LONDON LIBERAL JEWISH SYNAGOGUE INTRODUCES FIRST SUNDAY SERVICES

New Prayer Books Contain Poems by
Browning, Shelley and Keats
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

London, Oct. 9.—A new departure in the development of the Liberal Jewish movement in England was marked here when the Liberal Jewish Synagogue announced today that it has instituted Sunday services.

This step, which introduces for the first time in London Sunday services at a Jewish synagogue, is in consonance with the radical tendency of the Liberal Jewish movement in this country and its leader Mr. Claude Montefiore.

Rabbi Israel Mattuck, Rabbi of the Liberal Jewish Synagogue, has prepared three volumes of prayer books to be used in the services of his synagogue. The prayers include poems by Browning, Shelley, Keats and Tennyson.

ALFRED MOND EXPECTED BACK IN LONDON TODAY

London, Oct. 9.—Sir Alfred and Lady Mond are expected here Monday, on their return from their American trip.

Sir Alfred is returning in time to participate in the Palestine Economic Conference which will begin here Monday under the chairmanship of Sir Herbert Samuel and with the participation of a number of noted Zionist and non-Zionist figures.

The conference was arranged for the purpose of creating a non-partisan finance and economic committee to advise the Zionist Executive in the work of Palestine reconstruction.

JEWISH INVALIDS WILL APPEAL TO AMERICAN JEWS

I.O.B.B. HILLEL FOUNDATION IS ESTABLISHED AT UN- IVERSITY OF MICHIGAN

President Little of Michigan University
Welcomes New Foundation
(Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Cincinnati, O., Oct. 9.—A B'nai B'rith Hillel Foundation for religious, social and recreational assistance to Jewish students was opened at the University of Michigan at Ann Arbor, a statement issued by Alfred M. Cohen, president of the Independent Order B'nai B'rith, announced. This is the fourth Hillel Foundation to be established so far by the I. O. B. B.

Dr. C. C. Little, President of the University of Michigan, is among the college president who are interested in this program. "At a time when the application of a higher idealism to student life is the most vital concern of all our universities," Dr. Little said, "It is most gratifying to know of the establishment of a branch of the Hillel Foundation at the University of Michigan. To preserve what is best in the Jewish religion and to apply its principle in cooperation with Christianity will do much to help unify the student body and to give it a better under-

LODZ JEWS TO BE TRIED: ANTI-SEMITISM CHARGED

Lodz, Oct. 9.—Fifty-three witnesses will be called to testify in a sensational trial of three Jews that will begin here on October 13. The three Jews who are prominent manufacturers of this city, are charged with incendiarism. Their factory burned down recently and the accusation declares that the three Jews were responsible for the fire, their alleged intention being to collect on an insurance policy of \$20,000.

The defense points out the inconsistency of the charge in view of the fact that in the course of the fire a large sum of paper money belonging to the owners of the factory as well as a number of valuable documents, were destroyed.

The case of the three Jewish manufacturers has aroused widespread interest as it is believed by many that the accusation is motivated by anti-Jewish feeling.

TRANSJORDANIA ABOLISHES ALL TITLES; ONE EXCEPTION

Jerusalem, Oct. 9.—The spirit of democracy prevailing in a large part of the Western world has penetrated into the East, as evidenced by the abolition, through an order issued today by the Transjordanian Government, of all titles, such as Excellency, Pasha and Bey.

The only person who will from now on be permitted to use the title Excellency will be the Premier.

INTERNATIONAL CONGRESS OF AMERICANISTS DISCUSSES COLUMBUS' JEWISH ORIGIN

Prof. Cortecan of Lisbon Expresses
Belief Columbus Was Jew
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Rome, Oct. 9.—The question of the Jewish origin of Columbus was one of the principal topics of discussion at the International Congress of Americanists which is being held here now.

The Congress of Americanists is attended by historians and scholars from all over the world, who are especially interested in the study of the history and characteristics of the various peoples of America.

The conviction that Columbus was of Jewish descent was expressed to the representative of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency by Professor Cortecan of the Lisbon University. In the course of his interview Prof. Cortecan declared that the researches of Spanish and Portuguese scholars, especially of Don Enrique Zais, showed that Columbus was born in Spain in the province of Galicia, and that he originated from the Crypto-Jews or Marranos. "That this is so on the basis of researches made so far, is practically certain," Prof. Cortecan declared.

A number of Jewish scholars are participating in the Congress. Among them are Professors Almadizic of Rome, Levi of Florence, Davidson and Wiener of Harvard and Sternberg of Leningrad.

COUNTESS SCHNABEL GETS THREE MONTHS' SENTENCE

Potsdam, Germany, Oct. 9.—A sentence of three months imprisonment was imposed yesterday on Countess Hessold Schnabel, whose case recently created a sensation when it was learned that she had forged the will of her late husband, Prof. Schnabel of the Robert Koch Institute for Infectious Diseases, who was a Jew.

In repeating her confession in the court room yesterday, the Countess said she had invested much of her money in a beautiful island villa estate owned by her husband, and sought to prevent "grasping relatives" from obtaining her husband's fortune. As her husband died intestate, she declared she

TEL AVIV WILL BECOME
PALESTINE'S RAIL CENTER

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency Mail Service)

Jerusalem, Sept. 17.—A step of vital importance for the further development of the rapidly growing Jewish town of Tel Aviv has just been taken by the Colonial Office in London, it is learned here, by its decision to approve the proposed transfer of the Palestine Railway Junction from Ludd to Tel Aviv.

The proposal to make Tel Aviv the center of Palestine's railway system, which would to a large extent compensate the Tel Aviv and Jaffa district for the decision to build the Palestine harbor at Haifa and not at Jaffa, dates back to the appointment by Sir Herbert Samuel in March, 1925, of a Commission to consider the advisability of transferring the Railway Junction to Tel Aviv from Ludd. The Commission which consisted of the Directors of the various government departments, the mayors of Jaffa and Tel Aviv and the presidents of the Jewish and Arab chambers of commerce of Jaffa and the Tel Aviv chamber of commerce, reported favorably on the proposal. Ludd, which is about ten miles from Tel Aviv is the junction for the Kantara-Haifa and Jaffa-Jerusalem railway lines.

Dr. Nissou Touroff, former head of the Palestine School and until recently President of the Hebrew Teachers' College of Boston, has accepted the Professorship in the Department of Hebrew at the Jewish Institute of Religion, according to an announcement made today by the Acting President of the Institute, Dr. Stephen S. Wise.

Dr. Touroff translated into Hebrew Prof. William James' "Talks to Teachers," as well as the many of the works of the French psychologist, Ribot. For four years, Dr. Touroff was editor of "Hachinuach," the only magazine in Hebrew devoted entirely to the science of education.

The Young Folks' League of the East Mid-west Jewish Centre of Brooklyn has engaged the Opera House of the Brooklyn Academy of Music for Saturday evening, Nov. 13, at which time it will present Louis N. Parker's famous play, "Disraeli."

The proceeds will be donated to the building fund of the new centre which is being constructed at a cost of \$500,000.

Urges U. J. C. to Continue

That the United Jewish Campaign for East European Relief and Jewish colonization in Russia which was originally intended as a drive for a brief period will have to be continued for a number of years to come is the assertion made in the "Forward" of New York by Zion, who writes on the Chicago conference in the issue of October 9.

"At the conference in Philadelphia," the writer says, "the question whether or not Jewish colonization in Soviet Russia is merely a fantastic enterprise undeserving of attention was discussed. Today, however, the Jewish colonization is a fact which no one attempts to deny. Today there is only one question. Where can sufficient funds be secured to satisfy the growing desire of Jews in Soviet Russia to settle on the land?"

Dr. Rosen reports that despite the fact that last year only one-fourth of those desirous to settle on the land were taken care of, an additional thirty thousand families have registered for land settlement this year.

"When the conference in Philadelphia was held it was sought to create the impression that the relief work was being renewed only for a brief period. Fifteen million dollars would be secured and that would close the renewed activities, it was stated. It is to be hoped that at the Chicago conference, however, there will be no talk about stopping the work, but rather of pursuing it with added energy.

"Jewish colonization work in Soviet Russia will require the assistance of America for a number of years to come and America must not withhold this help. It is the most important assistance which the Jews of America can possibly render their brothers on the other side, and American Jewry can give, if it only wishes."

The Kosher Kitchen at Harvard

The establishment of a kosher kitchen for the Jewish students at Harvard University, which some time ago was charged with anti-Jewish tendencies, is commented on by the Jewish press.

"We do not know exactly," observes the "Jewish Morning Journal," "to whom credit is due for this achievement. At any rate the influence of the late President Emeritus of Harvard, Dr. Eliot's last address in which he called upon the students of the University to stick to their respective religious traditions, is to be felt. Time often achieves what the mind does not. Only a year ago Harvard University was accused of anti-Semitism and now it has a kosher restaurant for its Jewish students."

The "Jewish Daily News," Orthodox paper of New York, regards the estab-

lishment of the kosher kitchen of Harvard as an indication of the growing influence of Judaism among the Jewish students.

"We believe," the paper remarks, "that since the Union of Orthodox Congregations has found it necessary to establish a kosher restaurant in Harvard, the Union, no doubt, previously made an investigation to ascertain whether there would be a sufficient patronage for such a restaurant. We may assume, therefore, that Judaism is growing among the Jewish students. Years ago it would have been impossible to do such a thing at any university in America."

"There is another point in connection with this," the paper further writes, "Sometime ago there was talk of an unfriendly attitude toward the Jews on the part of Harvard University, that the heads of Harvard were displeased at the number of Jewish students at the institution. Whether this was true or not is of no importance in relation to the subject we are discussing here. It is important, however, that the Jews answered—with a kosher restaurant! We think there could be no more appropriate reply to unfriendliness than to stand firmly by things that are Jewish."

K. K. K. Kaputt

Under the above caption the New York "Times" of Friday presents an editorial review of the present situation of the Ku Klux Klan throughout the country. The paper finds that the Klan is on the wane everywhere and observes in conclusion:

"The K. K. K. will have, has already, successors. There will always be fanatics and fools, crooks to exploit them, politicians eager to use them; and when we see tolerance prevalent in the United States, we shall yank our ascension robe out of the closet. As true believers in 'the Nordics'—if we could find out what 'a Nordie' is—we are constantly pained by the knowledge that the latest consummate flower of bigotry blooms on the old American stock. Where is the Americanization brigade?"

Fire Commissioner John J. Dorman, whose joke over the radio last May about a "Mr. Cohen" caused several Jewish organizations to demand his resignation on the ground that he had reflected on Jewish people in general, was among the five men installed Friday night as honorary members of the Naar Tomid, an association of Hebrew firemen in the New York Fire Department.

The installation was at the Riverside Synagogue before several hundred firemen and their relatives and friends. The other new honorary numbers installed were Dr. Harry M. Archer, Honorary Fire Department Surgeon; General Sessions Judge Max S. Levine; W. W. Cohen, an honorary Deputy Fire Chief, and Dr. William J. Rosenkrantz, a Bronx physician interested in the welfare of firemen.

Benjamin Schwartz, editor of the "Jewish Times" of Baltimore, succeeded Dr. Leo J. Frachtenberg as head of the United Palestine Appeal Region No. 4 with headquarters in Philadelphia, according to an announcement issued by Bernard Stone, National Executive Director of the Appeal.

JEWISH PEOPLE ARE KEEPERS OF PALESTINE GATES, DECLARES NEW NATIONAL CHAIRMAN OF U. P. A.

Judge William M. Lewis, Head of \$7,500,000 Campaign, Issues His First Statement; Economic Possibilities of Palestine Have Become Matter of Established Fact, He Declares

"The economic possibilities of Palestine have graduated from the plane of discussion. They have become a matter of established fact."

This assertion was made by Judge William M. Lewis of Philadelphia in the first statement issued by him since he was elected recently national chairman of the United Palestine Appeal, which will conduct a drive of seven and a half million dollars during the coming year.

Pointing to the economic possibilities of Palestine today and referring to the outlook for the United Palestine Appeal in American Jewry, Judge Lewis called upon the Jews of America to cooperate with him in his leadership of the forthcoming campaign. His statement reads:

"In the rebuilding of the Jewish National Home, the Jews of America have assumed an obligation for which they will in time be called upon to answer at the bar of history. A terrible need, crying aloud for solution, has been coupled with a glorious opportunity calling for realization: hundreds of thousands of homeless and hopeless Jews in the still benighted land of Eastern Europe on the one hand, and Palestine, wide open for Jewish immigration and development, on the other.

"Both the need and the opportunity are clear. And I believe it is time to cease complaining of restrictive immigration regulations in Palestine. However it may be with other lands, when it comes to Palestine, we, the Jewish people are the keepers of the gate. It is not regulations that restrict, it is economic opportunities. Let us enlarge these opportunities and the regulations will vanish.

"The economic possibilities of Palestine have graduated from the plane of discussion. They have become a matter of established fact. Numerous branches of agriculture—fruit raising, dairying, vegetable-growing, tobacco culture—have been proven successful. A growing population of 30,000 is living on the soil attached to it not alone with the bonds of economic interest, but with a passionate love that centuries of separation have only served to deepen. Industry, properly conducted and financed, has also proven successful. It is but necessary to point to that group of industrial establishments—the Nesher Cement Factory, the Shemen Oil Works, the Palestine Flour Mills, the Palestine Salt Works—that cluster around Haifa, the city destined to become the leading port of the Near East. It is but necessary to see the electric power plants of the Ruttenberg Concession multiplying in the country. And with agriculture and industry thriving and expanding, commerce will take care of itself.

"The Jews are too experienced and

intelligent a people to think that this expansion can take place without the assistance of outside capital. We want the land to flow again with milk and honey. But it has lain too long neglected and waste. It cannot, like the Phoenix, spring suddenly to new life out of its ashes. It is true that Palestine is the classic land of miracles. The miracle that is now being enacted in it is a miracle of labor and love. Through our labor and devotion in this country, we, the Jews of America, are helping in the achievement of the miracle.

"The program for the year's work in Palestine has been announced. It is a simple and easily understood program. It calls for a large increase in land purchased by the Jewish National Fund, the consolidation and expansion of our agricultural colonization activities, provision for a larger immigration and maintenance and extension of the educational system, all of this under the conduct of the Keren Hayesod. Then there is the maintenance and extension of the hospitals and other health service by Hadassah, the encouragement of industry through credit facilities, participation in the Ruttenberg Concession, the Hebrew University and many other activities. It is a program that speaks clearly in terms of statesmanship and for an eventual Jewish commonwealth. It is a program that has been estimated to require for the year the sum of \$10,000,000. And of this sum, the United Palestine Appeal asks the Jews of America to furnish \$7,500,000.

"Is it too much to ask of the Jews of America? Considered in the light of the great purpose, that sum is little enough. It is certainly within the means of the Jews of America. It is also, and the past year has proven it, not beyond their generosity and comprehension of the great purpose.

"In taking up the burden of the office of chairman of the United Palestine Appeal, and on the eve of the intensive effort that is about to be launched all over the country, I appeal for the generous cooperation of all the Jews of America."

An increase over last year of \$250,000 in the remittances this year of the American branch of the Keren Hayesod to Palestine is reported by Morris Rothenberg, Chairman of the National Board of Directors of the Keren Hayesod, in a statement issued by him last week. The remittances during the year, ending September last, amounted to \$1,500,000 representing an increase of \$250,000 over and above the commitments of the American Keren Hayesod to the Palestine Zionist Executive.

The increase this year, Mr. Rothenberg states, was made possible by the success of the United Palestine Appeal

FEDERATION OF NEW YORK WORLD'S LARGEST COMMUNITY CHEST, REPORT SHOWS

The Federation for the Support of Jewish Philanthropic Societies of New York is the greatest community chest in the world, both in point of money spent by its constituent agencies and the number of agencies maintained, according to figures made public yesterday by Sol. M. Stroock, president of the Federation.

Pointing out that the Federation's 91 constituent societies expend \$8,500,000 annually and that of this amount the Federation is called on to raise \$4,720,000 from the public this year, the balance coming from trust funds legacies and other sources, Mr. Stroock's statement gives a detailed report on the various activities of the Federation.

Among the Federation institutions, it is pointed out, are child-caring agencies, vocational education schools, agencies handling delinquent problems, hospitals and medical social service agencies; schools and homes for the physically handicapped; agencies for the relief of the sick and needy, schools for religious education; fresh air camps, community centers and a home for the aged and infirm. Typical of the work done by the relief group, whose budgetary allowance this year by the Federation is \$805,274.04, is Mr. Stroock's explanation of what these institutions are doing this year. His summary follows:

Federation Employment Bureau for Jewish Girls secures employment for about 4,700 girls; also gives 91 scholarships to school boys and girls.

Hebrew Free Loan Society makes about 14,000 loans ranging from \$5 to \$500; total amount of loans being over \$1,000,000.

Jewish Sabbath Alliance secures employment for about 400 individuals observing the Sabbath.

Ladies Fuel and Aid Society provides about 1,000 families with coal and Pass-over supplies.

National Desertion Bureau, since its inception, has handled over 15,000 family cases, attending to desertion cases and giving some material relief to deserted families.

Jewish Social Service Association takes care of about 4,000 families, comprising about 16,000 individuals; conducts a self-support department; provides vocational guidance for children; and conducts home economics classes.

Widowed Mothers' Fund Association cares for more than 200 widows, who are unable to support themselves, and their 850 children.

The agencies dealing with the handicapped have a budgetary allowance every year from Federation of \$55,388.

UNIVERSAL PILGRIMAGE TO PALESTINE PLANNED

The enlistment of the Jewish, Christian and Mohammedan faiths for the purpose of conducting large scale pilgrimages of veneration to Palestine from November 11, 1928 to November 11, 1929, the tenth anniversary year since the declaration of the armistice ending the World War, is planned by the Palestine Chamber of Commerce in New York. This was decided upon at a meeting of the Chamber held in New York last week. An effort to secure the collaboration of Christian and Mohammedan bodies in the United States, Europe and Palestine will be made by a committee appointed for this purpose.

Tentative plans call for marked reductions in steamship transportation by the Mediterranean Conference, American Steamship lines, as well as North European lines. Special facilities on the Egyptian railroads to accommodate tourists will be granted prospective travelers to Palestine. In Palestine special exhibits of the accomplishments of the three major faiths will be staged for the pilgrims.

The opinion is expressed that for the period of this universal pilgrimage, Palestine's adverse trade balance of thirty million dollars will be wiped out by the disbursements of the many thousands of tourists in excess of the usual seasonal visitors.

who profit by controlling it; those who profit by splitting the fees; those politicians who profit through its machinations, and sincere people who labor under the impression that its perpetuity is essential to the nation.

"Groups have a right to unite in a democratic way; but no group has the right to organize to control despotically. If this sort of thing is allowed to go on, we shall have controlled political parties, press, business, industry and pulpit, all under the most despotic type of surveillance."

Rev. Beebe denounced the organization as a "one-man Order," made to serve the interests of an individual.

W. J. Harriman of Lincoln, Neb., who promised to tell of the Klan's dark deeds, was prevented from doing so when over 1,000 Klan members who were present at the meeting, arose en masse and left the auditorium when he began speaking.
