HEBREW UNIVERSITY AGAIN DENIES PROFESSOR EINSTEIN'S RESIGNATION

American Jewish Scholar to Lecture
at University

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Jerusalem, May 13.—Another denial of the alleged resignation of Dr. Albert Einstein from the Board of Governors of the Hebrew University was made here today.

The denial was issued by the administrative office of the Hebrew University, contradicting a report of the Jerusalem correspondent of the New York "Jewish Daily Forward".

Jerusalem, May 13.—Dr. Louis L. Mann, professor of the Hebrew Union College of Cincinnati and Rabbi of Temple Sinai, Chicago, will lecture at the Hebrew University during the next semester. Dr. Mann's subject will be medieval Jewish history.

TWO ANTI-SEMITIC CON- GRESSES IN ROUMANIA OPEN THEIR SESSIONS

Bucharest, May 13.—Roumania holds the distinction of housing two anti-semitic congresses which opened their sessions on the same day, but in two different cities.

One congress was that of the Christian League under the leadership of Alexander Cuza, which opened yesterday in Jassy. The Jassy congress, at the urge of Cuza, adopted a resolution excluding from the League all the deputies elected to parliament on the League's ticket. Thus, Cuza remains the sole representative of the League in the Roumanian parliament.

Simultaneously, a congress of Cuza's opponents in the Christian League opened in Bucharest. This congress decided to exclude Alexander Cuza from the party.

POLAND APPOINTS JEW AS ITS CONSUL IN TEL-AVIV

Warsaw, May 13.—The first appointment of a Jew as a Polish Consul in a foreign country was made by the Polish Foreign Office.

Deputy Hausner was appointed Polish Consul in the city of Tel Aviv. Deputy Hausner is affiliated with the Mizrahi Zionist Organization.

25 GET SUSPENDED SEN- TENCES FOR DISTURBANCE

Warsaw, May 13.—Twenty Christians and five Jews were sentenced to three months' imprisonment for their participation in the disturbances which followed the ritual murder agitation in Dobryn. The sentence was suspended for five years.

FELIX M. WARBURG FETED IN MOSCOW BEFORE DEPARTURE TO INSPECT COLONIES

Visited Cradles of Religions, Hopes for Peace Among All Nations, He Told
Moscow Audience; American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee
Praised for High Humanitarian Service in Russia

Moscow, May 13.—A reception in honor of Felix M. Warburg, chairman of the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee, was given by the Moscow Kehillah, prior to Mr. Warburg's departure for an inspection tour of the Jewish colonies in Russia. James H. Becker and Dr. Bernard Kahn were also guests at the reception which was attended by the members of the Board, social workers, distinguished men of letters and representatives of the press.

Albert Fuks, chairman of the Moscow Kehillah, praised the achievements of the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee in Russia and lauded the part of Felix M. Warburg and Dr. Joseph Rosen in this work which has earned the gratitude of Russian Jewry.

Dr. Gran, one of the oldest Russian Jewish social workers, pointed out that the Joint Distribution Committee brought aid to Russian Jewry during the terrible war years, thus preventing

its destruction. The J. D. C. work in Russia has been done with praiseworthy impartiality. The speaker paid tribute to Dr. Rosen, stating that it would be impossible to find a better man for the job. Dr. Wermel, a writer, expressed the hope that the Joint Distribution Committee will continue its work in Russia until Russian Jewry is self supporting.

Replying to the addresses, Mr. Warburg described the experiences of his five months journey, during which he visited Palestine. "I visited the cradles of all religions and cultures and it is my sincerest wish to see peace prevail among the races and nations."

Referring to the work of the Joint Distribution Committee, Mr. Warburg stated that its achievements were not only in the fact that it brought assistance to European Jewry, but also in the fact that it reminded American Jews of their origin and of their Jewishness. He himself, Mr. Warburg stated, was not interested in Russian Jewish affairs until the Joint Distribution Committee was formed. Now all Jews are alike to him.

The chairman of the Joint Distribution Committee then praised highly the services of Dr. Rosen and concluded by expressing the hope that the ties of friendship between American and Russian Jewry will remain as strong after the situation in Russia improves.

Odessa, May 13.—Felix M. Warburg accompanied by James H. Becker, Dr. Bernard Kahn, Dr. Joseph A. Rosen and a number of newspaper men left here to inspect the new Jewish colonies in the district of Cherson.

URGE RELIGIOUS INSTRUCTION BE MADE OBLIGATORY IN POLISH PUBLIC SCHOOLS

Warsaw, May 13.—A demand that Jewish religious instruction be made obligatory for Jewish pupils in Polish public schools was formulated by a conference of Polish rabbis which concluded its session here today.

A memorandum to this effect was submitted by representatives of the conference to the Polish Ministry of Education.

In the Polish public schools, Catholic religious instruction is obligatory and the practice has been that Jewish pupils have the right to abstain from this instruction, while their attendance at Jewish religious instruction is voluntary.

PALESTINE RICH IN GOLD AND OTHER MINERALS, SAYS BRITISH NAVAL OFFICER

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

London, May 13.—Palestine has gold mines and precious stones and is a veritable Transvaal, is the opinion expressed by Commander C. Crawford, a British naval officer who spent twenty years of search in Palestine.

Lecturing to the United Services Institution Commander Crawford said he found the lost lands of Ophir whence the Queen of Sheba brought to Solomon her magnificent gift of thirty-three tons of incense, spices, gold, jewels, apes, peacocks, pearls and other valuables. Ophir, he said, is in Arabia, about 400 miles east of Aden.

The city, with its ruined temple of God, is now little more than ruins, which have been visited by many seamen and political agents, he said, but they have never identified it. The commander suggested that excavations on the site would be richly repaid, and said that the land, which was mineral wealth, should be developed.

"The city is ideally situated," he said. "It has a harbor to the north and has a river which gives wharf space for a seaport. But a thin ribbon of coral sand is drawn across the harbor mouth. It is this strip of sand that strangled the life of Ophir. There is great wealth in Ophir still."

"Palestine now is the Palestine of King Saul. It lies in our power to develop the land to the prosperity of Solomon."

SABBATH ALLIANCE CHARGES NEW YORK POLICE ARE EN- FORCING NON-EXISTENT LAW

A charge that the New York police are enforcing a law which was never passed was made by the Jewish Sabbath Alliance of America, in a statement issued yesterday.

"On account of recent reports from various parts of the city that Sabbath keeping bootblacks, shoemakers and tailors were being forced to keep their place closed on Sunday through the alleged report that a bill was passed to that effect in the last session of the New York Legislature, the Jewish Sabbath Alliance," the statement declares, "made an investigation and found that such laws were introduced but never passed and that some one is responsible for the enforcement of a law which has been killed in Committee."

"The Alliance has taken steps to inform all Seventh Day observing bootblacks and tailors that they may continue their work on Sunday as provided by Section 2144 of the Penal Law which permits Seventh Day observers to work on Sunday."

URGE HASTENING RELIEF FROM SUNDAY COMPUL- SORY REST IN POLAND

Warsaw, May 13.—The Polish Vice-Premier, Professor Bartel, was urged to speed up the relief promised by the government for Jewish merchants from the compulsory Sunday rest law.

Scores of Jewish merchants in all parts of Poland urged the vice-premier in telegrams to hasten the measure as the continued enforcement of the Sunday rest law will bring complete economic ruin to the Jews.

Press Welcomes Non-Partisan Palestine Experts' Commission

The announcement issued by Louis Marshall last week regarding the selection of the Non-partisan Palestine Survey Commission, in accordance with the recent agreement on the Jewish Agency, is viewed with satisfaction by the Jewish press.

The "Jewish Daily News" likens the commission to the "meraglim," the messengers sent by Moses into Palestine before the Israelites entered the country. The paper points out these "messengers" have the duty to ascertain not about the principle of Palestine reconstruction, but regarding the most effective and efficient method of carrying out that reconstruction.

"Under such circumstances," the paper observes, "the commission is essentially a commission of experts which is divided into two categories: scientific experts who are able to render an opinion on the ways and means for carrying out the work and general experts, that is to say, business experts, who on the basis of the report of the scientific experts, will be able to submit general recommendations for the further continuation of the work."

The paper expresses particular satisfaction with the three heads of the commission so far appointed, Sir Alfred Mond, Felix M. Warburg and Dr. Lee K. Frankel. "We believe that Sir Alfred Mond, the great industrialist who rendered assistance in the economic organization of England during the war; Felix Warburg, banker of great reputation; and Dr. Frankel who is connected with a huge financial institution, are the best men that could possibly have been chosen as members of this commission," the paper avers.

The demonstration was made by 300 members of the anti-Semitic National Socialist Party and was held following the dispersion of a meeting by the police. The demonstrators attacked passersby on Kurfürstendamm. Eleven persons were injured.

stand, is not intended to determine on principles or to seek excuses for not helping in the Palestine reconstruction, but its task is to ascertain the best methods for furthering that reconstruction. The commission will render a report on everything that has been accomplished in Palestine up till now and will state what is to be done in the future."

As regards the personnel of the commission, we read: "Sir Alfred Mond is not only a great personality in England, he is also an active Zionist. Felix Warburg is not a Zionist, but he is one of the most fervent and sincere Jews in America, one who is ever ready to respond generously to every Jewish cause. He is not a Zionist, yet he sent his contribution to the Keren Hayesod before the agreement between Weizmann and Marshall was included. Dr. Lee K. Frankel is a man of wide knowledge and with many years of experience in communal activities. He is a man commanding the high respect and confidence of American Jewry."

The paper finds that the choice of the other leading members of the commission, as Professor Elwood Mead, Professor Lipman, Professor Adams, Mr. Ryerson and Mr. Strahorn, is equally well made."

A similar view is voiced in the "Jewish Morning Journal" by Jacob Fishman. Characterizing the leading members of the commission, Mr. Fishman concludes that they are well in a position to render a satisfactory and non-partisan report.

Scores Prof. Irving Fisher's "Superior Aliens" Idea

Prof. Irving Fisher's proposal that immigration should be based on the principle of admitting only "superior aliens," i. e., aliens superior to the average American, is termed stupid in an editorial on this subject in the "Jewish Criterion" of Pittsburgh. Writing in its May 6 issue, that paper says:

"This is rather a stupid position for so brilliant a mind to take. Does Prof. Fisher realize that some of the 'superior Americans' of today in art and industry would never have passed the Professor's test when they came here twenty or thirty years ago."

"One can't determine a superior mind through the Intelligence Test of an 'Ask Me Another.' A great many men of real mind could not pass an examination that would be easy for a grammar school boy. As for superior morals. Well, it isn't always the man or woman of culture who are superior morally. Many of the worst criminals in the country are both cultured and educated."

"We think that if we keep on trying to hand-pick our immigrants we are likely to make a mess of it. There is an expressive word that to our mind applies to Professor Fisher's suggestion and that word is 'bunk.'"

FORD COUNSEL GIVES REASON FOR REFUSING ARBITRATION

Detroit, May 13.—Stewart Hanley, attorney for Henry Ford in the manufacturer's defense against the libel suit of Aaron Sapiro, made public yesterday the correspondence in which he declined to accept the suggestion of the Detroit Board of Commerce that Mr. Ford and Mr. Sapiro arbitrate their dispute.

Mr. Sapiro agreed to the recommendation of the board on condition that the board open the hearings to the public.

Mr. Hanley's letter of refusal says that counsel for Mr. Ford never took the Board of Commerce's proposal seriously. It added:

"I say this because I cannot imagine one reason why this controversy should be transferred from an historical tribunal constituted to settle such disputes, where the settled rules of law are administered by experienced Judges, and turn the decision of the matter over to inexperienced arbitrators who are not supported by the bench of long tradition nor who bear the responsibility that attends the taking of the judicial oath of office. I say administrators inexperienced in matters of this kind because I notice that your Arbitration Committee and Council is composed largely of laymen, with a sprinkling of Judges and lawyers in private practice."

BEISAN LAND QUESTION AGAIN UP IN COMMONS

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency Mail Service)

London, May 2.—The cadastral survey and valuation of Palestine will be carried out by units either of villages or settlements and the advantages therefrom should begin to accrue on the completion of the work in each unit. Colonial Secretary Amery declared in the House of Commons yesterday in reply to a question by Col. Josiah Wedgwood.

Col. Wedgwood also asked the Colonial Secretary what steps are being taken to protect the rights of the Crown against claims based on doubtful titles over vacant or common lands.

No steps in this direction were considered necessary, Col. Amery replied.

The question whether the Beisan land settlement is expected to place any land now unused or undesired at the disposal of the Jewish emigrants for development was also put by Col. Wedgwood.

Mr. Amery in his reply said that the Beisan land settlement was in execution of the agreement made in 1921 with the existing Arab cultivators. The settlement was still proceeding and he was not at present in a position to say whether any land in that part of Palestine would on completion of the settlement be found to be surplus. Mr. Amery said that he hoped it might be possible to find some surplus land.

The golden jubilee of the rabbinage of Dr. H. Pereira Mendes, rabbi emeritus of the Spanish and Portuguese Synagogue, Seventieth Street and Central Park West, New York, will be celebrated at the Hotel St. Regis on Sunday afternoon, June 5, Dr. Mendes, who has been living recently in San Diego, Cal., will return to New York for the celebration.

PLAN HEBREW UNIVERSITY HOSPITAL IN JERUSALEM

Form Committee for Neurological Department

A committee to build the neurological department of the new hospital of the Hebrew University at Jerusalem, was organized at a dinner at the Hotel Astor Friday night.

It is the plan of the Joint Committee for the Building of the Hospital, of which Dr. Nathan Ratnoff is chairman, that specialists in each department of medicine organize their own committees to take charge of the building of their respective departments. In line with this policy, surgeons, obstetricians, pediatricians, dermatologists, eye, ear, nose and throat specialists, X-ray specialists and dentists, will at subsequent meetings, organize their committees for the establishment of departments for their branches of medical science. Dr. Ratnoff stated.

The Joint Committee for the building of the Hebrew University Hospital consists of an equal number of representatives of the American Jewish Physicians Committee of which Dr. Nathan Ratnoff is chairman and of the Hadassah Women's Zionist Organization, which is at present conducting health activities in Palestine, and of which Mrs. Irna Lindheim is president.

The committee of neurologists which met at the Astor Hotel Friday evening is headed by Dr. Israel Wechsler of Columbia University and Dr. Emil Altman.

Announcing the purposes of the new hospital, Dr. Ratnoff declared it to be the hope of the American physicians that the hospital will function as "a unit of a medical center to serve not only Palestine but the surrounding countries."

"The medical school of which the hospital will be the center will receive Jewish students from those lands where medical education is made difficult or altogether denied them," Dr. Ratnoff said. "But we shall allow no bars of sectarianism. We shall not only invite eminent Jewish physicians from all over the world to go to Palestine for a temporary sojourn, to work and teach and establish high standards, but we should like to see the Arabs, not only as students, but as teachers in the new school."

"The University Hospital will supplement the present limited bedside and clinical facilities, and coordinate its activities with the medical organizations already existing in Palestine."

The dedication of the first Liberal Jewish synagogue in Cedar Rapids, Iowa, took place last Sunday. Mayor W. G. Loftus, Dr. W. L. Ewing of the St. Paul's Methodist Church, representing the Protestant Ministerial Association, Dr. W. W. W. Argow of the Presbyterian Church, and Rabbi J. L. Baron of Mile-Pole's Church, and Rabbi J. L. Baron of Mile-Pole's Church, took part in the dedication ceremony. A banquet was held in honor of Rabbi Baron, who founded the congregation four years ago, and who ministered to it for two years, while he held the pulpit of Tri-City Temple Emanuel, Davenport, Iowa.

Charleston, South Carolina, will launch its United Palestine Appeal campaign today. The quota has been set at \$5,000. Samuel Rittenberg is chairman of the campaign.

Norfolk, Virginia, will launch its campaign for \$20,000 next Sunday.

ROCKEFELLER, JR., GIVES \$50,000 TO Y. M. H. A. CAMPAIGN

A check of \$50,000 from John D. Rockefeller, Jr., was received at the Biltmore Hotel Headquarters of the Y. M. H. A. campaign for \$1,500,000, headed by Judge Joseph M. Proskauer.

In the letter accompanying Mr. Rockefeller's check, he stresses the fact that he was not solicited for a contribution, but that he is moved to make one as an expression of his deep interest in the work which the organization is doing. Mr. Rockefeller's letter, which he sent by special delivery, to Samuel J. Bloomingdale, treasurer of Y. M. H. A. Building Fund read: "Although I have not been solicited in connection with the campaign for enlarging the facilities of the Young Men's Hebrew Association, I trust you will accept the enclosed check for \$50,000 as an expression of my deep interest in the work which your organization is doing, together with my best wishes for the successful consummation of your significant plans for the future."

In acknowledging the \$50,000 contribution Judge Proskauer commented on the spontaneous character of the gift, and added: "I must add my word of personal thanks for the gift and for the generous spirit which prompted it. Nothing could have happened which is more heartening to our workers, or more potent for the success of our cause."

Mr. Rockefeller's contribution to this campaign is the second made by him during the past year to Jewish causes, the first being one of \$100,000 to the United Jewish Campaign. The Rockefeller contribution brings the total raised to date in the Y. M. H. A. campaign to within \$1,000 of the halfway mark.

FOUR ZIONIST BODIES IN ROUMANIA FEDERATED

Bucharest, Apr. 23.—A Federation of the four Zionist Organizations in Roumania was decided upon at a recent meeting of representatives of the four organizations.

Old Roumania was represented by M. Adolf Bernard, the chairman, Senator Chloé Rabbid Dr. Nemierow, Dr. Milashan, Dr. Stern, and Dr. Singer; Bulwaria by Deputy Dr. Elner, Dr. Reifer and Engineer Zwilling; Transylvania by Dr. Marton, Dr. Seni, and Dr. Weinberg; and Bessarabia by M. Jacob Wassermann and M. Tarcauov-sky.

There will be a central committee consisting of two representatives from each of the four provinces. A Congress of the Zionists of the whole of Roumania is to be convoked within the next six months.

PALESTINE EMIGRATION IN MARCH ABOVE IMMIGRATION

Jerusalem, May 13.—The number of emigrants from Palestine exceeded the number of immigrants during the month of March, figures published today indicate.

According to the figures, 228 Jews came into the country while 588 left.

NATIONAL FUND DRAINAGE WORK WILL FURNISH EM- PLOYMENT TO MANY

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency Mail Service)

Jerusalem, Apr. 21.—A large number of workers will be given employment on a new amelioration and drainage activity which is to be carried out shortly on the banks of the River Kishon by the Jewish National Fund. The area is situated near the delta of the river and includes Harhatch, Mejdell and Jadtur, all near Haifa, and runs to about 40,000 dunams (about 8,000 acres). The works on the River Kishon previously announced concern Kneies, Jebata, Tel Tura, etc., south of Nahalal.

This new program provides not only for the work of drainage of the whole area, but also for the supply of water to the settlement within the area. The undertaking will cost about \$15,000.

Jerusalem, Apr. 25.—Figures on the membership of the General Jewish Labor Federation in Palestine were made public here.

According to the latest data, the Federation includes 2,935 members of the "Achduth Haavoda", 1,647 of the "Hapoel Hatzair", 295 of the Left Poale Zion, 64 Revisionists, 292 Hapoel Hamizrachi, 62 Communists, and 8,880 Independents. More than 17,623 did not give information regarding their party affiliation.

JEWISH COMMUNAL ACTIVITIES

The Hebrew Tabernacle at 605 West 161st Street, New York, was dedicated Thursday night.

Among the speakers were Dr. Nicholas Murray Butler of Columbia University, U. S. Senator Royal S. Copeland, Rabbi Stephen S. Wise of the Free Synagogue, Assistant Corporation Counsel Arthur J. W. Hilly, Rev. Dr. Christian F. Reimer, pastor of the Broadway Temple; Maurice Blumenthal and Rabbi I. Mortimer Bloom, rabbi of the Hebrew Tabernacle.

The synagogue, which is of modified Moorish design, will accommodate 1,450 persons. George and Edward Blum were the architects. The building was erected at a cost of \$325,000. Leo Schwartz was chairman of the building committee. Louis Austern is president of the congregation.

The dedication sermon was delivered Friday night by Rabbi Rudolph Grossman of Temple Rodeph Shalom. On Saturday morning the consecration address was delivered by Rabbi Judah S. Solomon of Temple Shaare Zedek. Judge Samuel D. Levy will be the speaker at this morning's services.

Representatives of the Jewish communities of the tri-cities which include Moline and Rock Island in Illinois and Davenport in Iowa, attended a meeting in Moline to launch the drive for \$100,000 for the United Palestine Appeal. The campaign for the tri-cities quota of \$100,000 will continue for two weeks.

Max Skolovsky of Moline is the general chairman of the campaign. He is assisted by Mrs. Harry Waxenberg, of Davenport, vice-chairman.

PALESTINE NOW HAS 566

MEDICAL PRACTITIONERS
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency Mail Service)

Jerusalem, Apr. 22.—There were 566 medical practitioners in Palestine in January, 1927, of whom 405 were Jewish. The names of four doctors were added to the list during February and March. There are 126 Jewish women doctors. Ninety-five of the Jewish doctors are resident in Jerusalem, 144 in Tel Aviv and 51 in Haifa. Thirty-four per cent of the doctors hold appointments and the remainder are in private practice.

The twenty-third annual convention of the Jewish Consumptives' Relief Society of Denver will consider problems for the care of Jewish tuberculars during its sessions in Atlantic City from May 20 to May 23.

Among those expected to participate in the deliberations is Prof. Allan K. Krause, in charge of the Tuberculosis Dispensary at Johns Hopkins University and Editor of the "American Review of Tuberculosis". Dr. Philip Hillkowitz is President of the Society and Dr. C. D. Spivak, Secretary.

The convention will also formally launch the Society's \$1,000,000 program which will increase its capacity from 300 to over 400 patients and provide opportunities for further tuberculosis research.
