## WORLD ZIONIST EXECUTIVE SESSION IN LONDON; WEIZMANN RENDERS REPORT

Great Britain May Grant Preferential  
Treatment to Palestine Products

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

London, Apr. 6.—The first session of the World Zionist Executive meeting was opened here today with the participation of American and Palestine members.

Louis Lipsky, president of the Zionist Organization of America, came to London with Dr. Weizmann especially for the purpose of attending the conference.

Dr. Weizmann reported on his activities and negotiations during his stay in the United States. He gave an account of the negotiations which led to the consummation of the accord in American Jewry and the agreement on the Jewish Agency.

Dr. Weizmann also stated that he understands that the agenda of the Conference of British Colonies, Protectorates and Mandated Territories, which will be held here on May 10, includes the question of preferential treatment for products in mandated territories. It is possible, he said, that Great Britain will grant preferential treatment to Palestine wines and tobacco similar to that accorded the dominions of Great Britain.

## RADIO CONNECTIONS ESTABLISHED BETWEEN POLAND AND PALESTINE

Warsaw, Apr. 6.—Radio connections between Poland and Palestine were established today. The new connection has been made by way of an intermediary radio station in Beirut.

At the ceremonies which were held to mark the occasion, it was pointed out that the radio connection between the two countries will bring about increased economic intercourse.

The Polish Consul in Jerusalem, Zbyszewski, has communicated with the Polish Chamber of Commerce regarding the question of the economic relations between Poland and Palestine. He replied especially to an inquiry on the part of the Chamber regarding the present economic situation in Palestine, it was stated here.

## JEWISH WORKER, SENTENCED BY COURT MARTIAL, EXECUTED

Kovno, Apr. 6.—The death sentence imposed by a court martial two days ago on Chaim Melamed, a Jewish worker charged with Communism, was carried out here today.

The same sentence imposed by the court martial on a non-Jewish worker, Kiapenas, was commuted at the last moment to life imprisonment.

## WILL OPEN BRITAIN'S DOORS WHEN LABOR PROBLEMS ARE SOLVED, SAYS JOYNSON-HICKS

Immigration Bars Temporary, He Declares, Disavowing Anti-Semiteism

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

London, Apr. 6.—The doors of England were barred to immigration only temporarily and will be reopened as soon as labor and housing difficulties are overcome. This statement was made by Sir Joynson-Hicks, Home Secretary, in an address he delivered at a dinner of the Jews' Shelter and Immigration Body held last night.

Sir Joynson-Hicks also disavowed any anti-Semitic tendencies on his own part or in the administration of his department in relation to the handling of immigration and naturalization cases.

Whatever restrictions were imposed on immigration, he claimed, were the result of practical considerations based on the economic situation in the country.

"Fifty years ago," he stated in his address, "when the Shelter was founded, the doors of Great Britain were wide open to immigrants. Now, owing to unemployment, they must for the time being be closed, but it is certain that as soon as labor and housing difficulties are overcome, the doors will again be flung open.

"I have been accused of anti-Semitic tendencies," Sir Joynson-Hicks continued, "but I want to emphasize that I cannot discriminate between Jew and Gentile, or favor one case against another."

Sir Joynson-Hicks called upon leading British Jews, such as Lionel Rothschild and others, to come to the Home Office to investigate the charge regarding discrimination against Jews in the matter of naturalization. "They would be convinced," he stated, "of the fallacy of the accusation. When I came into office," he stated, "1,000 naturalization cases were dealt with annually. Last year 1,300 cases were handled.

"Whenever the Jewish community has any need to call upon me, the doors of my office are always wide open to them. So long as I remain in office, I will see that no discrimination against any race is made," he declared.

## SAPIRO SHOWS HE WAS DAMAGED BY HENRY FORD'S ANTI-JEWISH CAMPAIGN

Reed Includes Lowden, Presidential Possibility, Among "Plotters"

(Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Detroit, Apr. 6.—Direct financial damages resulted to Sapiro upon the publication of the "Dearborn Independent" articles accusing him of being a member of an alleged "international Jewish conspiracy," Sapiro showed today in the course of proceedings in his \$1,000,000 libel suit against Henry Ford and the "Independent".

Continuing on the witness stand under the fire of Senator Reed's questioning Sapiro testified that he was requested to resign from the Oklahoma Broom Corn Association because of articles published in the Ford-owned "Dearborn Independent" pointing out he is a Jew and seeking to connect him with an international Jewish conspiracy to control agriculture.

"As a matter of fact it let you out because it was practically bankrupt and could not afford to keep you, didn't it?" demanded Reed.

"No," returned Sapiro.

An interesting moment at the trial took place when Senator Reed, chief of Henry Ford's defense counsel, and mentioned in many quarters as a possibility for the Democratic Presidential nomination, exchanged angry words with Sapiro over the status of Frank O. Lowden, former Governor of Illinois.

## STRESEMANN'S LIBEL SUIT AGAINST ANTI-SEMITIC EDITOR AROUSES INTEREST

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Plauen, Germany, Apr. 6.—The libel suit brought by Foreign Minister Stresemann against Herr Muller, editor of an anti-Semitic newspaper, assumed a mysterious character when it was announced suddenly that the sessions of the trial which opened here on April 1, will be held in camera. The trial has aroused great interest in all circles.

The suit is based on an article published by Muller in which he stated that Stresemann was a partner of Paul Litwin, a Russian Jew, now a German citizen, who is general director of the Evaporator Company, and that due to Stresemann's favor, Litwin, who is alleged to be a large contributor to the political funds of the Stresemann party, was able to dispose of supplies of the German army abroad to his own advantage.

The name of Herr Barmat, one of the brothers whose trial recently created a sensation in Germany, figured in today's proceedings when it was alleged that documents relating to Barmat and Stresemann had disappeared.

When Herr Muller made his accusation

### SEVENTIETH BIRTHDAY OF FAMOUS ARAB POET TO BE CELEBRATED

Palestine Hebrew Writers Will Send  
Delegation

Jerusalem, Apr. 6.—Preparations for the celebration of the seventieth birthday of Achmed Shawki, famous Arab poet, are being made.

The celebration, which will take place shortly in Cairo, where Achmed Shawki resides, will be attended by delegates from all Moslem countries. It is expected that the Palestine Hebrew Writers' Association will also send representatives.

### ASSOCIATION OF JEWISH WRITERS FORMED IN KIEV

### MASSACHUSETTS GOVERNOR WELCOMES ZIONIST DEBATERS

Boston, Mass., Apr. 6.—Governor Alvan T. Fuller of Massachusetts received the British Zionist Federation debating team and the Boston debaters of the Avukah yesterday afternoon.

The campaign for \$150,000 for the erection of a new Jewish Community Center in Plainfield, N. J., was launched by the Y. M. and Y. W. H. A. At the opening banquet \$64,200 was announced as pledged. Among the pledges were \$5,000 by Felix Fuld, Ben Bronston, Adolph Tepper, A. Kantor and Max Tepper; \$2,500 was pledged by Judge William Newcomb and \$2,000 by B. Weintraub.

#### Proposes Creation of New Conservative Federation in American Jewry

The creation of a Conservative Jewish body within the United Synagogue of America, to deal with "problems of ritual and domestic law," is urged by the "S. A. J. Review," organ of the Society for the Advancement of Judaism, of which Dr. Mordecai Kaplan is editor. Commenting on a report in the Bulletin of the organization of a new wing in German Jewry to be known as the Juedische Konservativen Vereinigung, the "S. A. J. Review" observes that "unfortunately there is no such group in this country" and goes on to say:

"There are Conservative congregations, and the S. A. J. is one of them. But there is no organized body of such congregations, though the need for it is imperative.

"Both the Reform and the Orthodox congregations in the United States have their own central bodies which act as coordinating and unifying agencies. The United Synagogue of America, which might have functioned as the centralizing agency of the Conservative congregations in this country, is in actuality of a hybrid nature trying to cater to the wants of both the Orthodox and the Conservative Jews. On this account, it has had to be too cautious and compromising, and has thus rendered its work ineffectual. It has avoided taking a definite stand on many important controversial issues, with the usual consequence that its influence and prestige have suffered.

"It would certainly not be advisable to have a fourth body organized. Within the United Synagogue itself, however, congregations which are as little Orthodox as they are Reformist should act cooperatively and deal with problems of ritual and domestic law in a

#### SEEKS FUNDS TO ERECT TOMBSTONE TO FRUG, LATE RUSSIAN JEWISH POET

Moscow, Apr. 6.—A complaint that the grave in Odessa of the late Jewish poet, Semion Frug, is still without a tombstone was made by Frug's brother, who is making an effort to secure the necessary funds to erect a monument.

Frug's brother stated that the poet left a considerable number of manuscripts in Russian, Hebrew and Yiddish and that the rights to these would be transferred for ten years to any person or organization willing to provide 15,000 roubles for the necessary tombstone.

It is not certain, the poet's brother stated, whether the Soviet government would permit the sending of the manuscripts abroad. This question would have to be taken up with the authorities.

#### Urges Adoption of "Common Prayer" for All America

The suggestion made by the "United American Magazine" that the "common prayer" issued on Washington's birthday by its joint authors, Rabbi Benjamin Frankel, director of the Hillel Foundation of the B'nai B'rith, Rev. John A. O'Brien, pastor of St. John's Catholic Church of Urbana, Ill., and Rev. James C. Baker, pastor of the Trinity Methodist Episcopal Church of the same city, be adopted as the all-American prayer, is endorsed by the "Jewish Independent" of Cleveland which in its issue of Apr. 1, says:

"This prayer, which as Editor Lango well points out, breathes 'a spirit of tolerance and good will to every citizen of our land, is in keeping with the fundamental intent of religious freedom upon which this, our Nation, was founded.'

"Acknowledging the common Fatherhood of God and stressing the potency of the human fellowship that is founded upon the deeper unities of the spirit, the authors of the common prayer have given vibrant, eloquent utterance to truths which guided the lives of the Nation's founders.

"The glow of human tolerance and sympathy animates the common prayer and mirrors the soul of the Union which the strivings and sacrifices of the founders called into being."

#### Kansas Paper Ridicules Ford

Most Americans did not read the anti-Jewish articles in Ford's paper, the "Dearborn Independent", and if they did see them they paid no attention to them, declares the Hutchinson (Kan.) "Herald". In an editorial on the Ford-Sapiro trial in its March 10th issue, the paper writes as follows:

"We don't like suits of this sort. They're foolish, we believe. They stir up animosities that have died down. They start up new animosities.

"There'll be nothing but personalities in the hearings. Most of us have forgotten all about the charges Ford made in his articles. Most of us didn't pay much attention to them when they were made. Most of us didn't even see them. And only a handful of us cared what Ford thought of this or that.

"Ford's a good business man but as a publisher of a magazine and dictator of policies, he, to our way of thinking, is quite moist—in fact, all wet."

## DEPUTY GRUENBAUM RETURNS TO POLAND

Deputy Isaac Gruenbaum of Poland, who came to the United States at the invitation of the American Jewish Congress to address its session in Washington, sailed on the Berengaria on Tuesday.

Before his departure, Dr. Gruenbaum was the guest of honor at a farewell dinner given on behalf of the American Jewish Congress at the home of Sidney Ross. The dinner was attended by the officers of the Congress and its affiliated organizations and representatives of the Jewish press.

Mr. Ross was the toastmaster and brief addresses were delivered by Benjamin Winter, Abraham Goldberg, Dr. Henry Moskowitz, Jacob de Haas, Bernard G. Richards and Dr. Stephen S. Wise.

Dr. Gruenbaum responded to the greetings with an address in which he gave his impressions of Jewish life in America. It is not to be denied, he stated, that world Jewish leadership is passing from Eastern Europe to America but he is fearful that American Jewry will not be ready to assume the responsibilities that go with leadership. "I am afraid," he said, "that the spiritual flame which has been burning in Eastern Europe for hundreds of years and whose warmth was felt in the various Jewish communities throughout the world will be extinguished before a similar flame is kindled and kept burning in America."

Referring to the work of the Joint Distribution Committee Dr. Gruenbaum said that "mere philanthropy, can not reestablish millions of human beings who have been dislocated from their positions by the war. The J. D. C. has done and still is doing a great and useful work but it should have broadened its task so as to fit in with the particular needs of the people in the various countries."

## PROTEST AGAINST NEW JERSEY ELECTION ON ROSH HA'SHONAH

Rabbis and prominent Jewish citizens of northern New Jersey have protested against the step of the Legislature in setting a special election on five constitutional amendments for September 27, the date on which Rosh Ha'shonah falls this year.

Governor Moore announced at Jersey City that he might call a special session to change the date. Messages have been sent to Senator Davis, president of the Senate, and to Speaker Siracusa, of the House of Assembly.

Resolutions against the date were adopted by the Samuel Deldizer Democratic League of Paterson and all Jewish organizations in Passaic County will be called next week to voice a protest.

The amendments include proposals to change the term of Governor from three to four years, to elect Senators for four years and Assemblymen for two years, to change the annual sessions to biennial meetings and to revise zoning.

### Col. Ament's "Investigation" Is Used By Roumanian Officials to Deny Anti-Jewish Excesses

(By Our Czernowitz Correspondent)

Czernowitz, Mar. 22.—The difficult position of the Roumanian Jewish leaders, especially in Bessarabia and Bukovina, resulting from the efforts of the government to secure denials from Jewish spokesmen of the excesses which have been taking place here, has been unexpectedly aggravated by the appearance of Col. Lytton Ament, who has launched an investigation of the Jewish situation.

Although asserting that he is acting in an unofficial capacity, Col. Ament's procedure has aroused consternation among the Jews. His refusal to secure his data privately and his questioning of the Jewish leaders in the presence of Roumanian officials has called forth particular resentment for it has made it impossible for the Jews to tell the truth and has, at the same time, given the Roumanian government circles the opportunity for which they have been looking. An idea of the manner in which Col. Ament has proceeded in his self-appointed investigation can be gained from the following conversation which took place between him and the Jewish leaders on March 19, in the office of Babianu, chief of Prime Minister Averescu's cabinet. The Jewish delegation consisted of Chief Rabbi Dr. Mark, Councilman Dr. Kassner and Joseph Wiznitzner.

When Col. Ament asked the delegation to tell him about the situation of the Jews in Roumania, the delegation declared that they are not authorized to make any political statements. Whereupon the Colonel stated: "My mission is not an official one and bears the character of a personal investigation. I ask you gentlemen to speak not as official representatives but merely on the basis of personal impressions."

Chief Rabbi Dr. Mark: "Then I will ask that you please direct concrete questions to us."

Col. Ament: "Are the laws of Roumania the same for all citizens, and especially for the Jews?"

Dr. Mark: "According to the law we are on an equal basis with the rest of the population."

Col. Ament to Councilman Kassner: "Are you of the same opinion?"

Councilman Kassner: "I would like to add the following: we do not identify the perpetrators of the well known incidents with the Roumanian people." Col. Ament: "The American press reported a great deal regarding pogroms in Roumania. Did pogroms take place?"

Dr. Kassner: "Actual pogroms did not take place."

Col. Ament: "Do you hope that your representations to the government will be successful?"

Dr. Kassner: "Prime Minister Averescu has only recently made a statement that he will take drastic measures

## SIR ALFRED DAVIES, BRITISH EDUCATOR, ARRIVES IN U. S.

Sir Alfred T. Davies, noted British educator and permanent secretary of the Welsh Department of the Board of Education since 1907, arrived in New York on Tuesday on the steamer Auraria.

Recently Sir Alfred visited Palestine, as a result of which he expressed his enthusiasm for the Jewish reconstruction work, especially praising the Chalutzim.

On his arrival Sir Alfred was met at the steamer by Zionist leaders.

## BREVITIES

Additional suits by Russian policyholders against American life insurance companies were begun Tuesday in the Supreme Court when the Russian Policyholders, Inc. brought eight actions on assigned claims of 974 persons aggregating \$1,214,479.

Four of these suits, totals of which aggregate \$276,014, are against the Equitable Life Insurance Society and the remainder are against the New York Life Insurance Company. They were filed by Charles Recht, Mr. Recht said other suits will be brought soon for amounts aggregating \$10,000,000 against American insurance interests.

The claims are similar to those in actions pending in Federal Courts. Counsel for the companies have argued policies issued by residents of Russia were rendered void when the Soviet Government confiscated the property of the insurance companies in Russia.

The charge that Samuel Untermyer is "a man of Bolshevik leaning" was made yesterday at a meeting of the Board of Directors of the Bethlehem Steel Corporation, by Richard A. Jones, stockholder and retired business man of New York, when the election of members to the Board took place. Mr. Jones objected to the reelection to the board of Alvin Untermyer, Samuel Untermyer's son, for the reason stated.

Eugene C. Grace, president of the company, answered Jones, saying Untermyer was a substantial stockholder, as was his father, and that he had served on the board three years and was a constructive director whose opinions were valued.

nois, regarded by some as Republican party Presidential nominee timber.

Senator Reed was seeking to gain from Sapiro a history of the national cooperative organizations he had represented.

He hit upon the National Wheat Growers Advisory Committee, formed at a meeting called in Chicago in September, 1923, by Judge Robert W. Bingham, publisher of the Louisville "Courier Journal" and the Louisville "Times".

In the list of those who attended was Mr. Lowden, who became chairman of the committee.

Senator Reed sweated and raged to show that Sapiro left the powerful American Farm Bureau Federation because he could not rule it and thereby control the American wheat crop.

Laboriously, and with little profit, he tried to pin "plot" on the meeting of those notables with Sapiro to form the National Wheat Growers Advisory Committee.

"Plotters," he cried. "Friends of the American farmer," shouted back Aaron Sapiro.

Sapiro, winner of most of the day's contests, replied with the accusation that John W. Coverdale, secretary of the Federation, had tried to put the Wheat Growers under the golden thumbs of the Armour Grain Company, a subsidiary of the packing corporation, and Rosenbaum Brothers & Co., another Chicago firm.

He termed Lowden "a splendid lawyer and a fine farmer, probably the largest farmer in some respects in the entire United States."

"Does he make his living farming, or is he the son-in-law of Pullman of the Pullman Car Company?" asked Reed with a tone of sarcasm.

"I don't think he makes his living as the son-in-law of Pullman," responded Sapiro. "He makes his living by his work as a lawyer and by his work as a farmer."

The names of Bernard Baruch and Eugene Meyer, Jr., figured when Sapiro listed the following as at the meeting, which he also attended: Senator Arthur Capper of Kansas, Gov. McKelvie of Nebraska, Tom Campbell of Montana, George Jewett of North Dakota, Carl Williams of Oklahoma City, Walton Petet of the American Farm Bureau Federation, a Mr. Chappell of Kansas, W. C. Langsdon of Kansas, William Settle of Indiana, Bernard Baruch of New York, Herman Steen of Chicago, Clifford Gregory of Chicago and Dan Wallace of St. Paul.

Eugene Meyer, Jr., chairman of the United States War Finance Corporation, came, but not as a committee member, said Sapiro.

A libel suit for \$100,000 instituted by Dr. A. Coralnick, one of the editors of "The Day," against the "Freiheit," was opened yesterday at the Centre and Pearl Street Court. Dr. Coralnick said that the "Freiheit," Jewish Communist paper of New York, used libellous terms in referring to him in its columns.

tion against Foreign Minister it was the simple charge that Dr. Stresemann used his influence as Minister to enable the Evaporator Company, of which he was a member of the Executive Committee and a shareholder, to make illegal shipments of materials which were easily convertible into munitions from Germany into Poland at a time when the Upper Silesian question was most acute.

Now, besides the charge of these irregular business deals, the accusation is made that Dr. Stresemann was intimate with General Nollet, Chief of the Interallied Control Commission, when that organization was most hated throughout Germany and that Paul Litwin was enabled to pay a visit to Premiere Poincare of France to conclude a business deal through Dr. Stresemann's influence.

Whether General Nollet's wife was Herr Litwin's sister could not be confirmed tonight.

It was learned today that Herr Stein, who was a witness, said that he edited 200 pounds of documents for the editor of Der Tag, one of the Hugenberg publications. The Nationalists purchased these documents from Herr Kranz and put them at the disposal of Hugenberg, who was awaiting the proper time to use them for furthering the ends of the reactionary parties. Herr Weiss, leader of the Nationalists, and Herr Stein said today that these papers contained no references to Dr. Stresemann, though when the time came to submit the papers to the Court it was discovered that they had been seized by the District Attorney in the Barmat case and could not be found.

Herr Kranz also had that Captain Kautter, right hand man of Captain Ehrhardt of Putsch notoriety, aided in wand through vast quantities of papers bearing on the alleged illegal business transactions and dark political affairs.

A letter sent to the Minister of Justice by Herr Knoll, who also was implicated in the document selling affair, charging Dr. Stresemann with perjury in regard to his relations with another Litwin firm, was referred to President Hindenburg. State Secretary Meissner referred the letter to the Chancellor about ten days ago, but the matter is now hidden under the same cloak of mystery which is tending to confuse not only the public but even the attorneys and Judges hearing the case.

The court will be open to the public again tomorrow, since the revelations which were considered a menace to the State's security was concluded today.

The Edward L. Rothschild Memorial Building in Philadelphia, will be dedicated on April 10th. The exercises will take place in the Rothschild Auditorium. Henry W. Brande, vice-president of the Congregation and president of the Y. M. & Y. W. H. A., will be the chairman.

The building has been erected by Congregation Beth El in memory of the late Edward L. Rothschild, who erected the Synagogue in 1915 in memory of his parents, Lippman and Henriette Rothschild.

The building has an auditorium, a kitchen, a stage and a moving picture booth. There are eight class-rooms, a chapel, club rooms and offices for the Rabbi and the School principal.

A library has been equipped in memory of the late Max Bernstein.
