Detroit, Apr. 2.—Officials of the take the women from the fields and county prosecutor's office moved to put them in their homes. puncture the bubble of obscurity surrounding the automobile crash in which Ford was injured here last Sunday.

Prosecutor Robert M. Toms asked officials of the Ford Motor Company for a complete report of their investigation of the affair. Mr. Toms said he did not intend to initiate an investigation unless the Ford organization report was such as to warrant arrest of those responsible.

In the face of persistent reports that the Ford coupe in which the man who makes them was riding deliber-ately was knocked from the road by a large speeding closed car Mr. Toms said he wanted "to find out what it is all about."

Official investigations were made by only two agencies, the Police Department of Dearborn, the Detroit suburbjust outside of which Mr. Ford's car was sidewiped, and the constable in charge of patrolling that point. Both reports leaned toward the theory of unavoidable accident.

ADOPT A COMPROMISE RESOLUTION ON ZIONISM Basic Character of Judaism Is Reli-gious, Resolution Claims, But Leaves Free Choice to Individuals

(Tewish Telegraphic Agency) Berlin, Apr. 2.-Reform rabbis in Germany are not bound, in their attitude toward the Zionist movement, by any policy of the synagogue which they represent.

At a conference of Liberal Rabbis which closed here on Friday, the question of the attitude toward Zionism was heatedly debated. The debate was con-cluded by the adoption of a compromise resolution which stated that "the basic character of Judaism is religious." Another part of the resolution states that "the conference, therefore, rejects the attempt to present Judaism in a naattempt to present Judaism in a na-tional aspect." The conference went on record as "leaving it to the personal responsibility of each individual to take whatever attitude toward Zionism he thinks proper. The conference hopes the settlement of Palestine will proceed in the spirit of safeguarding Jewish re-ligious life."

GOEMBOES TO LIQUIDATE BRANCH OF HUNGARIAN ANTI-SEMITIC MOVEMENT

Anti-Semites in Greece Renew Ritual Murder Agitation

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Vienna, Apr. 2.-One branch of the anti-Semitic movement in Hungary will soon go out of business, according to despatches to the evening newspapers from Budapest.
Deputy Julius Goemboes, notorious

anti-Semitic leader who has been of-fered the post of Minister of the Interior in the Bethlen cabinet, announced today, the despatches state, that he will liquidate the Hungarian Race Protection movement of which he'is the head. He found the movement to be utterly fruitless, he said.

The organization headed by Goemboes, known as the Rassenschuetzler, was responsible for many anti-Jewish outrages in Hungary in recent years.

Salonica, Apr. 2.-With the approach of Passover, the anti-Semitic organization of Florina repeated the ritual murder accusation it conducted in 1925 and 1926 against the Jews of the town. Two Greek children aged 5 and 7

were reported lost. The parents said that they were sure that the Jews had kidnapped them to kill them for ritual purposes. A mob gathered in the streets and shouted "Kill the Jews." The Chief of Police said that he be-

lieved the Jews had kidnapped the children, and he instructed the Rabbi of Florina to restore the children to their parents. The Greek Metropolitan, however, intervened on behalf of the lews and persuaded the police to undertake a search for the missing chil-dren. Feeling in the town ran high and militia had to be posted in the Jewish quarter to protect the Jewish population from the infuriated mob. Eventually the children were found by the police in a neighboring village.

An investigation into the affair has been ordered by the authorities.

The Issue Is Clear

No matter what will be the outcome of the libel suit brought by Aaron Sapiro against Henry Ford, declares the "Jewish Tribune" of April 1, "the real issue cannot be obscured by legal technicalities, the police court methods of the chief of defense counsel, or the academic wranglings by both sides.

"The truth is," the paper explains, "that Sapiro was singled out for attack because he is a Jew, and not because Henry Ford or his hireling thinkers were concerned about the fate of the 'poor 'American farmer. These attacks were all part of a vicious and malicious policy adopted in 1920 and adhered to with that arrogant asinine stubborness charactertisc of ignorant fanatics,-the policy of casting suspicion upon any Jew who has become praiseworthy in America, of putting sinister interpretations upon the acts of such Jews no matter how purely motivated, of denouncing the cooperation of Jews in any field as a spiracy.' It is this policy which which should be looked into; it is maintenance of this policy of character-assassination which Ford should be required to explain, for excuse it he cannot! This is the real issue in the present suit, and we feel that the ends of justice will not be served if the issue is evaded."

The Milwaukee (Wis.) "Journal" (Mar. 23) while agreeing with the rul-ing of Judge Raymond that technically a race cannot be libelled and the trial is therefore a personal issue between Sapiro and Ford, feels, nevertheless, that "the attempt of Mr. Sapiro's attorneys to make the whole Iewish race in effect a party to the suit may serve a useful public purpose. The belief that a purely Jewish drama is destined to take a conspicuous place in the world's literature of the stage, is voiced in the London "Daily Telegraph." In a series of articles, which began on Mar. 17, on the role of the Jews in the thea re of the nations, the writer L. A. H. Jones, says in part:

"Today most of the French theatres are in the hands of Jewish shareholders, the majority of the actors of Jewish nationality and three-quarters of the dramatic productions the work of Jewish authors.

"The revolution of 1784 enunciating the principle of the equality of all men, gave French Jewry its permit d'entree into the lists of open intellectual com-petition in France. The coming of Meyerbeer, Halevy and Offenbach and later Saint-Saens-all of them Jewsmay be said to have heralded the birth of Jewish influence in the French the-

"The most eminent, and one is almost tempted to say, the most disinterested among the present-day Jewish dramatic authors, is unquestionably M. Porto Riche, a Porto Rican Jew. M. Jerusalem, Mar. 4 .- A. Conference of Rabbis and orthodox communal workrappis and orthodox communa work-ers of all sections was held in Jeru-salem this week. About 200 persons from all parts of the country were present.
