PALESTINE JEWS BOYCOTT ROUMANIAN GOODS AS PRO- TEST AGAINST POGROMS

**Roumanian Firms Seek Palestine Mar-
ket for Their Products**
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Jerusalem, Dec. 27.—The protest of Palestine Jewry against the continued anti-Jewish excesses in Roumania will find expression in a boycott against Roumanian products and Roumanian steamship companies. A movement in this direction has made itself apparent.

Roumanian commercial firms have recently made an attempt to interest Palestine buyers in Roumanian goods. A Roumanian trade exhibition was arranged to be held shortly in various Palestine towns.

The Palestine League of Nations Society has sent a cable to the International of the League of Nations Societies at Brussels, protesting against the anti-Jewish excesses in Roumania.

ENCYCLOPEDIA BRITANNICA DECLARES IT WILL DELETE ZIONIST FLAG AS MISTAKE

London, Dec. 27.—The editorial management of the encyclopedia Britannica has yielded to the demands of the anti-Zionist Palestine Arab Executive in the matter of the Zionist flag.

A recent edition of the Britannica reproduced in its chapter on Palestine the Zionist flag as one of the Palestine flags. This called forth the protest of the Palestine Arab Executive. The editorial management in reply to this protest declared that the insertion of the Zionist flag was a mistake and will be corrected in all copies available.

FACHENBACH REHABILITATED BY GERMAN FEDERAL COURT

Berlin, Dec. 27.—Herr Fachenbach, former secretary of Kurt Eisner, was rehabilitated by a decision of the German Federal Court.

The court annulled the ten years' prison sentence previously imposed upon Fachenbach. Fachenbach was a member of the Poale Zion party in Germany.

Fachenbach was accused of treason several years ago and was sentenced to twelve years imprisonment. Recently, clemency was granted him. In November, the German Federal Court granted his petition for a reopening of the trial.

FRENCH GOVERNMENT HONORS AUSTRIAN JEWISH ARCHITECT

HEBRAISTS OF AMERICA CONCLUDE THREE-DAY CON- VENTION IN PHILADELPHIA

**Propose to Extend Work; Urge Atten-
tion of American Influences**
(Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Philadelphia, Dec. 27.—Measures to strengthen the Hebraic movement among American Jewry were considered and plans for extending this work were adopted at a three-day convention held here by the Histadruth Ivrit, an organization devoted to popularizing Hebrew as a spoken language and the promotion of Hebrew literature in the United States.

Ben Rosen, educational director of the Philadelphia Federation of Jewish Charities and David Weber welcomed the delegates on behalf of the Philadelphia Jewish community. The sessions of the convention were held at Dropsie College and at the B'nai Beshurun Center.

Various phases of the Hebraic movement and the activities of the organization during the past year were reviewed in the reports and addresses delivered by Abraham Goldberg, president.

A. Speischaender, Menachem Rybalow, editor of the "Hadoar", the organ of the Histadruth Ivrit; K. Whiteman, Dr. S. Bernstein and Z. Scharfstein.

Rabbi M. Berlin on behalf of the Mizrahi, Louis Lipsky on behalf of the Zionist Organization of America and Dr. S. Margoshes on behalf of "The Day" greeted the convention.

The financial report submitted at the convention shows that the organization had during the past year an income of \$28,788.29. The expenditure amounted to \$28,979.20, leaving a deficit of \$191.

Much interest was caused by the address of Dr. Max L. Margolis, head of the Biblical department of Dropsie

VIENNA KEHILLAH PROTESTS AGAINST ANTI-SEMITIC PRO- PAGANDA IN UNIVERSITY

Vienna, Dec. 27.—A protest against the spreading of anti-Semitic leaflets in the halls of the University of Vienna will be lodged, according to a decision of the praesidium of the Vienna Kehillah.

The praesidium will address the protest to the University Senate and to the Austrian Minister of Education.

Several members of the faculty of the University have expressed their indignation at the inactivity of the university authorities in allowing the distribution of the leaflets which contain unusually sharp insults to the Jewish race and are of an inciting character.

One of the leaflets, which is devoted to the corpse question, states, for instance, that Jews refrain from furnishing

NO ACTION LIKELY BY U. S. CONGRESS ON BLOOM RESO- LUTION, IS PREDICTION

**Congressman Addresses Letter to
Henry Ford**
(Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Washington, D. C., Dec. 27.—No investigation of Henry Ford's charges against the Jews will be made by Congress if Representative Bert Snell, chairman of the House Rules Committee, before which Congressman Sol Bloom's resolution to investigate the charges is pending has his way, according to a statement made to the Jewish Telegraphic Agency correspondent. No action has yet been taken by the Committee, and Representative Snell declined to say whether action will or will not be taken. It is a known fact, however, that in most instances the views of the Chairman of the Rules Committee prevail, so that there is little if any chance of favorable action by the Rules Committee.

"I don't think anyone has taken Henry Ford's charges seriously," declared Mr. Snell. "These charges are a joke. Everyone is familiar with the personnel of the Federal Reserve Board and no one could take seriously the charge that the 'International Jew' (whatever that term may mean), is in control of the Federal Reserve Board or America's financial system. On the face of it, these charges are preposterous. Congress should not lower its dignity by even taking the slightest notice of these charges."

Irrespective of Mr. Snell's statement, Congressman Bloom stated he will not cease his efforts for an official investigation of Ford's charges.

Today Congressman Bloom made public a letter which he sent to Henry Ford, putting the matter directly up to him to prove the one charge that the United States Federal Reserve System is under "direct international control." Congressman Bloom challenges Ford to lay proof of his accusations "before the Congress, the country and the American people."

Congressman Bloom's letter to Ford read:

PALESTINE ELECTRIC CO. VOTES 8% DIVIDEND

Jerusalem, Dec. 27.—Marked progress of the Palestine Electric Company was shown in the report submitted at the annual meeting of the Jaffa Electric Company, which is a part of the Ruttenberg concession.

The meeting decided to pay an eight per cent dividend on the preferred stock and six per cent on the common stock. An increase of thirty-three per cent in the consumption of electric power over 1925 was recorded in the report for 1926.

JEWIS HAVE HIGHEST PERCENTAGE OF PERMANENT RESIDENTS AMONG U. S. IMMIGRANTS

Jewish immigrants to the United States hold the highest record for permanent residence in the country among all racial groups of the immigrant population. This fact was brought out in a report entitled "Migration and Business Cycles", which gives the results of an investigation of the ebb and flow of labor in relation to the varying demands of industry. The figures were compiled by the National Bureau of Economic Research, Inc.

In general, the report states, the percentage of permanent residents is high for the race designated by the Government as the Hebrews and the races of Northern and Western Europe; and low for the races of Southern and Eastern Europe, except the Hebrews. Though the incoming South Italians far exceeded in number the immigrants of any other race, the net immigration for this race was only 44% of arriving immigrants in the fiscal years 1908 and 1923; while it was almost 95% for the Hebrews, 89% for the Irish, and over 80% for the Germans.

The figures show that the three leading races in number of immigrants were designated by the Government as the South Italians, Hebrews and Poles, in the order named. For all races, the net immigration—immigration less emigration—equals about 65% of gross immigration.

"In many instances entrance in this country into the ranks of common labor is not necessarily due to incapacity for more skilled occupations, but in part to the inability or failure of the immigrant to capitalize his past experience.

"Thousands of former farmers and agricultural workers find their way into factory, mine, or construction camp; and many skilled handicraftsmen, handicapped by differences in language and different methods of pro-

CREATES CHAIR AT JEWISH INSTITUTE OF RELIGION FOR NON-JEWISH PROFESSORS

A new departure in the field of inter-religious unity has been made by the Jewish Institute of Religion with the announcement made yesterday by Dr. Stephen S. Wise, acting president, that a chair has been created at the Institute by Joseph Strock of New York to honor the name of his late wife, Hilda Stich Strock.

For a number of years, the Institute has invited distinguished teachers who are not of the Jewish faith to lecture before it on themes which come within the purview of a training school for the ministry. These men have been only from American or English schools.

With the establishment of the Hilda Stich Strock Foundation, the Jewish Institute of Religion will, in addition to inviting American and English scholars, begin the practice of inviting some of the leading scholars in the field of Bible study, comparative religion, ancient and medieval history, in order that the students of the Institute may have the point of view of non-Jews, who are pre-eminent scholars, on the problems that face students of religion.

The first scholar to be invited under the terms of the new Foundation, according to Dr. Wise, is Professor Hugo Gressman, Professor of Old Testament Theology in Berlin University, and Rektor of the Institutum Judaicum, in succession to the late Herman Strack.

The second non-Jewish lecturer for 1927-28, under the terms of the Strock Foundation, has been announced as Dr. George Foote Moore, Frothingham Professor of History of Religion in Harvard University.

ZIONIST REVISIONISTS CONFERENCE OPENS IN PARIS

Paris, Dec. 27.—In the presence of 60 delegates from seventeen countries including the United States, the conference of the League of Zionist Revisionists was opened here Sunday. Among the delegates are three representing the United States, three from Palestine and three from England.

Vladimir Jabotinsky delivered an address in which he described the present situation in the Zionist movement and in Palestine and outlined his program for improving the situation. Mr. Jabotinsky criticized the Palestine government for its attitude toward the obligation incurred in the Mandate for the creation of the Jewish national home and charged it with the responsibility for the present economic crisis in Palestine.

An address was delivered by Mr. M. Grossman on the "Problems of the Activists." Vladimir Tiomkin delivered the opening address in which he declared that the Zionist Revisionist movement is growing continually and has gathered considerable strength among the Zionists.

The Wadsworth Bill and the Attacks on "Foreigners"

The Wadsworth bill, calling for the admission of 35,000 wives and minor children of declarants, which was recently passed by the U. S. Senate "should be approved on its merits by the lower house of Congress," urges the Chicago "News."

"The concession made in the Wadsworth bill to immigrants who have taken steps to acquire the status of citizenship is moderate and reasonable," the paper writes. "It is designed to ameliorate conditions that in more than a few instances are known to be tragic. Moreover, it is a measure of economic and moral stabilization. Family life is particularly beneficial to persons in a new atmosphere, where many adjustments are to be effected and social dangers avoided."

A protest against the attacks on "foreigners" that have been made since the renewed efforts in the U. S. Congress to modify the present immigration laws, is voiced by the New York "Forward" of Dec. 27, wherein we read:

"Since there has been a bit of noise in Congress about modifying the immigration laws attacks have come from all directions against the 'foreigners.' Anathemas have especially been hurled at our own New York. In the papers and on the radio 'good and pious' folk are declaring that New York, which has a large immigrant population, is a veritable Sodom, where all the bootleggers, gamblers and gangsters are to be found."

Drawing a parallel between New York and other cities where the immigrant population is much smaller, the "Forward" adds: "The enemies of the immigrants are either blinded by their hatred or else they are ignorant of the conditions in New York and other cities. Of course New York has its gangsters and bootleggers and gamblers, but compared to other cities it is but a Sunday School."

Urges President Coolidge to Refute Ford's Charges

The suggestion that if Congress takes no action on Congressman Sol Bloom's resolution President Coolidge should make a public statement refuting Ford's charge that the United States Federal Reserve System is under Jewish control, is put forth in the "Jewish Morning Journal" of yesterday by Jacob Fishman, who observes:

"We have a precedent for this in the President's speech at Omaha when the Klan became unbearable. At that time Coolidge gained grace overnight in the eyes of all liberal minded people. And his speech had the desired effect. The Klan is today merely a living corpse.

EMANUEL NEUMANN PREDICTS SUCCESS FOR UNITED PALESTINE APPEAL IN 1927

Report Shows Increase in Income This Year Over Same Period in 1925; Campaigns Throughout Country to Start in January

Confidence in the success of this year's United Palestine Appeal for \$7,500,000 was expressed by Emanuel Neumann, chairman of the Executive Committee of the Appeal, in a report made public by the Appeal.

Dating back to October 1, when the first campaigns towards the year's quota were officially opened, Mr. Neumann's report shows a net increase of 38 per cent over the subscriptions in the corresponding period of the previous year. Another section of his statement, showing comparative figures for the past three months of this year as against those for 1925, shows that there were considerable increases not only in the income from the United Palestine Appeal but also in the remittances made to Palestine.

Mr. Neumann praises Judge William M. Lewis, national chairman, and Bernard Stone, executive secretary, and declares that much of the success of the Appeal is due to their efforts in cooperation with the hundreds of workers.

"The campaign so far conducted for the \$7,500,000 United Palestine Appeal gives augury that previous efforts for Palestine by the Jews of America will be exceeded by the responses of this year," Mr. Neumann states. "While most of the campaigns throughout the country are not to be held until after the middle of January, the handful of cities which have already conducted their campaigns indicate an ever-increasing generosity in American Jewry's response to Palestine's Appeal. In every instance so far this year, cities with Jewish populations of 50,000 or over have exceeded the amounts raised last year, the average increase in the country being 38 per cent. The majority of the smaller communities fell in line by either equalling last year's record, or by exceeding previous receipts."

The larger communities which increased their receipts over last year's quota include Baltimore, Cleveland, Cincinnati, Boston, and San Francisco. Other cities that have so far conducted campaigns, or where campaigns are in progress, include Colchester, Conn.; Toledo, O.; Atlantic City, N. J.; New Brunswick, N. J.; Oklahoma City, Okla.; Allentown, Pa.; Harrisburg, Pa.; Minersville, Pa.; Reading, Pa.; and West Chester, Pa.

In addition to the above, the following campaigns have been organized to take place in the near future: Birmingham,

Ala.; Montgomery, Ala.; Meriden, Conn.; New London, Conn.; Norwich, Conn.; Middletown, Conn.; Waterbury, Conn.; Albany, N. Y.; Elmira, N. Y.; Syracuse, N. Y.; Rochester, N. Y.; Wilkes-Barre, Pa.; and Indianapolis, Ind.

Mr. Neumann's statement declares that the total campaign receipts to date, including community subscriptions and individual contributions announced at the National Conference on Palestine recently held in Boston, exceed the sum of \$1,000,000.

Comparative figures quoted by Mr. Neumann showing the remittance made to Palestine during the last three months, as compared with the remittances for the similar period of 1925, show that during October 1 to December 23, 1926, there was remitted a total of \$554,775 as against the sum of \$433,240 for the same period in 1925.

The Greater New York campaign, Mr. Neumann announces, will open on January 17, with a mass meeting in Mecca Temple. The delegation headed by Dr. Chaim Weizmann, and including Dr. Georg Halpern, Dr. Chaim Arlosoroff and Professor Selig Brodetsky, will be joined next week by Commander Joseph Montague Kenworthy, who will participate in the New York as well as the country wide Appeal.

PLAN POPULAR "YIDDISH UNIVERSITY" IN PHILA.

Philadelphia, Dec. 27.—Steps toward the organization of a "Yiddish University" in this city have been taken here.

This plan is the outgrowth of a conference held recently by representatives of Jewish societies of Philadelphia.

The plan was put forward by Prof. Hayim Fineman, head of the English Department at Temple University.

"This institution will be known as the Popular University," Dr. Fineman said, "and will offer courses that are not available in such specialized institutions as Gratz and Dropsie Colleges."

"All instruction will be given in Yiddish except in such cases where the use of English is absolutely imperative. The curriculum at first will include subjects that are commonly taught in university extension departments, such as economics and sociology, as well as courses dealing with specifically Jewish subjects."

It is expected that only \$5,000 or \$6,000 will be necessary to permit the opening of classes.

The committee selected to carry out the plan includes M. Katz, chairman; Mrs. Mary Greenberg, Dr. Fineman, H. S. Seidenberg, I. L. Stern, M. M. Silver, Dr. Moskonick, Dr. M. Barbour, vice-chairmen; M. Israelov, secretary, and B. Mapu, treasurer.

A check for \$10,000 was received by the United Hospital Fund from Colonel Michael Friedsam, president of the Altman Foundation.

A Significant Event in Canadian Jewry

(By Our Montreal Correspondent, A. Khinevich)

Montreal, Dec. 17.—The settling of the misunderstandings between the Jewish Immigrant Society of Canada and the Ica, achieved at the meeting here last Sunday of the National Executive of the Jewish Immigrant Society, is of more than ordinary significance. Since the number of Jewish immigrants to the United States has been so tremendously lessened by the quota laws, the importance of Canada as a haven even if only for a limited number of Jewish immigrants each year has risen proportionately, and hence too the establishment of good relations between the two above-named organizations is bound to have far reaching effects.

In fact, the favorable results of the new unity are making themselves felt already. Where hitherto there was separate and often conflicting action by the two organizations there is now cooperation and unity of action, as evidenced in the case of the delegation, with representatives of both bodies, which on Dec. 14, only two days after the understanding had been arrived at, called on the Minister of Immigration, Robert Forke, in Ottawa, and presented a request that the government grant the Jews of this country a new concession for the admission of relatives of Canadian Jews. The delegation, headed by S. W. Jacobs, A. Heaps, Rabbi Isserman and Lyon Cohen, was given a very cordial hearing by the Minister, and there is no doubt that their plea was strengthened by the fact they were united and spoke in the name of all Canadian Jewry.

Aside from this achievement the conference discussed a number of specific problems relating to Jewish immigration. Chief of these perhaps was the question whether Canadian Jewry should rest content with the general immigration laws of the country, or whether the situation warrants demanding special concessions for the Jewish immigrants. Thus it was pointed out that the Jewish refugees who are still stranded in various ports constitute a problem that is different from that of other immigrants and a concession in their favor is obviously necessary. P. C. 534 of the present immigration law was also cited. This article permits a Canadian Jew to bring over an unmarried child or brother, but what is to be done about a married child or brother or sister? Or what is one to do if the immigrant relative has not been able to conform entirely with the law which requires that the trip across be direct and uninterrupted, etc.?

All these and other problems were thrashed out and the demands which were later submitted to Minister Forke, were formulated. One cannot say definitely what the outcome will be. It is not likely that the government will consent to the same quota it granted the Jews in 1926, but it is almost assured that certain important concessions will be granted in this respect.

copy of my resolution, pending in the House of Representatives, calling for an investigation, by a select committee of seven, of your charge that the United States Federal Reserve system is under direct international control.

"I enclose also a copy of a letter sent by me to Representative Snell. As yet I have received no intimation from Mr. Snell concerning the House Rules Committee's attitude. Although you must have learned through the press of my move for a complete investigation of your charge, I have received no information from yourself as to your inclination for or against a thorough proving of the influence back of the Federal Reserve Board's policies.

"It seems to me, therefore, that a request addressed directly to yourself may serve to expedite an investigation which certainly is imperatively needed, if the Federal Reserve system is under such control as you assert.

"If it is proved that our financial system is internationally controlled, I shall resent it as deeply as yourself. Our government's finances should be entirely free from any vestige of alien domination, regardless of individualities, of race, country, creed, group or any other affiliations.

"International control obviously does mean, at least in part, alien control, inasmuch as internationalism cannot possibly be all-American. Every American will agree that there should not be the slightest suspicion of any but all-American influences in control, or even partial control, of the Federal Reserve system. I, as an American, concur heartily in this sentiment.

"Yet you have stated it as a fact that the Federal Reserve system is internationally controlled. If such control exists, it calls urgently for congressional action. The Congress created the Federal Reserve system and is the only body which can officially investigate it. But the Congress must have proof. An accusation is not proof. I by no means disregard your indictment. But the proof? Is it too much to ask you, as a good citizen, to bring it into court?—to lay it before Congress, the people?"

"You say, in the 'Dearborn Independent,' that you are willing to put others in the way of obtaining the same evidence on which you base your conclusions. But why not reveal the evidence itself? Why not permit an official investigation to begin in the light of such information as you possess now? If you have these facts, you owe it to your reputation as 'Chronicler of the Neglected Truth' to present them before the Congress. If, on mature consideration, you feel that you have charged more than you can substantiate, it is again the part of the 'Chronicler of the Neglected Truth' to admit it.

"Should you, for some reason, prefer not to appear before the Rules Committee, I ask you, before what congressional committee would you be willing to appear? Or before what body? In short, what method, of your own choosing, would be satisfactory to you as a means of placing, not a charge, but proofs of the international control

College on "Hebrew as a Spoken Language."

Dr. Margolis explained why Hebrew has survived the tragic vicissitudes of thousands of years.

Whereas more dominant languages such as the original Greek and Latin have vanished as spoken tongues, Hebrew has survived, according to Dr. Margolis, for two reasons. The first, and probably the principal one, is that the race that has always used the language has survived.

"The other reason," said Dr. Margolis, "is one that goes back beyond the middle ages. Long after the dispersion of the Jews messengers came periodically from Palestine to the Jewish colonies in Europe. These messengers, of course, spoke only Hebrew. In each Jewish community they were certain to find men who spoke not only the local idiom, but also Hebrew. Since the custom of sending messengers back and forth to Palestine has continued throughout the ages, Hebrew has thus been kept alive.

"The history of the Hebrew language from its beginning to the present time is still to be written," Dr. Margolis said. "The documents surviving from antiquity are literary and their language is somewhat artificial."

Dr. Margolis criticized Hebrew as it is spoken in Palestine now as "being too uniform and possessing too few synonyms." He said the building of the national home would be meaningless without the use of Hebrew speech.

Among the resolutions adopted was one calling for the award of a prize for the best literary production in the Hebrew language during the year. A jury of eleven Hebrew writers of America, Palestine and Europe will be the judges. During the debate which occupied the major part of the last day's session, the demand was put forward that more emphasis be laid in the Hebraic organization and its paper on the purely American aspects of the movement.

A prolonged debate was caused by the proposal made by Mr. Whiteman that the organization change its method of work and extend its activities not only among the Hebraists but among Jews generally.

Abraham Goldberg was re-elected president of the organization. K. Whiteman was chosen vice-president and William Z. Spiegelman, honorary secretary. M. Rybalow, Z. Scharfstein, Dr. S. Bernstein and Dr. P. Churgin were elected to the administrative committee.

of the Federal Reserve system before the Congress—the country—the American people?

"You are a man of far too much consequence in this country, Mr. Ford, and you speak with a voice of too much authority to make such a charge without producing a deep impression. You have lodged in many minds a suspicion, or certainty, which will do great harm if your charge remains no more than a charge, neither disproved nor substantiated."

ing Jewish corpses for the clinics because the Jewish body is abnormal. The Jewish brain is differently shaped than the non-Jewish brain and that is the reason why the nonsensical pacifism was born in the Jewish mind, one of the pamphlets states.

The protest of the Vienna Kehilla called forth a declaration by the dean of the university, according to which a new ordinance will be issued concerning the regulations with regard to posters in the university. He also ordered the immediate removal of the anti-Semitic placards and proclamations which are posted on the bulletin boards.

"Mendel Spivack" by Semion Yuskewitch, was presented last Thursday at the Yiddish Art Theatre by Maurice Schwartz and his company. Mr. Schwartz as Mendel was supported by Bina Abramowitz, as Aunt Schahel; Gella Adler, as Mendel's wife; Joseph Buloff and Isidore Cashier.

The Jewish Public Theatre, a new playhouse 21, Second Avenue and Fourth Street, New York, is announced to open on Jan. 8. The theatre has been built by David Schulman and Louis Goldberg, and was designed by Major David M. Olsharsky. It will be opened with an operetta.

Six Chicago Jewish charities received donations totalling \$5,000 as part of the \$67,200 Christmas charity distribution of the Wiesbold Foundation. The Foundation bases its contributions on the theory that authorized philanthropic agencies can serve the poor people of the city more efficiently than unsystematized giving. The largest donation to Jewish organization was \$2,500 to the Jewish Social Service Bureau. Others to receive checks were Jewish Relief Fund, Finding Society, \$900; Scholarship Association for Jewish Children, \$600; Marks Nathan Jewish Orphan home, \$500; The Jewish People's Institute, \$300, and The Orthodox Jewish Home for Aged, \$300.

A check for \$2,500 was given the Associated Jewish Charities of Chicago by the P. J. Carr Memorial Christmas Fund association. This sum represents the share of a sum exceeding \$20,000 which was raised for charitable uses. Various organizations and newspapers in Chicago helped raise the fund. The money given the Associated Jewish Charities will go into the organization's general treasury.

General Abel Davis of Chicago was named by Anton J. Cernak, president of the Cook County Board, to head a committee to prepare plans for the preservation and development of the Cook County forest preserves.
