NATIONAL ORIGIN PLAN MAY NOT GO INTO EFFECT; SECRE-

(Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Washington, Jan. 11.—The likelihood that President Coolidge will not issue the proclamation to put into effect the "national origins" plan became greater yesterday when a supplementary report on the computations of the sub-com-mittee was submitted to the Senate by President Coolidge.

Secretaries Kellogg, Hoover and James J. Davis have now refused to take responsibility for the basis upon which the quotas for immigrants to be admitted during 1927 under the national

origins law was determined.

When the quotas were announced last week, the three Secretaries said nothing of this kind in their letter of transmittal to Mr. Coolidge. In the letter sent by the President to the Senate yesterday they disclaimed resonnsibility for the computations arrived at by a sub-committee under their supervision

Senators interested in the "national origins" quotas said that the new construction undoubtedly gave to the President an opportunity to refrain from issuing a proclamation to declare the quotas in effect on July 1, 1927.

Since the national origins quotas were announced and it was seen that Great Britain and Northern Ireland would not only receive such a large proportion of the total immigrants to be admitted, but a large increase from the present (Continued on Page 3)

JEWISH DRAMATIST TRACES SHYLOCK LEGEND BACK

TO ANGLO-SAXON LAW Original Shylock Was Not a Jew. Jewish Historical Society Hears (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

London, Jan. 11.-The original Shylock was not a Jew but an Englishman, and Shakespeare borrowed his character from an anti-Jewish poem written in the thirteenth century, was the claim made yesterday by Myer J. Landa, Jewish journalist and dramatist, author of "The Alien Problem" and "The Jew in Drama."

Speaking before the Jewish Historical Society, Mr. Landa said he had traced the origin of the Jewish creditor who demanded his pound of flesh to a "Cursor Mundi", by an anonymous author, written about the end of the thirteenth century. Before then, said Mr. Landa, there was no Jew in the story.

The creditor in "Cursor Mundi" written about the time the Jews were expelled from England in 1290, was a fiendish person who sought to take the weight of the money he lent in a debtor's flesh piecemeal, beginning with the eyes and proceeding to the hand, tongue and nose. This horrible mutilation, Mr. Landa declared, was absolutely unknown in Jewish law, tra-dition, legend or history. The author, he said, got the idea from English law and practice in Norman and Plantagenet and even Saxon times.

SAMUEL GORDON, ANGLO-JEWISH NOVELIST, DIES

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) London, Jan. 11.-Samuel Gordon, Anglo-Jewish novelist and dramatist, died last night at the age of 56.

Samuel Gordon, whose work dealt almost wholly with Jewish life and character, was the author of "A Handful of Exotics," "Daughters of Shem,"
"Lesser Destinies," "Sons of the Coveand "Strangers at the Gate." Among his plays is "The Way Back."

The late writer was born in Buk, Germany, Sept. 10, 1871. He came to England with his parents in 1883 and was educated at the City of London School and Cambridge University. He was appointed secretary of the Great Synagogue in London, in 1894.

Baptists Gain First Victory in Move Against Persecutions in Roumania

The effect of the protest movement against Roumania for the persecution of religious and national minorities in that country is making itself felt, according to a despatch from Warsaw in yesterday's N. Y. "Times."

"The American Baptists," the

Baptists," Times" despatch states, "have gained their first tentative victory in the cam-paign of all Protestant and Jewish sects against the Roumanian Governsects against the Koumanan Govern-ment's alleged discriminatory treat-ment and persecution of their people, according to Dr. J. H. Rushbrooke, Secretary of the Baptist World Alli-ance, who arrived in Warsaw this morning from Bucharest.

"Dr. Rushbrooke said that he had the promise of a conference within a month with Foreign Minister Mitilinu of Roumania and the Ministers of Culture, the Interior and Education with a view to the elimination of religious inequality.

"W. O. Lewis, representative of the Northern State Baptists of the United

States in Northern Europe, added that 15,000 Baptists in Poland were also under the most severe handicaps, but that persecution such as prevailed in Roumania was far less.

"Dr. Rushbrooke declared that if next month's conference proved un-satisfactory, a Baptist campaign throughout the world would be directed to exposing the details of past difficulties.

AMERICAN EDITORS DISCUSS PALESTINE PROBLEM WITH COMMANDER KENWORTHY

A group of American journalists and editors engaged in a discussion of the problems facing the reconstruction of the Jewish Homeland in Palestine, at a dinner tendered to Lt. Commander Joseph Montague Kenworthy, M.P.,

noted British parliamentary leader, at the Hotel Waldorf Astoria, on Monday. The dinner was sponsored by Norman Hapgood, United States Min-ister to Denmark during the Wilson administration, Herman Bernstein, Editor of the "Jewish Tribune" and H. V. Kaltenborn, editor of the "Brooklyn Eagle.'

In his introductory address, Mr. Hapgood, who acted as toastmaster, deciared: "The doubts long shared by me and other non-Jews as to the possibility of reconciling Jewish national-ism with our international ideals has been dissipated by the remarkable spirit of understanding and goodwill which the Jews of Palestine have brought with them into the country. Enlightened nationalism such as Jewish nationalism is without imperialistic policies and which does not engender a chau-vinistic spirit may be regarded of inestimable value to mankind and in-ternational peace. This has been thoroughly demonstrated by the present Jewish achievements in Palestine, where Jews live in amity and helptulness with the Arab population."

Commander Kenworthy in his address declared that not only was the British Labor Party, of which he is a member, giving its fullest support to the carrying out, both in the spirit and in the letter, of the Balfour Declara-tion, but that both Liberals and Con-

servatives were also similarly pledged.
"The British people and the Government supporters as well as the enlight-ened opinion of the civilized world stands squarely behind the Balfour Declaration and nothing can bring about

a change in this policy."

In discussing Jewish-Arab relations in Palestine, Commander Kenworthy declared "relations between the Arabs and Jews are improving from day to The Arab population has begun to realize that with the restoration of the Jewish Homeland its own standard of living and economic prosperity is

being greatly improved.

"It has been proven that one hundred dunams of land, or twenty-five acres, cultivated in an intensive manner is sufficient to support an individual family," he stated. "By careful analysis it becomes clear that the Palestine of today can support an agricultural population of one million. It is reasonable to believe that with increasing Jewish immigration the Jewish National Homeland will naturally expand into Transjordania where there are found vast stretchess of rich and uncultivated land now left idle. But agriculture is not the only source of livelihood for the Jewish population. Industry and commerce are constantly expanding and with the improvements and extension of railroads and the construction of the port of Haifa, untold possibilities lie

ahead of the lewish Homeland, which (Continued on Page 4)

quotas, while the Irish Free State and Scandinavia would suffer accordingly, opposition has developed.

On Friday evening the President sent the national origins figures to the Senate, together with a letter from the Secretaries of State, Commerce and Labor dated Jan. 3. This letter gave a report from the sub-committee which made up the figures and determined the quotas.

Yesterday Mr. Coolidge sent to the Senate a formal fifty-word communication saying he was attaching a "copy of the letter of transmission" which ac-companied the Kellogg-Hoover-Davis report, "to replace an inaccurate copy which was inadvertently forwarded to

the Senate with such report."

The new letter from the three Secretaries was also dated Jan. 3. Its first paragraph was identical except that it substituted "alter this representation" for "alter the conclusions arrived at." Its last paragraph was essentially dif-

ferent, however, and read: "Although this is the best information we have been able to secure, we wish to call attention to the reservations made by the committee and to state that in our opinion the statistical and historical information available raises grave doubts as to the whole value of these computations as a basis for the purposes intended. We cannot, therefore, assume responsibility for such conclusions under these circumstances.

Representative Holaday of Illinois introduced a bill in the House yesterday providing for voluntary registration of aliens in order to facilitate procedure for their naturalization.

The measure provides that between May 1, 1927, and Oct. 31, 1927, inclusive, any unnaturalized alien who entered the United States prior to July 1, 1924, and who desires to become an American citizen may upon compliance with certain regulations register with the Labor Department.

The department is authorized to provide application blanks with questions designed to disclose the past history and present status of the alien, to assist in determining his suitability to become

Albany, Jan. 11.—Senator Benjamin Antin of the Bronx, yesterday intro-duced a resolution in the State Senate urging the House of Representatives to pass the pending amendment to the Immigration Act of 1924 which will permit the entry into the United States as non-quota immigrants of the wives and minor children of resident aliens who have declared their intention to become citizens of the United States.

In advocating the adoption of his resolution Senator Antin said, "The pending amendment of the Immigration Act of 1924 should be speedily enacted into law. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency Mail Service) Jerusalem, Dec. 19 .- Companies of several countries have asked permission to investigate the mineral and other possibilities of the Dead Sea with the view of later obtaining a concession to exploit such products commercially. Only recently the Jewish company which has been occupied for many years in investigating the possibilities of the Dead Sea finished its works.

Chemists from the Hebrew Univer-sity and other Jewish experts have been investigating the various salts and depths of the Sea. An Australian company has also been making various investigations with the cooperation of the Government geologist, it is stated by "Davar." The Chief Secretariat has stated that the results of the investigations and the plans for granting the concession are not for publication.

"I have published many articles in defense of the Roumanian Jews and also a number of diplomatic documents which did do something towards the alleviation of the intolerable position of the Rouof the intoterante position of the Roa-manian Jews, which was in such flag-rant contradiction of the international agreements of 1878. I was happy when I was assured solemnly by leading Rou-manian statesmen, and also by a Roumanian deputation which included among other influential Roumanian citizens the former Chief of the Rou-manian Army Staff, that anti-Semitism was dead in Roumania. But now a young Jewish student, David Falik, has been assassinated in Czernowitz by the Roumanian student Teutu, a disciple of that Professor Cuza whom the anti-Semites regard as their Savior. If I were to follow the example of many Roumanians and regard Professor Cuza merely as a lunatic I should be showing him too much tolerance. This anti-Semitic movement which is instigating unheard-of persecutions against the Jews of Roumania has its roots in the universities, but, unfortunately, it is spreading also throughout the country and as soon as Roumanian statesmen assure us that it has gone it breaks out anew as in the case of the recent excesses in Roumania, in which Jewish

"The students' conterence at Jassy has been followed by a series of anti-Jewish disturbances. Jewish passengers have been attacked and maltreated on the railways. The students on their return journey from Jassy got out at the stations en route and desecrated synagogues, plundered Jewish shops, robbed Jewish houses, and assaulted Jewish men and women. When the Government's attention was called in the Chamber to these events, it promised to intervene. But has it intervened? The half-hearted attitude of the Government makes one doubt of its goodwill.

"We who have always stood up in defense of the territorial and political greatness of Roumania cannot help thinking that Roumania is carrying on in Europe the example of religious persecution which has been set by Mexico.

'In view of these latest occurrences, we want to put this question-what is the League of Nations doing, this great body which has made it its task-to defend the oppressed nations such as the Armenians and Bulgarians? Why is the League of Nations not taking up this matter in the name of religious liberty, which is the essential condition for the maintenance of political and economic peace?" Luzzatti declared.

> "These quotas are not so bad as was expected," the "World" writes, "but they are bad enough. German immigration would be reduced from 61,227 annually to 23,428, Irish immigration (the Irish Free State) from 28,567 to 13,862, and Scandinavian immigration from 18,803 to 6,570. None of these reductions is justifiable. Unless the President is found to have power to ignore the clause a bill to repeal it should be hurried through Congress."
