RANDUM SATISFACTORY, MAN-DATES COMMISSION HOLDS Recommends Policy of Restricted Immigration.

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Geneva, August 8.—Recommending the continuation of the policy of restricting immigration to Palestine in accordance with the country's capacity

for absorption, the Mandates Commission of the League of Nations makes public its report to the Council of the League.

The Commission is satisfied with the information furnished by Great Britain as the mandatory power with regard to the progress of local autonomy. The Commission would like the next report to give more detailed information of the development of self-governing institutions as provided in Article Two of the Mandata.

The Commission states that the memorandum of the Zionist Organization provides valuable information of the activities of the Zionist Organization, but calls for no comment on the part of the Commission. Mandatory's replies to the points raised in the memorandum are wholly

BULGARIAN MINISTER TO INVESTIGATE EXCESSES

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Washington, D. C., Aug. 8-Information regarding the anti-Jewish excesses reported by the Paris daily, "Le Journal" to have occurred in Philippopolis, will be asked of the Bulgar-

ian government by the Minister of that government in Washington. Upon inquiry of the Jewish Tele-graphic Agency, S. Radoff, Bulgarian Minister in Washington, has cabled his government for information.

The report of the Paris newspaper stated that Members of the Association for the Defense of the Fatherland attacked the Jewish quarter in the southern Bulgarian city. The attacks were reported to have occurred early last week.

FEWER JEWS IN RED ARMY THAN UNDER CZAR'S REGIME

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Berlin, August 8 .- The percentage of Jews in the Red Army is lower than that in the army of the former Russian Czar, according to official statistics of the Jewish Scientific In-

stitute made public here. The percentage of Jews in the Red Army is 2.17, while under the Czarist regime the percentage was 4.7, the figures show.

BRITAIN'S REPLY TO Z. O. MEMO- | JUDICIAL DUTIES PREVENT JUDGE MACK FROM ATTEND-ING ZURICH CONFERENCE Endorses Aims of Conference

On Jewish Rights Judicial duties will prevent Judge Julian W. Mack from attending the conference on Jewish Rights which will open in Zurich on August 17. In a statment to the Jewish Daily Bulletin setting forth the reasons for his inability to attend the conference. Judge Mack gave his emphatic endorsement to the aims of the Confer-

"Answering your inquiry," Judge Mack stated, "the sole reason for my not going to Europe to attend the conference called in Zurich and the Zionist Congress is the imperative need of considering and deciding a the trial of which has just finished and has taken four months. Both in justice to the case itself and because of other judicial duties in the fall, this work cannot be postponed.

"I have sent to the Conference and shall send to the Congress an expression of my very deep regret that I cannot participate in the sessions. Despite the fact that some Jewish organizations have declined to participate in the work of the Conference. I regard the holding of the Conference highly desirable in order that there may be secured the largest degree of co-operation between Jewish organizations in the several countries engaged in endeavoring to translate into reality the paper rights secured to the minority groups and the individual members thereof through the so-called minorities treaties of 1919.

GERMAN JEWS PARTICIPATE IN RUSSIAN COLONIZATION (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Berlin, August 8 .- Active participation of the Hilfsverein der Deut-schen Juden in the reconstruction work of the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee in Russia was begun with the departure of Dr. M. Wischnitzer, general secretary of the Hilfsverein.

Dr. Wischnitzer will spend several weeks in Russia where he will study the cultural and social situation of the Jews. His trip is in connection with the plan of the Hilfsverein to take active part in the Russian colonization work.

DENY REPORT DEAD SEA CONCESSIONS GRANTED TO MOND COMPANY

Mineral Resources Are Estimated At \$1,500,000,000,000 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

London, August 8 .- Inquiries in responsible quarters by the Jewish Telegraphic Agency here regarding the report which appeared in the London papers that a concession to exploit the mineral resources of the Dead Sea is about to be given to the Imperial Chemical Industries, Ltd., of which Sir Alfred Mond is the head. brought a denial of the report. It was declared that it is likely

that Mr. Novomeiski and a British engineer will be awarded the concession. Mr. Novomejski, who is a Russian Jew, was the first to apply for a concession to exploit the salts of the Dead Sea.

London, Aug. 8-A concession to exploit the vast mineral resources of the Dead Sea in Palestine is about to be given the Imperial Chemical Industries, according to reports in newspa-pers here. The deposits of potash bromine salts, gypsum and magnesium chloride are estimated to be worth 238 billion pounds (about 1,190 billion dollars), or about 290 times the British war debt to the United States.

The granting of the concession will he the signal to start one of the biggest commercial enterprises ever undertaken by any nation. It is expected here that it will start a continuous flow of surplus profits into the Government coffers of Palestine. Once the enterprise is placed on a naving basis it will enable the farmers of the British Empire to obtain notash at approximately half the current prices.

It will seriously challenge the Franco-German monopoly of potassium chloride, a prospect which may he a considerable factor in enabling the British to obtain good terms in the negotiations now under way with (Continued on page 4)

ESTABLISH 29 NEW JEWISH COLONIES IN THE UKRAINE (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Moscow, August 8 .- Twenty nine new Jewish villages are about to be created in the District of Nikonal From twenty to twenty-five houses are being built in each village. Seven hundred and sixty-five families have already been settled.

Moscow, August 8 .- Two thousand desiatin of land were allotted to the Omsk (Siberia) branch of the Ozet, the Society for the Settlement of Jews on the land. The new allottment is located 25 verst from Omsk. The Ozet plans to settle three Jewish collectives consisting of 56 families, numbering 291 persons.

The Comzet, the Governmental Department for the Settlement of Jews on the Land, has granted to the Ozet another 50,000 roubles for Jewish settlement in White Russia. The Comzet previously allocated 20.000 roubles for settlement in White Russia.

The White Russian Ozet also received credit amounting to 170,000 roubles from the White Russian Agricultural Bank.

New elections to the praesidium of the Ozet have taken place. J. Weinstein-Rachmiel. Communist, elected president. Bragin, non-Partisan, Dr. Abraham was chosen vice-president.

JEWISH DEPUTY SAYS (J. T. A. Mail Service)

Berlin, July 26-Jews in Germany in their political life have never adopted any other than a German viewpoint, Dr. Ludwig Haas, member of the Reichstag, declared at a meeting arranged by the Federation of Societies of German Students of the Jewish Faith.

It can be historically established that Jews have been represented in all parties, Dr. Hazs said. In England they have been primarily on the side of the Conservatives. In Germany Jews have been on the side of the Left parties, but this is only due to the anti-Semitic attitude of the Right parties.

BERNARD MARCUS PRESIDENT OF UNITED STATES BANK

At the meeting of the Director of the Bank of United States the announcement of the election of Bernard K. Marcus as President to suceed his late father, Joseph S. Marcus. was authorized.

Mr. Marcus, who is now 37 years old, started in the Bank of United States as Cashier. He has been the active executive head of the bank for the past seven years. "During this period." the Wall Street Journal says, the Bank of United States has led the financial institutions of this country in gains, in deposits without absorption or mergers."

Mr. Marcus studied at Columbia University, from which he graduated in 1911.

The Board also authorized the announcement that Saul Singer was elected Executive Vice-President as Chairman of the Executive Committee and that Henry W. Pollack, former State Senator and Chairman of the Senate Banking Committee and introducer of the 1911 bill to revise state banking laws was elected to the Roard.

In 1913 the Bank of United States was founded with a capital of \$100,-000. At the present time the resources of the bank are in excess of \$100,000,000.

Writing of the election of Mr. Marcus, the "Commercial and Financial World" says: "The new President has long been a prominent figure in commercial, industrial and hanking circles, being universally esteemed as an executive and financier. He is especially well known for the achievements he has rolled up in his capacity as active executive head of the bank for the past seven years."

FIONEL DE ROTHSCHILD REPORTS ON WORK OF JEWISH WAR MEMORIAL

(J. T. A. Mail Service)

London, August 1 .- The work of the Jewish War Memorial in threefold purpose of strengthening the arrangements for the training of abbis, stimulating Jewish religious education and improving the status of the rabbinate was reported on by Lionel de Rothschild, president of the Memorial.

Jews' College, Aria College and the Yshibah Etz Chaim were the educational institutions to receive support of the Jewish War Memorial in their plan to strengthen the arrangements for the training of rabbis. Since its first contribution of \$2500 made to Jews' College, the Memorial granted increasing sums totalling \$38.750. with a grant of \$10,000 for the last year. These grants enabled the College authorities to raise the salaries of the professors and to provide for an additional Professor with an English Reducation. In their determination to encourage

the flow of suitable students to Jews College, the Council of the Jewish War Memorial entered into an arrangement with Aria College which entitles the Council to elect five students to the College. The Jewish War Memorial has also contributed to the Yeshibah Etz Chaim, which is an important factor in the training of rabbis.

The natural conditions make it possible, it is claimed, to recover the salts cheaply in a state of high commercial purity within a few miles of ocean transport facilities. The concession is said not to grant an unrestricted monopoly, but to provide that the bulk of surplus profits will go to the Government of Palestine, partly for reinvestment in Palestinian industry. Another provision is said to be the distribution of fertilizer to the farmers of Palestine and Transjordania at cost price.
