**ESTHONIAN LAW MAKES
COERCION OF MINORITIES
A PUNISHABLE OFFENSE**

**New Clause in Provisions of National
Autonomy Law**

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Riga, Apr. 30.—In connection with the provisions of the National Autonomy Law in Esthonia, under which the right of autonomy has been accorded to the Jews and the other minorities in the country, the Parliamentary Commission for the Reform of the Penal Code in Esthonia has decided to introduce the following new clause:

Persons who by the use of violence, threats or the misuse of authority or the power of economic independence, seek to influence a citizen of full age to register his nationality or the nationality of his children otherwise than according to his own desire, will be liable to imprisonment for a maximum period of six months.

**CLASH OF CHASSIDIC
SECTS IN MUNKACZ
STOPPED BY POLICE**

Vienna, Apr. 30.—The fight between the two Chassidic sects in Czechoslovakia, the followers of the Chassidic Rabbi of Munkacz and those of the Rabbi of Belz, was renewed the last day of Passover in Munkacz.

During the memorial services at the Munkacz Synagogue last Sunday, a fist fight started between the two groups, which are engaged in a feud that has lasted several months, and which had led to the mutual excommunication of the leaders of the two parties. The cantor was severely beaten in the clash.

The police intervened and cleared the synagogue.

**WARSAW STREET CAR CON-
DUCTORS DEMAND JEWISH
EMPLOYEES BE DISMISSED**

Warsaw, Apr. 30.—A strike of street car conductors was threatened by the Conductors' Organization in a protest submitted to the administration.

The conductors demand that no Jews be employed by the management, and that those Jews already in employment by the company should be dismissed. A similar protest was submitted to the Warsaw city government, which is control of the street cars.

Investigation shows that among the several thousand employees of the street car company, only two are Jews.

**AMERICAN ARCHAEOLOGIST
MAKES IMPORTANT DIS-
COVERY NEAR JERUSALEM**

**Solomon's Treasure City Claimed to
Have Been Discovered**

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Jerusalem, Apr. 30.—An important archaeological discovery, throwing light on the mode of life in Palestine as far back as 3,000 years before the Christian era, was made yesterday by an American archaeologist.

The discovery was made by Prof. William Bade, of the Pacific School for Religion, who has conducted an archaeological expedition to Mizpah. Prof. Bade has unearthed, at Tel El Nispeh, seven miles to the North of Jerusalem, a gigantic city wall. This is the largest wall ever unearthed in Palestine. When the section was cleared it appeared that the wall was 25 feet high from the foundations and was 16 to 20 feet thick. An investigation showed that the wall must have been 20 feet higher and is of the bronze age type. It was built probably about 1800 years before the Christian era.

Judging by the pottery found at Tel El Nispeh, it appears that the locality had a pre-Israelite history and was inhabited as far back as 3,000 years before the Christian era, Prof. Bade declared.

Prof. Alt of the University of Leipzig stated that Tel El Nispeh is the real site of the Treasure City of King Solomon.

**EXCAVATIONS ON MOUNT
OPHEL IN JERUSALEM
ARE TO BE RESUMED**

London, Apr. 30.—Another season of excavation in Jerusalem on the Ophel Hill is to be started as soon as possible, the Palestine Exploration Fund announces in the current issue of its "Statement" which has just been published. The decision, it says, was come to at a very largely attended meeting of the Executive Committee of the Fund. The results of the previous excavation, the "Statement" proceeds, though undoubtedly important, were not conclusive as regards the extent of the Davidic and pre-Davidic Jerusalem. It is felt that a site of so extraordinarily interesting a character

**JEWISH PARTIES IN WARSAW
FORM BLOC FOR FORTHCOM-
ING MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS**

**Middle Class Groups United Through
Efforts of Zionists**

Warsaw, Apr. 30.—A bloc of the middle-class Jewish parties was formed here for the forthcoming municipal elections which will take place on May 22.

The bloc was formed due to the efforts of the Executive of the Zionist Organization of Poland and consists of the Zionists, the Agudath Israel, the Jewish Merchants' Association, the Mizrahi, the Artisans' Association and the small traders.

According to an agreement concluded between the parties, the Zionists are to receive five seats in the Warsaw City Council, the Agudath Israel five, the Merchants' Association five, the Mizrahi three, the Artisans four, the small traders three and the women's organization, two.

**POLISH MINISTRY POSTPONES
DATE FOR TEACHERS' EXAMS**

Warsaw, Apr. 30.—What would virtually have brought about the closing of many of the existing Yiddish schools in Poland was averted by an order of the Polish Ministry of Religious Education.

According to a previous ordinance, all teachers who were not graduates of recognized teachers' colleges were to submit to state examinations. The final date set for these examinations is due shortly. Many of the teachers of the Yiddish elementary schools would not have been in a position to pass the examinations if they would be held on the appointed date. The examinations would pertain mainly to a knowledge of the Polish language, Polish history, etc.

The Ministry, in an ordinance issued yesterday, postponed indefinitely the date for these examinations.

**MISSIONARIES CLASH WITH
ZIONISTS AT LODZ MEETING**

Lodz, Apr. 30.—An attempt made by the Christian missionaries to bring missionary propaganda to the Zionist youth under false pretense led to riots here last night.

The missionaries rented the hall of the students' Zionist organization "Jordania". Before the lecture started the leaders of the organization discovered that it was intended for missionary propaganda and refused the speaker permission to appear. The missionaries then attempted to break into the hall. Several persons were wounded in the clash.

**PALESTINE GOVERNMENT
WILL START PUBLIC WORKS
TO EASE UNEMPLOYMENT**

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency Mail Service)

Jerusalem, Apr. 8.—The Government will shortly start a number of public works which may ease unemployment in the country, Col. Symes, the Chief Secretary to the Palestine Government, told a delegation of the Vaad Leumi consisting of Mr. David Yellin, Dr. J. Thon and Mr. J. Ben-Zvi which visited him this week. The works for the construction of a harbor in Haifa, Col. Symes said, will be commenced after the building plans have been approved.

Referring to the attitude of the Government towards the development of industry in the country, the Chief Secretary deprecated the opinion held by some that the Government shows indifference to this vital question. The Government, he said, had lost about £40,000 last year owing to the exemption from customs duties of various raw materials which are necessary for industries.

It was ascertained in the course of the interview that the revenue of the Government has fallen off considerably owing to the present economic situation in the country.

**YESHIVA CORNERSTONE
WAS LAID YESTERDAY**

The cornerstone for the first group of buildings of the Yeshiva College was laid yesterday with impressive ceremonies on the Yeshiva grounds at 185th Street and Amsterdam Avenue, New York.

**Mr. Lipsky's Criticism of British Policy
Arouses Controversy in London**

A controversy between Louis Lipsky, president of the Zionist Organization of America, and the London "Near East" semi-official organ of the British Government, has arisen as a result of a statement made by Mr. Lipsky recently upon his arrival in London to attend the meeting of the World Zionist Executive. Mr. Lipsky, in his statement criticized the British government in regard to its Palestinian policy. Discussing this subject, the "New Palestine," official organ of the Zionist Organization of America, in its issue of April 29 observes:

"Shortly after his arrival in London Mr. Lipsky, in an interview published the following day in a prominent London daily, ventured some criticism of the British Government in regard to its Palestinian policy. It was the opinion of Mr. Lipsky that the Government had not done all that it might have done, or should have done, to help in the rebuilding of Palestine.

"The rebuttal which was published shortly afterwards by 'The Near East' is of an astonishing character, and raises a second issue which, as we have observed, is perhaps of even greater importance. 'The Near East' acknowledges that the criticism of Mr. Lipsky is more important than that voiced by a Member of Parliament. But while it challenges the right of Mr. Lipsky to make any criticism at all, it opines that such criticism will, in any case, do more harm than good.

"Obviously, if the first is granted, the second follows. If the President of the Zionist Organization of America may not, even in the friendliest spirit, criticize the action of the British Government in Palestine, his criticism is a mere provocation. 'The Near East' puts it a little tartly: 'The British Empire, it says, is not to be moved by the observations of American Jews. To some extent it invalidates its own contention by remarking that had the American Jews made greater progress with the Agency, the criticism would have more point.

"It is our opinion that 'The Near East' has done the British Government no service in evading one issue to create another. If the sole defence that can be made against a friendly challenge is the retort 'It is not your business', others, besides the Jews of America, will be adversely affected in their estimate of the role of Britain in Palestine. It is manifestly unfair to attribute the attitude of 'The Near East' to the British Government itself, and it is to 'The Near East' that we address the following observations. It does appear that though the British Government is not the business of the Jews of America, there was a time

when the opinion of the Jews of America was very much the business of the British Government. The issuance of the Balfour Declaration did evoke among American Jews an outpouring of genuine feeling which the British Government considered an asset worth obtaining. Does 'The Near East' believe that the value of this asset has so deteriorated as to be worth no further effort?

"The sly remarks of 'The Near East' that the delay in the extension of the Jewish Agency takes away the point of Mr. Lipsky's criticism ignores the legal fact that the Jewish Agency has been recognized in the Zionist Organization: it remains there as long as the constitution of the Zionist Organization remains satisfactory to the British Government. And just so long, again, has the Zionist Organization the right to utter its opinion with regard to the role which the British Government is playing in Palestine.

"But there is something deeper than mere argument to be considered. The Jews of America are the greatest material contributors to the upbuilding of Palestine. They will have to remain so for many years to come. It is unthinkable that any intelligent person shall expect a body of men and women to carry an onerous burden without ever being permitted to venture an opinion of its own. It is unnatural to expect people merely to labor, merely to give, merely to acquiesce. The very degree of cooperation depends upon the ability to suggest, to criticize, to demur—in the friendliest spirit, but none the less unmistakably. At no time has even the extremist Zionist been actuated, in his criticism of the British Government, by anything but the friendliest spirit. Jews cannot, and will not, forget that Great Britain has been the chief mover in the chain of events which has given us the opportunity to redeem our national liberty. But is there anything ungrateful in pointing to errors of policy when the sole motive is to further the very purpose which Great Britain had in mind when it issued the Balfour Declaration?"

German Hakenkreuzler Continue Demand for Extermination of Jews

The manner in which the anti-Semitic press in Germany pursues its war against the Jews, brazenly calling for the extermination of the Jewish people, is to be seen from a copy of "Der Sturmer," Hakenkreuzler organ of Nuernberg. On the first page appears a call under the caption, "Golgotha," with two illustrations, one showing a Jew gloating over the crucified Jesus, the other showing a Jew gloating over a crucified figure of Germany. The call to all Jew-haters reads:

"The Christ-murderers still live. They live in the midst of the German people. And they are planning its destruction. The Jewish hand lies heavily on Ger-

ROMANIAN PROFESSORS SPEAK FRANKLY OF GOVERNMENT'S RESPONSIBILITY FOR ANTI-JEWISH EXCESSES

Text of Memorandum Signed by Forty Professors of Jassy University Issued; Government Could Stop Excesses If It Wished, They Declare

(Jewish Daily Bulletin Mail Service)

Bucharest, Apr. 15.—Frank language has been used by a group of forty professors of Jassy University in their memorandum submitted to the Minister of the Interior condemning the anti-Semitic excesses carried on by the students.

"For a long time," the memorandum says, "the normal procedure of our university has been interrupted by a section of the students who think that by means of agitations, strikes and acts of violence they will be able to settle problems of State which have nothing to do with the work of the universities. The results are very deplorable in regard to the education of the young and is fraught with grave danger to the future of the country. Unfortunately, no serious steps have been taken to combat the danger, and things have gone so far that the relations between the professors and the students, instead of being those of collaborators in the search for a common ideal of culture and progress, are such that some students have lost all respect for the professors. Under such conditions, the university cannot carry on its work properly.

"The students who indulge in disturbances, have come to the conclusion that they are permitted to do anything without fear of punishment. Much precious time is being lost and the students are going out into life without proper education and preparation for their work. The professors are compelled in defence of their lives to fight the students with weapons in their hands. The case of Professor Rescanu who was attacked in his laboratory by a group of students with cudgels and who was compelled to defend himself with a revolver is not an isolated one. The basis of University life has been undermined. It is clear that the State is not in a position to maintain order. It is no wonder that the professors are forced to adopt such measures. It is the duty of the

"The settlement of the students' question depends very much upon you, as the Minister of the Interior. The students must not find encouragement on the part of the authorities, or of public opinion. You can make representations to the higher authorities that they should take severe measures to preserve order, and to see that nothing should be done or said which will encourage this anarchistic movement. There must be no material or moral aid for these agitators who are doing damage to Roumania and Roumanian culture."

ROUMANIAN JUDGE WHO SENTENCED JEWS FOR SELF-DEFENSE REMOVED FROM POST

Bucharest, Apr. 14.—The Judge at Piatra-Niamtz who recently sentenced nineteen Jewish citizens of the town to heavy terms of imprisonment for having defended themselves against an attack made by a band of students on the Synagogue during service on Yom Kippur has been removed from his post by order of the Minister of Justice, M. Cudalbu.

Deputy Pop, of the Cuzist Party, put an interpellation yesterday to the Minister of the Interior urging him to take measures in order to Roumanianize the towns. The Minister of the Interior, M. Goga, stated in reply that there were two kinds of aliens in the country. There were aliens who were subjects of Foreign Powers and there were aliens who had come into the country from the other side of the frontier. This last class of aliens constituted a grave danger to the State. All Roumanians ought to shake them off. The minorities ought to unite in this if they did not want a large number of alien elements in the country. The general census which would be carried out on April 24th would enable the Government to take the necessary measures to this end. It was impossible to say at present what the measures would be, because announcing them beforehand would give the alien elements an opportunity of putting themselves on their guard, Goga said.

Appropriation of \$150,000 for prizes in a competition for the purpose of achieving "a real advance in the safety of flying" was announced Friday evening by Harry F. Guggenheim, President of the Guggenheim Fund for the Promotion of Aeronautics, at a dinner to leaders in American aviation given by the fund at the Yale Club of New York City.

Of the 513 law students in New York City who passed the March bar examinations, 270 are Jewish.

PALESTINE ARABS COMPLAIN TO PLUMER THAT CHRISTIANS DOMINATE SCHOOLS

Jerusalem, Apr. 30.—A petition has been addressed to Lord Plumer, the British High Commissioner in Palestine, by Sheikh Mahmud Saud Aluri, the former Cadi of Jerusalem, protesting against the appointment of an excessive number of Christians to the Department of Education.

"The French regime in Syria shows more respect to the Moslem religion than the English administration in Palestine," the petition declares. "Great Britain has injured the Moslems by entrusting the administration of the Department of Education to Mr. Bowman, who has filled it with Christian officials not only from Palestine but also from the Lebanon, as if there were not suitable candidates in Palestine. Moreover, he has abolished the post of Moslem Religious Inspector in order that his missionary acts against the Moslem religion might not be noticed." This is proved by the general history text-book used in the Government schools, which contains attacks against the Moslem religion."

The petition recalls that when the English occupied Palestine, they issued a proclamation pledging themselves to respect the religious and civil rights of the population. The High Commissioner is asked to put a stop to these attacks upon the Moslem religion.

DR. FAITLOVITCH HERE. REPORTS ON FALASHA PROGRESS

Dr. Jacques Faitlovitch, Field Director of the American Pro-Falasha Committee who has just arrived in America after an absence of two years, addressed the American Committee at a meeting held at the Jewish Theological Seminary. Dr. Faitlovitch delivered a report on the progress of the religious and educational work among the Falashas, conducted through the normal school at Addis-Abeba, the capital of Abyssinia, and through the native teachers in the interior provinces in the Northwestern and Central parts of that country.

Dr. Faitlovitch announced that at present there are fifteen Falasha youths receiving their education in the schools of Palestine and Europe. From these students he proposes to recruit the future leaders and teachers that the Falashas need in Addis-Abeba and in the provinces. Some of these students will be prepared for professional careers, especially the teaching profession and medicine.

Mr. Philip Liberman, importer of New York City, sailed Saturday on the Leviathan for a three months' trip to Europe. Mr. Liberman will visit Palestine, Germany and France.

Julius Rosenwald of Chicago presented former Mayor William E. Dever and Mrs. Dever with a vellum bound copy of resolutions of appreciation and tribute of his services as mayor at a banquet given by 1,000 friends of the former mayor at the Congress Hotel.

MAX WARBURG'S TRIBUTE TO MEMORY OF DR. PAUL NATHAN

Berlin, Apr. 15.—Herr Max Warburg was the chief speaker at a big memorial meeting held this week in Hamburg in honor of the late Dr. Paul Nathan, organized by the Hamburg branch of the Hilfsverein der deutschen Juden. Wherever and whenever there was distress, Herr Warburg said, Paul Nathan together with Dr. James Simon stood at the head of the relief work. "Here in Hamburg when the refugees arrived from Russia after the pogroms and later, he stood at our side in the work of the so-called Russian Committee, of the Hamburg branch of the Hilfsverein which he helped to found, of the Organization for Refugees and in other ways. We have to thank him and his negotiations with Government departments and with the shipping companies that the stream of emigrants was directed through Germany without causing any difficulties.

"In his last letter to me, written only five days before his death," Herr Warburg proceeded, "he wrote that he was ready to come to Hamburg in order to tell us what he had seen of the position in Russia during his visit there. The Hilfsverein der deutschen Juden is hoping to find a way of associating the name of Paul Nathan permanently with the relief work on behalf of the Russian Jews and we count on all his friends to participate in this work. His life was a constant search for a synthesis between true German and true Jewish feeling. He saw the unifying factor of all Jews in the common relief work. He sought to relieve distress among the Jews no matter where it was.

"In regard to Palestine, he was in a sense among the first Zionists. Before the war, he tried to build up a constructive educational work in Palestine. But nationalist Zionism, which might be in conflict with his Germanism was alien to him. Nathan was an untiring fighter against anti-Semitism. He collected authoritative material which disproved the ritual murder lies from Xanthen to Konitz. He helped in the defence of Bellis in Kieff. He made known the facts regarding the participation of the Jews in the army during the war. He was a leader, an example to us all as Germans and as Jews, of true loyalty, of courage and of self-sacrifice.

merits further investigation with the good hope of discoveries of first-class importance. To abandon this site now might well mean to do so for ever. The previous excavations were only suspended on account of exhausted funds and never really abandoned.

The prospect of immediate excavation with the spring, it is added, is made possible on account of an arrangement which has been come to with the British School of Archaeology in Jerusalem, whereby their new Director, Mr. Crowfoot, and his assistant, Mr. Fitzgerald, will under certain conditions undertake the management and direction of the excavation.
