PARIS SYNAGOGUE SERVICES FOR U. S. LEGIONNAIRES AT-TENDED BY MANY AMERICANS Representatives of American Embassy and French Government Present

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Paris, Sept. 19 .- Representatives of the American Embassy, the French government, prominent French Jews and leading American visitors attended the services held Saturday morning at the synagogue on Rue de la Victoire in honor of the American Legion. Rabbi Drevfus who efficiated recited

the Izkor, prayer for the dead, for the American soldiers who fell in the World war. The French and American hymns were rendered on the organ. Jewish veterans of the French army brought their banners to the synagogue during the services.

PALESTINE EMIGRATION IN JULY EXCEEDS IMMIGRATION Government Revenue Higher Than Expenditures, Report States

-(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Jerusalem, Sept. 19.-Strict economy was the continued policy of the Palestine government during the second quarter of the fiscal year 1927, according to financial figures made public today. The figures show that during the

three months. April May and June, the revenue of the Palestine government amounted to £471.746 while the expenditures came to only £457,804.

Immigration to the country continued during the month of July when 273 persons arrived, including 223 Jews. Emigration also continued, 618 persons having left Palestine during the month, of whom 383 were Jews.

CHICAGO JEWISH TEACHERS ASK PAY FOR HIGH HOLIDAYS

(Jewish Daily Bulletin) Chicago, Ill., Sept. 19-Jewish teach-

ers in the Chicago schools are negotiating with the school board to assure them their salaries during the coming

High Holidays.

Until last year, they always received full pay and it was considered a tradition which the Board of Education had observed for years. Last year, however, an exception was made and more than 200 Jewish teachers on the city payroll found their salaries deducted when they absented themselves from school during the holidays. Morris Eller, City Collector, has announced that he will champion the teachers' cause before Mayor William Hale Thompson.

'INTERNATIONAL JEW' STILL OBTAINABLE IN GERMANY: EXPLANATION DEMANDED "C. V. Zeitung" Asks Ford If He

Knows Book Is On Sale (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Berlin, Sept. 19.—Th advertising of Henry Ford's book, "The International which Mr. Ford in his letter to Louis Marshall promised would be withdrawn, is commented upon by the "C. V. Zeitung," the organ of the central organization of German Jews.

The Hammer Verlag, Theodor Fritsch's publishing house which issued the German translation of Ford's book. published an advertisement in the Boersenblatt stating that Ford has not withdrawn his book which is obtainable as hitherto, all press reports regarding the withdrawal of the book presiding judge declared that this was being untrue.

The "C. V. Zeitung" asks whether Henry Ford knows of this and agrees to it.

RABBI GETS SIX MONTHS FOR TEACHING BIBLE TO CHILDREN · IN RUSSIA (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Moscow, Sept 19 .- A sentence of six months imprisonment was imposed and later commuted to a fine of 50 roubles on the local rabbi of the town Romni, district of Poltava.

The rabbi was charged with teaching religion to Tewish children under sixteen. It was charged that the rabbi kept the children in the local Beth Hamidrash behind closed windows and locked doors, where he instructed them in the Bible and Talmud. He denied having taught the children, declaring that they studied themselves and referred to him only when they came across difficult passages.

One of the three synagogues in Kutelne, Zhitomir, was seized by the workers and will be converted into an artisan club following a long conflict between the religious congregation and the workers.

CHARGES DISCRIMINATION WAS PRACTICED IN HUNGA-RIAN ANTI-ALIEN RAIDS Case of Native Hungarian Jew Brought To Court

Budapest, Sept. 19 .- Discrimination agains lews in the recent raids on aliens in Hungary was brought to the attention of the Hungarian court in the case of Alfred Wohlstein, a native of Nagytapolsekany, a part of the territory which was severed from Hungary by the treaty of Trianon

Wohlstein appealed to the court against the deportation order. At the proceedings his attorney, Rendes, charged that notwithstanding the fact that Wohlstein is a native Hungarian, he was sent out of the country because he is a Jew. The impossible. In giving up the leader-ship of the Hakoah, Dr. Koerner strongly criticised the tendency that has developed among some of its members which he termed "denationalizing professionalism."

#### BUDAPEST JEWISH KEHILLAH OBTAINS \$1,000,000 LOAN FROM LONDON PRUDENTIAL CO.

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Budapest, Sept. 19.-The amount of

£200,000, the loan obtained by the Budapest Jewish community from the London Prudential Assurance Company, Ltd., through the agency of the British Overseas Bank, Limited, for the purpose of carrying out a number of building works. has 'een placed to the credit of the community in the Budapest bank.

The loan will be used for the purpose of building three synagogues, completing the construction of the secondary school for Jewish boys and girls, establishing a ewish hospital, two tenement houses. and a monument to the Jewish soldiers who fell in the Great War, which has been designed by Professor Rona.

Repayment will be made in seventy half-yearly payments at a rate of 8.7 per cent.

#### ANTI-SEMITES URGE LAWS AGAINST INTERMARRIAGE (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

### NEW BOOK PUBLISHED IN BOSTON MAKES A VICIOUS ATTACK ON AMERICAN JEWS

Barbaric Persecutions Advocates Reminiscent of Middle Ages

Vehement attacks on American lewry, culminating in proposals which recall the barbarism of the Middle Ages are contained in a book, "The Evil Religion Does" by Morrison L. Swift, published by the Liberty Press, Boston.

The book speaks of "Jerusalemizing the American mind." It also contains an attack on what it terms "Catholic anti-Americanism" and "Protestant anti-Americanism," and on the "Jewish atavism in the Christian churches.'

In the book Mr. Swift advocates: "Until the 'Jews' abolish their tribe, abandon 'Jewry,' drop their double citizenship, and merge as complete Americans, the following steps are imperative:

"The 'Jews' should be given a birth quota to limit their intemperate reproduction, for the same reason that their immigration is curtailed. Disregard of this birth quota should be followed by sterilization. Child produc-tion is a privilege, not a right, and depends on social sanction. The Jews could themselves exercise birth control by contraception, but they do the re-They propagate in monstrous verse. excess.

"Jewish immigration to the United States from any country should be entirely barred, not merely reduced," he continues. "The American right to discriminate among groups and nations and wholly exclude those that are for any reason unsuitable, is clear, absolue and obligatory. It is as sound a right as the debarment of undesired individuals. It is not invidious. simply affirms that the excluded are not a proper chemical for the American population-compound planned. The Jews could make themselves fit, as this book has shown, and refuse to do so. Therefore bar them out.

"All Jewish children, born already or hereafter in this country, should be excluded from citizenship.

"Newspaper owners are obliged to publish their names and degree of ownership as a measure of public protection. Since the Jews are undermining America by absorption of wealth and wealth-influence, business and professional Jews should not be allowed to hide their identity behind American or company names. All business and

professional Jews, large or small, should be required to publish on their signs, stationery, advertisements, etc., a word indicating their Jewishness; and business companies, corporations and the like, and the shares they own or represent.

"The 'Jews' have chosen the status they want; Americans should recognize and deal with that. They should debunk the Jews' prentenious farce that they can be Americans and also Iews. It is impossible.

The book strongly attacks the pro-Palestine movement and the support given it by American Jews. "Palestine where this antique Jewism is first to be restored," the author writes, "will be the base of action for breaking down modern culture and Judaizing civilization. It is mainly the money of rich American Jews derived from the great body of genuine Americans, that is enabling the Jews to do this subversive work. It is the duty of the American people to unite as an immovable barrier to further progress of the Jews in these lines and compel them completely to abandon their antimodern, anti-American policies and Jewishness, or to receive the status of complete aliens here. They must no longer trick and double-cross Americans by playing the two-faced part of Americans on the surface and Jews underneath.

"That no group, racial or otherwise shall build itself up as a separate tribe or nation in the United States is a fundamental American principle. The Jews under very bad leadership have elected to do it. To cast off their false leaders, cease their tribal practices, and merge with the rest as genuine Americans is now incumbent on them. If they refuse, they have no basis of complaint if they are treated as the intrinsic aliens they have elected to be, and are deprived of the privileges accorded only to true citizens. When this happens the Jews will, as always, raise the cry of persecution, race prejudice and religious bigotry, against Americans; but it is the Jews who are guilty, not Americans. For they are practising racial and religious bigotry when they decline to renounce Jewishness and become Americans in comfortable homes to answer the call of
