BRITISH AGAIN CHARGED WITH LACK OF COOPERA- TION IN PALESTINE

Com. Kenworthy to Sail for United
States on December 29

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

London, Dec. 23.—The British administration of Palestine was again charged with lack of cooperation with the Jewish endeavors to establish a Jewish national home in Palestine. The charge was made by Col. Josiah Wedgwood at a reception given in his honor and in honor of Henry W. Nevinston, who recently returned from Palestine, by the Zionist Executive here.

Dr. Eder, member of the Executive, presided. He paid a tribute to Col. Wedgwood's understanding of the ideals and realities of Palestine life. Col. Wedgwood, in his reply declared that he found in Palestine more than he expected. He then laid great emphasis on the lack of cooperation extended by British officials to the Jews in Palestine. The British officials do not even fulfill the intentions of the British government in Palestine, he declared.

Mr. Nevinston analyzed the objections against Zionism and declared that the difficulty arises out of the fact that British officials are not accustomed to govern such an intelligent population as

ICA AND EMIGDIREKT JOIN EFFORTS IN IMMIGRANT AID

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Berlin, Dec. 23.—Cooperation between the Emigdirekt, the Jewish emigrant aid society, and the Jewish Colonization Association, to aid Jewish emigrants through the establishment of an emigrant trust bank was endorsed by the Council of the Emigdirekt in session here.

The Council ratified the negotiations carried on by Dr. James Bernstein and Dr. Myron Krainin with the Ica and has authorized them to proceed with the negotiations, as well as to inaugurate the work of assisting the relatives of American Jews to settle in Palestine.

URGE PROHIBITION OF SHECHITA IN BAVARIA

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Munich, Dec. 23.—The government of Bavaria was petitioned by the Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals to introduce a bill in the Landtag, prohibiting the Shechita, the Jewish method of slaughtering animals.

The Society declared that it speaks on behalf of its branches in the cities of Ansbach, Dillingen, Landshut, Passau, Kulmbach and the vicinities of these cities. The Society demands that the law make it compulsory for all animals to be stunned before slaughter.

ANTI-JEWISH EXCESSES ARE REPORTED IN CLAUSENBURG, TRANSYLVANIA

Interparliamentary Union Cannot Intervene for Roumanian Jews,
It Declares in Reply to Message of Jewish Sejm Deputies

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Vienna, Dec. 23.—A report of anti-Jewish excesses in Clausenburg, Transylvania, was transmitted by the Hungarian Telegraphic Agency and published in the press here.

According to the report, 120 armed Roumanian students stormed a Jewish hall on Tuesday night at the Hotel New York. The hall was being given for the Jewish orphan asylum in Clausenburg. The guests were attacked by the invading students who grabbed the knives and forks from the tables and hurled them at the guests. Many of the guests were injured. The excesses continued until the early morning, when General Popp, with the aid of two detachments led by him personally, stopped the outrages. Several of the students were arrested.

Warsaw, Dec. 23.—The Interparliamentary Union, composed of members of all parliaments in Europe, to which a protest against the anti-Jewish excesses in Roumania was directed, can not intervene on behalf of the Roumanian Jews.

This is the substance of a message received by the Club of Jewish Deputies from the headquarters of the Union, acknowledging the receipt of a protest telegram from the Club. The Union cannot intervene in matters of a political nature which can cause international complications. However, the Union asked the Club to submit details of the Roumanian excesses.

In reply to this, the Club of Jewish Deputies declared that its protest telegram was intended merely as a notification. The facts will be submitted by other Jewish organizations.

12,000 TOURISTS EXPECTED IN PALESTINE THIS SEASON

Jerusalem, Dec. 1.—About 12,000 tourists are expected in Palestine during the coming tourist season, it is stated here. The majority are expected to come from America.

The Jewish Information Bureau of the Zionist Organization announces that all preparations have been completed for the reception of the tourists. Representatives at Kantara, Haifa and Tel-Aviv will meet the visitors and provide them with information and literature. The Jerusalem headquarters of the Bureau is placing its facilities for arranging tours, etc., at the disposal of the visitors.

BACK TO SOIL MOVEMENT STARTED BY GERMAN JEWS

Berlin, Dec. 23.—An effort to inaugurate a Jewish land settlement movement in Germany is the outcome of a conference of the Federation of Jewish Ex-Servicemen held here. A fund is planned for the purpose of purchasing an estate where the work will be started. A plan worked out by the agricultural experts of how to settle Jewish farmers and gardeners in the Rhineland was submitted at the conference.

Professor Franz Oppenheimer and the German agriculturists Mosse, Stangenhausen and Sandelowsky, have joined the movement which is to be conducted under the slogan: "Back to the soil."

PALACE OF NATIONAL MINORITIES WILL BE ERECTED IN MOSCOW

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Moscow, Dec. 23.—A palace of National Minorities will be built in a central location in Moscow, it became known today.

The government has endorsed the project for the construction of the planned museum, which will preserve the characteristic products of the various minorities, both in the field of culture and politics.

ELECTION OF HUNGARIAN ANTI-SEMITES ANNULLED

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Vienna, Dec. 23.—The election of General Hejjas, leader of the Hungarian Race Purifiers, was annulled, press reports received from Budapest state. New elections are to take place shortly.

Hejjas' election was contested in view of the fact that his rival received almost an equal number of votes, the majority by which he was declared elected being 56.

LITHUANIAN SEJM TO BE DISSOLVED; NEW ELECTIONS ARE PREDICTED FOR SPRING

Senate Takes Action on Corpses
Question

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Kovno, Dec. 23.—The Lithuanian Sejm will in all probability be dissolved by the new government, according to a statement made yesterday by a prominent member of the present cabinet. New elections will probably take place in the spring.

Notwithstanding the change in government, the discussion on the question of corpses being supplied by the Jewish community for the anatomical clinic of Kovno University is still engaging public attention. The question came up in the Senate and it was decided that no religious sentiment should interfere with the solution of this problem. For this purpose a bill was approved, according to which the university is to be supplied with the corpses of suicides, paupers and executed criminals. Strict measures will be taken against students who interfere with their Jewish fellow-students in their clinical work because of the corpse question, it was declared.

C. A. TILLES CREATES FUND FOR RELIEF AND EDUCATION

(Jewish Daily Bulletin)

St. Louis, Mo., Dec. 23.—A motion picture of SENIOR and boys and girls seeking relief and education was issued by C. A. Tilles, prominent Jewish citizen of this city.

The unanimous board of the fund consists of Archbishop Stepinac, Rabbi Isaacson, Louis D. Katz, former United States and the Mississippi Valley Trust Company.

A series of meetings will be held throughout the United States in January, 1925, at which time the fund will be organized in a number of cities in America. The meetings are being arranged by the American Jewish Congress. The meeting in New York will take place at the Waldorf-Astoria, January 24, in the ballroom of the Grand Hotel, when approximately 2,000 to 3,000 people, prominent Jewish and non-Jewish speakers, are expected to address this gathering.

CORNERSTONE FOR BIBLE HOUSE IN JERUSALEM LAID

Jerusalem, Dec. 23.—The cornerstone of a Bible House, the fifty-fourth house of this kind established by the Bible Society all over the world, was laid here yesterday. High Commissioner Lord Plumer laid the stone. The Anglican Bishop conducted the services.

The construction of the Bible House will cost not less than £10,000 which is already available for that purpose, it was stated. In his address, the High Commissioner emphasized that the work of the Society is denominational.

English, Hebrew and Arabic texts of the Bible, as well as the Greek version of the New Testament, were placed under the stone.

the Jews. The Arabs, he said, only gain from the Jewish colonization.

Nahum Sokolow and Joseph Cowan also addressed the gathering. The latter declared that Col. Wedgwood and Mr. Nevinson were particularly distressed because of the growing mistrust of the Jews in Palestine toward Great Britain.

London, Dec. 23.—Lieutenant Commander J. M. Kenworthy arrived here today from Palestine. He is sailing for the United States on the Berengaria on December 29.

Jerusalem, Dec. 23.—In a letter addressed to Col. Frederick H. Kish, political representative of the Zionist Executive, Commander Kenworthy defined his impressions of Zionist work in Palestine as excellent. He was particularly struck, he declares in the letter, by the fine spirit and keenness of the settlers.

Exodus of orthodox Jews from the vicinity of the Congregation Chever Shalom Anshe Lishon Synagogue, N. Y., has made it impossible to gather the quorum necessary for holding services. Rabbi Samuel Yallow resided before Justice Elgoborn.

Rabbi Yallow was called as a witness for the congregation on the issue of certain portions of the deed by removal of certain portions. These state the buildings always must be used as a synagogue in order to give the property, acquired 12 years ago from Mr. and Mrs. Harris Barrington, owners of realty adjoining the synagogue.

The respondents are attacked as having been misled and without knowledge or consent of members of the congregation.

An unusual situation is faced by the congregation. The property no longer is used as a place of worship. The respondents claim the land and buildings revert to the congregation.

Plans were broken last Sunday for a \$50,000 Jewish Community Center in Atlantic City, N. J.

The plans as drawn by J. Vaughn Mahlin, architect, and approved by the board of government, decided by former Mayor Isaac Nathan, call for a three-story steel and stone structure which will include a large gymnasium, stage and assembly hall, showers, library, club, restaurant, and other facilities.

The board of trustees of the Jewish Community Center Association includes City Solicitor Joseph B. Berenson, David Rapp, Nathan Kohn, Joseph J. Josephson, Nathan Kohn, and Morris Kohn. Joseph M. Weidberg, present executive director of the center last January.

Chicago Paper Takes Ford to Task

Henry Ford is taken to task for his latest charges against the Jews by the Chicago "Post." The paper says in part:

"The Detroit manufacturer continues, at more or less regular intervals, to indict the Jewish people of many fantastic offenses, including inconsistency. He insists that 'the international Jew' is the power behind the scenes in communistic Russia and in capitalistic England.' In other words, Mr. Ford's fabled 'international Jew' is setting up the machinery in one part of the world to destroy himself in another, which certainly does not give the fictitious bugaboo credit for much discernment.

"Most people who have reached maturity can recall the dangers they visioned as lurking in dark places. Common sense may have told us there was neither wolf nor burglar in the closet or behind the cellar stairs, but it was hard to feel perfectly comfortable until safely back in the glare of light. Mr. Ford has not yet succeeded in getting 'the international Jew' out where anyone else could examine him, but is satisfied there must be one back of the closet door."

The Anti-Semitic Excesses and Roumanian's Economic Problem

The statement in the Roumanian Parliament by the Minister of Public Works to the effect that Roumania must give up her principle of economic self-determination and resort to a policy more attractive to foreign capital, is regarded by the "Jewish Morning Journal" as an indirect reply to the Jewish protests against the pogroms in Roumania. Pointing out that foreign capitalists will not invest in Roumania while reports of anti-Jewish excesses emanate from that country, the paper observes:

"The question is: can Roumania make peace with the Jews and treat them decently, even if she desired it? The masses there are as bad as the government, maybe worse. The condition of the worker and the peasant is very bad and Bolshevism, across the Danube, lures to revolt. If the anger and venom were not directed against the Jew as an explosion, such as the neighbors of Soviet Russia are always in fear of, might take place. A speedy, fundamental improvement of the situation is impossible, especially with the daily undignified of a new crisis upon the death of Ferdinand. In Roumania, more than elsewhere, they mean the Jews when they speak of foreign capitalists, and the desire to be on good terms with them, may be interpreted as a readiness on the part of the Roumanian government to become better, though it is obvious that this will not be so easy to accomplish."

UKRAINE LEADER WARNS UKRAINIANS AGAINST GLORIFYING PETLURA

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency Mail Service)

Paris, Dec. 11.—M. Vinitchenko, former Prime Minister of the Ukrainian Directory of which Petlura was one of the three members, has just issued a leaflet warning the Ukrainian Socialists against representing Petlura as representative of the Ukrainian national movement.

"The Jewish Press," he writes, "and the Russian bourgeoisie are speaking of Petlura as the head of the Ukrainian movement, and if the Ukrainian Socialists follow their example they are doing something extremely dangerous. In representing Petlura as the head of the Ukrainian movement they make the whole Ukrainian people responsible for his crimes."

M. Vinitchenko goes on to explain that the Council of Ukrainian Workers who held the supreme power in the Ukraine elected a Directory of which Petlura was one of the members. "But Petlura was not the head of the Directory," he says. "Gradually Petlura usurped all power, thus violating the principles of the Constitution of the Directory and of its election. In this way Petlura broke with the Council of Workers, the institution which was the legal representative of the people and of the Ukrainian Nationalist movement. The whole of his subsequent activity was carried on entirely on his own personal responsibility. He should therefore be regarded as a usurper, and not as the real leader of the Ukraine, and the legal head of the Ukrainian nationalist movement. All his crimes fall upon his own head and not on the head of the Ukrainian movement. Schwartzbard in shooting Petlura shot the man who in his eyes was responsible for the pogroms, not the head of the Ukrainian movement."

"The word 'Petlurovshchina,' meaning the era of Petlura's power," M. Vinitchenko proceeds, "must be used only to indicate a certain phase in the history of the Ukrainian movement. It covers only the period of Petlura's personal activity and that of a small group of his friends."

"If the friends of Petlura," M. Vinitchenko concludes, "wish to defend his memory and his honor, it is for them to do so, but they would do well to avoid injuring thereby the honor of the Ukrainian revolution and what it stands for. For to us, the rest of the Ukrainians to whom the honor of the Ukrainian movement for national freedom is dear, it is important that the Petlurist movement should be identified solely with the personal activities of Petlura. The deeds and the honor of the Attaman Petlura are by no means the same thing as the honor of the Ukrainian people. This must be made quite clear by all who do not want to be identified with the group of Petlura's friends."

GENERAL MARITZ CAUSES ANTI-SEMITIC AGITATION IN SOUTH AFRICA

Johannesburg, Nov. 18.—General Maritz, who recently made a violent attack on the Jews, was the object of a hostile street demonstration here today. As he was walking past the Johannesburg Stock Exchange with a press representative to whom he was explaining the reason for his anti-Jewish stand, about 50 persons standing about the Stock Exchange building booed the General and made what the press describes as one of the most remarkable street demonstrations ever seen in Johannesburg.

"Before the next general election comes," the General said, "the whole aspect of South African politics will have changed. There will no longer be Nationalists and a South African Party. It is going to be a fight between the Jewish Party and the Christian Party. Mr. Tielman Rooze, the Acting-Premier, is trying to pacify the Jews about what I have said. If he is so fond of the Jews let him go and make his own little Republic in Palestine. But I am a Nationalist!"

He is sure that there is a great body of opinion in South Africa which agrees with his sentiments, who are afraid to say so. The future of South Africa and its salvation lies in cooperation between the English and the Dutch. Although these two peoples might never be completely conciliated they must cooperate in face of the emergency.

Mr. Rooze, in a statement he has just made to the Press, says that he attributes General Maritz's outburst to the fact that the Government has paid no heed to his repeated applications for a free pardon for his acts of treason, so that he could get into Parliament. Mr. Rooze has always been opposed to giving him such an amnesty.

PALESTINE MORTGAGE BANK TO PAY DIVIDEND JANUARY 2

The branches of the State Bank of New York were instructed to pay to American holders of the bonds of the General Mortgage Bank of Palestine dividends on the first coupons due on January 2, 1927, an announcement issued by the Palestine Securities states. Any holder of mortgage bonds of the General Mortgage Bank of Palestine may clip his coupons, deposit them in his own bank with instructions to collect on them through the State Bank.

It was recalled that the coupons of the Tel Aviv bonds, numbering about 1100 in the United States, have been paid regularly since 1923, through the Guaranty Trust Company. The next coupons of the Tel Aviv bonds are also due on January 2, 1927 and their holders can collect on them through their own banks.

JEWISH COMMUNAL ACTIVITIES

A good-will meeting of Jews, Protestants and Roman Catholics was held in the Free Synagogue, No. 40 West 68th Street, Wednesday evening.

Dr. Stephen S. Wise, Rabbi of the congregation, the Rev. Dr. S. Parkes Cadman, pastor of the Central Congregational Church of Brooklyn; the Rev. John W. Herring of the Federation of Churches of Christ in America, and Giles Isham, a Catholic and a member of the Oxford University debating team now touring America, were the speakers.

In answer to questions from the audience after the meeting was over, Dr. Cadman said he was convinced the Jews and others in Roumania were suffering injustices and their grievances were to be taken up by the Federal Council of Churches. He said this same organization would pay no attention to Henry Ford's recurrent attacks on the Jews because Mr. Ford's charges "fell rather flat" and were not given much attention.

Eventually, he said, he believed Catholics, Jews and Protestants would come together in a single religion, and history would look upon their present division as "a period of comparative barbarism."

BREVITIES

The General Executive Board of the International Ladies' Garment Workers' Union voted to take over the affairs of Local 22, made up of 9,000 dressmakers, and the one local in the dress and waist trade under Communist control.

The decision of the board, announced by President Morris Sigman, was at once part of the general movement against Communism in the unions, and a step to prevent the 35,000 waist and dress makers of the city, being precipitated into a strike Jan. 1, when the existing wage contract expires.

The Concert of Hebrew Music in Carnegie Hall, Sunday evening, December 26, which will have the distinguished leader of the Moscow Theatre Habima, Naum L. Zemach, and also Miriam Goldin of the company, on its program, has as concluding numbers Hebrew dances set by Saminsky and Gneissin to be performed by four pianists. The pianists, all notable soloists, are Ignace Hilsberg, Isidor Gorn, Max Barnett, William Sauber. Other soloists appearing on the program of concert works based on Hebrew folk music are Eugenia Erganow, Leon Cortilli, Yascha Fishberg and Gdal Saleski.

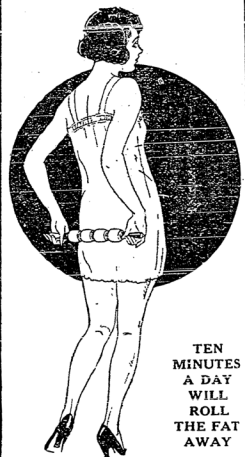
