THREE AUTONOMOUS JEWISH REGIONS TO BE ESTABLISHED IN UKRAINE

Ozet to Facilitate Visits of Representatives from Abroad (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Moscow, July 26.-The establishment of three Jewish autonomous regions is part of the program of the Depart-ment of National Minorities, for the year 1928. The regions will be established in the districts of Krivoyrog, Zaperoje and Mariupol, where Jewish colonization efforts are concentrated. The Executive Board of the Ozet,

the Society for the Establishment of Tews on Land, has decided to facilitate the visits of representatives of organizations and other individuals from abroad, who are anxious to inspect the Jewish colonies. Numerous applications for this purpose have been received by the Ozet.

ANTI-SEMITE PAPER WANTS METRO-GOLDWYN REPRE-SENTATIVE BE DEPORTED (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Berlin, July 26.-The deportation of the representative of the Metro-Goldwyn Films in Germany is demanded in the last issue of "Der Hammer."

Ernst Lubitsch, who, according to the paper, came to Germany in order to produce the well-known play "Old Heidelberg" by Meyer-Foerster at an expense of four and a half million marks did not acquire for the company the rights of production from the au-

The anti-Semitic periodical accuses the company of having in the past produced anti-German films and asks that it be prevented from carrying out other productions in Germany.

TWO HUNDRED NEWSPAPERS

WILL BE REPRESENTED AT TRIAL OF SCHWARTZBARD (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Paris, July 26.—M. Flory has been appointed president of the Schwartz-bard trial, while M. Reignaud will act

as public prosecutor. The trial will open on October 18th.

More than 100 witnesses will be called by both sides. Schwartzbard's lawyer, M. Torres, expects the trial to last eight days.

Great interest in the trial has been manifested. Over 200 newspapers, from every part of the world, have requested that seats be reserved for their correspondents.

EARTHOUAKE SHOCK CAUSES PANIC JAFFA AND HEBRON

One Hundred Seventy-five Houses in Jerusalem Affected by Shock

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Jerusalem, July 26 .- The new earth-

quake shock, reported yesterday to have been felt slightly in Jerusalem. Jericho and Bethlehem, was also felt in the cities of Jaffa and Hebron, where it caused a panic among the population, the correspondent of the Iewish Telegraphic Agency learns. The shocks, which have, since July

11th, been following in rapid succession, have created considerable uneasiness among the people. The newspapers are trying to calm the population asserting that yesterday's shock was a natural vibration following in the wake of the first shock.

Arab newspapers are giving expression to their satisfaction at the various actions for relief which have been undertaken by the Zionists in Europe and in the United States. "While our own appeals to organizations and individuals have remained unanswered, the Jews are coming to our rescue," one paper says, pointing to the gift of \$25,000 which has been cabled by the New York Jewish philanthropist, Nathan Straus.

An official inspection by the municipality of Jerusalem shows that 175 houses have been seriously affected by the shock of July 11th.

The enzyklika will be issued by the Pope as soon as the movement of the Society has gained force.

The Society "Friends of Israel" (Amici d'Israeli), was founded in Rome for the purpose of developing within the Catholic world a friendly attitude towards the Jews, and to arouse the sympathies of the Jewish people. A number of prominent Catholic prelates, among them Mon-signors Pisani and Cariador, have joined the society, which is regarded with favor by several influential cardinals. The initiative for the forma-tion of the society was taken by its General Secretary, Mgr. Dr. Van As-seldonk, the head of the Dutch religious order.

KING FERDINAND MAKES BEQUEST TO JEWISH SCHOOLS IN LAST WILL

Bucharest, July 26 .- A bequest to Jewish schools is included in the last will of the deceased King Ferdinand. This action has deeply impressed the Jewish public. The Jewish newspapers, in their comments, praise the late King for his generosity.

At today's session of Parliament the representatives of the Jewish, German and Hungarian minorities solemnly declared their unconditional loyalty to young King Mihai.

"Our great protector died," says a manifesto issued by the Board of the Jewish Community of Bucharest. "He was the first," the manifesto continues, "who recognized the sacrifices on the battlefield made by the Jewish citizens. He was anxious to satisfy our strivings for equal rights. EMANUEL NEUMANN RESIGNS CHAIRMANSHIP OF U. P. A.

Emanuel Neumann, Executive Chairman of the United Palestine Appeal, resigned from his position, the "Jewish Daily Bulletin" learns. The resignation of Mr. Neumann from the United Palestine Appeal was

submitted at the last meeting of the Board of Directors of the Appeal, and was accepted with regret. The resignation followed Mr. Neumann's resignation from the Administrative Committee of the Zionist Organization of America in May, submitted prior to the holding of the annual Zionist convention in Atlantic City, where an oppositional group attacked the Lipsky administration and called forth wide discussion which led to the changes in the Zionist administration.

Mr. Neumann was one of the pioneer workers of the Keren Hayesod in the United States having joined this organization as its secretary when it was established in 1921, following the breach at the Cleveland Zionist convention. In the past two years Mr. Neumann occupied the leading position in the national administration of the Keren Havesod as a volunteer worker.

In accepting the resignation, the Executive Committee of the United Palestine Appeal passed a resolution expressing the appreciation of the Com-mittee for the services of Mr. Neu-

JEWISH RECORD OF JEWISH CANDIDATES MUST BE UN-OUESTIONABLE, PAPER SAYS

Denounces Candidates Who Are Jews at Election Time in Order to Obtain Votes

In the political circles of the Democratic as well as the Republican Party. a great deal of activity can be noticed in connection with the various appointments of judges in the elections which will take place in November, writes the "Day.

While there are as yet three months' before elections, a number of candidates have already organized their committees, who try to influence Judge Olvany and Samuel Koenig with regard to their choice of candidates for the Supreme Sessions and the Municipal courts. Although there is only one vacancy in the Supreme Court, the applicants are innumerable. Among those seeking the Supreme Court judgeship, over 100 are lewish candidates.

A well-known leader of the Democratic Party told a reporter of the "Day" that there is hardly a well-known lewish lawyer who does not consider himself a Jewish leader and entitled to an appointment. "In our own circle. he said, "we do not have to suffer from such applicants. We know where each man stands in political life, and we cannot be deceived. But as soon as the question of Jewish candidates arises. we are often seriously embarrassed. We do not know how to decide. Each one brings a list of signatures of rabbis and other jews and declares that he is a leader of Jewry. The most important candidates for

Supreme Court judgship are, according to the paper, Mr. Irwin Untermeyer, lo the paper, arr. Trwm Cinerineyer, Jonah J. JEWISH DAILY "FORWARD" PLACES WREATH ON GRAVE OF VIENNA RIOT VICTIMS (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Vienna, July 26 .- A wreath was de-

posited today on the grave of the victims of the recent riots which oc-curred in Vienna, by Jacob Lestchinsky, correspondent of the Jewish Daily "Forward" of New York, and well-known Jewish writer and statistician.

It is a well-known fact that of the three candidates which the Democratic Party nominated last year for the Supreme Court, one was a Catholic, one a Protestant and one a lew-"It is therefore of great importance

to the Jewish community that if a can-didate is nominated as a 'Jewish candidate' he should be not merely a Jew in name, but actually our representative. Such a candidate should not only have a general record as a citizen and jurist, but also a Jewish record as a Jewish communal worker. Because the Jewish candidate is considered by the outside world as a symbol of Judaism, he should be a recognized Jewish leader. Only too often are such Jews, occupying high positions, merely election Jews. that is, lews who declare themselves as such only at the time of elections n order to secure votes. It is therefore important from the Jewish viewpoint that Jewish candidates should not be men with Jewish names only. It is vital that the following questions be asked of the Jewish candidate: Is he a lewish communal worker? Has be participated in or worked for the Federation of Jewish charities and other philanthropic institutions? What has philanthropic institutions? What has he done for Jewish education in order to maintain Judaism in the United States? Does he belong to any of the large Jewish organizations? What has he done for the suffering Jews on the other side of the ocean? Is he connected with the great historical enterprise of rebuilding the Jewish national home in Palestine? "It is the duty of the leaders of the

two great political parties and of our own lewish ocmmunal workers to take care that the candidates who are elected because of their Jewishness be Jews not only in name, but should incorporate the best qualities of the Jewish people.

6,554 HOMELESS WERE

SHELTERED BY HIAS The Hebrew Sheltering and Immi-

grant Aid Society of America (Hias) has sheltered 6,354 wayfarers and homeless persons during the past year, and served them with 32,262 meals, according to a report made public today.

The Hachnosos Orchim, or the Shelter Department of Hias, the report states, is the only institution of this kind in Greater New York, and is made use of not only by New York organizations, but by agencies from all over the country, which refer to it

tion. Nevertheless, the press generally is amazed or incredulous or both at the statement in the apology that the owner of the "Independent" had not known what his magazine was printing.

"Imagine a publisher letting seven years go by before directing his 'personal attention' to what was being printed in his paper!" exclaims the Knoxville "News Sentinel", which estimates "the artlessness of the apology" as "rivaled only by the old, old story of the 'Babes in the Woods'."

The Anniston Star considers that

Mr. Ford's "admission that he did not know the tenor of the writings that were appearing in his own paper" will cause him to "lose prestige as a pub-licist and as an executive," and the Flint "Daily Journal" remarks: "We are certain that Henry Ford knows exactly what is being issued from his factories in the shape of automobiles and other products, staff or no staff. If he has actually not seen what has been printed in the 'Dearborn Independent' then he has made a confes-sion of incredible short-sightedness."

"Was ever journalism thus conducted before?" asks the Louisville "Courier-Journal", while the Charleston "Daily Mail" declares: "That very freedom of the press of which we boast as a people, and which is perhaps the most precious of all our possessions, by its very freedom imposes the greatest of responsibility upon those who would exercise it." The Tulsa "Daily World" believes that if Henry Ford "did not read his own publication . . . then he stands self-convicted of being unworthy of the high privilege of owning and publishing a periodical of any character."

Says the Winston-Salem "Twin City Sentinel": "No man has any right to sponsor a journal of any kind unless he knows what it is doing. There is no place for falsehood, untruth, half-truth or gross errors in journalism. Mistakes will sometimes be made; errors will sometimes appear. This is inevitable. But there is no excuse for a deliberate perversion of facts, which Mr. Ford admits took place in the 'Dearborn Independent', the conduct of which he had turned over to others."

"A publisher cannot, of course, have personal knowledge of all that goes into his publication," says the Omaha "World Herald", "but it is only an exceptional one who can be blind to something which has been going on for five years and which everybody else apparently, except himself, is fully aware of," and the Richmond "News Leader" calls attention to the fact that "every other publisher is held responsible for the general edi-

The Dayton "Daily News" holds that "hardly in our time has so conspicuous a man confessed to so egregious, so inexplicable an error."

Many of the papers feel, however, that Mr. Ford's present action should be taken at its face value. The Rochester "Times-Union" is glad because of his announcement that "his name will no longer be connected with encouragement here of that anti-Semitism which is a disruptive force in a number of countries," and the Washington "Evening Star" thinks Mr. Ford's statement "was a manly, conrageous act which calls for warmest praise and congratulation."

The Detroit "News" says: "What-ever the inspiration, his retraction evidently comes from the heart and is

characteristically complete."
The Washington "Post" says: "The premise that Ford aspires to the Presidency can be attributed only to the dearth of actual news. The conclusion that the Demograts would take his caudidacy seriously is the most unkind thrust that has yet been directed at that much maligned party."

SAYS RELATIONS BETWEEN NATIVE AND FOREIGN-BORN IS PROBLEM OF AMERICA Miss Florina Lasker Writes on Subject in "The Red Cross Courier"

In an article contributed to the recent issue of "The Red Cross Courier" official publication of the American Red Cross, Miss Florina Lasker of New York City, National Chairman of the Department of Immigrant Aid and Immigrant Immigrant Education of the National Council of Jewish Women, discusses "Adjusting the Relations Between the Native and the Foreign-Born Resident". Miss Lasker maintains that the fundamental problem facing America today is the relationship between the native and the

foreign-born resident of this country. In presenting her point of view, Miss Lasker writes:

"The future of America depends in large measure upon the nature of the relations established between these two groups-relations which will reflect themselves not only in our political and economic institutions, but in our social and cultural structure as well. Early Iewish Women recognized the significance of this problem and organized a Department of Immigrant Aid, whose program in the course of years has been broadened and developed to meet existing needs.

"With the enactment of restrictive immigration legislation, it has obviously been found necessary to make cergram. No only has the Department increased its activities in behalf of those foreign-born women and girls who have been in this country a number of years, perhaps, yet who, never-theless, still feel themselves strangers in a strange land, but its services in (Continued on Page 4)
