CONCESSION TO EXTRACT POTASH FROM DEAD SEA WILL SOON BE GRANTED Colonial Office Investigation Commis-

sion Finds Bright Prospects for Revival of Palestine Industry (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

London, Apr. 4.-The concession for

the exploitation of the Dead Sea to obtain potash may shortly be grant-ed by the British Colonial Office, a report in the London "Daily Chronicle" states today.

The number of applicants for the concession has been reduced to two or three and it is probable that they will he united into one concession group. The concession may be given for a

period of 21 or 25 years.

A commission of the Colonial Office, which investigated the commercial possibility of the region, reported that there would be no difficulty in extracting 100,000 tons of potash annually from the Dead Sea. The newspaper adds that the commission was extremely cautious in its estimate in the possible exploitation of this inexhaustable reservoir. With the securing of a good management. Palestine can be made a country flowing with milk and honey and the Dead Sea will be a decisive factor in the industrial revival ot Palestine's prosperity, the paper states.

ARABS AND JEWS UNITE FOR FORTHCOMING JERUSA-LEM MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS

Both Arab Parties Issue Statements Favorable to Jews

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Jerusalem, Apr. 4.—Jewish and Arab parties will work together in the forthcoming municipal elections in Jerusalem as a result of an agreement concluded here yesterday.

Following Devish community concluded an eticion agreement that he cluded an eticion agreement that he cluded an eticion agreement that he mayor, Nashishibi, and El Husseini. Support for the candidates of both parties is a part of the agreement. Nashishibi and Husseini, who is the secretary of the anti-Zionist Palestine Arab Executive, have made declarations favorable to the Jewish population.

The register of voters from the municipal elections in Jerusalem showed, when completed, 1,463 Moslem voters, 1,227 Jews and 830 Christians.

In Haifa, the Electoral Committee announced on completion of the registration, that 4,590 voters had registered, including 1,915 Moslems, 1,836 Christians and 819 Jews. Appeals from those whose names have been omitted will be heard by the Committee after the register has been published.

ZIONIST CONGRESS TO MEET IN BASLE IN SEPTEMBER (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

London, Apr. 4.—The Fifteenth Zionist Congress, the legislative body of the Zionist movement, will take place in Basle, it is stated here on ad authority.

The Congress will in all probability be convened in September.

The Yeshiva Cornerstone and Orthodox Unity

FRANCE WELCOMES JEWISH IMMIGRATION, HERRIOT SAYS (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Canadian Paper Discusses Sapiro-Ford Suit

Regret at the fact that the Jewish issue has been ruled out of the Sapiro-Ford libel suit is voiced by the Toronto (Ont.) "Mail & Empire" of March 22.

The paper recalls with some amusement Mr. Ford's experience on the witness stand in his famous libel suit against the Chicago "Tribune" and expresses the hope that he may be called to testify in the present trial. It then goes on to say:

"Through the 'Dearborn Independent. ent, a weekly paper owned by Mr. Ford, campaigns have been carried on against the Jews, though it has been patiently explained that the campaigns were not against the Jews but against certain Jews. The paper unearthed old, sensational and discredited documents to show that a clique of Jews was mainly responsible for all the ills the modern world is heir to, including the world war and the soviet republic. The 'Dearborn Independent' writer seemed to think that these Jews were plotting for the overthrow of the whole Christian civilization and the establishment of the Jews upon its ruins as the mas-ters of the world. Innumerable He-brew societies protested against the articles, but were met with the bland assurance that not the race but certain members of it were being properly exposed. But if Mr. Ford's supposed attitude to the Jews is to be excluded from the record the trial will loose much of its popular appeal. It will, nevertheless, be an important one, since Mr. Ford is alleged to have asserted that Sapiro's false conduct was due to a conspiracy which aimed at controlling

WASSERMANN'S "WORLD'S ILLUSION" TO BE FILMED BY METRO- GOLDWYN

Producers Entertain Noted Novelist (Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Los Angeles, Apr. 4.—Jacob Was-sermann, whose "World's Illusion", is to be produced as a moving picture, was the guest of the Metro-Goldwyn Mayer studio, owners of the film rights of his novel.

If his case shall be separated from its actual background, Sapiro will find himself in difficulty.

"A great statesman once said that you could not indict a people. This pompous dictum appears to be incor-porated into English and American jurisprudence. If Henry Ford, or any other sees fit to attack a race, or a religion, or a people, or a nation, there does not appear to be anything to do about it except to depend upon the vindication of time, circumstances, history the facts."

The High Point (N. C.) "Enterprise" (March 24) seems to take the view that the responsibility for the anti-Jewish campaign of the "Dearborn Independent" rests on its editor, Cameron, rather than on Ford. We read, in part: "The suit has served to bring more

fully into public notice the man back of the strenuous assault on the morality of a race. That man is not Henry Ford, and nobody who followed Ford's rord, and nobody who followed Fords testimony in the Chicago 'Tribune' trial suspected it was he. Editor Cameron was the marshal of the attack and Cameron now says that Ford's instructions to him were to be sure he was right and then to go ahead."
The paper adds: "If Sapiro wins his

case, Mr. Ford will be forced to pay. It is conceivable that the Detroit manufacturer would be willing to spend some of his millions in a kind of preaching; up to the present time ne has turned very little of that gold loose in the ordinary channels of social ser-

DR. WISE CHARGES DISCRI-MINATION AGAINST JEWISH STUDENTS IN COLLEGES

Attacks Students Who Change Name and Hide Race; Criticizes Jewish Fraternities

Discrimination against Jewish students in American colleges was charged by Rabbi Stephen S. Wise in his sermon Sunday morning at the Free Synagogue on "The Jew in American Colleges." Acts of discrimination, he declared, have tragically caused the Jewish intellectual to cease to be a Jew and "to become associated with nothing." through his efforts to lose his racial and religious identity.

In the course of his sermon Dr. Wise mentioned specifically Harvard, Yale, Princeton and Columbia as typical institutions where Iewish students and their activities were being discriminated against.

"Not one in 100 of the young Jews in American colleges and universities is sincerely and frankly a Jew," said Dr. Wise. "The young Jew in our col-leges is a problem. He is an alien element, a child of a daring race, without ideals or vision. Not 5 per cent of these students go to the synagogue or link themselves in any way to the Jewish religious life. I can see why Christians look askance at this."

Dr. Wise contended that it was "immeasurably more difficult for a Jew to achieve a position in a university than it is for a non-Jew." He declared that only a few Jews got into university

only a few Jews got into timestry clubs here and elsewhere, and those who did get in "usually sneak in" by withholding their racial identity.

At Yale and Princeton, Dr. Wise said, in scanning the list of recent entrants to Greek letter fraternities and clubs and so-called honorary societies he did not see the name of a single Jew. He explained that he knew many Jewish students choose any but Iewish names

Rabbi Wise attacked Greek letter fraternities. They were "worse than awful," he said, and he regarded Jewish fraternities as even worse, cause they are exactly like the others only more so." These Jewish fraternities exclude Jews whose parents and grandparents were not born in the United States or who may be of Russian Jewish and Polish Jewish origin.

CARRIE CHAPMAN CATT URGES PALESTINE WOMEN TO DEMAND SUFFRAGE (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Jerusalem, Apr. 4 .- Palestine women were urged to emulate the civic virtues of American womanhood in a message addressed by Mrs. Carrie Chapman Catt, president of the International Women's Suffrage Organization and founder of the American League of Women Voters, to Palestine Jewish women.

In her message Mrs. Catt stated that Palestine was the center of civilization for a thousand years. It must now resume its place. There must be women councillors and leaders in Palestinian towns. She urges Palestine women to equality.

ORTHODOX CONGREGATIONS URGED TO ORGANIZE INTO NATIONAL FEDERATION

Nationwide Conference to Meet May 2

Plans or a nation-wide conference of Orthodox Jewish congregations which will be held in New York on May 2 in connection with the laying of the cornerstone of the Yeshiva College of America were endorsed at a preliminary conference of Orthodox Jewish congregations of Greater New held last Sunday at the Central Jewish Institute

Gedaliah Bublick, editor of the "Jewish Daily News" and chairman of the Congregations Committee of the Yeshiva College Building Fund, presided at the meeting. About 200 congregations were represented.

In pointing to the necessity for Orthodox congregations to organize into one central body of Orthodox Jews, Mr. Bublick asserted that the Reform congregations have a greater influence on Jewish life than is proportionate with their numbers. While the Union of American Hebrew Congregations has a membership of little more than 200 congregations, in all matters of national importance pertaining to Jewish religious questions, the voice of Reform Iews is heard, while Orthodox Jewry is not given proper representation. In defining the term Orthodox Jew, Mr. Bublick took the view that all those American Iews who are not affiliated with Reform congregations stand on the basis of traditional Judaism which is opposed to any change in the ritual of either home or synagogue. The number of such Jews in the United States approximates two millions, he stated Harris L. Selig, Executive Director

of the Yeshiva College Building Fund, submitted plans for the forthcoming conference on May 2. He stated that over 1,000 Orthodox congregations function in Greater New York and more than 2,000 throughout the coun-

The committee calling the national conference is headed by Judge Otto A Rosalsky and Orthodox leaders of New York, Philadelphia, Detroit, Pittsburgh and other cities.

JEWS ASK LEAGUE UNION AGAINST INTERVENE COMPULSORY SUNDAY LAW

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency Mail Service) Salonica, Mar. 16.—The League of Shomerei Sabbath has made representations to the Athens League of Nations Union asking it to intervene with the authorities to abolish the Compulsory Sunday Closing Law, which compels the Jews to keep their shops closed two days during the week, thus seriously injuring the business interests of thousands of Jews.

7.534 JEWS WERE COLONIZED IN ARGENTINE LAST YEAR (Jewish Telegraphic Agency Mail Service)

Paris, Mar. 18.—A report received by the Jewish Colonization Association here from its Administration in Buenos

Aires states that 7,534 Jewish immigrants entered the Argentine in 1926. Five thousand, eight hundred and eighty-four of these came from Poland. 520 from Russia, 179 from Lithuania

and 170 from Roumania.

Three hundred and forty-five of these immigrants were settled in the Ica colonies. Forty-eight families (200 immigrants) were established on small holdings. One hundred and five persons have been regularly employed on farm work during 1926 by these col-

The Ica has received a report from the Administration in Brazil stating that the immigrants in the Ica Colonies at Quatro-Irmaos find no difficulty in obtaining employment, and agricultural workers are paid at the rate of 8 to 10 milreis a day. Artisans and other workers earn as much as 12 to 15 milreis a day.

"The Jewish immigration movement to the colonies," the report says, "is a spontaneous one. At present, the newly-arrived immigrants are engaged in preparing the areas reserved for colonization. When this work is completed, suitable agriculturists will be settled on the areas by the Ica."

282 JEWS EMIGRATE FROM PALESTINE IN FEBRUARY
