

## AMERY OUTLINES SITUATION IN PALESTINE BEFORE BRITISH IMPERIAL CONFERENCE

### Arabs Benefitted by Jewish Immigration as Much as Jews, He Says; Arab Population Increase Greater Than That of Jews; Looks to Abandonment of Non-Cooperative Policy

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

London, Oct. 23.—The present political situation in Palestine was taken up by the British Imperial Conference which is in session here.

The matter was presented by Leopold H. Amery, British Colonial Secretary. "As a result of the last five or six years of the steady and impartial administration, there has been a great improvement in the political situation of Palestine," he said. "The Arabs, although they are still critical of the Balfour Declaration and opposed to the establishment of the Jewish National Home, as apparent from the utterances of their political leaders, have come to realize that their fear that we are embarking on a policy of displacing the native population of the country by bringing in a horde of Jewish immigrants is groundless. They are realizing, too, that the influx of Jewish capital and Jewish settlers with capital has contributed to the growth and prosperity of the Arab population in an equal measure as it has contributed to the growth and prosperity of the Jewish community," he stated.

"Although the large immigration of Jews to the country has doubled the Jewish population in Palestine, the Arab population has also increased, due to better economic and sanitary conditions. The increase of the Arabs is actually greater than that of the Jews. I consequently hope that the attitude of non-cooperation on the part of the Arab political leaders, which has hitherto precluded the functioning of representative institutions in Palestine, will gradually end. Palestine today no longer receives any administration grant from the British exchequer, it is self-supporting and even more than self-supporting. Great Britain continues to pay for a small detachment of the air force stationed there. Great Britain also makes a grant jointly with the Palestine government for the Transjordanian force, but apart from that,

Palestine asks for no defense from the imperial forces. Perfect tranquility was preserved in the country during the period of unrest in Syria.

"The agricultural developments of Palestine are remarkable. Oranges and tobacco are grown on a large scale. A number of industries have been established by the Jewish settlers. All these developments are due to a great extent to the policy of the first high commissioner, Sir Herbert Samuel, his immense industry, absolute impartiality and enthusiasm for the development of the country. The face of Palestine has changed entirely. From a little Turkish province it is developing into a little, contented and prosperous country," Amery said.

The controversy between the League Council and the Permanent Mandates Commission on the questionnaire was also taken up at the conference. Premier Bruce of Australia, speaking on the matter, declared while he admits that the Permanent Mandates Commission is responsible to the League for the manner in which the Mandates are being administered and while it is true that the mandatory power would not offer the slightest objection to giving the fullest possible report concerning the mandated territory, he thinks that the questionnaire proposed by the Permanent Mandates Commission exceeds its jurisdiction.

## THEODOR FRITSCH, GERMAN ANTI-SEMITIC, LOSES APPEAL IN WARBURG LIBEL SUIT

### Court Finds Max Warburg Rendered Great Service to His Country; Charge of "Treason" Dismissed

Hamburg, Oct. 23.—The final verdict in the libel suit of Max Warburg against Theodor Fritsch, leader of German anti-Semites, was rendered here Friday night by the court.

Fritsch was sentenced to a term of four months' imprisonment for libelling Max Warburg. Giving the reasons for the sentence, the judge declared that the house of Warburg has been established in Germany for the past four hundred years and that Max Warburg has done great service for Germany. Max Warburg has been the counsellor and expert for the German government on important economic questions and at Versailles. "The action of Theodor Fritsch in asserting that Warburg was guilty of treason to the country and that he gave preference to the interests of Jewry over the interests of Germany is condemnable," the court declared.

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## QUEEN MARIE PETITIONED BY HUNGARIAN JEWS IN U.S. FOR TRANSYLVANIA JEWRY

### Emphasize Mistreatment of Former Hungarian Jews in New Rou- manian Province

A plea for the Jews in Transylvania, the former Hungarian province incorporated into Roumanian territory, was presented to Queen Marie by the Federation of Hungarian Jews in America, of which Samuel Buchler is president.

Expressing regret at the necessity of disturbing the Queen on her sojourn here, the petition goes on to say:

"We as loyal American citizens join the American people in bestowing honors upon you. You ought to be happy Fair Queen, that an opportunity is given you to feel that you are in America, the greatest democracy on God's earth, where the Jews can express their feelings and are in a position to protest against an injustice perpetrated upon their brethren in another country. This is not a land of kneeling and self denial. This is that wonderful land, which you dreamed about prior to your entry and which you realize now while reading this humble memorandum.

"That you are familiar with the conditions as they exist in Transylvania we have no doubt. But, we pray, do you know that our Jewish brethren in Transylvania today are not better off than they were at the time Transylvania belonged to Hungary? Do you know, that to get rid of Horthy, the cruel and inhuman Regent of unfortunate Hungary, and to be treated with Horthism in Transylvania is one and the same thing? Do you know that 90% of the Jews in Transylvania are of the Orthodox Jewish faith and yet their children are compelled by Government decrees to publicly violate the Sabbath in the schools? Do you realize that the schools of each denomination in Roumania receive a subvention from the Government, (of which His Majesty and you are the head) save the Jewish schools, which are left to their destiny, although the economic

## COUNT CHEREP-SPIRIDOVICH, RUSSIAN ANTI-SEMITIC AGITA- TOR, FOUND DEAD IN ROOM

### Spread Legend of Jewish Conspiracy; Planned Universal Gentiles' League to Combat "Satanism" and Jews

Count Arthur Cherap-Spiridovich, one of the rabid anti-Semitic agitators of the Russian Czarist school, was found dead in his room at Barrett Manor, Arrochar, S. I., having inhaled gas from a gas radiator pipe. His suicide came on the eve of what he termed a "Slav Convention" which was to have taken place on Monday.

Count Spiridovich was 75 years old. He held the rank of Major General in the former Czarist army. He arrived in the United States in 1920, when he was detained at Ellis Island for a special inquiry by the Immigration Bureau before being admitted. There was some confusion as to his identity, for the visiting General was denounced in a published letter as the wrong Cherap-Spiridovich. The letter said there were two Cherap-Spiridoviches—one was an enthusiastic amateur of world politics, the other an adventurer who traded on the amateur's name and tried to float large political schemes involving the collection of money.

The General, when asked about the two Cherap-Spiridoviches, said the adventurous one was in Paris and occasionally caused embarrassing confusion.

Since his arrival, Count Spiridovich was associated with Boris Brasol, who imported the "Protocols of the Elders of Zion" into the United States.

In the wake of the republication of the "Protocols" in the United States and the efforts made by certain elements to spread the legend of the "Protocols" and a Jewish world conspiracy, Spiridovich wrote and circulated a book entitled "The Secret World Government." In this book and in other leaflets Spiridovich advocated a universal Gentiles' League whose purpose should be to unite the 200,000,000 Slavs, save Russia and create a universal anti-satan federation to protect the Aryan race from Jews and Jewish influence.

Count Cherap-Spiridovich, citing Henry Ford as his authority, stated that the Jews are responsible for all the evils of the world and for the collapse of Russia. He stated that he had writ-

### Queen Marie and the Roumanian Jew

The leaders of the Federation of Roumanian Jews in America who participated in the reception to Queen Marie and the Roumanian Jewish congregation in Chicago which has extended an invitation to the Queen, are severely criticized in the "Day," of Oct. 23, by S. Niger.

"New York Jews," the writer declares, "have given the Chicago Jews an example of belated subservience and eternal cowardice. These were the Jews who are at the head of the Roumanian Verband. They accepted the invitation of the Mayor of New York to join the welcome for the 'distinguished guest.' Apparently they lacked the courage to refuse the great honor. They failed to understand that it would have reflected more honor on them had they stayed away."

Referring to the prayer of blessing for the King and the royal family customarily uttered in the synagogues of some Eastern European countries, Mr. Niger continues: "But in our country, as yet, thank God, we are not obliged to utter this blessing for Kings and Queens. Hence, the above mentioned Jewish 'representatives' could have afforded to exhibit some self-respect and dignity, even were it not a question of the rulers of a country with such a reputation as Roumania has among the Jews. Particularly, when it is a question of Roumania, a country whence daily reports of anti-Jewish excesses reach us, a country against which only Czarist Russia could compete in the matter of anti-Semitism."

The writer further demands to know whether the Roumanian Jews consulted any Jewish body like the American Jewish Congress before taking their step. "Or is it possible," he asks, "that the leaders gave their consent to this slavish act? Is it possible that anyone should still entertain the notion that such groveling will benefit the Jews in Roumania?" and in conclusion we read:

"It seems that by this time we should have learned a lesson from the honor bestowed recently by another Jewish Verband on the official representative of another country 'friendly to the Jews'—Poland. Did the bowing and genuflecting before Count Skrzynski help any in the fulfillment of the Polish-Jewish Agreement?"

## REPLY TO "JEWISH DAILY BULLETIN" INQUIRY DESCRIBES SITUATION AT HARVARD

### No Discrimination in Admission or in Classes; Only Extra-Curriculum Activities Give Cause for Complaint

The result of the inquiry conducted by the "Jewish Daily Bulletin" regarding the alleged existence of discrimination against Jewish students in American universities caused considerable interest in wide circles. Satisfaction was expressed that the facts of the situation were presented, proving that the charges of discrimination in the admission of Jewish students and during the course of their studies were unfounded. The inquiry also showed that while the university authorities did not practice discrimination, some discriminatory tendencies are complained of in the social aspect of student life.

We quote below one of the numerous replies to the inquiry. It is of particular significance, coming as it does, from Harvard University. The correspondent states:

"Harvard is adopting the psychological and character tests this September. There was a claim that Jews were dis-

mission to investigate the conditions in Russia before launching the colonization plan, the "Courier" observes: "Now, it seems, the Chicago conference turned the tables and adopted a resolution that is exactly like the one of Rabbi Wise, only in the other direction: the commission is to go to Palestine."

"We do not doubt the sincerity of Mr. Marshall, Mr. Warburg and the other leaders of the conference," the paper further says, "but the resolution to send Dr. Rosen to Palestine is entirely superfluous. Professor Meade of California, who is now at the head of the United States agricultural department, is surely as big an authority on agricultural questions as Dr. Rosen. And only last year he brought back a report on Palestine after a two months' stay in that country. Also, Mr. Warburg was in Palestine on a short visit. Is it reasonable to postpone help for Palestine until Dr. Rosen will come back with his report?"

The joint drive for Palestine and relief being conducted now in Cincinnati is regarded by the "Philadelphia Jewish World" as one of the signs of the re-establishment of harmony between the leaders of the J. D. C. and the Zionists.

Pointing out that David A. Brown, national chairman of the U. J. C. and Judge William Lewis, national chairman of the U. P. A., were both present to inaugurate the Cincinnati drive, the paper feels that "the very beginning is such as to arouse enthusiasm. Large sums have already been secured, and no wonder. United energies, energies that are not wasted on disputes and recriminations, are bound to bring much greater results. . . . It is to be hoped that such unity of effort will add new impetus both to the work for Palestine reconstruction and the work of relief and colonization in Russia."

criminated against in the famous "newspaper reformation" of a year or two ago, and the college, to shut off all talk, adopted the upper-seventh-of-the-class scheme. I do not believe Jewish students are discriminated against in the classroom, or in the offices of the administration to any noticeable extent.

"The discrimination lies in extra-curricular activities. Jews are practically unknown in the editorial boards of the college daily ("Crimson") and the college humorous magazine ("Lampoon"). And they are kept out of the drama clubs (Pit Eta and Hasty Pudding) excepting in rare cases, although they are readily admitted to the Harvard Dramatic Club. They are allowed in musical organizations but each musical group has an "elected-to-membership" group—a sort of nucleus which runs the larger group—into which Jews have hard times getting into.

"Although the records of the Phi Beta Kappa are quite closed, there is positive information about that the past three years have seen election to that society based on a far from scholarship standard. Twenty-two out of the upper forty seniors are to be chosen and on several occasions noses instead of marks have been examined. The cases are too flagrant to ignore.

"The number of Jewish students at Harvard has increased. As to dormitories—Yes. They are grouped together as room-mates in the Freshman year. (In the case of those solitary individuals who want to room "double" and send in their names to be mated.) In the dormitories allotted to upper classmen Jews are kept out of the older dormitories for which every Junior Senior applies for the sake of tradition. A few do not get in. But most find their way into two larger dormitories—Thayer and Matthews Halls.

"As to fraternities. President-Emeritus Eliot squashed the fraternity spirit in Harvard. You find no such conditions as exist at Cornell, U. of P. and other fraternity centers. Club system has arisen. Among the fraternities extant activities are desultory. No Christian fraternity lets in Jews. No Jewish fraternity let in Christians. The clubs: The exclusive "final" clubs keep out Jews unless they have become captains of major teams, or high class officials. I know of only two Jews who have made "finals." There may be more in the general clubs—the famous Institute of 1770, which has hundreds of members, and the like. A Jew gets in only if he has become famous in major sports.

"All scholarship funds are open to Jews (except a few bequests as those open to a man named 'Murphy'). The predominant practice is to give to a man who has the marks. He gets money if he says he needs it (\$200 to \$600) and if he says he doesn't need it he gets an honorary scholarship. If he's poor the officers are less critical as

## AMERICAN CHRISTIAN FUND FOR JEWISH RELIEF INAUGURATES ITS ACTIVITIES

### Effort to Be Factor for Closer Union Between Jews and Christians in U. S., Dr. Cadman Says

Plans of the American Christian Fund for Jewish Relief were discussed at a luncheon Friday at the Yale Club at which Dr. S. Parkes Cadman, president of the Federal Council of Churches, and Judge Victor J. Dowling, prominent Roman Catholic, were present. They are joint chairmen of the movement, said to be the first national organization of Christians for philanthropic work among Jews.

A mail canvass will be made by the Christian Fund, and it is expected that the effort to raise money will last until the first of the year. No goal has been set for the campaign. On the committee in charge of it there are seven Governors, six United States Senators, four Bishops, one Cabinet officer, eleven college presidents and the mayors of several cities.

At the luncheon Dr. Cadman was the principal speaker. After making it clear that the movement began among Christians and was unsolicited by Jews, who, he said, were always in the van in charitable movements, Dr. Cadman said:

"The Jews are not responsible for the terrible conditions in which they find themselves in Eastern Europe today. They were merely caught in the maelstrom which followed the war, and are suffering as a result of circumstances over which they have no control. Talk of ameliorating conditions in Europe today by the cancellation of debts is futile—it is like putting a plaster on a cancer.

"It is a lack of social imagination on our part that causes our ignorance of the misery prevalent now in many parts of Europe. Could we but visit these centres and see the suffering which is on every hand, we would to a man give of our best. The success of this campaign will be a most happy factor in bringing about closer union between the Jews and Christians of this country."

**League to Study Status of "Men Without Country"**
