TELLS OF MIRACULOUS ESCAPE DURING RECENT PALESTINE EARTHQUAKE

**Prof. Crowfoot Caught in Quake While
Directing Mt. Ophel Excavations**
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Jerusalem, July 28.—The miraculous escape of Prof. Crowfoot, who is directing excavations on Mount Ophel, during the recent earthquake shock, was reported by Mr. Masterman, secretary of the Palestine Exploration Fund.

At the time of the shock, Prof. Crowfoot was at the bottom of the excavation. While the wall near which he stood shook greatly, the stones did not budge.

The excavations were in no way affected by the shock, Mr. Masterman stated to the correspondent of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency.

ANTI-SEMITIC PAPERS CONTINUE ATTACKS ON ALFRED M. COHEN

Berlin, July 28.—The anti-Semitic papers continue their agitation against Mr. Alfred M. Cohen, President of the Independent Order B'nai B'rith, who is at present in Europe.

The "Voelkischer Beobachter", the organ of Hitler, says that Cohen came to Europe in order to arrange for a Bolshevik revolution, not only in Austria but also in the Balkan countries.

The paper says that the riots in Vienna were only the first demonstration of Mr. Cohen's plans.

MAVROMATIS CONCESSION MAY BE CANCELLED

Jerusalem, July 28.—The concession which Mavromatis holds for both the electricity and water supply in Jerusalem may become invalid, the Jewish Telegraphic Agency learns.

According to the decision of the Permanent Court of International Justice, Mr. Mavromatis had the precedence over Rutenberg for the concession in Palestine. He may lose it, however, due to the fact that he has not yet proceeded with the works, although he had obtained an extension of time from the Government.

PREDICT VERA MENCHIK WILL BECOME INTERNA- TIONAL CHESS CHAMPION

London, July 28.—Vera Menchik, the young Russian Jewess who is a member of the British team in the International Chess Tournament, is "carrying everything before her," according to the comments in the British press. She will most probably be the first international woman chess champion, the newspapers state.

CHARGE GREAT BRITAIN WITH ATTEMPT TO INSTIGATE IN- SURRECTION IN UKRAINE

**British Press Denies Allegation Made
by French Paper**
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Paris, July 28.—Mr. Bernard Le-cache, the French Jewish journalist who recently visited Russia, confirmed in the Paris daily, "Matin", the allegations made by the Communist paper "Humanite", that the British Government has entered into an intrigue with representatives of the Petlura organization in Paris, with the view of organizing the Petlurists in Ukraine and cause an insurrection.

The British press ridicules this suggestion as fantastic, and declares it to be pure fiction. The British Embassy in Paris, the English papers say, has decided to ignore this so-called revelation, claiming that it does not contain a single word of truth.

JEWISH LEADER FIGHTS DUEL WITH FASCIST

Rome, July 28.—A duel was fought between Dr. Paolo Levi, prominent Fascist, and Luigi Menini, Secretary of the Fascist Academic Association.

Dr. Levi challenged Menini because of the anti-Semitic propaganda in which the latter was engaged.

Levi wounded Menini five times, while the former was slightly wounded once. The physicians stopped the duel and the adversaries parted without a reconciliation.

Dr. Paolo Levi was formerly the head of the Fascist Press Bureau in Padua, and is now Secretary of the Padua Jewish Community.

SUCCESSFUL PRODUCER OF MANY PLAYS CANNOT READ OR WRITE

London, July 28.—That one of the leading theatrical managers in England, Joseph Leopold Sacks, who produced many plays, some of which scored great success, is unable to read and write, was disclosed during his examination in bankruptcy proceedings here today.

Sacks, who for some time was manager for Sir Harry Lauder, was born in Russia in 1881, emigrated to South Africa at the age of nine, became a circus clown, and started his career as theatrical manager at the age of nineteen.

JEWISH NATIONAL ASSEMBLY, ASSEFATH HANIVCHARIM, TO CONVENE IN OCTOBER

**Demands Proper Representation of
Palestine in Jewish Agency**
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Jerusalem, July 28.—The Jewish National Assembly (Assefath Hanivcharim) has been called into session for October, in order to organize Palestine Jewry in accordance with the Community Ordinance which has recently been promulgated, according to a decision of the Vaad Leumi.

The Vaad Leumi has also appointed as its representatives at the World Conference on Jewish Rights in Zurich David Yellin, Ben Zion Mossinson, Ben Zvi and Rabbi Meyer Berlin.

Another decision of the Vaad Leumi is to demand the proper representation of Palestine in the Jewish Agency.

ROTHSCHILD LIBRARY MAY BE TURNED INTO GERMAN NATIONAL INSTITUTION

Berlin, July 28.—The "Frankfurter Zeitung" suggests the use of the Rothschild Library at Frankfurt am Main as the nucleus of a central German national library.

The paper points out that while London has the British Museum, and France her national library, Germany is without a national library. The paper further states that the Rothschild Library would lend itself very well to this purpose.

AMERICAN JEWISH PAINTER EXHIBITS WORK IN ROME

Rome, July 28.—Elias Grossman, American Jewish artist who recently painted a portrait of Mussolini, is holding an exhibition at the International Art Society in Rome, under the patronage of the Minister of Education, Prof. Fidele, and the United States Ambassador to Italy, Henry P. Fletcher.

The "Messaggero", prominent daily in Rome, in an article, pays tribute to Grossman.

VIENNA SPORT CLUB, HAKOAH FACES A SERIOUS CRISIS

IRISH JEWS IN U. S. ORGANIZE:
TO FORM NATIONAL ORDER

Irish Jews, in an effort to convince the world that they exist, have organized a fraternal society which will eventually, they hope, into a national order with branches in all the leading cities. The organization was named The Irish Jews of America at the first meeting, held last night at the home of Alexander Freeman, formerly of Belfast. Jack S. Levine was elected chairman, and Leon Hahn, attorney and author of "A History of the Jews in Ireland," honorary chairman.

Mr. Freeman volunteered to make a trip to Ireland next June in behalf of the organization and to report to the members, on his return, the conditions there.

This is the first time that the Irish Jews have attempted to get together. One of their chief aims is the establishment of an Irish Orthodox Synagogue similar to those in the Free State, where Reform Judaism is practically unknown. Keen satisfaction was expressed at the reception which the leaders and people of Ireland rendered Frederick Sterling, American envoy to that country, last week.

There are about one thousand Irish Jews in Greater New York, and several thousand scattered throughout the States; it has been estimated.

HABIMAH TO GIVE OPEN AIR
PERFORMANCES IN PALESTINE

Berlin, July 28.—The Moscow Hebrew Theatre Habimah will play in Jerusalem in the open air during the next Passover. The performances will be given on the site where the permanent Habimah Theatre will later be erected.

It is believed that the presence of the Habimah Theatre in Palestine will attract considerable crowds to the country.

WOMEN'S COUNCIL CONDUCTS
SANITATION CAMPAIGN
AMONG JEWISH FARMERS

A special summer campaign has been conducted among the Jewish farmers by the Department of Farm and Rural Work of the National Council of Jewish Women, to counteract the problem that arises from the great rush of men, women and children to the farms of the eastern states. Many homes that entertain a small family during the winter, suddenly find themselves quartering a large number of people. These summer boarders, aside from being a source of a revenue to the Jewish farmer, constitute a serious menace unless proper safeguards are put into effect.

To save the Jewish farmer and his family from a great part of the evils that are involved in summer boarding, the Council's Department of Farm and Rural Work has distributed posters in Yiddish and in English, emphasizing several important rules of sanitation, with reference to the kitchen, screen doors, refuse, the care of the grounds, immediate to the farm house, the airing of bedding and the drying of clothes.

Health lectures are being given in various rural communities by the Department's supervisors. At Toms River, New Jersey, a Child Health Day was recently observed with a program given in the local Community House. The program included a discussion of a health subject by Dr. Herman Robbins, director of the Nutrition Clinic, Brooklyn, N. Y., and a playlet, "A Tour to Good Health," by the farmers' children. This playlet was written by Janet Hill, nutrition supervisor of the Department of Farm and Rural Work of the National Council of Jewish Women.

MRS. ISAAC M. ULLMAN,
OF NEW HAVEN, DIES

New Haven, Conn., July 28.—Mrs. Flora Adler Ullman, wife of Colonel Isaac M. Ullman, manufacturer and Republican leader in this city, died yesterday after a brief illness.

A few years ago Colonel and Mrs. Ullman made a trip abroad, during which the latter suffered an injury from some undetermined source, later necessitating the amputation of a limb. Since then Mrs. Ullman, who had been foremost in charitable projects, relinquished much of her activities, and her husband, to a large extent, withdrew from political life.

Mrs. Ullman's automobile accident, have received letters from the Ford Motor Company offering the discontinuance of taking subscription to the "Jewish Daily Bulletin," the automobile magazine.

UKRAINIAN MINISTER
OF AGRICULTURE VISITS
NEW JEWISH COLONIES

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency Mail Service)

Moscow, July 13.—The Ukrainian Minister of Agriculture, M. Shlichter, during a recent tour of Southern Ukraine, visited the Jewish colonies there and in the course of his report, now issued, he devotes considerable space to the question of the Jewish colonization work in Russia. "A large number of stories are being spread about the Jewish settlement work," he writes, "such as the story that big merchants are settling on the land, using the land as a sort of adjunct to their other work of trading in the towns. Their families, it is said, have stayed behind in the towns and are carrying on their trading as before. It is also said that the Jews do not work the land themselves, but use hired labor. On the basis of my personal observations in the course of my tour, during which I visited a large number of Jewish colonies, I categorically deny these absurd libels, the Minister declares. We visited an area of 13,000 desiatin of land on which there are at present 680 Jewish farms. The farm movement on this area started at the end of 1925. By July 1st of this year 82 per cent of the entire families of the settlers were actually on the land. This shows that there can be no question of the members of the families of the settlers having remained behind in the towns to continue trading.

"There are, of course, ex-traders and ex-artisans among the Jewish farmers. It is just these classes of Jews who, because of historic reasons are the largest classes of the Jewish population and formed the majority of the population of the Jewish towns in the Ukraine. It was they who suffered most from the change in the economic conditions of our country. It is true that among the new settlers there are a few persons who were previously big merchants, but these are rare exceptions. In the Jewish agricultural district about 25 persons were disfranchised because they had been big traders, only three because they engaged in trading in the new settlements, and only four because they used hired labor on their farms. That shows how baseless are the allegations that the new Jewish settlers are big traders and used hired labor.

"I did not come across a single case of a Jew who had rented his land to a farmer. In order, however, to prevent any such case arising I have now issued an Ordinance which prohibits the renting of any land. I have not seen the Jews use hired labor. The neighboring peasants often mistake the assistance which the Jewish settlers obtain from the Jewish organizations abroad as being given them by the Government, and this creates a feeling of envy. It is necessary to conduct a big campaign to enlighten the peasants as to the real facts. Of late, the Minister concludes, the relations between the Ukrainian peasants and the Jewish peasants have very much improved. The peasants have convinced themselves that the Jewish settlers are con-

ANTI-SEMITISM IN TORONTO HOSPITALS CHARGED BY RABBI ISSERMAN

Practically Impossible for Jewish Student to Serve Internship. He States in
Editorial; Officials Deny Any Prejudice or Discrimination;
Declare Jews Entered in Past

"Though Toronto has 40,000 Jews, who constitute about one-fourteenth of the population, and though the University of Toronto has had among its most brilliant graduates Jewish students, it is practically impossible for a Jewish student to serve an internship in a Toronto hospital," states Rabbi Ferdinand M. Isserman in an editorial published in a current issue of *The Canadian Jewish Review*. "Those medical students who want experience in addition to their college course must go for that experience in the States or in England. The Toronto General Hospital has no Jewish interns with the possible exception of one woman. It has no Jews on its staff. The Hospital for Sick Children, a large proportion of whose patients are Jewish, has not one Jewish intern and has never had one.

"The Western Hospital has likewise no Jewish interns, though the institution has two Jews on its staff," continues the article. "As a result of this practical banishment from local hospitals, Jewish physicians have not had an opportunity to develop their talents freely.

"The investigations of the King's County Hospital, Brooklyn, revealed that only three Jewish nurses were found among a staff of 200," claims the article. "In Toronto it is absolutely impossible for a Jewish girl to follow the nursing profession. To our knowledge no Jewish girl has ever been admitted to a nurses' training school in Toronto. Such a state of affairs is not in accord with British justice and fair play."

Spoken to in regard to the assertions made in the article, Dr. E. A. Gray, superintendent of the Toronto General Hospital, declared that the claim that "the Toronto General Hospital has no Jewish interns, with the possible exception of one woman," was not correct. Although at the present moment there were no Jewish interns in the General Hospital, there have been in the past, said Dr. Gray. Questioned as to whether there existed a prejudice at the General Hospital against Jewish interns, Dr. Gray said that he did not know or any. He declined to make further comment until he had read the article under discussion.

In the absence of Miss Gunn, acting supervisors of the Nurses' Training School of the Toronto General Hospital refused to discuss the statement made by Rabbi Isserman to the effect that Jewish girls were not readily admitted to Toronto's nurses' training schools.

ducting their farm work very successfully and by their own labor, and this has put a stop to the rumors which have been preventing friendship between the Ukrainian and the Jewish peasants."

Hospital for Sick Children, stated that he was not aware of any difference being made in connection with applications from Jewish interns. There was no Jewish intern at present in the Hospital for Sick Children, but he could not say whether there ever had been or not. He could not recollect having had any applicants among Jews, and was under the impression that there must have been very few such applications to come before the hospital for consideration. There was no discrimination made in regard to Jewish students at the Hospital for Sick Children, he said.

Regarding Jewish girls applying at the nurses' training school in connection with the Hospital for Sick Children, Mr. Swaine held that very few eligible Jewish young ladies had ever made application for nurses' training. He could only recall two Jewish girls applying, and neither of these had possessed the necessary educational qualifications.

Asked whether a Jewish girl who might be eligible to enter the Nurses' Training School would be rejected because of her nationality, Mr. Swaine stated that he could see no reason why she should not be accepted although he could not speak definitely, since no applications of this nature had come under his supervision for final consideration.

Speaking for St. Michael's Hospital, authorities last night claimed that while there were at present no Jewish interns in the hospital, there had been some in the past. It was not known whether any Jewish girls had applied for admittance to St. Michael's Nurses' Training School in Toronto but it was stated that Jewish girls had trained in St. Michael's Hospital in Winnipeg.

Authorities at the Jewish Hospital, Yorkville Avenue, remarked on the fact that, although nurses joining the staff were graduates of hospitals in England, New York and Cleveland, and other general hospitals in the United States, they had none who were graduates of Toronto hospitals, but they were unable to state whether Jewish girls had found it impossible to secure training in Toronto schools of nursing.

Reports from Paris state that Alfred Dreyfus of Devil's Island fame, Lieutenant Colonel, retired, in the French Army, may go to the United States to plead the cause of Sacco and Vanzetti, under sentence of death for murder in Massachusetts.

Dr. Hyman J. Landau, who on Sept. 1, retires as Rabbi of the Hoboken, N. J., Jewish Center, has accepted the rabbinate of the North Hudson Jewish Community Center, a larger congregation.

The new maternity hospital, which is being erected on the grounds of the Jewish Hospital in Philadelphia and which will shortly be completed and dedicated, will be called the William B. and Adeline Hackenberg Maternity Hospital. Announcement to this effect was made by Arthur A. Fleisher, president of the Jewish Hospital, following a meeting of the board of directors.

OZET REAPPOINTS ITS DELEGATE TO UNITED STATES

Moscow, July 14.—The United States Government recently refused to grant a visa to M. Weinstein, one of the two delegates appointed by the Jewish Colonization Society (Ozet) to proceed to America in order to acquaint American public opinion with the Jewish colonization work. The second delegate, Professor Laprow-Skolob, has received his visa. It is understood that the visa has been refused to M. Weinstein because he is a Communist. The Board of the Ozet has, after consideration of the situation, unanimously re-appointed M. Weinstein as its delegate to America.

failure of the last tour of the Hakoah in the United States has precipitated the crisis.

A general meeting of the Club has been called in order to attempt a re-organization.

The Vienna Jewish press gives expression to its regret that the Hakoah may be forced to discontinue its activities, pointing out that, through its many victories, Hakoah has enhanced Jewish prestige and was a great factor in rejuvenating the Jewish race.

Jerusalem, July 28.—The case of the Jewish citizen, Mr. Zvi Smolin, who was struck by an officer of the Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals, has attracted wide attention here.

The officer insisted that the case be tried before a British magistrate because of his British nationality.

Mr. Smolin, who brought criminal action against Mr. Graham, the officer, charged that the latter struck him in the back, and demanded \$25 damages. The case was brought before the court of the District District Commissioners.

Mr. Graham admitted that he had pushed Mr. Smolin, but the case was dismissed by the Magistrate after hearing the facts on both sides.
