LONDON LIBERAL JEWS FORM SOCIETY TO SUP- PORT JEWISH AGENCY

**Committee of Influential Members of
Liberal Synagogue Formed**
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

London, May 27.—Another section of Anglo-Jewry was organized to assist in the work of the extended Jewish Agency for Palestine, as a result of steps taken by Liberal Jews here.

A committee consisting of influential members of the Liberal Synagogue of London was formed following a meeting addressed by Col. Frederick H. Kisch. A Society of Liberal and Reform Jews was organized for the object of supporting the work of the Jewish Agency and furthering the interests of progressive Judaism in Palestine.

CZECHOSLOVAKIAN JEWS FORM CENTRAL COUNCIL (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Prague, Czechoslovakia, May 27.—A federation of federations, to be known as the Supreme Council of Jewish organizations in Czechoslovakia, will soon be formed, it was learned here today.

The Council is to have headquarters in Prague. The statute of the organization has been submitted to the government for approval.

POLICEMAN IS SENTENCED FOR KILLING JEWS IN 1905 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Moscow, May 27.—The district court of Homel sentenced a Russian police officer, Schwarow, to death on the charge that in 1905, the year of the first revolution, he shot and killed two Jewish workmen and wounded many. His sentence was commuted to ten years imprisonment.

SCHWARTZBARD TRIAL AGAIN POSTPONED (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Paris, May 27.—The trial of Sholom Schwartzbard, which was scheduled to take place during the summer, will probably be postponed, it was learned here today.

No definite date for the trial has been set. It is expected, however, that it will be held in the fall.

GERMAN JEWISH ATTORNEY, MAXIMILIAN KEMPNER, DIES (Jewish Telegraphic Agency Mail Service)

Amsterdam, May 11.—Councillor Maximilian Kempner of Berlin, died here yesterday at the age of 72.

Councillor Kempner was among the most prominent legal authorities in Germany. Before the Revolution he was a member of the Reichstag and one of the leaders of the Progressive Peo-

INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE OF LEAGUE OF NATIONS SOCIETIES TAKES UP ROUMANIAN JEWISH QUESTION

**Palestine Representative and Bucharest University Head Clash on Issue in
National Minority Committee**

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Berlin, May 27.—A plea that the rights of national minorities be respected by the majority populations in European states was made in the address of M. Aukard, at the plenary session of the International Union of League of Nations Societies which was opened here today.

M. Dizengoff, former mayor of Tel Aviv, the representative of the Palestine League of Nations Society, was chosen a member of the conference presidium.

A preliminary to the expected discussion on the Roumanian Jewish situation took place yesterday at the meeting of the Union's committee on national minorities. At this meeting, M. Droyen submitted a memorandum in which the martyrdom of Roumanian

Jews was described. Another memorandum refuting the charges against Roumania was submitted by the Roumanian League of Nations Society.

A resolution which was introduced on the question, urging the Roumanian Jewish situation on the attention of the League, was discussed. It was supported by Mr. Dizengoff, who stated that the resolution is in accord with the duty resting on the Council of the League of Nations to provide protection for the national minorities.

Mr. Dizengoff was opposed by M. Pangreti, rector of the University of Bucharest, who repeated the old anti-Semitic charges. The Roumanian Jews, he said, are conspiring with the enemies of Roumania. The Jews in Roumania are, nevertheless, he stated, given equal rights with other citizens. The Jews are not mistreated in Roumania. As proof of this he quoted the alleged statements of Rabbi Niemirower in his famous address in the Roumanian Senate and the alleged statement of Dr. Victor Jacobson, a representative of the World Zionist Organization, who recently visited Roumania. The debate on the question will be continued at tomorrow's meeting of the committee.

AMERICAN EXPEDITION FINDS NEW SINAI TABLETS

**Discovery Important for Study of
Earliest Semitic Script**
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

London, May 27.—New Sinai tablets, resembling those found by Sir Flinders Petrie, famous Egyptologist, were discovered on Mount Sinai by the Harvard-Michigan Sinai expedition under Professors Lake and Blake.

The fragments of the tablets, a despatch from Cairo to the London "Times" states, were taken to the Cairo Museum. The fragments are said to bear inscriptions which are claimed to be the earliest Semitic script.

In commenting upon the discovery of the American scientists, Professor Allan Gardiner, famous English Egyptologist, states that these fragments of Sinai tablets are of extreme importance in view of the prolonged controversy during the past 12 years over the inscriptions on the Sinai Tablets which contain what is believed to be the origin of all alphabets.

Two years ago Professor Hugo Grimmer of Munich contended that he had deciphered the Flinders Petrie tablets and had found in them a reference to the story of Moses. This contention is regarded by a majority of scholars as fantastic. The Sinai inscriptions are carved on statues and other stone monuments.

CZECHOSLOVAKIA APPOINTS JEW VICE-CONSUL IN JAFFA (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Jerusalem, May 27.—A Jewish attorney in Tel Aviv, Mr. Gruenwald, was appointed Czechoslovakian Vice-Consul for the District of Jaffa.

The address of Rabbi Niemirower in the Roumanian Senate on Feb. 1, which is referred to in this report, called forth many denials and contradictions. The claim was made that the official Roumanian news agency misquoted the rabbi's address in order to counteract the effect of the anti-Jewish excesses.

JERUSALEM POLICE GUARDS ROUMANIAN PATRIARCH (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Jerusalem, May 27.—Steps to prevent unfriendly demonstrations were taken by the Jerusalem police in connection with the expected arrival here of Monsignor Myron, Roumanian Patriarch.

The Patriarch is expected to come to Jerusalem on Monday. A reception has been arranged in his honor.

FRENCH JEWISH LEADER SAILS FOR UNITED STATES (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Paris, May 27.—Dr. Leon Zadek Kohn, prominent French Jewish leader, sailed yesterday for the United States. Mr. Zadek Kohn is the president of the Keren Hayesod in France and a member of the Executive of the Alliance Israelite Universelle. He is chief physician at the Rothschild Hospital.

CHESTERTON, IN POLAND,
EXPLAINS HIS ATTITUDE
ON JEWISH QUESTION

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency Mail Service)

Warsaw, May 11.—Gilbert K. Chesterton, who is on a visit here, explained his attitude on the Jewish question in the course of an interview with the Polish-Jewish daily "Nasz Przegląd."

"People," he said, "describe me as an anti-Semite without there being any justification for it, simply because I have drawn attention in the English press to the fact that there is such a thing as a Jewish question. The fact that I have merely placed the Jewish question upon the agenda is surely not sufficient ground for calling me an anti-Semite. I associate the Jewish question with my anti-capitalist and anti-socialist views. But with anti-Semitism as such I have nothing at all to do. The anti-Semitism of the 'Morning Post' is the anti-Semitism of ignoramus and fools.

"I paid a visit to Palestine some time ago," said Chesterton went on, "and I wrote a book about it, 'The New Jerusalem.' I believe in the idea of giving the Jews a territory somewhere because it is the only way to solve the Jewish question. But it hurts me to think that it should just be Palestine which has been promised to the Jews for Palestine is a country of great importance to the Christians and the Moslems. Dr. Weizmann, the president of the Zionist Organization," Mr. Chesterton added, "spoke to me some time ago of his scheme to divide Palestine on the lines of Switzerland. This project seems to be both reasonable and feasible."

TASK OF ZIONIST BUDGET
COMMISSION IS OUTLINED
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency Mail Service)

London, May 13.—The nature of the work to be performed by the special Budget Reorganization Commission, with two American members, which will be sent to Palestine by the Zionist Executive, was described in the proposals adopted by the Actions Committee at its session here.

According to the proposals, "the Executive and the General Council instruct the Commission to prepare the official Budget estimates for the forthcoming Congress and to present them to the Executive, who shall submit them with their observations to the Congress.

"The Budget estimates for the coming year shall not exceed the expected income of the Keren Hayesod, it being understood that the estimate of this income made by the Executive and the Board of Directors of the Keren Hayesod shall be binding upon the Commission and that Agricultural Colonization shall receive special consideration.

"It shall be the task of the Commission to examine the entire economic system and administration of Zionist work, as well as of institutions in which the Zionist Organization participates only indirectly. It shall draw up its reform proposals respecting the present economic system and administration as well as proposals in reference to the continuation of the work of reconstruction, and submit them in the form of resolutions to the forthcoming Congress.

"The General Council instructs the Commission to investigate the administrative expenditure of the Zionist Executive and other Zionist institutions, banks and companies both within and without Palestine, and the possibility of economies in staff, as well as the reduction of the expenditure of the administrative apparatus, and shall pay regard to the results of the Commission which has already been appointed."

The Executive is to deliver the report on the proposals of the Commission to all the Federations and other affiliated bodies of the Zionist Organization at least three weeks before the Congress.

ZIONISTS IN ROUMANIA
ESTABLISH CREDIT BANK

Bucharest, May 11.—A cooperative bank has been established here on the initiative of the Democratic Zionist fraction "Renasteria." The object of the new bank is to provide cheap credit aid for Jewish artisans, small traders and members of the liberal professions. The General Zionists are also represented on the Council of the bank.

Mr. Vecksel is chairman of the bank and the members of the committee include Adolf Bernard, the president of the Zionist Organization of Roumania and Dr. Stern, the chairman of the "Renasteria."

Lauds Warburg's Ten-Year Plan For
Palestine and Russian Colonization

The report that Felix Warburg, following his recent visit to Palestine and his inspection of the Jewish colonies in Russia, has worked out a 10-year plan for the promotion through one great fund of the Palestine reconstruction and the Russian colonization work, is greeted by the "Jewish Morning Journal" (May 27) as an incident pregnant with historical possibilities. Says the paper:

"Mr. Warburg has in mind a general program and a general fund for the next ten years. That means, one great drive will be made in America for Palestine and for Russian colonization, the pledges to be paid out over a period of ten years.

"These are only the outlines of a proposal which it is now too early to discuss in detail," the paper continues. "But the goal and aim of the plan is big and far reaching, as befits its originator, a man under whose auspices more than sixty million dollars was raised and distributed for relief work. This is the first project offering a possibility to create a really great fund, let us say, one hundred million dollars or more, in other words, the first plan of such magnitude proposed by a man who can help to realize it. Others have spoken of large sums, even of billions, but their words had no concrete ground. A plan under the direction of Mr. Warburg has every possibility of materialization.

"The first condition of such an undertaking, which will be the greatest Jewish undertaking of all times," we read further, "is that all 'quarrels and hysterics' must cease. This attitude of the great American Jewish leader must be adopted by American Jewry as well as by the Jews in all other countries. The work in Russia should not be viewed as a competition to Palestine reconstruction, the United Palestine Appeal and the United Jewish Campaign must be merged, one great effort must be made to help the Jews wherever help is needed.

"The enlarged Jewish Agency," the paper further observes, "will assume a new significance through this, provided, of course, that it will adjust itself to such a broad, general program and be ready for cooperation or co-leadership in the rehabilitation of the Jews in all countries where aid can be extended. Without complete unity and the abolition of all inner strifes, success is unthinkable."

In conclusion the paper opines that "the expectation that Dr. Weizmann on his part will welcome the point of view of Mr. Warburg, is probably the reason why the London English-Jewish press has suddenly become friendly to the Zionist leader."

THE J. D. B. NEWS LETTER

Felix Warburg's Visit Stirs Russian Jewry

(By Our Moscow Correspondent)

Moscow, May 11.—The visit of Mr. Felix M. Warburg to this country to inspect the Jewish colonies is viewed here as significant not only as an indication of the deep personal interest outstanding American Jews of wealth take in the colonization work, but also as a sign of the growing bond of understanding and friendship between the Jewries of the two countries. Nothing could demonstrate this better than the reception tendered by the Moscow Jewish community to Mr. Warburg, James Becker and Dr. Bernhard Kahn on the eve of their departure for the Jewish colonies.

The welcome was especially an expression of esteem and admiration for the head of the J. D. C. who has dedicated himself so nobly to the work of aiding his fellow Jews.

The reception, which made a deep impression on the guests as well as in those who welcomed them, was attended by representatives of the Moscow synagogue administration, the Moscow Jewish relief organization Mevopo, prominent Jewish intellectuals, social workers and scholars.

Mr. Albert Fuchs, the president of the Moscow Jewish Community who was in the chair, said that this was not the first occasion on which the Jews of Moscow were welcoming guests from America. "But we are specially proud to welcome among them Mr. Felix M. Warburg who is the head of the organization which more than all others has responded to the needs of the Jews, and in particular of the Russian Jews," he declared. Mr. Fuchs went on to praise the work of Dr. Joseph Rosen, the head of the Agrojoint in Russia, who, he said, had won for himself the esteem and affection of the whole of Russian Jewry.

Dr. Gran, one of the oldest social Jewish workers in Russia and a leader of the Jewish Health Organization Oze, said: "It is twelve years now since the Joint Distribution Committee has come into the life of Russian Jewry. In the year 1915 when a flood of espionage libels had been poured out upon the Russian Jews, and they were overwhelmed by the catastrophe of life in the war-zone and of forced evacuations, the J. D. C. was the first to come to their aid. The J. D. C. came to the aid of all the relief organizations, the Yekopo, Ort, Oze and the others which were at that time engaged in a vigorous activity. In America the J. D. C. has united all classes and sections of the Jewish population. For twelve years now, the J. D. C. has been watching over the interests of the whole of Jewry in the various countries. At first it engaged in a work of immediate relief. Then it took up the task of reconstructive work. It has prevented the literal annihilation of hundreds of thousands of Jews in all countries. The present work of the J. D. C. in Soviet Russia

is of special importance. The Jewish colonization work which was commenced after a very close and thorough investigation of the conditions in Soviet Russia and after very careful consideration is a work of historic importance not only to the Russian Jews but to the Jews of the other countries as well. The J. D. C. has been most happy in its choice of Dr. Joseph Rosen as the head of its work in Russia. The Russian Jews owe it to Dr. Rosen that the colonization work is so successful. I want in particular to thank the J. D. C. for the assistance it is giving the Oze. The American Jews have through the J. D. C. raised nearly a hundred million dollars for the relief work on behalf of the Jews of Eastern Europe."

Dr. Wermel, the prominent Jewish social worker, said that it was only ten years since the Russian Jews had obtained their emancipation and enjoyed all citizenship rights. But Mendelev Mocherseforim had once said that one did not dance before one had eaten. "We have a lot of rights," Dr. Wermel said, "but we have no bread. The Russian Jews are at present in a state of re-convalescence. People who are just beginning to recover after a long and severe illness need good nourishment. The J. D. C. is helping the Jewish working masses in Russia to obtain this nourishment through agricultural colonization. People who had been small traders, cantors, luftmenschen, are now becoming sturdy landworkers." Dr. Wermel expressed the hope that the J. D. C. would continue to help Russian Jewry until it reached a stage when it would be able to stand upon its own feet.

Mr. Felix M. Warburg, in replying to the speeches, described his travels during the last five months, accompanied by Mr. Becker, through various continents. They had visited, he said, Greece, Italy, Palestine, Ceylon, the Himalayas, India, China and Japan, and now they were in Russia. They had seen the cradles of various cultures and religions, they had seen the beauties and the wonders of nature, but more than the beauties of nature they had been interested in the spirit and the ways of life of man. He would like to see peace and harmony among the various races and nationalities, among all men. When he had seen the sun rise over the Himalaya mountains he had reflected that the same sun shone upon all mankind and that Moses, Jesus and Confucius could have sat down at one table.

"The Joint Distribution Committee," Mr. Warburg proceeded, "has one great achievement to its credit. It has brought it about that the American Jews no longer consider where people came from. Up to the time of the formation of the J. D. C. I had never given a thought to the Russian Jews. But today there are for me no Russian

YESHIVA COLLEGE STARTS CAMPAIGN FOR A \$50,000 MAINTENANCE FUND

Orthodox Congregations Set Aside Date for Membership Appeal

A campaign to secure \$50,000 as a maintenance fund through increasing the present membership income has been undertaken by the Yeshiva College Building Fund, the organization engaged in erecting the Yeshiva College buildings and in extending the work of the academy.

According to an announcement made public yesterday by Samuel Levy, chairman of the fund, the Yeshiva, located at 301 East Broadway, has at present an enrollment of nearly 600 students, including many from European countries and from Palestine. The annual budget for the maintenance of the institution amounts to \$200,000. The \$50,000 fund which is now being raised is intended for the erection of the new Yeshiva buildings. Congregations and individuals, particularly those who have made liberal contributions towards the building fund, are now being canvassed to subscribe on an annual basis towards the maintenance fund.

Four classes of membership were created. The associate member is required to subscribe \$10 annually. A regular member \$25, a contributor \$50. Those who subscribe \$100 annually will be named Patrons of the Yeshiva.

In accordance with a resolution adopted at the National Conference of Orthodox Congregations held at the beginning of May in New York City, Orthodox congregations throughout Greater New York have set aside one day of Shavuoth which falls on June 6 and 7 for appeals for subscriptions toward the maintenance fund.

The members of the Yeshiva alumni who are rabbis of congregations in greater New York met yesterday and adopted a resolution to urge their respective congregations, to participate in the membership campaign.

An increase in the enrollment of the institution was announced yesterday by Dr. B. Revel, president of the Faculty of the Yeshiva. During the last few weeks, 28 new students were admitted to the institution. These new students come from all parts of the United States, including one from Los Angeles, and five from European countries.

Mr. Warburg concluded with the hope that the union between the Russian Jews and the American Jews would continue to be as firm in the future with improved economic conditions among the Russian Jews.

PHILADELPHIA JEWS RAISE \$340,000 FOR U. P. A. QUOTA

Philadelphia, Pa., May 27.—With \$340,000 raised, the largest sum which the local Jewish community has ever contributed to Palestine, Philadelphia's ten day campaign for the United Palestine Appeal was brought to a close on Wednesday evening. This sum represents an increase of \$50,000 over the amount raised last year. Over a thousand persons attended the banquet in the Y. M. H. A. which concluded the drive.

A number of subscriptions were received from non-Zionists, including Alfred W. Fleisher who gave \$1600 to the Hebrew University and Hadassah in memory of Jules E. Mastbaum; Judge Horace Stern, \$100 to the Hadassah; and Gimbel Brothers, \$100.

The speakers on Wednesday evening were Morris Rothenberg of New York, national chairman of the Palestine Foundation Fund; Judge William M. Lewis, national chairman of the United Palestine Appeal; Sol C. Kraus, chairman of the local campaign; Mrs. Max L. Margolis, chairman of the Women's Division; Benjamin L. Rubinsohn, chairman of the Palestine Foundation Fund for Region No. 4, presided.

HEBREW UNIVERSITY PROFESSORS FORM SOCIETY

Jerusalem, May 4.—The professors, lecturers and assistants of the various Institutes of the Hebrew University have established a society. Professor Otto Warburg has been elected chairman. Professors J. Klausner, vice-chairman and Rabbi Segal, secretary. The society has forty members.

Old tenements on the lower east side and on the west side were marked for destruction Thursday when the Board of Estimate branch of the Municipal Assembly unanimously passed the Walker bill extending tax exemption for twenty years to model low-priced apartment houses which will be built to replace them.

It is learned the Mayor expected to announce within a few days a housing program which, it is said, will provide solution of the housing problem on a large scale, without taking advantage of the tax exemption.
