

CHAIM, MODERN MORDECAI, IS EXECUTED IN TEHERAN; OTHER JEWS ENDANGERED

**Intervention of British Government
Invoked by Bagdad Zionists**

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Bagdad, Oct. 19.—A wave of excitement is agitating the Oriental Jewish communities, particularly in Persia and Mesopotamia, over the execution of a leading Persian Jew in Teheran several days ago.

The Jew, Chaim, was a former member of the Persian parliament and was one of a group who were accused by the Shah's government of having been implicated in a plot to kill the Shah. Four other Persian Jews were arrested on the charge of conspiracy and it is feared death sentences will be pronounced upon them.

It is the general consensus of opinion that Chaim was innocent of the charge. An expression to this feeling was given in a cablegram addressed by the Zionist Organization of Bagdad to the Zionist Executive in London, asking for intervention with the British Foreign Office.

Chaim was a prominent leader of the Jewish community in Persia and played a conspicuous part in the political life of the country, always protesting to the Persian government against the persecution of Jews in Persia. Chaim was regarded by the Jews of Persia as their present day Mordecai. He was a member of the Zionist Organization of Persia.

LITHUANIAN JEWS HAVE LOWEST PERCENTAGE OF ILLITERATES IN COUNTRY

Kovno, Oct. 19.—The Jewish population in Lithuania has the lowest number of illiterates among all the racial groups in the country, notwithstanding the fact that the public school system was not available for Jews until recently.

This fact came to light when statistics concerning illiteracy in the Republic were made known. According to these figures, the number of illiterates among the Russians in Lithuania is 66%, White Russians 67%, Lithuanians 60%, Poles 55%, Germans 42% and the Jews 32%.

TO TRAVERSE PATRIARCH'S ROUTE BY AUTO IN 3½ DAYS

Jerusalem, Oct. 19.—The route covered by Abraham the Patriarch on his wanderings from Ur of the Chaldeans to Palestine will be shortened by the introduction of American modes of communication.

A regular automobile service was established between Jerusalem and Bagdad, the capital of Mesopotamia. The journey by automobile will take three and a half days.

"BACCALAUREATE" IS ROUMANIAN FORM FOR ANTI-JEWISH NUMERUS CLAUSUS

**Twenty Jewish Pupils in Czernowitz Arrested When They Protest Against
Unfair Examinations; School Question Involving Minors
Causes Political Agitation in Bukovina**

Bucharest, Oct. 19.—"The Baccalaureate" is the Roumanian form of a secret numerus clausus against Jewish pupils, it now develops when registration for the new term has ended.

It appears that in order to avoid the introduction of an official numerus clausus Understate Secretary Angelescu introduced a "baccalaureate" system whereby all pupils applying for enrollment are to be examined by special professors for matriculation. This move put the pupils of all the national minorities in Roumania and particularly the Jewish pupils at the mercy of the anti-Semitic professors. The result of this arrangement was that seventy per cent of all the pupils of the

national minorities in Roumania applying for admission were flunked on the examinations. When the results became known a group of parents submitted a protest to the Roumanian Minister of Education demanding that the "baccalaureate" examinations be cancelled and that the pupils be given another chance under fair conditions. This protest was disregarded by the Ministry, with the result that all the Roumanian pupils passed the examinations, while only 30% of the German and Ukrainian pupils and 15% of the Jewish pupils were passed.

When the results of the examinations were made public, a group of pupils of the national minorities in Czernowitz, Bukovina, directed an inquiry of the cause of their failure. Instead of showing the reasons, the professors refused to make any reply and instead made anti-Semitic speeches. The pupils organized and demonstrated against the examining professors who are in the Cuza movement. The professors interpreted this as a "dangerous Jewish attack on two Christian professors."

Twenty Jewish pupils of the secondary schools were arrested last week in Czernowitz under suspicion that they plotted an attack against anti-Semitic professors. The news was suppressed by the Roumanian censor, the full facts not being available until now.

Warsaw, Oct. 19.—The admission of Polish Jews to full cooperation in the economic and cultural development of Poland will bring the best results for the country, August Zaleski, Polish Foreign Minister in the Pilsudski cabinet, stated in an interview with Jacob Landau, managing director of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency.

"I follow with friendly interest the achievements of the Zionist movement," the minister stated. "The development of the activity of the Zionist Organization in Poland encounters no difficulties. A decree instructing the administration authorities to regard the Zionist Organization

TIBERIAS HOT SPRINGS CONCESSIONS TO BE GIVEN TO SYRIANS, IS RUMOR

Jerusalem, Oct. 19.—The governmental concession for the operation of the famous hot springs of Tiberias will be granted to a Syrian company, according to a rumor circulated here.

The concession, it is rumored, will run for thirty years, the company being obliged to pay £2,500 yearly to the government. A provision of the contract imposes the obligation on the company to establish modern baths at the springs.

**QUEEN MARIE EMBARRASSED
WHEN JEWISH QUESTION IS
RAISED DURING INTERVIEW**

**King Is Fond of the Jews, She Replies;
"What Happened to Pride of the
Jews?" Socialist Leader Asks**

The Jewish question in Roumania was brought to the attention of the American public interested in the visit here of Queen Marie by a representative of a New York Jewish newspaper when 200 press representatives met the Queen on the Leviathan.

"I am the representative of a Jewish paper. We would like to know your Government's attitude toward the Jews in Roumania," the reporter asked the Queen.

For a moment there was an oppressive silence. The reporters had been informed that the Queen would answer no questions on political subjects, and it seemed that one of her aides was about to step forward and interfere. But Queen Marie, apparently embarrassed, then replied:

"Everybody is treated in our country in the same way."

"But the Jews are not permitted to study in the universities," the reporter persisted.

"I know there have been difficulties, but I had nothing to do with that personally. The Jews have been most friendly to me, and I hope they will remain so. The King is very fond of the Jews and considers them his children just as his other subjects. Among the Roumanians here in the United States are very many Jews, and I shall look forward to meeting them. I shall be as glad to see them as any one else," the Queen said.

Justice Jacob Panken, Socialist candidate for Governor of New York State, denounced officials of the city, State and Nation for what he termed their "undue zest in groveling before the Queen of the most corruptly governed country of Europe."

"The citizens of this democratic Republic," he said, "must stand aghast at

APPOINTMENT OF GOVERNOR

Warsaw, Oct. 19.—A storm of protest broke out in the Polish press in the province of Posen when it became known that former Minister of the Interior Mlodjanski was appointed Wojewoda (governor) of the district of Pomerania.

The anti-Semitic newspapers state that Mlodjanski is "a friend of the Jews and his appointment to the governorship would mean that the district would be flooded with Jews from Congress Poland."

A delegation of Polish citizens of Graudenz directed a request to President Moscicki asking that he withdraw the appointment.

**Queen Marie's Statement Regarding
the Jews**

Queen Marie's statement to representatives of the Jewish press admitting that "there have been some difficulties" in regard to the Jewish situation in Roumania but disclaiming any responsibility in the matter and asserting that she and the King have many Jewish friends, is commented on by the "Day" of yesterday.

"We do not know," the paper says, "to what extent things are being 'straightened out' in Roumania, though we do know well enough regarding the 'difficulties' relative to the position of the Jews in Queen Marie's kingdom, but we take the Queen's word that she has many Jewish friends. We also know that among the Roumanian Jews in America are many who wish to greet her. The Federation of Roumanian Jews sent representatives to the city's reception at City Hall, the Roumanian synagogue, Shaarei Shomayim, of Chicago, plans to invite the Queen, a convalescent home in New York erected and supported by Roumanian Jews is preparing to send Jewish girls dressed in Roumanian national costume to greet her. There is a great deal of political naivette and stooping in this, but it does indicate that the Queen is not altogether wrong when she speaks of her Jewish friends.

"We wish to explain to the Queen, since she is after all but a guest in America, that in this country there is a saying current regarding people who prefix their statements with the remark: 'my best friends are Jews.'

"Whenever an enemy of the Jew wants to justify a bad joke of his at the expense of the Jews, or an act of his aimed at the Jews, he starts his defense with the old phrase—my best friends are Jews.

"The Jews of America have learned to judge their friends and their enemies not on the basis of a few words uttered at an opportune moment regarding personal friendships which may also include some Jewish individuals, but on the basis of actual facts and deeds.

"And may the Queen of Roumania have ten times her present number of Jewish friends in Roumania and in America, Jewish public opinion can have an interest in her only as a queen of a country where the Jewish situation is still very, very deplorable and where every influence that may lead to a better, friendlier attitude to the Jews on the part of the government, is justifiable."

VERDICT IN WARBURG LIBEL SUIT AGAINST FRITSCH TO BE RENDERED TODAY

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Hamburg, Oct. 19.—The final verdict of the Hamburg court in the spectacular libel suit of Max Warburg, German banker, against Theodor Fritsch, leader of the German anti-Semites, will be rendered tomorrow. The case which is now before the court of appeals has lasted nearly two years. In December 1924, Fritsch was sentenced to three months imprisonment in the libel action brought by Max Warburg and the banker Melchior. Fritsch had published a number of articles in the anti-Semitic paper, "Hammer," and issued leaflets in which he claimed that Warburg and Melchior, while representing Germany at Versailles as Germany's financial experts to the Peace Conference, had betrayed their country in favor of America and the allied governments. Fritsch appealed the case.

At the trial which opened here today, the presiding judge established the fact that Theodor Fritsch broke his promise given at the previous trial not to attack Warburg any more in his paper, "Hammer." On the basis of the promise, the first libel suit was withdrawn.

At the beginning of the trial today Theodor Fritsch reiterated his assertion that Max Warburg induced his brother, Fritz Warburg, who was at the time German commercial attache in Stockholm to hasten the German-Russian negotiations for a separate peace conducted with the Russian Minister Protopov. Max Warburg stated that the charge of Fritsch was nothing but imagination. He had no part whatsoever in these negotiations, he declared.

PALESTINE JEWS WILL AID SCHWARTZBARDE DEFENSE

Jerusalem, Oct. 19.—Steps to assist the Schwartzbard defense committee in Paris will be taken by Palestine Jewry, it was learned today.

A Palestinian committee was organized here for this purpose. It is probable that two prominent Palestinian Jews will be called to appear at the trial as witnesses.

ANTI-SEMITIC STUDENTS RENEW AGITATION IN HUNGARY AND POLAND

Budapest, Oct. 19.—Renewed excitement prevailed in the ranks of anti-Semitic Hungarian students following a conference of the Youth Association held in Turul.

The conference adopted a resolution asking that their alma mater be freed of Jews and that no Jewish students be admitted to the University.

The University Senate issued a warning to the students that in case they will attempt to carry out their decision by force, they will be excluded from the university.

Warsaw, Oct. 19.—Trouble among the students of the University of Vilna is brewing following a decision taken by the Polish students demanding the exclusion of Jewish students from the clinics. The Polish students demanded as a condition for the admission of Jewish students that eight Jewish corpses be furnished, corresponding to the proportion of Jewish students in the medical college.

CORRECTS FACTS ON JEWISH RELIEF FOR FLORIDA

(Communication to the Editor)

Sir:

I note with interest the item headed, "Appeals for Florida Jews; Charges Neglected," which was published in the "Jewish Daily Bulletin" on Sunday, Oct. 10, 1926.

The "Bulletin" has been very liberal in its publicity for the Jewish Relief.

My response to the unjustifiable telegram of I. Louis Seligman, is that Mr. Seligman acted without authority in making this statement.

Further, there has been no meeting whatsoever at which this proposition was brought up, we having had full confidence in the Jewish Rehabilitation Committee of Miami to do as they agreed and as soon as possible. I beg to advise you that I, as the local Treasurer, have received One Thousand Dollars from Isidore Cohen, the general Treasurer, a few days ago, and Five Hundred Dollars more yesterday, making a total of Fifteen Hundred Dollars, for which, I am sure, those in dire distress here are certainly grateful.

Please remember also that we deeply appreciate the similar sum that the Central Miami Jewish Rehabilitation Committee has sent to Fort Lauderdale with whom we are working on a basis of helping those in distress, with the surplus money of either place.

I take this opportunity in stating the fact, that while we are deeply appreciative of the efforts made on our behalf, you must realize that the sums we have received are hardly adequate to take care of all the distressed families we have here.

With regard to the "nervous breakdown due to financial depression," I beg to advise you that that is absolutely erroneous, as that man was content to resign in two or three days due to a nervous breakdown from the excitement of the hurricane, and now this man is in possession of a business, which he purchased—whether with personal funds or through assistance, I am in no position to advise you—but I am sure that the case referred to is the incident above stated.

I sincerely trust that this statement will not be taken seriously as we deeply feel the unfortunate tone contained in it, and which was made under a mistaken idea, and without any authority whatsoever.

In conclusion, I wish to state that in my humble opinion it should be the duty of Rabbis to smooth matters out, and I feel that it was an unwarranted act on the part of Rabbi I. S. Ravetz, to have transmitted Mr. Seligman's telegram to you without the same.

nization in Poland as a political party which does not require special legalization but needs only a registration for special activities outside of the political limits was issued," the minister said.

Asked what is the attitude of the present government toward the demand for Jewish autonomy in the country, the Foreign Minister replied that as an adherent of the cultural development of all sections of the citizenry irrespective of nationality, he recognizes the desirability of all efforts in that direction within the limits of the existing laws. "The Polish constitution goes further than the international minority treaties," he stated. "The constitution secures to all citizens the preservation of their nationality and the development of their language and their national characteristics. The constitution provides for the creation of autonomous minority federations with public rights. I regard with sympathy the Jewish efforts to obtain an organized form of cultural autonomy," he declared.

Asked for his opinion as to the cultural and economic contributions of the Jews in Poland, the Foreign Minister praised the contribution of the Jews to the world's civilization. "The family of mankind consists of various peoples and it develops in accordance with the pace of the development of all its members. Each civilized nation contributes much. The Jews are not a closed organism but are scattered in all countries. They frequently fuse, culturally and economically with the peoples among whom they are dwelling and they occupy an honorable position in human endeavor. They have contributed famous philosophers, artists and heroes. The work of the Jews can be a valuable element in the economic and cultural development of the country. Consequently, the mutual cooperation between Jews and non-Jews in Poland will bring best results," he stated.

JABOTINSKY PRESENTS REVISIONIST PROGRAM TO PALESTINE AUDIENCE

Tel Aviv, Oct. 19.—The program of the League of Zionist Revisionists, aimed at bringing about a quicker tempo in the development of the Jewish National home in Palestine, was presented to a Palestinian audience by Vladimir Jabotinsky, leader of the League, who is on a visit here.

Ten thousand people attended an open air meeting and listened to Jabotinsky's lecture in which he described his program and commented on the present situation in Tel Aviv. He was received with great ovations by the audience.

A religious census at the University of Chicago, in which 5,103 students recorded their church affiliation, shows the Jews with the second largest group. They were outnumbered by the Methodists who have 686 students. One thousand and sixty-nine students failed to record their church preference.

Even the liberal Roumanian newspaper, "Glasu Bukovinu," accuses the Jews of "arranging a state-subversive demonstration and charges that the initiative of this demonstration was given by the private secretary of the Jewish deputy Ebner. Special police detachments were despatched to the Jewish quarter of Czernowitz and detectives arrested the Jewish pupils.

Following these developments, Deputy Ebner and Senator Kluger, together with the German and Ukrainian deputies, issued a manifesto declaring that the entire incident was fabricated by the anti-Semites for political reasons. The Jewish deputies also telegraphed to Prime Minister Avrescu, Minister of the Interior Goga, and Minister of Justice Cudalbu, giving the facts of the arrest of the Jewish pupils, who are all between seventeen and eighteen years old, and demanding their release and the punishment of the anti-Semitic students for anti-Jewish excesses in Czernowitz.

estine even a small percentage of what the middle class gives. And if we do have a score or so who are interested in 'economic councils' and 'economic boards' for Palestine, they demand such drastic conditions for Palestine investments as are never expected of investments outside of Palestine, they demand bigger dividends in Palestine than they do in the diaspora.

"It is an open secret," the writer declares further, "that the London Economic Board or Council, which has been in existence for some years, has so far done nothing concrete for Palestine, because the Walky-Cohens who control it demand impossible profits in Palestine. Not much different is the situation with regard to the American Palestine Economic Council.

"The truth must be told, even to our notables, that we are well-stocked with advice. What the present writer expected to hear from this conference is not what the Keren Hayesod or National Fund needs to do, but how much these eminent gentlemen are going to give for the Palestine funds. What new sums has the London conference created?"

A recent meeting was held at which plans for the survey were formulated. The principal speaker was Samuel A. Goldsmith, of New York, a director of the research bureau.

The Newark Conference of Jewish Charities has decided upon a survey of the physical and social service in the city. The survey, it is announced, will include all organizations in the Jewish community, those affiliated and not affiliated with the Conference, who are engaged in the service of child care, hospitalization, care of the aged and infirm, educational and recreational fields, etc.

The study is to be made by the Bureau of Jewish Social Research of New York. Frederick Jay, chairman of the social welfare committee of the Conference and Mrs. Leah Frank Segal, executive director, were authorized to arrange for the survey.

Mayor James J. Walker, Louis Marshall and Judge Otto Rosalsky are expected to officiate at the ceremonies marking the dedication of the Ocean Parkway Jewish Center.

The building is now completed at a cost of half a million dollars, exclusive of the land. The building is of Georgia colonial architecture, rising seventy feet. Entirely of marble is the ark in the synagogue constructed, with bronze doors.

Among the guests of honor were Frederick Brown, general chairman of the campaign; Henry F. Samatya, chairman of trades or organization of the Federation; Oscar Abel, Jack H. Mack, Louis J. Chamansky, John Block and Felix Lienthal.

SAILS TO CREATE AMERICAN PLAYGROUNDS IN PALESTINE

Miss Eva Dushkin, social worker, sailed yesterday on the steamer Roma for Palestine.

Miss Dushkin, who was trained in playground and recreational center work by the Playground and Recreation Association of America, will organize playground activities in Jerusalem, Haifa, Tiberias and Tel Aviv.

The construction and maintenance of the playgrounds have been made possible by funds donated by Mrs. Max Guggenheimer of Lynchburg, Va. One playground is already in operation in Jerusalem, and it is planned to build additional ones in connection with the schools.

said: "If I were Mayor only for this day so I could have shown royalty what we think of them. What happened to the pride of the Jews in this city? After all the atrocious pogroms in Roumania why could not they raise at least a mild protest?"

A meeting of protest against the Queen's reception as the Nation's guest was held at Union Square Monday night under the auspices of the International Labor Defense. The meeting was attended by about 300 persons.

William Feder, an American Jew of Roumanian origin and an official of the immigration department at the New York harbor, headed the committee of immigration officials, who escorted Queen Marie and her suite when she disembarked from the Leviathan.

Mr. Feder greeted the Queen in Roumanian and in reply to her question declared that he is an American Jew of Roumanian origin.
