READING'S ATTEMPT TO AID RELIGIOUS AND POLITICAL REFUGEES IS DEFEATED

House of Lords Rejects His Amend-
ment; Desborough Supports
Influx Restrictions

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

London, July 21.—The government bill declaring the restrictions on immigration to the United Kingdom permanent, was passed by the House of Lords on the third reading of the bill.

The amendment introduced by Lord Reading which calls for keeping the gates of the United Kingdom open to religious and political refugees, was rejected by a majority of 46 against 19. Bishop Southworth defended Lord Reading's amendment. The bill will now be taken into the House of Commons, where a bitter fight is expected.

During a discussion of Lord Reading's amendment, the government spokesman, Lord Desborough, stated that under the present conditions of unemployment the government cannot admit persons who are religiously persecuted. The government would admit one or two distinguished Armenians, but not thousands. Nor would it admit thousands of Russian Christians who are being persecuted. The Russian Jews are most estimable people and we have tried our best for them in Palestine. However, they might prefer this country, with its free education, hospitals and a dole system for unemployed, to Palestine, where they are already meeting difficulties," he stated.

JEWISH DOCUMENTS LOST WHEN ARCHIVE IS BURNED IN RECENT VIENNA RIOT

Vienna, July 21.—Many valuable documents bearing on the history of the Jewish communities in Galicia and Bukovina since 1772 and concerning the Jewish communities in Moravia, Bohemia and Silesia since 1550 were destroyed in the Austrian State archives which were burned during the riots of last week, it became known today.

JEWIS' PILGRIMAGE TO TEMPLE WALL STOPPED BECAUSE OF EARTHQUAKE

Arabs Ordered to Fast Three Days
and Repent

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Jerusalem, July 21.—The continuous prayers offered by pious Jews at the western wall of the Temple, commonly known as the Wailing Wall, were interrupted for the first time in many centuries as a result of the Palestine earthquake.

The pilgrimage of pious Jews to the Wall was stopped due to the fact that the city authorities declared the houses in the narrow streets leading to the Wall as unsafe.

The effects of the earthquake upon the Arab population in Palestine and Transjordan called forth a deeply religious mood. Emir Abdullah, ruler of Transjordan, decreed a fast of three days. The population was urged by the Emir to devote these three days to prayer and repentance. Any Arabs, subjects of the Emir, who will be found eating during these three fast days will be liable to six months' imprisonment.

The headquarters of the Palestine Government will be transferred, owing to the damage done to the Government House on Mount Olives, to St. John's Hospice on Bethlehem Road, Jerusalem, it was announced today.

DEAD SEA CONCESSION TO BE GRANTED SOON. WASHINGTON HEARS Earthquake May Have Affected Sea Level

(Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Washington, July 21.—The franchise for exploiting the mineral deposits of the Dead Sea will shortly be awarded by the British government, according to a report published in the Washington "Post," which states that the task of awarding the franchise has occupied the authorities of London and Jerusalem for some months. In this connection the report also declared that the full details of the Palestine earthquake are awaited with great interest in commercial as well as scientific quarters because it is believed that the upheaval may have affected to some extent the level of the Dead Sea.

The value of the enormous chemical deposits which are known to be contained within the Dead Sea, at current quotations, is stated to be \$1,267,620,000,000.

It is expected that work will shortly be authorized and that the development will not only add millions of dollars to the treasury of Palestine and afford employment for thousands, but will serve to furnish potash to the entire world at prices far below those exacted by the German and French

TAMARISK CONSIDERED CLUE TO DETERMINE SUB- STANCE OF BIBLICAL MANNA

Hebrew University Scientists Investi-
gate Phenomena of Sinai
Peninsula

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Jerusalem, July 21.—The tamarisk, an evergreen shrub of the Mediterranean region, frequently mentioned in the Hebrew Bible under the name of Eshel, may offer a clue to establishing the substance and character of the manna which served, according to the Bible records, as food for the Israelites in their forty years' wandering in the desert.

It was learned here today that the investigation of the tamarisk will occupy the attention of a group of scientists who left for the Sinai Peninsula to carry on, in behalf of the Hebrew University in Jerusalem, an investigation into the origin and substance of the manna.

The scientific expedition consists of Dr. F. Bodenheimer, director of the ethnological department of the experimental station in Tel Aviv, Dr. Carmin and Dr. Theodore, Associate Professor in the Microbiological Department of the Hebrew University.

The attention of scientific observers in Palestine was drawn to the tamarisk tree which produces during the months of June and August a substance resembling that contained in the manna. Ancient Hebrew and Arabic legend has it that the substance of the tamarisk contains ingredients capable of producing the taste of many kinds of fruits. The tamarisk is frequently found in several valleys of the Mid-Sinai. There are, however, years in which the unexplainable substance is not produced by the tamarisk, particularly in meagre years.

The expedition of the Hebrew University, which will spend about a month on the Sinai Peninsula, will concentrate on an investigation of this tree.

OPPOSITION ZIONIST
OFFICIALS RESIGN
POSTS IN U. P. A.

The National Headquarters of the United Palestine Appeal announces the resignation of Israel Goldberg, Director of the Department of Public Information (Publicity Department), Morris A. Zeldin, Campaign Director of Greater New York, and Harry J. Kahn, Director of Boro Park. These resignations have been tendered at the beginning of the month and have been accepted with regret by the Executive Committee of the United Palestine Appeal, to go into effect August 1st.

Mr. Goldberg, Mr. Zeldin, Mr. Kahn and Dr. Abramowitz were the leaders of the oppositional group which severely criticized the Zionist administration at the last annual convention of the Zionist Organization of America. It was stated that their resignation was the result of this oppositional activity.

Meyer Goodfriend, for thirty-six years a member of the firm of Goodfriend Brothers, dealers in pearls and precious stones, died. He was sixty-six years old.

Mr. Goodfriend was born in New York and in 1880 was graduated from the College of the City of New York. He was Honorary President of Temple Agudas Chessed, having resigned the active Presidency three months ago after holding the office for twenty years. It was under his direction that the plans were made for the erection of the new temple at 117th Street and West End Avenue. As the new building is not yet completed, the services for Mr. Goodfriend were held in Temple Israel, West Ninety-first Street.

Mr. Goodfriend was one of the founders of the United Synagogue and was its first President and was one of the early supporters of the Zionist movement. He made more than sixty trips to Europe and was a member of the Chamber of Commerce and American Club in Paris. He was greatly interested in the arts and owned a valuable collection of pictures.

BUREAU OF JEWISH SOCIAL
RESEARCH IS ORGANIZED
AS PERMANENT AGENCY
Makes Extensive Study of Educational
and Social Problems Affecting
Jewish Population

Justice Alfred H. Towney, of the Supreme Court, yesterday signed a certificate of incorporation for the Bureau of Jewish Social Research, a national agency organized in 1919 on an experimental basis by leading Jews throughout the country and now established permanently upon the recommendation of the executive committee, of which David M. Heyman is chairman.

Adolph Lewisohn, chairman of the Bureau; David M. Heyman, Dr. Harry G. Friedman, vice chairman of the executive committee; I. Edwin Goldwasser, of the executive committee and Felix M. Warburg, of the board of trustees, are listed as the incorporators. The incorporation was decided upon to register the decision to continue the work on a permanent basis and to provide opportunity for the Bureau to receive permanent funds, which can more readily be given to an incorporated organization. The organization has been financed to an extent of more than 60 per cent of its budget by fees paid for its services by communal groups requesting surveys.

The major project being promoted by the Bureau at the present time is a two-year study of the Jewish communal needs of Greater New York, with fifty social workers under the leadership of Samuel A. Goldsmith, director of the Bureau, and Hyman Kaplan, associate director, doing the field work, upon the recommendation of a citizens' committee of which Judge Otto A. Kosloski is chairman, with Dr. Lee K. Frankel as chairman of the executive committee. The workers are making an intensive study to determine the Jewish population and to analyze the situation in such fields as child care, family welfare, health and hospital work.

Major studies have been made in various fields of welfare work by the Bureau in scores of communities. Among the results of the Bureau's work has been the establishment of a bureau which collects and endeavors to verify facts and statements of events affecting Jews throughout the world. In New York it has encouraged child care agencies to give up extensive building operations and to extend the work of the boarding-out departments for children in individual homes. It also has introduced improved methods of work in the Jewish Board of Guardians, which deals with delinquents of both sexes, in Los Angeles, a new hospital, a new orphan asylum and a new community center and the results of the Bureau's recommendations.

In Cleveland a Jewish Board of Education was organized to handle the entire problem of cultural and language instruction of Jewish children and the Jewish youth. In Detroit changes in methods and plans of the organizations in the Jewish community were worked out along the lines laid down in a survey. In Newark, New Jersey, plans were made for a Conference of Jewish

HILLEL FOUNDATIONS
TO BE ESTABLISHED
IN GREAT BRITAIN
(Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Cincinnati, July 21.—Inspired by the success of the Hillel Foundation in strengthening the ties of Judaism among students at American universities the first B'nai B'rith Lodge of England is developing a program for similar work among Jewish students at British universities, an announcement of the headquarters of the Independent Order B'nai B'rith states. The addresses delivered by International President Alfred M. Cohen, during his recent visit to London, gave the British members of the Order a definite understanding of the Hillel Foundations in this country and stimulated them to immediate action.

A special committee appointed by the first lodge of England to draft a scheme of cooperation with university students brought in a series of recommendations all of which were unanimously adopted.

Among these recommendations are the following:

Admission of students as members of the lodge at a small fee; contributions toward the establishment of B'nai B'rith Hebrew study circles; presentation of Jewish books to a students' library, arrangements for lectures, and the offer of prizes of \$50 and \$100 for essays on some vital Jewish topic.

This was followed on June 30 by an "Open Evening" for Jewish students, under the auspices of the first lodge of England. The program was in the nature of a symposium on "Jewish University Students and the Community," and addresses were delivered by representatives of the Jewish students at the various universities.

Charities, later included in a Community Chest. The bureau also has made extensive studies of Jewish philanthropic programs of various Jewish Federations throughout the country and includes a department of information and statistics, which publishes a monthly summary of events of Jewish interest and contributes to the American Jewish Year Book the annual survey.

An announcement issued yesterday by the bureau, following the incorporation, shows that the organization made 115 major investigations last year in response to requests from organizations and individuals. The investigations dealt with philanthropic and educational efforts of Jewish groups throughout the world. HEBREW UNIVERSITY LIBRARY GETS BERTHOLD AUERBACH LETTERS

Jerusalem, July 21.—The collection of autographs of prominent Jews which was donated by Dr. Abraham Shwadron to the Jewish National and University Library some months ago, was enriched by the gift of Mr. Emile Honigman, the son of the novelist David Honigman, of a collection of letters written by Berthold Auerbach. David Honigman was a well-known author in his day, and his books the Grave of Sahionetta and Berl Grenadier, were very popular. David Honigman was a dear friend of Berthold Auerbach, and the letters now presented to the Jerusalem Library are documents of this close friendship of two prominent German Jewish writers.

Mr. Joshua Gordon has donated to the Library a collection of many valuable and rare Yiddish books and newspapers, including the newspaper Der Yiddische Congress, which was published by Pincas Rutenberg in New York in 1915, and which is now very rare.

Mr. Nathan H. Kaplan has donated to the Jewish National and University Library a number of important manuscripts which were transmitted to the Library through Prof. Boris Schatz of Jerusalem. Among the items included is the Tarsishin of Rabbi Moshe ben Ezra, a copy made by the well-known scholar Solomon Frensdorff. Several stanzas missing in the printed text are to be found in this copy, which has also a commentary on the margin.

JEWISH POPULATION IN UKRAINE NUMBERS 1,750,000

Riga, July 6.—In the course of a report on the minorities in the Ukraine, submitted to the Praesidium of the Minorities Council, it is stated that the Jewish population in the Ukraine, according to the latest figures, is 1,750,000 souls. There are sixty-nine Jewish Soviets in the Ukraine. Educationally the Jews occupy first place, with only 349 illiterates to every thousand of the Jewish population.

One hundred and twenty-eight thousand desiatin of land have been allocated so far for Jewish land settlement in the Ukraine. The land is worked by over 8,000 Jewish agricultural societies. These have received States aid to the amount of two and one-half million roubles and a further sum of four and one half million roubles has been provided by the Jewish Colonization Society (Ozet). Two hundred and forty of the Jewish farms are model collectives. Seventy-five per cent of the remainder are worked without hired labor.

Aaron Sapiro denied the report circulated to the effect that he received a sum of \$10,000 from Henry Ford. He stated that he did receive an ample check from Mr. Ford, to cover part of the cost and the attorney's fees of his suit.

FRENCH JEWS OPPOSE ZURICH CONFERENCE ON JEWISH RIGHTS, SAYS BERL

Paris, July 6.—The French Jews are not generally in favor of the idea which moved the Committee of Jewish Delegations and the American Jewish Congress to convoke an International Jewish Conference for the Defense of Jewish Rights. Alfred Berl, the editor of "Paix et Droit," the organ of the Alliance Israelite Universelle, said in the course of a statement of the J. T. A. here today:

According to the idea of these two organizations, Mr. Berl said, this Conference is to draw up a scheme for an International Jewish Bureau, which would be charged with the co-ordination of the activity of the big Jewish organizations, such as the Alliance Israelite Universelle in France, the Joint Foreign Committee in England, the Hilfsverein der Deutschen Juden in Germany, etc., which have been working in this sphere till now. So far as the French Jews are concerned, such an organization would be contrary to our conception of the rights and duties of the Jews in their respective fatherlands. We hold that all Jews are united by the religious tie, but not by nationality.

"That is so far as the principle of the thing goes. But the scheme also seems to hold out few practical advantages and many dangers. Ten years experience of the work of the Jewish organizations I have mentioned, has proved to us that each organization ought to act in accordance with the interests of its own country. Whatever is done on these lines will be more effectual than the activity of a Jewish International. The Alliance Israelite Universelle, for instance, has frequently succeeded, with the aid of the French Government, in solving difficulties in the countries in which our co-religionists are oppressed, as in former Russia and in the post-war period in Poland, Roumania, etc., in regard to the question of the Numerus Clausus, for example.

"The work of the other organizations, like the Joint Foreign Committee, has proved the same point.

"The discreet diplomatic action of these Jewish organizations seems to us preferable to the noisy discussions at the meetings of a Congress setting itself up as a Parliament.

"Besides, the Jews of each country have their own interests to defend. By taking part in such a conference and becoming absorbed in an international organization, they run the risk of compromising themselves with their Government.

"The idea of co-ordination 'oo, which is put forward by the Committee of Jewish Delegations, does not mean anything really new. The big Jewish organizations never undertake anything without a preliminary agreement among themselves. Their interventions are not therefore chaotic, as is asserted; they are paralleled and therefore much more efficacious.

"There is also the point that the proposed organization would have pretensions at playing the part of a large in-

FORD'S RETRACTION PRAISED BY SAPIRO

(Chicago, July 21.—Henry Ford "did the square and manly thing" in making public his apology for articles in his "Dearborn Independent" reflecting on the Jews and "meant every word of it," Aaron Sapiro, who recently settled his \$1,000,000 suit for libel against Mr. Ford, declared in a radio address over station WEDC last night.

Mr. Sapiro added, however, that his score against United States Senator James A. Reed, Mr. Ford's chief defense counsel, is not yet settled.

"I still wonder," he said, "if a member of the Senate has a moral right to take money in the defense of religious bigotry. As a Senator Mr. Reed is being paid by Mr. Ford, myself and people of all religious denominations.

"During the course of the trial Mr. Reed continually availed himself of the opportunity to cast slurs at myself and other Jews. He was continually and purposely mispronouncing my name, and he was always commenting that there was no religious difference in the case."

"Since he was a successful business man," Mr. Sapiro said, referring to Mr. Ford, "many people looked on Mr. Ford's opinions on the Jews as expressing the accumulation of one billion dollars' worth of wisdom. I am glad that in a small way I was able to secure from Mr. Ford a retraction that was felt even more forcibly than the original criticisms.

"Ford did the square and manly thing and I believe he meant every word of the public apology. He is now doing his utmost to wipe out the harm he caused to the Jewish people."

CHICAGO JEW GIVES \$15,000 TO JEWISH NATIONAL FUND

Chicago, July 21.—An interesting bequest has been brought to the attention of the Zionist Organization of Chicago by Joseph H. Platt, local attorney. Mr. Platt is attorney for the estate of the late Harry Miller, a Chicago tailor, who died in May at the age of 52. In his will the deceased directs that the bulk of his estate, exceeding \$15,000, be disposed of and the proceeds turned over to the Jewish National Fund.

A further provision is that the funds be used for the erection of a model dwelling in Palestine for use by the needy, at a nominal rental which shall not exceed a 3% return on the capital. The only personal bequest in this will is that of \$500, to a sister in Bialystock.

syndicates, which today control the product, including that of Poland, Russia and Spain, states the report, and adds:

"The problem to be solved, which is of so much interest to Americans, is, how far below the present prices shall the price of the Palestinian products be fixed to meet the demands of agriculture throughout the world?"

"During the centuries of Turkish control all efforts to persuade the Sultan to permit the deposits to be exploited were without result. But since Great Britain took the mandate for Palestine careful estimates of the possibilities for recovery of the salts have been made by some of the foremost experts of the world. These experts have reported that the potential tonnage to be obtained amounts to 1,300,000,000 tons of potash, 853,000,000 tons of bromin and enormous supplies of salt, gypsum, and calcium chloride."

The British Colonial Office, acting with the Palestine administration, has the power to grant concessions, and tenders have been invited for the recovery of the salts.
