FRANCE IS CONSIDERING ABANDONMENT OF SYRIA MANDATE, LONDON HEARS

Said to Plan Transfer of Mandate
to Italy

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

London, Oct. 27.—The opinion that France is actually ready to transfer the mandate over Syria, is expressed today by the diplomatic correspondent of the London "Daily Telegraph."

Discussing rumors concerning negotiations between Italy and France on the subject, the correspondent suggests that the French Minister of Foreign Affairs and other statesmen are anxious to return the Syrian mandate to the League, if this can be done without loss of prestige to France. France might acquiesce to Italy becoming the new mandatory power for Syria, provided Italy rewards France by abandoning its aspirations in Tangiers and Morocco, the correspondent states.

OZET CONFERENCE URGES MODERN STANDARDS FOR JEWISH COLONIZATION

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Simferopol, Crimea, Oct. 27.—The all-Ukrainian conference of the Ozet, the society for settling Jews on the land, closed its sessions here yesterday. Forty-four delegates from all parts of the Crimea were present. Mr. Larin, one of the leaders of the Ozet, in his address to the conference emphasized the importance of the colonization work which he stated meets with sympathy in all countries.

The agricultural settlements of the Jewish peasants will be built in accordance with up to date standards from the very beginning, he said. It is necessary to introduce into the settlements more profitable branches of farming, such as viticulture, tobacco growing, orchards and dairies. It is necessary for the Jewish settlers to create a new type of agriculture which will be a model for their neighbors, he said.

ORTHODOX TO WAGE WAR ON LIBERALS IN ENGLAND

London, Oct. 27.—A religious controversy within the Anglo-Jewish community was in sight following the meeting of the executive committee of the Agudath Israel, the Orthodox Jewish organization, held last night. The meeting condemned the Liberal movement "as undermining the foundations of Judaism."

The attack was directed particularly against the Liberal Synagogue of London which recently introduced Jewish religious services on Sunday into England for the first time. A special committee was formed to counteract the influence of the Liberals.

ICA COLONIES IN ARGENTINE ARE PROSPEROUS, REPORT AT PARIS MEETING SAYS

Ica Report Expresses Faith in Future
of Russian Colonization

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Paris, Oct. 27.—Good tidings of the progress of the Jewish agricultural settlements in the Argentine were brought to the general annual meeting of the Ica, Jewish Colonization Association, held here under the chairmanship of Jules Philippson, of the Administrative Council. A report submitted on the situation in Argentine states that the Jewish colonies there are in a prosperous state. They cover an area of 590,000 hectares of land and have a population of 33,135; 3,654 families numbering 20,382 persons, are definitely settled on the land.

In Brazil, the Philippson settlement has been placed on a sound economic basis. A new colony named Baron de Hirsch was organized there. In Canada, the Ica colonies have made repayments amounting to more than the Ica disbursement. The report also expressed firm belief in the future of Russian colonization. The Ica colonies in Southern Russia have 7,900 farmers settled on an area of 95,905 hectares

Passaic, N. J., Oct. 27.—Over one hundred rabbis were present at the semi-annual convention of the Union of Orthodox Rabbis of the United States and Canada which opened here yesterday. Questions affecting the religious life of the Orthodox Jewish community were presented by the rabbis. The questions of Jewish education and supervision of the sale of kosher meat were discussed.

JAPANESE CONSUL ASKS FOR DATA ON PALESTINE GROWTH

Jerusalem, Oct. 6.—Mr. Kuroki, the Japanese Consul at Port Said, has called at the offices of the Zionist Executive and asked for a duplicate set of Zionist literature for his information and the information of his Government on the Zionist activities in Palestine and elsewhere. He also suggested that the Consul in Jerusalem be supplied with literature for distribution to Japanese visitors to Palestine.

SWISS JEWISH PUBLISHER DIES

Geneva, Oct. 27.—Dr. Aime Schwob, leading Swiss Jewish publisher and former president of the Kehillah here, died. Dr. Schwob was the founder of the papers, "Suiss Sportive" and "Sport Suiss."

JEWISH EMIGRATION FROM EASTERN EUROPE MUST FIND OUTLET, SAYS HIAS DIRECTOR

Urges Experts Commission; Says Relief Work Does Not Offer Solution

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Berlin, Oct. 27.—Greater attention for the Jewish emigration problem in East European countries was urged by Dr. James Bernstein, European director of the Hebrew Immigrant Aid Society of America, Hias, in an interview with the correspondent of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency here.

It is impossible to think that mere relief activity will help the situation of the Jewish population in the East European countries, Dr. Bernstein stated. The Jewish emigration problem is not an accidental one. It is erroneous to believe that when the general economic conditions in the respective countries will return to normal the Jewish emigration problems will be solved.

Prior to the war, 50,000 Jews left Poland annually. In the post war period, the economic situation of the Jewish population has become critical beyond words, due to the fact that the manufacturing centers of Lodz, Kalisz and Bialystok have lost their Russian markets. In addition to the annual 50,000 emigration as in the pre-war period, there is a vast army who must emigrate. The situation in Russia is worse. The constructive relief of the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee does not present a complete solution of the problem. Only Jewish emigration from Russia will improve conditions, he stated.

Dr. Bernstein expressed his conviction that thousands of Jews can find possibilities for starting life anew in many countries, particularly in South America. In the Republics of Argentina, Uruguay, Chile and Brazil, as well as the Dominions of Canada, Australia and South Africa. What is imperatively necessary is that a special commission of experts visit these countries and study the possibilities for Jewish immigration there. It is also necessary to organize institutions in those countries similar to that of the Hebrew Immigrant Aid Society of America which would be competent to take care of the new arrivals.

CHIEF JUSTICE HAYCRAFT HAS RESIGNED, IS RUMOR

Jerusalem, Oct. 27.—Chief Justice Haycraft, Chief Justice of the Palestine Supreme Court, has resigned from his post, according to rumors circulated here.

The cause for his resignation is said to have been a difference of opinion with the Palestine government. Justice Haycraft will leave Palestine, shortly, it is rumored.

JEWS CONSTITUTE ONLY**3.6% OF COMMUNIST PARTY MEMBERSHIP IN RUSSIA**

Yevsektsiya, Jewish Section, Has Membership of But 2,000

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency Mail Service)
Berlin, Oct. 14.—Data on the participation of Jews in the Communist Party in Russia were published here by the Yiddish Institute of Science.

The importance of the Jews in the Communist Party has very largely diminished, because the number of non-Jewish communists has grown in the same period in a much greater proportion, the figures show. The Jews in the Communist Party form at present 3.6 per cent of the total membership of the Party as against 5.2 per cent in 1922.

With the general increase of the membership, the number of Jews who are members has also increased. In 1922 the Jewish membership was 19,562; at the beginning of 1926 they numbered 37,000.

About half the Jewish Communists are active in the central Russian provinces. Their percentage to the general number of Communists in these provinces is less than 3 per cent, because these provinces are the centre of gravity of the Communist Party.

In the Ukraine there are 14,353 Jewish Communists and in White Russia, 3,922.

The mass of the Russian Communist Party consists of town-dwellers. The non-Jewish town population contains more Communists than the town-dwelling Jewish population. Of the non-Jewish population in the towns in the Ukraine, 23 in every thousand are Communists as against only 9 in every thousand among the town-dwelling Jews.

The majority of the Jewish communists are engaged in general party work and have no connection and rarely any interest in Jewish affairs, so that the Jewish Communist Section, which concentrates in itself the whole work among the Jewish population, consists all in all of only about 2,000 members.

CHICAGO UNIVERSITY STUDENTS CONFIRM 'JEWISH DAILY BULLETIN' SURVEY**We Have No Complaints to Make, Correspondents State**

Substantiating proof of the results announced by the "Jewish Daily Bulletin" survey that no discrimination is practiced against Jewish students in American universities, is contained in a description of the situation at the University of Chicago by the survey correspondents there.

"We students of the University of Chicago who belong to the Jewish faith have no complaint to make. We are admitted everywhere, in dramatics, in newspaper work, in glee clubs, into Phi Beta Kappa, just as long as one has the ability that is required of any student.

"Orthodox Jewish students who remain out of school on the Jewish holidays find the instructors willing to cooperate in making up lost work.

"There are eight Jewish fraternities. If there were any anti-Semitic tendencies the number of Jewish fraternities would be restricted.

"There have been rumors that the number of Jewish students is limited. This is not borne out in fact.

"We do have a new Jewish students organization on our campus and the leading Gentile organization on the campus, the Y. M. C. A. is giving us its full cooperation.

"I am unable to detect evidences of discrimination in any general tests delivered by the institution, all denominational questions being omitted. The Jewish student body is tending to increase rapidly, ranking second on the campus in the number of students affiliated with any sect.

"The Inter-Fraternity Council, composed of representatives of all fraternities of the 'under-grad' school recog-

PLAN MASS MEETING TO WELCOME WEIZMANN

New York's East Side During Election Campaigns

That the population of the East Side shows a greater interest than that of any other section of New York in the local and national political issues, as evidenced during the election campaigns, is the assertion made in the "Jewish Morning Journal" of Oct. 27 by J. Magidov.

"The candidates find the best response on the East Side," the writer says. "A meeting on the East Side is usually attended by thousands of persons and the candidates feel that here they actually have the electorate before them. Rarely are meetings in other sections of the city as large as here or as demonstrative. And the population of the East Side is numerous enough to furnish large demonstrations for the Democrats in a Republican district and large Republican rallies in a Democratic district. The fact is, the East Side constitutes the best forum for candidates of all parties if they desire to discuss issues earnestly. Here they do not speak to empty seats and unthinking heads, here they really get what is called inspiration. This is to be observed in reading or listening to the addresses delivered on the East Side by Smith and Mills, by Wadsworth and Wagner. Here they do not speak without consideration, here they take up the issues carefully and try to answer them seriously."

Jewish Youth and Halloween

Jewish young folk have acquired the custom of celebrating Halloween without realizing that in so doing they are celebrating what was once a pagan and is now a Christian holiday, declares the "Jewish Daily News," orthodox daily of New York. In its English section of Oct. 25, the paper quotes a correspondent as follows:

"Many of our Jewish young men and young women will celebrate Halloween on October 31st. I am quite sure that they are ignorant of the meaning of this day, or else they would not want to celebrate this Christian festival any more than they would want to celebrate Christmas. It was surprising to me to have received two invitations to a Halloween party from clubs in two different institutions that are thoroughly Jewish. I found that the idea of Halloween is that it is a sort of pre-election affair.

"May I state that this was formerly a pagan holiday. The ancient Druid priests used to light fires on the evening of October 31st for the dead spirits. This custom was later utilized by the Christian Church after the conversion of the pagans and thereafter the day was recognized as All Hallowes or All Saints' Day, a day on which mass is said for the martyrs and saints of the Christian Church.

PALESTINE AGRICULTURE WILL BE SUCCESS, CATHOLIC EXPERT, ON VISIT HERE, SAYS

Father Sacchetti, Salesian Procurator in Beitgamel, Gives Reaction of Non-Jewish Observer to Palestine Development; May Seek Aid Among American Jews for His Institutions

Bright prospects for the Jewish agricultural development in Palestine were predicted and the views of a Catholic agricultural expert on the recent developments in Palestine were given by Father Alfred Sacchetti, manager of the Christian Agricultural School at Beitgamel and procurator of the Salesian Fathers in Palestine. Father Sacchetti, who came to the United States for the purpose of collecting a fund of \$50,000 among American Catholics for his agricultural school, is a leader of the Catholic Salesian community, which was founded about sixty years ago by Don Bosco, a priest of Turin, Italy. The Salesian community conducts agricultural schools in various parts of the world and its purpose is to educate poor and abandoned Christian children by teaching them arts and trades. The institute has about 300 schools. They have six institutions in Palestine. The agricultural school of Beitgamel was founded by the Salesian Fathers at the same time as the Jewish Mikvah Israel School was founded by Carl Netter.

Commenting on his mission to the United States, Father Sacchetti stated that "it would not seem strange that I also seek support for our institutions among the Israelites. I hope to be able to find some charitable persons who might interest themselves in our work. Palestine is our common country and our work, being non-sectarian, is directed toward, the exercise of well understood charity and the agricultural rebirth of the Holy Land."

Father Sacchetti, who is considered one of the agricultural experts of the Catholic community and who is very influential in governing Catholic circles in Jerusalem, expressed his opinion on the agricultural work of the Jews in Palestine in an interview with the representative of the "Jewish Daily Bulletin."

"I have traveled through Palestine many times, both during and after the war, and during my trips I noted the striking result achieved during the last few years in many places but especially in the valley of Esdraelon. I know this locality very well because I had to carry on several scientific researches there during 1919. At that time the entire plain of Esdraelon was desolate. A few small villages could be seen but the rest of the land was in an abandoned state. The whole aspect has now been changed. There have arisen about 25 villages, great extensions of land have been afforested, all swamps and marshes have been drained and cases of malaria are rare. The plantation of eucalyptus trees is rapidly

growing and fields of cereal, pastures and vegetables cover many miles of the land. The village of Nahalal has an Agricultural Training College for Women, an ideal institution, where the small industries of rural life are taught. There is a hospital in a neighboring village and active commerce has begun with the nearby cities of Haifa and Nazareth. What had been up to six years ago a wild and unproductive waste land has been transformed into a fertile and productive country.

"There is no reason to believe that similar transformations do not take place in other colonies, even though conditions are not as favorable as in the Valley of Esdraelon," he stated.

Asked as to the possibility of the financial success of the Jewish agricultural settlements in Palestine, Father Sacchetti offered his opinion in the following terms: "This is a question of statistics and figures concerning those colonies which have already passed the critical period of the first years. The Jews in Palestine are now studying various methods of colonization and are making experiments in many directions. Even though, theoretically speaking, the system of private property payable in instalments should be the best, it is not always practicable in all places. Experience alone will be able to decide which of the systems will succeed.

"One must not forget that the geological and climatic conditions of Palestine are adverse and that dryness and warm winds of the East sometimes produce disastrous results, but the agricultural resources are very numerous for the intelligent and laborious farmer, especially if he is allowed to make a reasonable use of credit. Where water abounds in the under-soil, the hydraulic installations easily solve the problem of cultivation. Methodic planting of trees, especially of the olive tree and the afforestation of rocky land constitute an effective capital in reserve.

"The elements of financial success are not wanting, especially for the settlers that have already had a certain amount of agricultural experience and for the new generation which has been bred in the country and has an intimate knowledge of the peculiarities, your ideals both religious and patriotic certainly assure a moral and financial success. It is beautiful and moving to see groups of fine strong young men dedicate themselves happily and contentedly to all sorts of hard farming all day and then meet in the evening to study or to arrange concerts. I also know people of importance and profession that do not disdain to do farming and that have dedicated their modest fortunes for the purchase of a tract of land in order to do their share towards the redemption of Palestine. This sort of work, rendered lighter by intellectual activity and raised by an

Jews Hit Economically Harder Than Others by Florida Disaster

(By Our Jacksonville Correspondent)

Jacksonville, Florida, Oct. 20.—While, fortunately, there were almost no Jewish casualties in the recent Florida hurricane, economically the Jews were hit harder than others. Largely storekeepers they suffered not only through the damage caused by the storm but even more through the general pillage and thefts which followed. Rabbi Aistet of the conservative congregation at Miami stated that over 100 Jewish families are destitute and are in need of loans for rehabilitation. A Jewish Rehabilitation Committee has been organized in Miami which has set as its goal the raising of \$100,000. The response so far has been meagre. For some reason or other, the great Florida disaster has failed to evoke the necessary sympathy and proper response.

The true condition of the stricken areas is a very sad one. There has been no exaggeration. On the contrary, the whole truth has not been told. It's a case of pinching one's checks that the color may stand. But Florida has many unique and favorable features which promise much for a speedy recuperation.

It was these attractive features that were responsible largely for the rapid progress of the Jewish population in this state from some 6,000 souls in 1920 to 18,000, according to conservative estimates, at the present time. It is true that the real estate boom brought many Jews here but the charge that the Jews flocked here because of the boom only is groundless. Even before the boom there was a rapid increase of the Jewish population, and proportionately the increase of the non-Jewish population, owing to this cause, has been much greater than that of the Jewish. In the winter on the other hand, the number of Jewish tourists is proportionately far greater than that of other elements. Jews, however, are conspicuous by the prominent position they occupy in the commercial and professional fields.

Most of the dry goods, clothing, and furnishing stores are in Jewish hands, and there has been in recent times great increase in the number of Jewish lawyers and doctors. Only a few are brokers or real estate operators. This in itself is proof of the fact that Jews were attracted to Florida by its natural beauty and climate rather than by a desire to speculate. Of the few Jews who are engaged in the real estate business the larger number were in the same

PROMINENT JEWISH AND NON-JEWISH PERSONAGES AT FUNERAL OF VINAVER

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency Mail Service)

Paris, Oct. 13.—The funeral of Maxim Vinaver took place here today in the cemetery of Pere Lachaise. The hearse was followed by a large gathering of Russian and French Jews. The religious service was performed by Rabbi J. H. Dreyfus and the rabbi of the Temple de la rue des Victoires, M. Henri Kahn, assisted by the choir of the Temple. Wreaths were laid on the grave by the Committee of Jewish Delegations, the Jewish World Relief Conference, the Russian Jewish Community, the Russian Constitutional Democratic Party (Cadets), and the ex-members of the Russian Duma who were signatories of the Viborg Manifesto and were imprisoned together with Vinaver.

M. Paul Miliukov, former Minister for Foreign Affairs in the Russian Provisional Government, speaking in Russian dwelt on the great importance of what Vinaver had done for Russia, especially in the Duma. Russian history, M. Miliukov declared, will never forget the name of Vinaver.

M. Sliosberg, who spoke in the name of the Russian Jews in Paris, spoke of Vinaver's work for Russia and for the Jewish people. Vinaver had understood, M. Sliosberg said, that the Jewish people could enjoy freedom only in a free Russia and for that reason he had devoted the whole of his life and all his energies to the cause of political freedom in Russia.

M. Salomon Reinach paid a tribute in the name of the Alliance Israelite Universelle to Vinaver as the first Russian Jew who had taken part in the activities of the Alliance.

M. Aksentiev, a former member of the Russian Duma, expressed the sorrow of a number of Russian political organizations, especially the Russian League of Nations Union, at the loss of so distinguished a man, whose place in Russian political and social life will long remain unfilled.

Leo Motzkin, speaking in Hebrew in the name of the Zionist Organization, pointed out that it had been Vinaver who in the first Duma had formulated the rights of the Jews as the rights of the Jewish nation.

Rabbi Eisnstadt, former Chief Rabbi of Petrograd, spoke of Vinaver's achievements for the Jewish people. In his last conversation with Vinaver, he said, they had discussed Zionism and Vinaver, who had not been a Zionist, had said: My hand is stretched out towards Zionism.

M. Yefroykin, speaking in Yiddish, said that Vinaver's death was a particularly hard blow for the Russian Jews abroad.

Other speeches were delivered by M. Goldstein, the well known Russian Advocate, and the former Russian Senator Gourevitch.

M. Israel Levi, Chief Rabbi of France assisted in the burial service.

business prior to the boom and even before they came to Florida. Stories which have been circulated that Jews created the boom and stimulated frenzied speculation are unfounded. It is merely a repetition of the well known practice of making the Jew the scapegoat for every calamity and failure.

Florida is not free from prejudice and race discrimination. The Klan is strongly entrenched here and wields considerable political influence. Parades are arranged in which thousands march in their white robes and masked faces, with the police band furnishing the music. Massmeetings are held in the parks and other public places under Klan auspices, and generally the K.K.K. finds itself very much at home in Florida.

There are certain communities in Florida where anti-Semitism is open and rampant. In St. Petersburg, for example, a sheet known as the "Daily News" contains almost daily the most vituperative attacks on the Jewish people. Not so long ago the hotels there announced, "Dogs, Jews, and Niggers not admitted here." Similarly whole neighborhoods are restricted against Jews and negroes. Fortunately just those anti-Semitic land development companies with which Jews had no connections whatsoever were the first to fail and some are undergoing court investigations on criminal charges.

The National Council of the Y. M. C. A., through affiliated local associations, has set for its 1937 task the duty of meeting a budget of approximately \$54,000,000, according to the report of the Budget Committee, submitted at the last plenary session of the annual council meeting in Chicago.

The National Council will call for \$4,104,000, about \$20,000 more than last year, to be expended directly through local and State organizations.

Missionary work under the Home Board will receive approximately \$1,000,000; under the Foreign Board, approximately \$1,500,000, and the balance will go to educational enterprises, the physical program and building and recreational facilities and maintenance, it was stated.

Negotiations for the merger of the great mail-order houses of Sears, Roebuck & Co., which Julius Rosenwald is the head, and Montgomery Ward & Co., under one management, with J. P. Morgan & Co. in control, are taking place, according to rumors circulating in Chicago.

The two companies do an annual business of \$450,000,000. It was stated that from \$10,000,000 to \$15,000,000 overhead expenses would be eliminated by the combination.

Miss Minnie Edelschick, one-time supervisor with the Bronx district of Jewish Social Service Assn. of N. Y., and a member of the Emergency Commission sent to Cuba to assist the immigrants stranded there, was appointed supervisor of the United Hebrew Charities, Hartford, Conn.

The will of Harry Mayer, of 970 Park Ave., New York City, who died on October 7, provides for the erection and maintenance of a free lodging house and eating place for the poor. It directs that as "soon as reasonably can be done after my decease and prior to the expiration of two years after my decease, the trustees shall cause to be organized a charitable organization to be known or designated as the 'Mayer Rest' or some similar name which shall show on its face that its creation was brought about through me."

The establishment of the lodging house is to be funded out of the residuary estate. Besides this gift, Mr. Mayer left \$5,000 each to the Mount Sinai Hospital and the Jewish Working Girls' Vacation Society. Other sums are bequeathed to other hospitals and charitable societies.

nizes no discriminating actions. Jewish representatives attend group dinners at Gentile fraternity houses, and our organizations reciprocate pleasantly and hospitably.

"The University of Chicago offers a huge number of scholarships and there are no restrictions as to religion, color or creed. The predominant method of selection for students to receive said scholarship is the scholastic grade."

"There are no tendencies to exclude Jewish members from athletic competition, Jewish athletes being on every varsity team."

"There is no external evidence of bias on the campus, but the Jewish students are notably weak in the election of class officers. I can imagine of no way in which Jewish students have been discriminated against or in which anti-Semitic tendencies figured."

with a population of 36,845. In accordance with an agreement between the Ica and American Jewish organizations, the Ica undertook to settle the stranded refugees in Roumania, Turkey and Poland. The task will be completed this year, the report stated.

Jack J. Zahler, American candy manufacturer, who is now in Mexico City, received a series of letters threatening him with death for aiding the Mexican soldiers in their search for Jacob Rosenthal, the New York merchant who was kidnapped and later killed by bandits. Mr. Zahler, who was Mr. Rosenthal's host, was warned at the time of the kidnapping not to inform Mexico City officials. Ignoring the bandits' demands he led the search along the road between Cuernavaca and the capital where Rosenthal was kidnapped.
