

VISCOUNT CASTLEROSSE INVITES AMERICAN JEWS TO SETTLE IN ENGLAND

Says England Has Less Anti-Semitism
Than America

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

London, May 30.—Advice to American Jews to emigrate to Great Britain because of the pressure of anti-Semitism in the United States was offered by Viscount Castlerosse, writing in the London "Sunday Express."

"If I were the next boat for England," the Viscount writes. "There is less anti-Semitic feeling in England than in any other country in the world, including Palestine. On the other hand, the Jews have a wretched time in America. Why do not American Jews come to England where money talks so loudly that it drowns out the hiss. We would be fools not to make them welcome here," the Viscount writes.

URGE CREATION OF SECOND AUTONOMOUS JEWISH REGION

Charkoff, May 31.—The creation of a second Jewish autonomous region in the Ukraine, to be composed of the new Jewish settlements, was urged in a resolution adopted by the annual conference of the Ukrainian Ozet, the society for settling Jews on the land. The conference concluded its sessions here yesterday.

Reports submitted to the conference showed that the position of the new settlers is not entirely satisfactory, due to the lack of houses and medical assistance.

JERUSALEM RABBIS GREET ROUMANIAN PATRIARCH

Chief Rabbi A. I. Kook of the Ashkenazic community and Chief Rabbi Jacob Meyer of the Sephardic community were among the clergy who greeted the dignitary of the Roumanian church.

HORTHY BESTOWS HIGH HONOR ON HUNGARIAN JEW

Vienna, May 30.—Col. Martin Zoeld of the Hungarian army was elevated by an order of Admiral Horthy, the regent, to the rank of general. The appointment was made for the extraordinary service rendered by Col. Zoeld during the World War and the post war period.

Col. Zoeld is the first Hungarian Jew to be raised to this rank. He takes an active part in Jewish affairs in the country.

PLAN TO ESTABLISH JEWISH CONSISTORY IN LITHUANIA MEETS WITH OPPOSITION

Kovno, May 31.—A suggestion that the government take steps to establish a Jewish consistory in the Republic of Lithuania caused a sharp controversy among the religious leaders of the Jewish community here.

The suggestion came from the Rabbinical Council of Kovno. According to the Council's plan, the consistory would be headed by a chief rabbi, who would be subject to the jurisdiction of the director of the Department of Religious Affairs, a post held by a Christian priest.

An important section of the Lithuanian rabbinate is opposing this plan, contending that it is not in accordance with tradition.

The government has taken up the matter and is now drafting a bill to be introduced into parliament soon.

NOTED AMERICAN JEWS RETURN FROM ABROAD

James Marshall, son of Louis Marshall, the noted American Jewish leader, returned on the Majestic yesterday from an extended trip in Europe where he studied the Jewish situation. Mr. Marshall also visited Palestine where he acquainted himself with the reconstruction work. Mr. Louis Marshall met his son at the pier.

A number of other noted American Jews were among the returning passengers of the Majestic. Among these were: Samuel C. Lampert, well known merchant and communal leader, who was accompanied by Mrs. Lampert; Morris Miller, Philadelphia attorney; Joseph J. Bach, vice-president of the Public National Bank; Jacob Landau, director of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency and the "Jewish Daily Bulletin"; D. S. Gottesman, chairman of the Board of Directors of the Central National Bank; Morris J. Speiser, former District Attorney of Philadelphia; Rabbi Ruben Meyer, who came as delegate from the Mizrachi World Organization; and Adolph Zucker, head of the Famous Players Lasky Corporation.

Union, in session here, adopted a resolution renouncing the claim of the Jewish population in the Republic of Austria to the provisions of the international peace treaties concerning the rights of national minorities. The resolution states that the demand of the Jewish population in the Republic of Austria is only for equal rights in accordance with the provisions of the Austrian constitution.

The convention simultaneously established the fact, in a resolution adopted, that anti-Semitism is the reigning policy in the Austrian colleges and universities. During the last few years the admission of Jews as assistant professors was stopped completely, as well as the admission of Jewish instructors. Jewish scientists were not given advancement, the resolution complains.

DR. WEIZMANN IN PARIS TO CONFER WITH HEADS OF JEWISH AGENCY COMMISSION

Paris, May 31.—Dr. Chaim Weizmann, president of the World Zionist Organization, arrived here yesterday.

During his stay here, Dr. Weizmann will confer with Felix M. Warburg, Sir Alfred Mond and Dr. Lee K. Frankel, the three commissioners heading the Jewish Agency Palestine Survey Commission.

POLISH JEWS ASK RELIEF FROM SUNDAY REST LAW

Warsaw, May 31.—Demands that the government grant immediate relief to Jewish merchants and artisans from the compulsory Sunday rest law are being voiced in a series of mass meetings which are being held in many cities throughout the Republic.

The meetings are called by the Jewish artisans and small traders organizations. Resolutions adopted at the mass meetings urging modification of the Sunday closing law were telegraphed to Vice-Premier Bartel.

SENTENCE ANTI-SEMITIC POET FOR BLASPHEMY

Berlin, May 31.—M. Majewski, the official poet of the Hiltentes, was sentenced to three months imprisonment on the charge of blasphemy.

The suit was brought by the Central Verein Deutschen Buerger des Juedischen Glaubens. Majewski wrote a hymn entitled, "Satan Jahwe."

AUSTRIAN JEWS PROTEST AGAINST ANTI-JEWISH PER- SECUTIONS IN ROUMANIA

Anglo-Jewish Body Publishes Verified
Facts on Rumanian Jewish Situation

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Vienna, May 31.—The protest of
Austrian Jewry against the anti-Jewish
persecutions in Roumania was voiced
at a huge mass meeting held at Olympic
Hall Sunday night.

In eloquent addresses Chief Rabbi
Zevi Chajes and Mr. Ornstein charged
the Roumanian government with direct
responsibility for the anti-Jewish ex-
cesses. The speakers described a num-
ber of gruesome attacks on Jewish in-
dividuals and groups, which were ver-
ified and cannot be denied in any way.

In a resolution adopted by the mass
meeting which was called by a joint
Austrian Jewish committee, embracing
all sections of the Jewish population,
Austrian Jewry went on record as join-
ing the protests of British and Ameri-
can Jewry against the anti-Jewish
excesses. The resolution appeals to the
conscience of the civilized world and
urges intervention in behalf of Rouma-
nian Jews. The resolution further
states that Roumanian Jews have been
all too patient during a full year, negoti-
ating with their government to no
avail. Roumanian Jews must be given
equal rights and protection with other
citizens.

"Prime Minister Averescu will not
be in a position to maintain that our
protest committee is composed of Bol-
sheviki," Dr. Chajes declared.

Prior to the holding of the meeting,
the Roumanian Ambassador here at-
tempted, through the intervention of a
prominent Jewish attorney, to call the
joint protest committee for a confer-
ence with him, apparently with the in-
tention of counteracting the effect of
the protest meeting. The committee ac-
cepted the invitation with the under-
standing, however, that it would take
place after the mass meeting was held.

MACCABEES OF PALESTINE ARE GREETED BY MAYOR WALKER OF NEW YORK

All-Jewish Team Gets Big Ovation at
City Hall

The Maccabees of Palestine, all-
Jewish star soccer aggregation, which
arrived in this country on the Acqui-
tania last Friday, was officially wel-
comed to the United States yesterday
at noon by Mayor Walker of New
York.

The Maccabee delegation is com-
posed of nineteen men, seventeen of
whom are players. The two officials
are Dr. Chaim Weisberg and Shlomo
Pelley, respectively president and vice-
president of the Maccabee organiza-
tion.

At the reception accorded the Jew-
ish players at City Hall Dr. Weisberg
delivered to Mayor Walker a letter
from the Mayor of Jerusalem intro-
ducing the players. Dr. Weisberg
thanked the mayor for the generous
interest which Americans, Jews and
non-Jews, have taken in the extended
tour of his organization, and also
thanked Mr. Walker for his repeated
endorsement of Palestine reconstruc-
tion work as carried on by the Zionist
organization. Dr. Weisberg declared
that the youth of Palestine appreciates
what is being done for their country
by Americans.

AGUDAH STARTS NEGOTIA- TIONS FOR RECONCILIATION WITH ZIONIST BODIES

Jerusalem, May 30.—New steps to
bring about a reconciliation between the
Ultra-Orthodox Agudath Israel and the
Zionist Organization in Palestine are
under way.

The attempt at reconciliation was
started this time on the initiative of the
Agudah. Negotiations are now in
progress between this organization and
the Communal Council of Jerusalem
Jews, concerning the possibility of a
compromise between the two sections
with regard to the provisions of the
Palestine Communities Ordinance.

It was learned that a memorandum
on the subject was directed by the
Agudath Israel to the forthcoming ses-
sion of the Permanent Mandates Com-
mission of the League of Nations.

HEBREW TEACHERS ON STRIKE IN WARSAW

Birth Control Seen As New Danger to Jewish Race

That birth control constitutes a new
menace to the Jewish race, is the fea-
voiced by the Jewish press which com-
ments on the report that the Jewish
population in Germany has decreased
by 30 per cent, according to the 1925
census, which has just been published.

The decrease of German Jewry is
not so alarming as appears at first
glance, in the opinion of Jacob Fish-
man, who writes in the "Jewish Morn-
ing Journal" of yesterday. But it is an
indication of a real danger to Jewry
everywhere and Mr. Fishman says we
need "a Roosevelt to lift up his voice
against race suicide among the Jews."

"Figures which we have at hand," he
writes, "show that in the census of 1922
there were only 615,000 Jews in Ger-
many. Perhaps there was another cen-
sus taken between 1922 and 1925. But if
the later census showed 800,000 Jews it
could not have been due to natural in-
crease by birth, but resulted from the
influx of Jewish immigrants from
Eastern Europe who were attracted by
the then prevailing low currency in
Germany.

"This it seems to us, is the true ex-
planation of the decrease, although we
do not mean to deny the importance of
the two other factors; intermarriage
and decrease in births among the Jews.
It is well known that just as Germany
witnessed in the first years an unnat-
ural influx of Jews, there was also an
exodus of thousands when the currency
was stabilized. As regards intermar-
riage that is an old trouble in Germany
and it is to be regretted of course, that
it is becoming more and more aggra-
vated.

"The new phenomenon here is the in-
trusion of birth control among the Jew-
ish masses. In this respect Germany is
not alone. Statistics which have been
published recently regarding the Jews
in Soviet Russia indicate the same de-
velopment. The number of births among
the Russian Jews is now smaller rela-
tively than the number of births
among the non-Jews. In this way an
old Jewish tradition of centuries has
been broken.

"That this really constitutes a danger
for Jews as a race is unquestionable.
We now need a Roosevelt to raise his
voice against the spread of race suicide
among the Jews."

The "Jewish Daily News", in a
lengthy editorial, has this to say:

"The case of the Jews in Germany
is particularly important because what
is happening in that country may soon-
er or later take place in other large
civilized countries where Jews are un-
der the influence of great cultures. The
question of birth control is becoming
increasingly important along with the
intermarriage question in the countries
of Western Europe and even in Amer-

AMERICAN SYSTEM URGED FOR JEWISH EDUCATION AT CONFERENCE IN ATLANTIC CITY

\$9,000,000 Spent Last Year for Jewish Training; Dr. Samson Benderly Advocates New Methods

Atlantic City, N. J., May 31.—New buildings either begun or completed in the course of the past twelve months in the larger Jewish communities of America represent an outlay of upwards of \$2,000,000. More than \$7,000,000 were spent by the Jewish Communities of America for the purpose of carrying out their educational programs. New York, Chicago, Philadelphia, Cleveland and other cities where the communities are organized there is an awakened interest in the problem of Jewish education.

These were some of the outstanding facts brought out at the opening session of the National Council for Jewish Education held Sunday night at the Jewish Community Centre of Atlantic City. Several hundred educators as well as laymen interested in the problem of Jewish education are present. The sessions are being held at the Ritz Carlton Hotel.

In his review of the progress of Jewish education during the past year, Dr. Leo Homer, president of the council, pointed to the growing sense of community responsibility that has manifested itself throughout the country with regard to the problem of Jewish Education.

Mr. Ben Rosen, educational director of the Associated Talmud Torahs of Philadelphia, was the presiding officer at the opening session.

Defining the scope of the National Council for Jewish Education Mr. Rosen said: "The National Council for Jewish Education was organized last year in Cleveland. Its purpose was to bring about an exchange of opinion and experiences among those in executive and supervisory positions in the field of Jewish education in the various communities.

Figures gathered by Jewish educators place the number of Jewish children in this country of school age at 800,000. Of these only 30 per cent are receiving Jewish education. The Jews of America are spending approximately \$4,000,000 a year for Jewish education.

A plea for a more American system of Jewish education was made by Dr.

ica. The more Jews enter into the better planes of economic progress on the one hand, and the more they attend educational institutions on the other, the smaller Jewish families become, parallel with a similar decrease among the non-Jews."

The London "Jewish World" of May 19, commenting on the same subject before the full report of the census figures had been published, observed:

"The return shows a notable decrease, either actually or relatively, of Jews among the population. Thus in Hamburg, while there had been a slight increase over the previous census of

Samson Benderly, director of the Bureau of Jewish Education in New York.

It is the task of the Jewish educator to provide a program of religious education for the Jewish youth of America that shall be in the fullest harmony with the American conditions and environment, Dr. Benderly said.

"With the stoppage of Jewish immigration into the United States," he said, "Jewish education must meet the new situation. It will not be possible in the future to make use of the same schedule of attendance as we did in the past. American Jewish children cannot be expected to attend Hebrew schools until 8 P. M., nor can they be expected to come five times a week. Furthermore, most of the text books that have been used by the more progressive schools during the last decade and which are based on Jewish life in vogue in Eastern Europe will have to be replaced by books that will reckon more with the changed condition of Jewish life in America. Similarly, Jewish education must face the issue of an American Jewish teaching personnel. We hardly have enough good teachers to meet the needs of the twenty-five per cent of children of school age who attend our schools at present. Where will we get teachers for the vast army that is un schooled?"

"Because of the complexity of the problem of the adjustment of Jewish life to the American environment, we must have teachers who are fired with great zeal and who are very hopeful about the possibilities of American Jewish education. Mere job holders will not suffice. Similarly, the new situation demands greater communal responsibility for Jewish education. Jewish education cannot be left to the haphazard doings of this or that individual. It will be necessary not only to arouse the leadership of American Jewry to the great danger which hovers over the perpetuation of Judaism in America because of the great majority of Jewish children who do not receive any Jewish education whatsoever, but also we must center their attention on the great difficulties that confront us in the work which is being done with the children who do attend Jewish schools. In short, the next decade will constitute a very critical period in Jewish education. The solution of the question confronting American Jewry of to be or not to be will greatly depend upon the seriousness and the comprehensiveness with which we will approach this problem of all problems confronting us in this country."

Tobey Meyer, formerly of Rochester, died Friday at Hotel Breton Hall in New York in his eighty-first year. Mr. Meyer lived in Rochester, N. Y. for sixty years and was a pioneer in the clothing manufacturing industry.

Mr. Meyer was for many years a director of the Jewish Consumptive Relief Society of Denver.

ZIONISTS PROCLAIM JUNE "REDEMPTION MONTH" FOR CASH ON U. P. A. PLEDGES

June was proclaimed "Redemption Month" for pledges to the United Palestine Appeal in an announcement issued from the headquarters of the Appeal in New York. This call is expected by the officers of the Appeal to bring in \$1,000,000 in cash. The funds, it was announced, will be transmitted to Palestine to be used to provide employment for workers affected by the situation in the country.

"The situation in Palestine is serious but far from critical. Dr. Stephen S. Wise, honorary chairman of the Appeal, stated in giving the reasons for Redemption Month: "In fact, as was recently reported by the head of the Palestine Zionist Executive, Col. Frederick H. Kisch, the peak of the economic difficulties has been passed and it is now a question of bringing conditions back to normal as speedily as possible. The agricultural settlements that the Jews have established in Palestine in line with their program of rebuilding the Jewish National Home under the British Mandate, have proved themselves thoroughly sound in their ability to withstand periods of general economic disturbance. The unemployment that resulted has been confined to the towns and a good many of the workers found employment by being transferred to the farm settlements.

"Our aim is to provide employment to all and to permit immigration to be resumed at the normal rate by promoting a series of constructive enterprises in different parts of the country. The tens of thousands of American Jews who are interested in the realization of Israel's hope of national restoration and have made their subscriptions to the United Palestine Appeal, are well aware that the country must have their assistance in the early stages of development. They realize that they are the chief source of the means necessary for making that hope a reality. The work of raising the necessary funds this year has been successful. Owing to the economic depression in Palestine, however, we are faced with greater obligations. We are faced above all with the need of financing the new operations without delay. We have instituted Redemption Month in order that the thousands of subscribers may redeem their pledges without delay."

The share in the \$1,000,000 expected from New York City during Redemption Month is \$200,000.

NATHAN STRAUS RESTING WELL, PHYSICIANS REPORT

Nathan Straus, who is in Mount Sinai Hospital suffering from acute appendicitis, is resting well, the "Jewish Daily Bulletin" learned from the hospital yesterday afternoon.

Dr. Albert A. Berg, who is in constant attendance on Mr. Straus, said his patient's condition remained unchanged. Following a consultation with Dr. Leo Stieglitz, the Straus family physician, Dr. Berg said they have been trying to avoid an operation but that it seemed inevitable in the next two or three days.

**DR. HENRY KELLER HEADS
JEWISH SCHOLARS ACADEMY**

Dr. Henry Keller, New York University, was elected president of the Jewish Academy of Arts and Sciences at the sessions held at the Hotel Manhattan Square.

Chancellor Elmer E. Brown of New York University, in an address before the Academy, said tremendous contributions were being made by Jews to the arts and sciences.

He said he was "glad to extend the best wishes and greetings of one institution of learning to another." He declared the Jewish Academy of Arts and Sciences will help not only Jewish scholars, but non-Jewish scholars as well.

Papers were read by Professor David I. Macht of Baltimore, Professor Isaac Husik and Dr. I. Klotz of New York.

Besides the president the following officers were elected: First Vice-President, Professor Nathan Isaacs, Harvard University; Second Vice-President, Professor Moses Hyamson, Jewish Theological Seminary; Treasurer, Dr. Wolf Freudenthal, Montefiore Hospital; Executive Secretary, Dr. Shelley R. Safir, City College of New York; Recording Secretary and Counsel, I. Herman Sher.

Directors included the officers and Professor Richard Gottheil, Dr. Julian Morgenstern, Dr. Bernard Revel, and Dr. Nathaniel Reich.

**HAKOAH ALL-JEWISH
SOCCER SCORES VICTORIES**

Philadelphia, May 31.—The Hakoah soccer team of Vienna defeated the Philadelphia All-Stars, 7 to 1, at Franklin Field before more than 10,000 spectators Monday afternoon.

Gruenwald, star center forward borrowed from the New York Giants, was the star for the Jewish eleven, tallying three times on hard boots. The Hakoah outplayed the local national leaguers in all departments of the game and were leading, 3 to 0, at the half.

The Hakoah played before 10,000 persons at the Polo Grounds Saturday afternoon and defeated the Indiana Flooring team, 2 to 1.

Honors were even in the first half, at the end of which the score was 1 to 1. Hakoah got off to a good start five minutes after the ball was put in play. Near the close of the period the New Yorkers came up even. The decisive goal went to the credit of the Hakoah eleven after twelve minutes of play in the second half.

The scoring honors went to Gruenwald, Hakoah's inside left. Nicholsberger, was kept at bay by the Indiana defense. The single tally credited to the losers was netted by Purvis, who occupied the same position as Gruenwald on the opposing side. Indiana did a lot of attacking, getting thirteen corners and Hakoah three.

Captain Miller of Indiana Flooring kicked off at 3:52 o'clock and after five minutes of play Gruenwald shot the first goal for Hakoah off Fischer's pass.

A night soccer game will be played in the United States for the first time on June 8th. The game at the Polo grounds will be between the Hakoah team and Bethlehem, American Soccer League champions. It will mark the final match of Hakoah in this country.

In Bavaria, while there was a marked decrease of Jews, the non-Jewish inhabitants increased by 7.1 per cent. And the same story runs throughout. Of course, as it stands, the return is partial only and Berlin and Prussia, while they may confirm and even accentuate the general trend, may, on the other hand redress the balance. For ascertaining which the figures will do, we must wait and see. When we do, and there appears to be an actual or relative decrease in the Jewish population in general, it will be interesting to enquire what has caused it."

**INDEPENDENT WORKMEN'S
CIRCLE OPENS CONVENTION**

(Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Philadelphia, May 30.—The nineteenth convention of the Independent Workmen's Circle opened here Sunday night at the Benjamin Franklin Hotel. One hundred and nine delegates, representing 75 branches, are present.

Morris Horowitz, national chairman, in his opening address, urged the delegates to avert a split of the order on the ground of different political opinions of the members and asked them not to destroy the independent and impartial spirit of the order.

Negotiations between the Independent Workmen's Circle and the New York Workmen's Circle for an amalgamation of the two orders have not yet led to results, Mr. Horowitz reported at the second session of the convention.

The president also reported that a committee of the Order, having rendered a favorable report after an investigation of the complaints by Jacob Marinoff against the Hias, the order had contributed \$3,500 to the Hias campaign.

Fourteen new branches with 1,000 new members were added to the order during the past two years, bringing the total membership to 7,000.

**WEDGWOOD ASKS FOR
HOUSING AID IN TEL AVIV**

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

London, May 31.—The question whether the Palestine Government is prepared to help the municipality of Tel Aviv with part of the cost for a housing plan in the northern part of the city was raised by Col. Josiah Wedgwood in the House of Commons today.

The Colonial Secretary, Col. Amery, replied that the Palestine government had recently given financial assistance to Tel Aviv. Further assistance is under consideration, but he could not say what form it would take.
