooperative system which has absorbed so much money is wrong and that the opponents of Socialist experiments in Palestine have gained a new recruitthe father of the experiments himself!

"As to Prof. Oppenheimer's assertion," the paper continues, "that the solution lies in a 'strong man' who could help out the Palestine colonization, this will surely find approval in many Zionist circles. The opinion has been expressed long ago that the Zionist Organization ought to free itself a little from the rule of the radicals under which it is subjected in Palestine:"

to America and is admitted to citizenship is presumed to be just as good an idge. His record and not his race should determine his patriotism.

America has become the melting pot, because it wanted to become the melting pot, he stated: "It was we who encouraged our neighbors across the sea to join hands with us in perfecting the magic alchemy which has made of us an unconquering and unconquered people. It was of our own choosing that America was made the melting pot of the world."

His own conception of the spirit of tolerance which should prevail he de-fined when he said: "No man is an alien who lives in and loves a free country; no man is without a country who is domiciled in America; no man is un-American because he is not 100 per cent Nordic. Americanism is de-fined in terms of deeds and acts, not in terms of racial distinctions.

"As a free born subject of this Republic and as a Senator of these United States, I deprecate with all the verbal energy at my command, the growing tendency in this country to revive a race prejudice against the Jew which up to a decade or more ago had been gradually disappearing.

"There is no place in our institutions, our lives or in modern history, for intolerance toward the Iew as a race.

"The Jew in the movement for American independence is not a myth. Neither is he a factor of impotence or intellectual nullity. Although no Jew immortalized his name on the great Declaration of Independence, Jewish history, Jewish minds. Jewish culture and the Jewish birthright which long antedates medieval and modern achievement left their imprint to guide the fathers. Your blood and my blood has thrilled to the same call of independence," he declared.

"Let us never forget that we are a happy conglomeration of alien tonges. indissolubly joined and we must not permit any class or any sections of these tongues, whether they be pure Nordic or of a mixed strain to dominate Our material interests are as varied as the constellation above and it is because of this variety that we must pull together and aim at a common destiny. We must cultivate a dis-position to tolerate opinions, beliefs, practices and conduct differing from OUT OWN

"Of all the bigotries that ravage the human temper, there is none so stupid as the anti-Semitic.' Thusly reads the tribute to your race from Hon. David Lloyd George. What then has the Jew to fear, if he is honest, upright and courageous?"

France Needs 700,000 Additional Immigrants, Noted Authority Declares

(By Our Paris Correspondent, J. Shechtman) Paris, Sept. 20.—That France's only hope of salvaging her national existence lies in immigration and that, in fact, the country needs and can easily absorb at least 700,000 additional immigrants, is the statement made here by Professor Roger Picar, noted French scholar and member of the Executive Committee of the League of Human Rights.

This conclusion, which will prove of no small interest to the Jews whose migration problem at present is so acute, was arrived at by Prof. Picar on the basis of an extensive investigation, the results of which he has now

made public.

In 1911, according to Prof. Picar. France's population consisted of 36,-605,000. After the war the country (not including Alsace-Lorraine) had 37,500,000. In absolute figures_ (not considering natural increase) France lost in the war more than 2,000,000 persons. Including Alsace-Lorraine the loss totalle: 2,400,000. France cannot get along without these almost 2,500,000 individuals, for economic as well as military and political reasons. This is generally admitted. But who is to replace these 2,500,000 hands that toiled and produced before the war?

Prof. Picar contends it is the immi grants. He does not polemyze with the chauvinists who fulminate against aliens. He produces figures, which show that: In 1911 there were 1,330,000 foreigners in France, while in 1925 there were 2,845,000, an increase of only 1,700,000. In order to cover the war losses France needs 2,400,000 persons, and, without figuring those that have already arrived, she must have at least 700,000 new immigrants. With-out these 700,000 the country is short in hands for its factories, mines_and farms. In this way, it appears, Prof. Picar says, that France is doing the immigrants no favor in admitting them, but on the contrary, the immigrants are enriching the country and helping it to regain its economic stability.

clusion of his lecture that the London Zionist Executive asked him by telegram for permission to publish the full text of his survey, to which he consented.

A statement issued vesterday by the Zionist Organization of America declared:

"In a cable received by Louis Lipsky, president of the Zionist Organization of America and made public yesterday, Prof. Franz Oppenheimer of the University of Frankfort and an authority on colonization, states his conviction that there is a good outlook for Jewish agriculture in Palestine. Prof. Oppenheimer has just returned from a trip to Palestine, where he made a special study of agricultural methods. In his message to Mr. Lipsky he states that some of these methods should be changed in the interests of efficiency.

"Prof. Oppenheimer was associated in colonization experiments in Palestine and was the first to introduce the cooperative method at the request of the World Zionist Organization. The first cooperative settlement established under his supervision was the colony of Merchavia in the Valley of Jezreel. Prof. Oppenheimer's message, as made public by Mr. Lipsky, is as follows:

"In the interests of efficiency, I believe changing some agricultural methods indispensable. I am still strongly convinced there is a good outlook for Jewish agricultural settlement in Pal-

CZERNOWITZ POLICE RAID JEWISH LABOR ORGANIZA-TIONS; NO REASON GIVEN (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Czernowitz, Oct. 4.-The Tewish labor club of this city was searched by the police last night. Many workers were arrested and documents were seized. It is understood that the search was ordered by the military authorities.

A search was also made by the political police at the Poale Zion kitchen where fifteen persons were arrested. The police also raided the office of the Hias, Hebrew Immigrant Aid Society, where two refugees, Korman and Trachtenberg, were arrested. tenberg was recently released from the Jassy prison after serving fourteen months.

The reason for the arrests has not been made known.

PROFESSOR FALKENHEIM CELEBRATES 70TH BIRTHDAY

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency Mail Service) Berlin, Sept. 5 .- Dr. Hugo Falkenheim celebrated his seventieth birth-

day yesterday at Koenigsberg.

For many years Professor Falkenheim has been active in the Central Union of German Citizens of the Tewish Faith. He has been a resident in Koenigsberg since 1885.

He was appointed Professor Extra-ordinary in 1896 at the Albertus University in Koenigsberg and head of the University Children's Clinic, which he founded. For many years he was unable to attain the regular Professorship because he was a Jew and it was not until the establishment of the Republic that this rank was conferred upon him. In 1924 he was made Dean of the Medical Faculty of the University. During the war he served as Doctor-in-Chief in one of the Koenigsberg prison hospitals and at the end of the war retired with the rank of Doctor-General in the Reserve.
