JEWS IN VIENNA SPLIT ALONG CLASS LINES IN NATIONAL ELECTION

Middle Class Group Puts Forward Jewish List

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Vienna, Apr. 19.—The Jewish com-munity of Vienna is split along class lines in the forthcoming national elec-

While the middle class elements are supporting the Jewish Election Committee which has put forward a Jewish list, the Poale Zion labor party is conducting an energetic campaign against the Jewish list and is support-ing the Social Democrats.

Simultaneously, the Poale Zion party is collecting signatures to a peti-tion to the Social Democratic Party, requesting it to alter its attitude toward the national minorities and to-ward the Zionist movement.

NOT A CENT FOR JEWISH RELIGIOUS INSTITUTIONS IN ROUMANIA'S BUDGET

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Bucharest, Apr. 16 .- Not a single cent

was allotted by the Roumanian Government for Jewish religious institutions, it was learned today, when the government budget for the religious and cultural needs of the national minorities in the country was made public. The budget shows that the amount

of 45,000,000 lei was set aside by the government for the needs of the schools and churches of the national minorities.

ITALIAN COOPERATIVES TO ERECT LUZZATTI MONUMENT

Rome, Apr. 18 .- The memory of Luigi Luzzatti, late Italian Jewish statesman, will be honored by the erection of a monument.

The Federation of Italian Cooperatives decided to erect a monument to Luzzatti in the city of Venice, Luzzatti's birthplace.

It is probable that Henry Glicenstein, famous Polish Jewish sculptor, will be commissioned to design the monument.

FELIX PERL DIES; FOUNDER OF POLISH SOCIALIST PARTY

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Warsaw, Apr. 16.-Dr. Felix Perl, Polish Jewish socialist and one of the founders of the Polish Socialist Party,

died here Friday at the age of 57. Dr. Perl, who was a scion of one of

the most prominent lewish families in Poland, had a long record of service in the Polish patriotic labor movement. He, together with the present Marshal Pilsudski and the former president of the republic, Stanislaw Wojciechowski, founded the P. P. S. He was threatened by the Czaristic government and at one time he and Wojciechowski were (Continued on Page 4)

BRITISH COMMANDER THANKS SHANGHAI JEWS FOR AID IN PACIFICATION OF CHINA General Duncan Expresses Apprecia-

tion for "Generous Assistance" (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Shanghai, Apr. 19.—Appreciation of the cooperation of the Jewish community in the steps taken by the British to bring about normal conditions in Shanghai was expressed by General Duncan, Commander of the British defense in China.

In a letter addressed to "Israel's Messenger", the Anglo-Jewish weekly in Shanghai, General Duncan expresses his "appreciation for the generous way in which the Jewish community assisted the Shanghai defense forces.

The commander mentions particularly Sir Elly Kadoorie, Mr. and Mrs. Ellis Hayim, S. A. Hardoon and Maurice Benjamin who, at great personal sacrifice, placed their properties at the Commander's disposal for the accom-modation of troops. Many others have helped in various ways, he says.

"The way in which the Jewish community has come forward to help is greatly appreciated and will never be forgotten," General Duncan declares.

HUNGARY PLANS NUMERUS CLAUSUS FOR LAWYERS (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Budapest, Apr. 18.-The Hungarian government intends to introduce a numerus clausus for the admission of Jewish attorneys to the Hungarian bar, according to an announcement made by the Hungarian Minister of Justice.

This policy was predicted in a state-ment by the Minister of Justice published today in the "Az Est.

FORD DETECTIVES MEDDLING WITH CASE, PREJUDICE JURY. SAPIRO'S COUNSEL CHARGES Mistrial Will Be Asked Again by Ford, His Counsel Announces

(Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Detroit, Apr. 19-A second motion for mistrial on the ground of alleged misconduct of a juror will be made by Henry Ford's counsel in the \$1,000,000 libel suit against him by Aaron Sa-piro, it became known today. The motion will be made next Thursday morning, Stewart Hanley of Ford counsel told Judge Fred M. Raymond in requesting a continuance until then because of the illness of Senator James A. Reed, chief of Ford counsel.

Hanley did not state his reason for the mistrial motion in open court, but later said: "We will move for a mistrial on the grounds of misconduct of

a juror."

It was understood that one of the six women on the jury was called into Judge Raymond's office last night and questioned about reports of an investigation made by detectives for the Ford organization.

William Henry Gallagher, chief of counsel for Sapiro, in an address to the court, assailed the Ford counsel and charged that Ford detectives were meddling with the case in an effort to prejudice the jury.

Gallagher referred to "fear of the (Continued on Page 4)

MICHELSON TO MAKE NEW TESTS OF LIGHT SPEED (Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Chicago, Apr. 18 .- New plans to obtain a more accurate estimate of the speed of light were disclosed on Saturday by Prof. Albert A. Michelson, famous Jewish physicist, at the University of Chicago during the course of a lecture to the graduate body.

His plan, he said, is to measure the speed of light in a pipe line three miles long. The pipe line is to be filled with rarefied gas or air at one-tenth of an atmosphere in pressure. If arrangements can be made, the professor will perform this experiment in the cicinity of Chicago this summer.

THREE ORGANIZATIONS JOIN TO CALL CONFERENCE OF ORTHODOX CONGREGATIONS

Members of the Union of Orthodox Congregations in the United States were urged to send representatives to the National Conference of Orthodox Jewish Congregations which will be held on May 1st and 2nd in connection with the laying of the cornerstone of the Yeshiva College.

The National Conference will be held under the auspices of the Yeshiva College Building Fund, the Union of Orthodox Rabbis and of the Union of Orthodox Congregations.

"Let us join in making America safe for the Torah and Orthodox Jewry one strong united body," the President of the Union of Orthodox Congregations declared in his letter to the affiliated organizations.

It was learned that the sessions of the National Conference will be presided over by a presidium consisting of representatives of the three organizations which have called the conference. The session devoted to the problem of Jewish education will be presided over by a representative of the Union of Orthodox Rabbis.

LEAVES \$12,000 FOR PALESTINE Bequests amounting to \$12,000 for education and health work in Palestine

are provided by the will of the late Adolph Winters, of Buffalo, according to an announcement from the head-quarters of Hadassah, the Women's Zionist Organization of America.

A sum of \$5,000 is assigned as as cholarship fund for the Hebrew University in Jerusalem, a like amount is given to the Hadassah Medical Relief Association to endow a bed in the proposed University Hospital, and \$2,000 is bequeathed to Hadassah to be allocated by the organization.

NEW JEWISH MONTHLY, "REFLEX", EDITED BY DR. MELAMED, APPEARS MAY 20 Rongy Heads Publishing Corporation

The publication of a new American Jewish journal in English will be started soon, according to an announcement made yesterday by Dr. S. M. Melamed, who will be the editor of the journal.

The magazine is to appear monthly under the name, "Reflex" and is, according to editorial announcement, to be dedicated to "critical opinion and the secular interest of the Jewish people."

The first issue is to appear on May 20 and is to be a magazine of approximately 100 pages. The publishers of the new magazine are the Gilboa Publishing Corporation, with offices at 95 Madison Avenue, New York City. Dr. A. J. Rongy is president, Carl Sherman, Treasurer, and Jacque A. Rosenblatt, secretary of the corporation.

Gov. Smith's Reply as Viewed by the Jewish Press

Governor Smith's reply to Mr. Chas.
Marshall's letter is lauded by the Jewish press, which views the Governor's utterance as a victory in the cause of preligious tolerance which is of particular integer to the Louis

atterance as a victory in the cause of religious tolerance which is of particular interest to the Jews.

The "Jewish Daily News", drawing an analogy between the position of the Jews and the Catholics as religious minorities in this country, says:

"The Catholics in America are a re-

ligious minority, true, a much larger one than the Jews, but nevertheless a minority, and in this respect the two groups are in the same position. Those who say that the Catholics are disqualified for the office of President are employing the method that is used against the Jews wherever Jews are discriminated against. In this case the same thing was done. Mr. Charles Marshall in his questions sought to establish the evidence' that a Catholic has a divided loyalty: the state and the church, and hence, being loyal to the church, and hence, being loyal to the state. This resembles very much the state. This resembles very much the complaint that the Jews have a divided loyalty: one to the country and one as a Jew. In both cases, Catholic and Jew, this complaint is due either to viciousness or to stupidity, or to

both things."

The "Jewish Morning Journal" expresses itself thus:

"In a question of discrimination, of an effort to disqualify a certain group owing to their religious convictions, we Jews cannot remain indifferent. Under the law a Jew, if only he is a native citizen, can be eligible to the office of the Presidency of the United States. In practice, however, people are never as free from prejudice as the best law which they themselve create. Whenever a prominent Catholic comes up for discussion, there is talk about the influence of Rome and the power of the Pope. If a Jew should emerge in such a role the ignorant fanatic would be frightnend by the alleged 'Elders of Zion' and many who know better would still entertain a fear of the 'danger' of the ficitious international Jewish conspiracy."

If there was any doubt before in the minds of American citizens, avers the "Day", regarding the wisdom of bestowing the highest office in the gift of the American Republic on a Catholic, those doubts must have been effectively dissipated by Governor Smith's utterance.

"The Jews of America always felt," the paper says, "that Smith is an upright, loyal American in whom his religious faith could only serve as a ground for greater tolerance rather than oppression of other religions.

UNITED JEWISH CAMPAIGN TO END IN FEW WEEKS NEARS \$25,000,000 GOAI

Within the next few weeks the United Jewish Campaign for \$25,000,000 is expected to be completed, according to an announcement made today by David A. Brown, national chairman of the campaign, at the headquarters in New York.

The United Jewish Campaign while formally launched in the fall of 1925. actually got under way with the first of its community drives in the winter of 1926. In the year that has elapsed, more than 2,500 communities have participated through local and sectional drives, and it is expected that when the campaign is concluded every town of 5,000 population or more in the United States will have taken part in the effort. Reports returned to the national headquarters to date show approximately \$20,000,000 pledged thus far.

The state quotas toward the fund were allocated to meet the original objective of \$15,000,000 set for the United Jewish Campaign at its launching. Subsequently it was adjudged necess sary to increase the goal to \$25,000,000 if the relief and reconstruction operations to which the Joint Distribution Committee was committed were to be carried out on an adequate scale. While state quotas were not increased, the difference in the national objective is being made by maximum returns from all the states, and in numerous instances, by oversubscriptions of the quotas formally assigned.

Among the states that have exceeded their assigned quotas, according to Mr. Brown's report, are Alabama, Arkan-sas, Indiana. Kentucky, Mississippi, Michigan, Ohio, Oklahoma, Oregon, Texas, and Washington.

New York City and Chicago, which were assigned quotas independent of their states, both achieved record-Among breaking over-subscriptions. other large cities which exceeded their quotas are Philadelphia and Pitts-burgh, Penn.; Cleveland, Cincinnati, ourgn, renn.; Clevetand, Cincinnati, Columbus, Dayton, Akron, and Toledo, Ohio: Rochester, Syracuse and Albany, N.Y.; Trenton, N. J.; Louisville, Ky.; Indianapolis, Ind.; Detroit, Mich.; Portland, Ore.; Nashville and Memphis, Tenn.; Seattle, Wash.; Wheeling, W. Va.; Dallas, Ft. Worth, and Houston, Tex.; New Haven, Conn.; Birmingham, Ala.; Little Rock, Ark.; Springfield and Peoria, Iii., and Montreal, Canada.

PRUSSIAN PREMIER DEFENDS HONOR OF JEWISH STATE OFFICIAL

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency Mail Service) Berlin, Apr. 4 .- The Prussian Premier, Herr Braun, defended in the Reichstag today, the honor of a Jewish State Official, Dr. Badt, Ministerial-Director and Prussian Representative to the Reichsrat, against whom one of the Nationalist Deputies, Dr. Frick, launched an attack last week.

At the session of the Reichstag held on March 21, the Premier said, Dr. Frick sneered at Dr. Badt, alleging that during the war he had gone about peddling old clothes and begging in Galicia and now he is the man who has to decide the future of Germans wno had fought at the front. Dr. Badt. the Premier declared, was in the service of the Prussian State since 1908. As soon as the war broke out he went to the front and in the first month of the war he was wounded and decorated with the Iron Cross for valor on the field. His colonel had written to him expressing his appreciation of his great bravery and fearlessness in face of the enemy fire, during the battle on August 22nd and 23rd, 1914.

If Deputy Frick came across a man in Galicia named Badt, the Premier added, who peddled old clothes, he had no right to confuse this person with Ministerial Director Badt. The Government of Prussia wants emphatically and indignantly to repudiate the absurd allegations made by Dr. Frick against its authorized representative, the Premier declared.

collapse of the Ford case," asserted that Ford detectives had lined the corridors of the Federal building since the inception of the trial and frequently had been seen in conference with jurors, and stated also that twice Judge Raymond had received mem-bers of Ford counsel in his private chambers while Sapiro's counsel was excluded.

Mrs. William Hoffman, the eleventh juror to be chosen, was brought before Judge Raymond last night by George H. Beamer, Deputy United States Mar-shal, acting as chief officer of the court during the trial. She was interrogated by the Judge for forty-five minutes upon reports made to him by Ford counsel, who in turn had them from Ford detectives

In explaining his refusal to agree to some other of Ford counsel continuing with the cross-examination of Sapiro. which Senator Reed had conducted fourteen days, Gallagher said to the

"We do not want the defense to have any pretense or claim that they were injured in the defense of this case through the untimely illness of Senator Reed. We prefer to have the case stand over until the man in charge of the matter may himself be upon the ground

so there will be no alibi or excuse for the collapse of the defense just because the man in charge could not carry on." C. B. Longley, head of legal counsel for the Ford Motor Company, objected strenuously to Gallagher's reference to "collapse of the defense," and the jury was hurriedly dismissed for continua-

tion of the argument. Longley contended for striking the objectionable phrase from the record and Gallagher said:

"Perhaps the defense cannot collapse, when it never has been maintained, so I may be wrong in that respect."

"Now if the Court please, as your Honor has no doubt been aware, as everybody else has been aware, since this case has been in progress, the intelligence department of the Ford Motor Company has been very greatly represented in the court room and the corridors of this building," resumed Gallagher. "They have had a large number of their representatives circulating not merely among the spec-tators but among the jury, and instances have been reported to us where these men were talking with the jury, whether to learn the jury's attitude or to influence the jury's attitude we don't know; but we do feel that it is the duty of the court to instruct the counsel for defendants that they instruct all of their detectives to scrupulously refrain from contact with these jurors, either for the purpose of demanding their state of mind or influencing their state of mind, in conversations with them. That is a matter that is nothing short of contempt of court."

Judge Raymond denied any misconduct on the court's part. As regards direction the court will take very Gallagher's charge that Ford detectives prompt action."

MICHELSON TO MAKE NEW TESTS OF LIGHT SPEED

"To test the Einstein theory, to measure the stars and to test the velocity of light. I've done them all, but I still keep on checking and trying to get more accuarate results."

Describing his apparatus, he told of an arrangement of mirrors which will enable him to get results as satisfactory as those obtained over a much longer distance outdoor, such as the eighty-two miles distance which he used in his latest efforts at Mount Wilson.

"Considering the extraordinary ac-curacy obtained in the experiments of July, 1925, it is dubious whether results obtained with an increased distance, as I attempted to do this winter, can be better," he said. "There is always a little 'boiling' because of disturbance of the atmosphere, and the greater the distance the greater the disturbance.

"By using the pipe line, and with only a slightly modified arrangement of the mirrors, a sharp image can be obtained independent of weather conditions. If we can arrange for the loan of that much pipe, ten to twenty inches in diameter, the exeriment will be undertaken shortly."
