#### AMERICAN JEWS SHOULD NOT "KOW TOW" TO ROUMANIAN TOW" TO ROUMANIAN QUEEN, CHICAGO JUDGE SAYS Judge David Refuses to Serve on Reception Committee

(Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Chicago, Ill., Nov. 9.—Queen Marie, as head of a "government of bigotry, intolerance and persecution" should not be "kow-towed" to by Americans, was the rebuke of Superior Judge Joseph B. David, who today made public a letter refusing to serve on the Committee of the United Roumanian Jews of Illinois to receive the Queen. The organization has arranged to receive the queen here at the First Roumanian Congregation, Douglas Boulevard and Millard Avenue. A large committee of Jews was

sought to welcome the queen. Judge David's terse comment was the first inkling of possible difficulty.

"I have yours of the 5th instance," ludge David wrote to Mark Weissler, Secretary of the Organization, "inviting me as a member of the reception com-mittee of the United Roumanian Jews of Illinois to receive the queen of Roumania, and in reply will state, I most respectfully decline to accept your invitation, given, no doubt, in good faith.

"My declination is justified by the following: In view of the treatment of the Jews by the government of Roumania, a government of bigotry, intolerance and persecution, and in view of the further fact that, as an American citizen, I pay no deference to a (Continued on Page 8)

#### ROUMANIAN SCHOLAR, FRIEND OF JEWS, GIVEN BUCHAREST UNIVERSITY PROFESSORSHIP (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Bucharest, Nov. 9.—Priest Gregory Fishkulescu, known under the penname of Gala Galaktion, was appointed professor at the theological college of the University of Bucharest.

Professor Fishkulescu, who is known in Roumania for his philo-semitic writings, was for a long time refused a pro-fessorship in the Roumanian universities because of his friendly attitude toward the Jews.

Professor Fishkulescu recently turned from Palestine, following which he wrote an enthusiastic book on the country. He is also preparing a trans-lation of the Bible into Roumanian.

#### GLOBATSCHOFF, LEADER OF RUSSIAN BLACK HUNDRED EXECUTED IN CHARKOFF Notorious Anti-Semite, Organizer of

Pogroms Under Czarist Regime (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Moscow, Nov. 9.—Col. Globatschoff, one of the Russian monarchist leaders and known for his anti-Semitic activities, was executed by the Communist government in Charkoff, Ukraine, despatches received here state. Col. Globatschoff, who was the aide of the well known anti-Semitic agita-

tor under the Czarist regime, Purisch-kewitsch, former member of the Russian Duma, was charged with being a contrarevolutionary spy and with having crossed the Russian frontier il-legally for the purpose of organizing monarchistic organizations there. Globatschoff was the leader of the

Russian Black Hundred, the well known hooligan bands which operated under the Czarist regime, being responsible for many anti-Jewish po-groms. He was the editor of the Odesskava Rezina" and was a close friend of Krushevan and Pelikan who organized the pogroms of 1905.

#### CZERNOWITZ JEWISH PUPILS PUNISHED FOR PROTESTING UNFAIR EXAMINATIONS (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Czernowitz, Nov. 9.—The twenty Jewish pupils arrested for participating in a demonstration against the Bacca-laureate examinations, the Roumanian method of applying the numerus clausus, will be punished, according to a decision of the Roumanian Ministry of

According to the decision, which was made following an investigation of the case, those Jewish pupils who have not completed their studies in the high schools will be expelled for two years; those who have already completed their studies will lose the right to enter Roumanian universities for two years.

#### PALESTINE GOVERNMENT TO ISSUE CODIFIED LAWS (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Jerusalem, Nov. 9 .- A codification of all the laws enacted in Palestine since the British occupation will be issued by the British government during the month of December, it was learned here today.

The code of the laws was prepared under Norman Bentwich, attorney general of the Palestine government.

#### ON CREMATION REJECTED WARSAW KEHILLAH Rabbinate Moves Against Furnishing Jewish Corpses for Dissection (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

PROPOSAL FOR INQUIRY

Warsaw, Nov. 9 .- An inquiry to establish the concensus of opinion of world Jewry on the question of crema-tion was suggested to the Council of the Warsaw Jewish community following the recent controversy over the burial of a Polish Jewish merchant after cremation.

The suggestion was made by Adoli Peretz, a Warsaw banker and leader of the Liberal element, to Deputy Kirschbraun, an Orthodox, who is president of the Kehillah Council. The President of the Council rejected the proposal, declaring that the question of burial in the Jewish cemetery is a matter which is entirely under the jurisdiction of the religious authorities, that is of the rabbinate and no inquiry from laymen can have weight on the matter. Another incident demonstrating the

respect which Polish Iews hold for the dead came to light when the rabbinate of Warsaw applied to the Warsaw district attorney, asking him to take measures against the action of the Jewish hospital. Following the recent demand of Pol-

ish students that Jewish corpses be furnished for dissection in the clinics of the medical college of the Warsaw University, the hospital delivered a body of an unidentified Jewish woman who died in the hospital. When the news was published, relatives came forward to claim the body, identifying the woman as Mrs. Deborah Meisner.

#### BUDAPEST COURT ANNULS PROFESSOR'S WILL HAVING ANTI-SEMITIC PROVISIONS

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Budapest, Nov. 9.-The spectacular

trial of the widow and daughter of the late Professor Varszonyi, who are contesting his will which disinherits the daughter of a large fortune in case she marries any one with a "drop of Jewish blood in his veins" came to an end vesterday when the court declared the will invalid.

The court motivated its decision with the statement that the provisions of the will were unmoral. Another reason for the verdict was that the purity of race cannot be proved.

#### MICHELSON'S ANNOUNCEMENT ON SPEED OF EUROPEAN LEADERS GREET HIAS DECISION TO EXTEND JEWISH EMIGRATION WORK LIGHT STARTLES SCIENTISTS (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Result of Long Research Extending Over Period of 40 Years Creates Interest Equal to That of Einstein Theory Several Years Ago

(Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Philadelphia, Nov. 8.—Prof. Albert A., of measuring the speed of the earth, Michelson, American Jewish physicist and, with it, the whole solar system, of the University of Chicago, today through space. In order to solve this announced discoveries concerning the speed of light that already promise to create almost as much of a furore in the scientific and lay worlds as the announcement several years ago by his friend, Prof. Albert Einstein, of the theory of relativity.

Speaking before the convention of the National Academy of Sciences, of which he is president, the small, shy physicist said he had determined that light rushes through space at the rate of 299,796 kilometers a second, or a decrease of about 36 miles a second over the figure of 186,000 miles a second that every school boy has been

taught to learn. This deviation from the old figure may cause a reshaping of the Einstein theory, as the Jewish mathemati-cian in Berlin (who, incidentally, bears a striking resemblance to Prof. Michelson) based his theory on formerly accepted figures concerning the speed of light.

But Dr. Einstein will not be the only scientist to be vitally interested in Prof. Michelson's discovery. Mathematicians, philosophers, astronomers, and physicists throughout the world

will have to overhaul their theories, their beliefs and their experiments. Prof. Michelson has spent forty years investigating the speed of light, but the result announced today was the outcome of experiments conducted particularly during the last year with light beams that were shot from Mt. Wilson, California to Mt. San Antonio, a distance of 44 miles and back again.

"The results of five series of observations with revolving mirrors having 8, 12, and 16 facets," said Prof. Michelson, "showed a remarkable agreement, and gave us a final result for the velocity of light between the two points of 299,796 kilometers per second.

Prof. Michelson's discovery may lead to uncovering the secret of the velocity with which the earth rotates and likewise the speed of the entire solar sys-

One of the principle features of the Michelson experiments is the discovery that the speed of light never varies. which leaves light velocity as one of the few, if not the sole, constant left to the world of science. Natural phenomena that only a few years ago were thought to be constant, have been dis-covered to change, but Prof. Michelson's statement about light is expected to remain.

Prof. Michelson's discovery was made possible by a machine of his own invention, the interferometer, and enabled him to obtain his figures with greater precision than has hitherto been possible. He described the instrument years ago as follows:

CHAIM WEIZMANN Answers Criticism Against Zionist Policies in Palestine; Shows Difference Between Palestine Colonization and Other Colonizing Efforts; Opposes "Military Phraseology"; Will Bar Its Influence Over Palestine Situation; Makes Impassioned Plea for All-Jewish Cooperation in Difficult Task Through Extended Jewish

DAWN OF NEW ERA IN UPBUILDING OF PALESTINE IS PREDICTED

in his first public message to the Jews Monday evening.

Over 5,000 persons crowded the hall to greet the president of the Zionist Organization on his fourth visit to this country, and listen to his description of the situation in Palestine which causes much concern to New York's lewish masses, and to the outline of his mission of "peace and unity" in his final efforts to complete the organization of the Jewish Agency to include American non-Zionists in the body designated by the Palestine Mandate as an Advisory to the Palestine administration, on matters effecting the crea-

tion of the Jewish national home.
Emanuel Neumann, who opened the meeting, expressed the desire of the Zionist Organization of America to lend Zionisi Organization Or. Weizmann's ef-forts in this direction. Judge William M. Lewis of Philadelphia, national chairman of the United Palestine Appeal, presided over the gathering. Dr. Stephen S. Wise, honorary chairman, in a moving address, paid tribute to Dr. Weizmann, declaring that no matter what happened five years ago in Cleveland, "there is no reason for anybody to absent himself from the work for the cause," adding a dramatic touch to the occasion when, finishing his address, he grasped Dr. Weizmann's hand as an expression of unequivocal loyal support. Louis Lipsky, president of the Zionist Organization of America, and Dr. Chaim Arlosoroff, Palestine Jewish labor leader who is a member of the Weizmann delegation, delivered ad-

### Dr. Weizmann Outlines Situation

Dr. Weizmann, in his address, gave a broad outline of the Palestine development, touching both on the political and economic aspects of the problem and answering some of the criticisms recently directed against the Zionist Executive.

"The two features, which were of uppermost importance in the problem of upbuilding Palestine were: first, it was necessary to prove that Palestine could be rebuilt, and second, that Palestine could be rebuilt by Jewish hands. These two questions were answered in the affirmative to the satisfaction of the world's public opinion. The main factor which determined the political situation in Palestine and regulated the attitude of the mandatory power was the reaction of public opinion to the enterprise. In this respect the Zionist movement has achieved success. It was only a few years ago that the British Government looked upon the Jewish settlement of Palestine as an experi-

dent of the World Zionist Organization, is not a single serious-minded man in England who is not convinced that Iewof the United States since his arrival ish work in Palestine has come to stay here, delivered at the Mecca Temple on and must be reckoned with. This situ-



ation in the Center has had its effect in other countries. This attitude of respect and consideration we find not only in England, but also in France, in Italy, in

other European countries, not to speak of the United States. has also been manifested in the so-called Arab problem, which has often been more acute in New York than in Jerusalem," he stated. "The Arab problem today has lost its acuteness and our relations with the Arab people are on a solid foundation.

#### Analyzes Z. O. Executive Policy

Dr. Weizmann analyzed the policy of of the Zionist Executive in Palestine, declaring it to differ from all other methods of colonizing peoples. other colonizing peoples accomplish their task by means of material force. It is for the first time in the history of colonization that a country-Palestine-is being colonized by the methods of peace, not by the sword and rifle but by the hammer and plough. This is, perhaps, the secret of the world's satisfaction with, and admiration, for our work. There is not one living Arab who can complain that an injustice was done him in Palestine by the Jews. Thanks to this policy Palestine is the most quiet corner in the entire Near East, and we will forbid, as much as it is within our power, the use of any military phraseology or, for that mat-ter, any kind of ology, to interfere with this situation or to break the line and style of our policy in Palestine.
"The two main lines of development

in Palestine, agriculture and industry, are sound, notwithstanding all that may be said about the present unemployment. able suggestion for improving its efficiency and productivity. Emphasizes Mission of Peace and Unity Dr. Weizmann, in summing up, without mentioning the Jewish Agency, re-

ferred to his plan concerning the extension of the Jewish Agency. The mission of peace and unity is engraved not only upon my heart, but upon every hill and vale of Palestine The record sibility for upbuilding Palestine rests upon the entire Jewish people. Public opinion of the world calls upon every Jew, be he Zionist or non-Zionist, to do his duty in this direction. We must reach every Jew and urge him to do his share in the great task. We carry a heavy burden which can crush men much stronger than we are. The door must be opened wide for every Jew to enter and share in this responsibility. We have no right to leave out anyone. We have passed through great difficulties. We know, however, what is our task and what is our duty, and we

task and what is our duty, and we march with sure steps toward the dawn of a new era in Palestine," Dr. Weizmann concluded. The crowd gave Dr. Weizmann a tremendous ovation. Dr. Wise, in his address, referred to Dr. Weizmann as a page of Jewish history. Mr. Neumann, in welcoming Dr. Weizmann, stated:

"Last year the regularity of his visits was interrupted. Circumstances of a compelling nature detained him abroad; and we were deprived, at least in the immediate sense, of his counsel and support.

Fritsch, Leader of Anti-Semite International, Fails Again in Charge Against Alleged Jewish "International"

notorious editor of the anti-Semitic "Der Hammer" and member of the Anti-Semitic International, whose chief grievance against the Tews is due to his illusion that the Tews are organized

into an "international" for the destruction of the Christian world, has suffered his fourth defeat yesterday in the case of the libel suit against him by the Jewish bankers Max Warburg and Dr. Melchior, when the Court of Ap-peals here upheld the verdict of the lower court sentencing Fritsch to four months' imprisonment. Whether this case is now definitely closed is not known since Fritsch's lawyer has intimated that further appeal will be filed from the decision of the Hamburg

court. The picture of Theodor Fritsch in court could be regarded as a symbol of the anti-Semitic movement in Germany On the eve of his life, he is 74 years old, bigoted and narrow-minded, living mentally in a medieval world, he repeated all the outworn imbecilic charges of the anti-Semites. Far from withdrawing or softening any of his libels in "Der Hammer" against the Jews gen-erally and against Max Warburg in particular, he reiterated all his assertions. He charged the Jews with being the arch-conspirators of the world who caused the World War, brought on the Bolshevik revolution, effected the overthrow of the Kaiser and were planning numerous other such deviltries. To substantiate his statements he "quoted" the Old Testament, the Talmud and the Schulchan Aruch. He also "quoted" a number of modern books of an anti-Semitic nature and declared in the course of his speech before the court that "Bernard" M. Warburg had been at the head of the war industries in the United States during the war at the same time that Rathenau was in charge in Germany and that therefore it was clear that the war was caused by the Icws. Semite made a melodramatic gesture and "quoted" a passage from the Prophets that the Jews "would overcome all kings and rulers." Interesting in the same sense was the address of Fritsch's lawyer. He started

out with the assertion that he would give a review of the history of am-Semitism from a purely "objective" point of view. But in the course of his speech he made so many incongruous, contradictory and abusive statements that the judge was compelled frequently to halt his outpour and order him to confine himself to facts pertinent to the case. The lawyer, named Jacobsen, repeated of course all the ancient anti-Semitic hokum. Again: the Jews are Bolsheviks, international financiers and perpetrators of all the world's evils. As a proof that the Jews were responsible for the overthrow of the Kaiser, Jacob-sen cited the fact that Ernesto Nathan. the Italian Jew, was at the head of the Freemasons in Italy, hence it was Nathan who brought Italy into the war, and that contributed to Germany's defeat. Very "consistent" was the lawyer's argument regarding the Jenish role in America and Germany. In both countries, he pointed out, the Jews control the finances; in America Wall Street is entirely in the hands of Jews What would be the eventual outcome of this situation? Germany will suffer Russia's fate, Jacobsen contented, be cause of the activities of the Jewish financiers. In America, however, no such disaster was foreseen by him.

Of course, it was easy for Attorney Samson, lawyer for Max Warburg to refute the ridiculous and senseless state ments of Fritsch and his attorney. Great tensity prevailed in the court room when Max Warburg himself arose to speak He made a number of statements relative to the facts in the case, speaking with remarkable consideration and reserve of his libeller, in view of the latter's age. In conclusion, Mr. Warburg ironically called Fritsch's attention to the fact that in a recent article lie. Fritsch, had made assertions regarding

the question of tariffs which leaned to-ward "Jewish" principles, and hence he could be accused of being under Jewish influence.

Washington, D. C., Nov. 9.-The Orthodox conception of the Zionist movement is gaining ground among the traditional elements of American Jewry and is finding expression in organized form. These were the tidings brought to the twelfth annual convention of the Mizrachi Zionist Organization which is in session here at the Jewish Community Center and is being attended by 320 delegates, mainly rabbis.

The extension of the activities of the organization and the fact that it is finding a greater number of followers. after a period of several years of diminished activities, was reported by Rabbi Mairim Magnes, General Secretary of the organization, in his report. which he submitted at the second day's session of the convention.

Orthodox women are being enlisted in the work for increasing the Palestine sentiment among the traditional elements, it was brought out.

#### Mizrachi Delegation Received by President Coolidge Between sessions the delegates head-

ed by Rabbi Meyer Berlin, called on President Coolidge. A photograph of the President with the delegation was made. A blessing was bestowed upon the President by Rabbi M. S. Margolis, of New York, seventy-five years old, honorary president of the Union of Or-thodox Rabbis of America.

The blessing was the customary prayer prescribed for Jews on seeing a ruler of a country. "Blessed be the Lord for having im-

parted some of His glory upon flesh and blood."

The delegation Rabbi Berlin and delegation included besides Berlin and Rabbi Margolis, Rabbi B. L. Levinthal, of Philade phia The rabbis were introduced by Rabbi

Louis J. Schwefel, of Washington. "Since our last convention we have established eighteen branches. Today we have one hundred and ninety-two of these branches, Rabbi Magnes re-

ported. "The membership of the organization has increased extensively. Our membership campaign was successful. The campaign brought in new life to the organization. The Mizrachi Bureau

carried on an enlightenment campaign as to the purposes and ideas of the Mizrachi. Much was contributed to our campaign by our party organ, 'Un-ser Stimme.' For a number of years we were unable to publish our own newspaper, but since last April, when Unser Stimme' began to appear, we have been enabled to reach the masses with our ideas. We also carried on, during last year, increased oral propaganda, sending our speakers to various cities."

Interest of Women in Mizrachi Work Grows, Report Says

"The work among Mizrachi women has been greatly developed during the past year. The Ladies' Society of Chicago donated ten thousand dollars for the Girls' School, Tachkemoni. Many women's societies are now occupied with various enterprises in Palestine aside from their organization work here in America. They participate in all Mizrachi activities and are collecting funds for the Palestine work. The women's organization formed at our eleventh convention in Cleveland has developed during the year. We hope that it will be able to start practical work after this convention. The Mizrachi Hazair is also of great importance to our movement. The Young Mizrachists are the future of the Mizrachi. ## JEWISH ORPHANS IN EASTERN EUROPE Exhibit of Crafts Taught Jewish Children Under J. D. C. Care

Tells Remarkable Story of Relief Activities (Tewish Daily Bulletin)

Philadelphia, Pa., Nov. 9.—An elo-quent spokesman for the Joint Distribution Committee has arrived in America depicting the work being done for the thousands of orphaned children

This spokesman represents the orphaned children of Poland, Czechoslovakia, Roumania, Lettland, Lithuania, Austria, Hungary and Turkey. It's name is the Orphan's Exhibit of East-

ern Europe. Early last week, there arrived in Philadelphia an exhibit of the handiwork fashioned by the orphaned Jewish children who have been trained in various vocations in schools, provided by the funds of the United Jewish

Campaign. These exhibits, ranged from the commonest kitchen articles, to the finest work of art, tell eloquently of the work of American Jewish relief.

The American Joint Distribution Committee cares for almost nineteen thousand orphans. The youngest ones were placed in orphanages. Those above school age were placed under such tutelage, as might provide them with a means of becoming self sup-porting. For this purpose the Joint porting. For this purpose the Joint Distribution Committee has provided twenty vocational schools, and fiftyfour professional schools and workshops where 5,440 orphans receive that training which will make them financially independent. The work repre-sented in the exhibit comes from these schools. The exhibit is now being erected in the campaign headquarters of the Philadelphia United Jewish Campaign, where it will be on public display the latter part of this week and continuing until the conclusion of the week's campaign for \$1,500,000 which begins here on November 21st. The Exhibit will then be taken to the principal cities of the country.

The exhibit is of unusual interest, both for the variety of its articles, and the fine quality of their execution throughout. The whole is a portable museum, consisting of seven rooms arranged in a semi-circle, with a long corridor providing an entrance. exhibit includes examples of rug weav-

ng, embroidery, basket weaving, tailoring, dressmaking, tapestry and leather, stone carvings, etchings, furniture, upholstery, bookbinding, bone carving and filigree work.

One of the most interesting features of the Exhibit is a section called "The Room of Jewish Themes." This exhibition consists almost entirely of articles of religious nature, especially decorations for the Holy Scrolls, such as curtain, altar cloth and Torah Covering. This is a gift from the orphans of Lemberg to a Temple in New York. A Torah covering of an old synagogue was used for the pattern of these arti-cles. All the embroidery is done by hand by orphan girls. The room represents work of orphaned children from many sections of Eastern Europe.

#### Proposes Jewish National Repatriation Loan Under League's Auspices

A Jewish national loan under the auspices of the League of Nations, similar to the Greek and Bulgarian resimilar to the Greek and Bulgarian re-patriation loans, to be used for settling in Palestine the thousands of Jewish refugees who are still scattered in various parts of the world as well as Jewish emigrants from Poland and other countries, is the plan urged by M. Frostig, Polish Jewish leader and member of the

Presenting his views in "Dos Yid-dishe Folk" (Nov. 5) of New York, Deputy Frostig outlines the successful activities of the Greek repatriation loan, of which Henry Morgenthau was the

"In the first eighteen months of its activities the Autonomous Commission in charge of Greek repatriation colonized 70.000 families, and if we assume that each family consisted of five members it means that in a period of about a year and a half 350,000 homeless Greeks were settled in their own country. If we compare these figures with the number of people whom we desire and must colonize in Palestine, we can see how much can be accomplished in the field of mass colonization if only we had the necessary financial means. In a brief period the Autonomous Commission erected 35,000 houses and supplied the colonists with 130,000 heads of cattle, besides furnishing them with tools, seeds, etc. The re-emigration process of the Greeks from Minor Asia was carried out in the best order; Greece began to prosper economically thanks to the new human material and working capital and the \$50,000,000 which had been borrowed for this purpose became a blessing for the country and for the Greek nation.

"What was possible for Greece and Bulgaria must be, and is in our opinion, possible for the Jewish people. lews too, have our hundreds of thousands homeless families who are scattered in nearly all European countries. In Poland, France, Germany and Belgium, there are tens of thousands of Jewish families that have no citizen rights in these lands and are being tol-erated merely as 'homeless ones.' They are constantly threatened with expulsion and new wanderings because they are in fact citizens of no country, their citizenship not being recognized by any government and living on the basis of the well known Nansen passports.
"Tens of thousands of other Jewish

families must emigrate from Russia and especially from Poland where the conomic ground is being taken more and more from under their feet. We Jews were always a people of wanderers and the World War completely shattered our former possibilities for existence in the East European countries. We are forced to wander to escape and we have no where to go except Palestine.

What Greece and Bulgaria-after all but two small and weak Balkan countries-were able to accomplish should also be possible for the 15,000,000 Jews of the world. And what the world regarded as necessary because of social and humanitarian reasons to do for Greece and Bulgaria, it should also do for the hundreds of thousands of Jewish refugees, who are homeless, hounded, in despair, a great misfortune to the Jewish people and a social menace to the European countries.

## The Jews in Canada and Queen Marie

Resentment at the participation of Canadian Jews in the reception to Queen Marie is voiced by the "Canadian Jewish Review," of Toronto. In an editorial of Nov. 5, under the head "Poor Shtadlonim" (self-appointed representatives), the paper contrasts the behavior of the Jews with that of the Ukrainians in Canada whose delegation to the Queen protested against the treatment of their brethren in Roumania. The paper writes:

"It was surprising-and indeed mortifying-to hear that some of our Jewish citizens had so little self-respect as to go cringing before the Queen, and offer their unwelcome homage, heading in the press read that 'members of the Roumanian colony' appeared to welcome their Queen. If such was the case we should not be concerned. But the names and the accompanying photographs revealed what the initiated might have expected; the 'Roumanian colony were Jews. And they were Zionists at

"Roumania has treated her Jewish population more atrociously than even Russia of the Czars. And at the very moment when the local Jewish citizens were smiling their hypocritical smiles at the Queen, Jews in Roumania were being subjected to the most inhuman cruelties.

"A delegation of Ukrainians appeared before the Queen too. They were not Jews. Their brethren were being oppressed in Roumania. The Ukrainians They did not bear did not fawn. They did not bear flowers. They did not prattle prayers. They spoke up like men. They reminded the Queen that Ukrainian men and women were being treated inhumanly in her land where she is Queen. They asked her to exercise whatever influence she may have to change the condition

of the Ukrainians. "A lewish rabbi desecrates the holy tongue when he reads adulatory addresses to the representative of a land which humiliates and grinds down his own brothers. The Jewish girls who knelt with their floral offerings before Queen Marie were degrading the Jewish sense of self-respect. The Queen must have looked at them and thought: What? Some more Jews! I hate them in Roumania. What do they want of me here?""

brother-Jews suffered economic col-lapse. The effect of the disaster could not be confined or localized. It crossed into Palestine causing a severe depression, bringing in its wake hardships and distress. There was talk of a crisis; and at once the word was seized upon and exploited by our antagonists. The manufacture of political capital out of shoddy materials is one of the oldest industries known to civilized society. Its technique dates back to the days of classical antiquity and has been carried to a high degree of perfection in this more efficient and competent age.

"And so throughout Europe there was an outburst of anti-Zionist propaganda. Our temporary difficulties in Palestine were exaggerated to fabulous proportions. Inspired prophets pre-dicted the doom and downfall of our movement and the ruin of all our work. Unfriendly newspapers threw open their columns to the insincere Jeremiads of our opponents. Dead organizations that had been laid low in previous conflicts with the forces of Zion-ism were now again pressed into service. Their lifeless corpses were resurrected for the occasion and made to stalk grotesquely across the arena of Jewish life. Sinister figures crept out of dark corners to thrust a sword into the vitals of our national movement.

The anti-Zionist wave spread to other parts, and threatened to inundate this country as well. Symptoms were not lacking. If that madness had succeeded here, it would have affected our movement at a most dangerous and vulnerable point; for it would have struck a blow at the base of supplies, upon which the progress of our work in l'alestine so largely depends.

"We stand a disciplined and victorious host and salute him in whose hands is the supreme command. The hour is big with destiny. Weizmann is here to lead, and we rejoice in his leadership. His message and mission is peace. We are prepared to follow him in peace as we have followed him in war. We ardently desire peace with all who share our dreams and our visions, our responsibilities and our We are loath to regard as adversaries even those by whom we yearn for that peace which comes from common striving for a common goal.' he stated.
