#### COVERNMENT OF POLAND PROTESTS TO U. S. AGAINST "INTELLIGENCE TESTS" Speedy Elimination of Objectionable

Method Believed Likely

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Warsaw, Aug. 30 .- The intelligence tests introduced by the American Consul General here in the examination of Zionist Congress, the legislative body Jewish applicants for United States visas will be given up in the near future, it was stated here today on good

The intelligence tests, which included questions like, "How many feathers has a goose? How long is a string? How many feet has an American cat? What is the difference between summer and winter? What is the difference between a man and a woman? How many minutes and seconds are there in an hour? What does one do when it rains? What is the difference between silver and iron? Can you make a stove out of butter?" called forth wide protest.

The matter was taken up by the Polish Emigration Office, a Government department dealing with emigration problems. Acting upon a report of the Emigration Office, the Polish Foreign Office intervened with the United States Ambassador in Warsaw, pointing out that these intelligence tests are applied only in Poland.

It was stated that the Ambassador assured the Foreign Office of the speedy elimination of these tests.

#### ANTI-SEMITES USE FORD RECANTATION FOR SPREAD-ING "INTERNATIONAL JEW"

Say Report of Withdrawal is Untrue: 10,000 Copies on Market (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Leipzig, Aug. 30 .- Henry Ford's voluntary recantation and withdrawal of his anti-Semitic charges, contained in what purported to be his book, "The International Jew," is being used by, German anti-Semites as a means for promoting the distribution of the anti-Jewish libels among the German people.

Theodore Fritsch, a leader of the German anti-Semites and translator of the "International Jew" into German, has circulated widely an advertisement of the German version of the "International Jew." The advertisement reads as follows:

### FIFTEENTH ZIONIST CONGRESS OPENS WITH SOKOLOW AS PRESIDENT

Weizmann and Sokolow Deliver Opening Addresses; Nine American Delegates Unseated at Opposition's Protest: Actions Committee Generous with Opposition Groups; Grants Them Privilege of Representation

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Basle, Aug. 30.-The Fifteenth of the International Zionist movement, went into session at 8.30 last night, at the Messe Hall, in the presence of 280 delegates, representing Zionist societies from all parts of the world

A large number of guests, including many from the United States and Canada, came to attend the sessions of the Congress, which marks the 30th anniversary of the founding of political Zionism. Thirty years ago today, in this city, the Zionist World Organization was created at the first Congress, convoked by and presided over by Dr. Theodore Herzl. founder of modern Zionism.

The large Messe Hall was crowded with delegates and guests when Nahum Sokolow, Chairman of the World Zionist Executive, opened the session. By a unanimous vote, Mr. Sokolow, one of the oldest living Hebrew writers and leaders, was elected President of the Congress.

Eleven vice-presidents, representing the various countries and groups with delegates at the Congress, were elected. Dr. Leo Motzkin of Palestine was elected as first Vice-Presi-Other vice-presidents are: Deputy H. Farbstein, Dr. Leo Reich, Deputy Isaac Gruenbaum of Poland. Mr. Feinmann, Mr. Kaplan and M. M.

Following the opening addresses of the heads of the Zionist Executive. the delegates listened to addresses by Dr. Martin Buber, well-known German Jewish writer and by Mr. Sokolow, eulogizing Achad Ha'am, the late Hebrew writer and philosopher, who was the founder of the school of spiritual Zionism.

As the Congress went into session, there were no clear indications as to the probable course the various groups would follow in the decisions on the pending questions. The announcement of the creation of a joint committee of the general Zionists which, it is believed, would uphold the Weizmann administration, was met by the announcement of the labor groups that they have undertaken negotiations with a view of creating a bloc of the labor groups.

The strength of the delegation of American Zionists, who were to hold the balance of power at the Congress. was diminished by a decision of the Congress Court, acting upon the protest of the opposition leaders, that the credentials of the American delegates are not valid in view of the fact that no elections took place. The Court, which has the function of the Credentials Committee decided that only 40 of the American delegates are to be admitted, unseating nine. It was also learned that the Amer-

The General Council has appointed a committee of twelve to work out a report on the question of the anti-Zionist persecutions in Russia and on the relief question.

Basle, August 30 .- The validity of the credentials of the American delegation to the Fifteenth Zionist Congress here was confirmed by a decision of the Zionist Congress Court.

The credentials of the American delegates were protested by opposition leaders on the ground that no election of delegates took place in the United States. The Court however, found that the Election Committee complied with the regulations of the statute governing the election of delegates to Zionist congresses, and because of the fact that there was unanimity of opinion between the various groups, no formal election was necessary.

A generous decision with regard to the status of the opposition groups at the Congress was taken at to-day's meeting of the Zionist Actions Committee. According to the statutes of the Congress, only groups which have at least fifteen members are entitled to the privileges of a "fraction," and thus justified to have representation in the praesidium and also to delegate its spokesmen to participate in the so-called general debate. Considering the numerical weakness at the present Congress of the Zionist Revisionists and Radical Zionists. the Actions Committee decided to recognize them, notwithstanding the fact that they fall short of the prescribed number as fractions. groups will be given representation in the praesidium of the Congress.

Dr. Gothein's attitude on the Jewish question was summed up in the address he delivered to the Conference of the Union for Combating Anti-Semitism in Germany which was held last year at Cologne, when he said: "A German is he who speaks German as his mother tongue, feels himself German, and in time of need places his life at the service of the German Fatherland."

#### WOMEN'S INTERNATIONAL Z. O. HOLDS MEETING IN BASLE (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Basle, August 30 .- The annual convention of the Women's International Zionist Organization, presided over by Mrs. Weizmann and Lady Samuel. started its sessions here prior to the opening of the Congress.

The convention was addressed by Lady Samuel, Dr. Chaim Weizmann and Mr. M. M. Ussischkin. The convention decided to establish

a Neutral Zionist Women's Palestine Fund. This fund is to engage in JAMES H. BECKER RETURNS FROM EUROPE TOUR TODAY

James H. Becker of Chicago, member of the banking firm of A. G. Becker and Company, returns to-day on the liner Paris from an eight. months' tour abroad. Mr. Becker. who was very active in the launching of the Joint Distribution Committee activities abroad left the United States last January accompanying Felix M. Warburg, chairman of the J. D. C., on his round-the-world-tour on the Resolute. With Mr. Walburg he made the

journey through the Jewish agricultural colonies in the Ukraine and Crimea last spring, on which Mr. Warburg reported at the welcoming dinner tendered him by his fellowofficers of the J. D. C. and the United Jewish Campaign and a national group of philanthropic leaders at the Hotel Astor in June. On this trip Mr. Becker made a film depicting the life and background of the Jewish pioneer settlements in which tens of thousands are being helped to build a new permanent livelihood for themselves by the direction and support of the Agro-Joint, with the aid of funds contributed by the Jews of America through the United Jowish Campaign. This film, which was brought back to America by Mr. Warburg and shown for the first time at the dinner gathering in his honor. is the first screen record of the picturesque human drama of the great "back-to-the-soil" movement in Russia which America has yet seen. Mr. Becker is especially known for

the record of his intrepid first venture into the war-barricaded Eastern countries, on a mission of succour to the Jewish men, women and children helpless in the travail of destruction and starvation in 1919-20. On service abroad as a commissioner of the American Relief Administration, Mr. Becker set out alone from Paris on a hazarous venture into Poland and the Ukraine, as the acting European director of the J. D. C. He went also as the JDC's first commissioner into Roumania, where he spent six months in laying the foundation of a relief program which became the basis of all later reconstructive effort in that country.

Mr. Becker, who is a member of the Executive Committee of the J. D. C., is expected to bring back with him important first-hand data based on his own observations of the development of the J. D. C. reconstruction program in the countries he visited.

agitation was carried on against Ford and his book. Jewish journals depicted Ford as a fool; they claimed that the book was pro-German. They even claimed that the German translation is a falsification of the original. All this was of no avail. The book had its triumphant march and reached in Germany an edition of 100,000 copies. Then only one means remained: Ford himself had to fall.

"Exploiting his economic difficulties, Ford was finally driven into straits. He had to give in meekly, unwilling to jeopardize his economical technical lifework and the existence of 60,000 workers and their families.

"What does 'Ford's recantation' prove? What does withdrawal of the 'International Jew' signify? Nothing!

"Ford's 'fall' is only additional proof of the immense unscrupulously used power of Jewish capital! Not facts, not the truth, decides, but the power of money. The contents of the book 'Inernational Jew' were not destroyed by Jewry. It has only by its merciless power destroyed morally a man who would otherwise have been economically destroyed. Thus, the 'Ford case' is for us only a new challenge: just let Henry Ford's book find wide distribution among the German people!

"The claim of the Jewish press that Henry Ford has withdrawn his book naturally is not true!"

During the evening someone met Robote and gave him a hiding as a reprisal. The next day a student came into the Shiber Bank and said that the students demanded from the Jews two million Lei compensation because Robote had been beaten. "The Prefect of Dorna received in-
