FORD IS REPORTED IN NEW ROLE AS BENEFACTOR TO HUNGARIAN ANTI-SEMITE Officer Gets \$3,000 on Furnishing Proof of Anti-Semitic Activity

(Tewish Telegraphic Agency) Vienna, Apr. 27 .- Henry Ford is depicted in a new role, that of benefactor of individual anti-Semites, in a report published today by the "Pester Kurier.

The newspaper states that Henry Ford has forwarded a check for \$3,000 to a Hungarian officer, a member of the anti-Semitic Awakening Magyars, on the latter's plea that he lost his post due to his anti-Semitic views.

The unnamed officer, the paper states, received the check yesterday, following a request directed to Ford several months ago. His request was granted only after he had, at directions from Detroit, submitted to Ford conclusive proof of his anti-Semitic activity.

The memorial was erected to the late Baron Robert Lieben who died in 1913. Lieben won distinction by the invention of electron tubes and his researches in the radio. Baron Lieben was the grandson of Baron Tedescus.

RADIO PICTURE INVENTION BY JEW AROUSES INTEREST (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Vienna, Apr. 27.—A new invention which will revolutionize the transmission of pictures by radio was an-nounced here by Louis Weissglas, a Jewish engineer.

Weissglas's invention is based on the use of magnets. It was stated that due to this invention, the transmission of pictures will be put in popular use as the cost will be greatly reduced.

DEAD SEA AND HOT SPRING CONCESSIONS SOON TO BE GRANTED, COMMONS HEARS Leases To Be Granted for Forty-Year Period, Amery Says (Tewish Telegraphic Agency)

London, Apr. 27.-The concessions for the exploitation of the Dead Sea and the hot springs in Tiberias will soon be granted, according to statements made vesterday by Col. Amery, British Colonial Secretary, in reply to questions in the House of Commons.

Answering the question of Col. Wedgwood, Amery stated that the Colonial Office will soon issue a statement concerning the agreement to be concluded with regard to the Dead Sea concession. Concerning the hot springs in Tiberias, the secretary stated that negotiations are now proceeding with the holders of the pre-war Turkish concession. The new lease will be granted for a period of forty years. The lesees will be compelled to erect and completely furnish within three years a thermal bath establishment. Maximum rates will be fixed by agreement with the government. After the expiration of the term of the lease, the buildings and the plant will become the property of the Palestine government.

David Kirkwood, Labor M.P. asked the Colonial Secretary whether the Dead Sea is located on the site of Sodom and Gemorrah. No reply was

given to this question. Replying to another question by Col. Wedgwood, Amery stated that the Palestine government has made no reduction in the immigration fee which is £1 for each person over sixteen. Zionist Organization is not maintaining immigration camps but is only paying the cost of accommodation for immi-

grants under its auspices.

SEEK CONFISCATION OF MOSCOW SYNAGOGUE FOR WORKERS CLUB

YIDDISH STATE THEATRE IN MOSCOW A FAILURE (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Moscow, Apr. 27 .- The Yiddish State Theatre, a modernistic playhouse which is subsidized by the Soviet government, is not a financial success, according to a report issued by the Soviet State Control Commission.

The report states that the theatre has incurred a heavy deficit due to lack of patronage on the part of the Moscow Jewish population. It was proposed that the theatre be transferred to a place where there is a larger Jewish population, in the Ukraine or White Russia, where the governments have promised to grant the theatre a subsidy.

Ford Suit Contempt of court proceedings against the Ford defense for their

manguyres in forcing a mistrial in the Sapiro-Ford suit are believed to be a possible development before long by H. Lang, a member of the "Jewish Daily Forward" staff, who reported the trial for that paper from Detroit. Writing under the heading "Now It Can Be Told" (Forward, April 26 issue) Mr. Lang describes the back stage developments in and around the court which could not be reported while the trial was going on. He charges that the mistrial caused by the woman juror's interview in a Detroit paper was the result of a deliberate frame-up by the Ford defense. Seeing that Reed's unsuccessful cross-examination of Sapiro was drawing to an end and realizing that Ford would then be called to the stand, the Ford defense resorted to desperate methods, we are told by Mr. Lang, who continues:

"Determined to break up the trial at all costs the Ford defense 'wound-up' a reporter of a Detroit newspaper to get an interview with the woman juror. The reporter told her that she was being accused of intending to sell her opinion, and he also insinuated that she was charged with having a blind Mr. Layanburg has offered to conpig' and maintaining an immoral house. But the Ford counsel pursued their manœuvres further. First, they declared in court that Senator Reed was sick and asked a postponement of one day; a day later they declared that Senator Reed was still sick and asked postponement of two more days and stated that at the expiration of those two days they would demand that the Judge stop proceedings to take up the charges against the woman juror. The day before that the Ford counsel were to present to the court the affidavits of the Ford detectives regarding the charges against the woman juror, as well as copies of those affidavits to Sapiro and his counsel. "First they stated that they were making no charges against Sapiro himself, which they did in order to forestall any move in court on the part of Sapiro. Sapiro, therefore, waited for the affidavits. The affidavits were presented to Sapiro after five o'clock on Wednesday afternoon, which is to say, on the evening prior to the day when the whole matter was to be taken up by the court. They did this so that Sapiro might not have enough time to prepare an adequate reply. Moreover they did not present the affidavits to

SECOND GENERATION OF JEWISH FARMERS IN AR-GENTINE CLING TO SOIL

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency Mail Service) Buenos Aires, Mar. 22—The cooperative of Jewish colonists in the Rivera district in the Argentine his started a movement to raise funds for the purpose of purchasing an area of land for the settlement of the sons and sons-in-law of colonists.

An agreement has been concluded between the cooperative and the estate owner, La Rossa, by which an area of 8,680 hectares of land adjoining the Jewish colony Rivera will be purchased. A sum of 28,119 pesos has already been paid for the land and the balance of 130,000 pesos is to be paid up during April.

First place in the settlement work will be given to the sons and sons-in-law of colonists, but provision will also be made for the settlement of others on the land. Each colonist will hold between 100 and 200 hectares of land. Eighty per cent of the purchase price will remain over to be paid off by the settlers within a period of 33 years.

The court, there-fore, had no other alternative but to declare a mistrial, since the jury could no longer be prevented from outside influences.

"One of the Detroit newspapers has been indicted for contempt of court because of this. But if all the details were to be probed, contempt of court proceedings could in fact be instituted against the Ford defense. And it is possible that this will happen. "Sapiro is possessed of remarkable.

BRUTAL EXCESSES AGAINST JEWS ON ROUMANIAN TRAINS DEPICTED IN MEMORANDUM Stirring Document Begs Government for Protection

Bucharest, Apr. 10.—The Jews of the
town of Bratushany, district of Hotin,
have sent a memorandum to General
Rescanu, High Commissioner for Bessarabia and Bukowina. The memorandum complains of the excesses
committed against Jewish travellers on
the trains and asks the General to take
measures for their protection.

"We, the undersigned," the memorandum, which bore eighty signatures, read, "inhabitants of the town of Bratushany, in the district of Hotin, have the honor to report to you the following: As is shown by the enclosed declarations and medical certificates, Jews of our town who on the night of March 16-17 travelled in the passenger train from Jassy to Czernowitz, were attacked between the stations of Stolnitchen and Skumpiu, by a group of Cuzists, armed with leaded sticks. The lews were dragged out one by one from the compartments into the corridor and were beaten mercilessly. Three of these travellers were thrown out of the windows of the train while it was going at full speed. Nothing is known of what has happened to them. The other seventeen Jews were seized by panic and rushed to the doors of the compartment. But they were The Jews were saved by a locked. kind-hearted soldier who helped them to jump off the train while it was travelling at full speed "There were only five Cuzists and

they could easily have been suppressed. But the staff on the train preferred to do nothing. They looked on passively, while the Jews were being attacked.

"These wild excesses on the trainare the result of the anti-Semitic agitation which is being carried on without hindrance all along the railway line from Jassy to Kishineff and from Jassy to Biclee. A systematic incitement is being carried on against the peaceful Jewish population. Pamphlets and manifestoes and proclamations are circulated, which are full of provocative allegations against the Jews and which call the population to acts of violence and brutality. These anti-Semitic proclamations are for the most part circulated in the railway stations with the tacit approval of the station

COMZET REPORTS TO SOVIET GOVERNMENT ON PROGRESS OF JEWISH COLONIZATION (Jewish Telegraphic Agency Mail Service)

Moscow, Apr. 8.—A detailed report of the work of the Government Commission for Jewish Land Settlement Comzet was presented this week to the Presidium of the Central Executive Committee here. The report covers the period of October 12th, 1925, to January 1st, 1927.

During this period 44.044 hectares of land were allocated in Northern Crimea, (in the districts of Jankiu and Eupatoria) for the settlement of 1,280 Jewish families. In addition, 20.296 hectares were consolidated for the use of 638 families who settled in these regions before the State started the allocation of Jand in the Crimea for Jews.

The State assigned a million Roubles during 1926 for the work of the Connect. Of this 434,000 roubles were expended in the Ukrainian colonies, 120,000 roubles in White Russia, 25,000 roubles in the Province of Homel, 6,000 roubles in the Province of Homel, 6,000 roubles in taxerbaidjan, 70,000 roubles for the purchase of agricultural machinery and 325,000 roubles for providing building materials through the agency of the Jewish Colonization So-

ciety Ozet.

Transmieration orders were issued during 1926 to 5,054 familles. Of these, 1,072 familles contributed 10 roubles each to the settlement work, 2,233 families contributed a hundred roubles each, 1,031 families contributed 300 roubles each, 430 familles contributed 500 roubles each and 248 families settled on the land entirely at their own expense, receiving from the Government only the land ferre of charge.

Three thousand five hundred and sixty-six families settled during the past year in the Ukraine. Altogether 5,003 families were settled on the land during 1926, making together with those previously settled a total of 19,229 families. 2,241 eney houses have been built in the period in the new settlements.

SALONICA GOVERNOR TELLS JEWS ANTI-SEMITISM HAS NO FOOTHOLD IN GREECE (Jewish Telegraphic Agency Mail Service)
