ROUMANIA REPORTS STATE New Parliament Session to Receive Government Bills

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Bucharest Oct. 10. - Legislation which will introduce favorable changes in the status of the Jewish population in Roumania as a result of the recent agreement concluded between the Liberal party and the Union of Roumanian lews, of which Dr. William Filderman is the leader, will be enacted during

the forthcoming session of parliament. it was learned to-day. According to well informed sources. the Roumanian cabinet has decided to submit a bill at the new session of parliament which will open Saturday,

regulating the status of alien religions. The government organ, "Cuvintul." states that the government is preparing a bill to revise the citizenship law which will in all likelihood enable 10,000 Roumanian Jews to become cit-

CRIMEA JEWISH POPULA-TION DECREASES: NUMBER OF COLONISTS GROWING (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Moscow, Oct. 12.-Seventy-two nationalities inhabit the peninsula of Crimea which has a population of 413,823, according to the official census of the Soviet authorities.

The Jewish population of Crimea numbers 39,921 representing 5.6 per cent. of the total population. Russians number 42.2 per cent and the Tartars 25.1 per cent. A comparison with the figures of

the census taken in 1921 shows that the Jewish population in Crimea has decreased 19.2 per cent. Simultaneously, the number of Jewish colonists in Crimea has increased from 1,000 in 1921 to 4.000.

WISE URGES FORD TO START COMMISSION FOR SCHOLARLY STUDY OF ANTI-JEWISH LIBELS

Christendom Owes It to Jew to Prevent Resurrection of Libel: 'Day' Criticises Suggestion

A suggestion to Henry Ford that, as a result of the withdrawal of his anti-Semitic charges, he make it possible for a commission to conduct a scholarly study of the literature of anti-Jewish libels, so that these libels may never be resurrec-ted, was made by Dr. Stephen S. Wise in a sermon delivered at the Free Synagogue. This sermon was the first public statement of the American Tewish Congress on Ford's recantation.

"Would it not add something of repa-

ration to his retraction." Dr. Wise declared in his sermon, "if he were to make it possible for a commission to make a scholarly study, if necessary over a term of years, of such anti-Jewish material as the 'Protocols of the Elders of Zion,' which could be adequately documeted and nevermore resurrected. A fully documented study of the rise and development of anti-Semitism is owing from Christendom to the Jew. Why should it be left to a Dr. Bloch to an-swer Professor Rohling in Vienna, or an Edward Lasker to answer Treitschke in Berlin? To make this possible is an opportunity of reparation, the use whereof would indeed be Henry Ford's distinc-

MAVROMMATIS, GREEK ENGI-NEER LOSES HIS CLAIM FOR JERUSALEM CONCESSION

Permanent Court of International Justice Upholds England (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

The Hague, Oct. 12 .- The claim of

the Greek engineer, M. Mavrommatis. for £217,000 damages alleged to have been caused through the British government's delay in the approval of his plans for the Jerusalem electrification concession which he held under a grant of the Ottoman government, failed today. The Permanent Court of International Justice, by a vote of seven to

four, upheld the objection taken by the British Government to the international court's jurisdiction to hear the Greek Government's claim against Great Britain for a violation of international obligation. Sir Douglas Hogg in arguing the

case before the court for the British Government, presented the contention that there might have been a breach of contract, but in no case was there a breach of international obligation. Consequently, the Courts of Palestine alone had jurisdiction. "Even admitting for the sake of argument," he said, "that it was a question of a breach of international obligation, that breach would not be one committed in the exercise of the powers of public control provided for in Article II of the Mandate, and that was the only case in which the Court was given jurisdiction."

Eighth Session of the Assembly of the League of Nations, in behalf of the Ioint Foreign Committee, the Alliance Israelite Universelle and the Jewish Colonization Association. Except in the matter of the Russian refugees, the Assembly and its various Commissions have not been directly

concerned with any Jewish questions, but Mr. Wolf availed himself of the opportunity of discussing all pending Jewish and minorities questions with the officials of the Secretariat and the diplomatists who are attending the Assembly as delegates of their respective countries. Among the matters dealt with are the qualifications of candidates for membership on the Council, the procedure for giving effect to the League's guarantees of the minorities treaties, the problem of the Staatenlose, the Roumanian memorandum on the Jewish question, the grievances of the Jews of Salonika and the numerus clausus law in Hungary. On the first and the last of these

questions. Mr. Wolf presented formal notes to the Secretariat. The first took the form of a renewal of the application made by the Joint Foreign Committee on September 13, 1926 for certain amendments to the regulations governing the election of new members of the council, the object being to render ineligible states in default in their obligations under the minorities treaties. Attention was drawn to the note in the official journal of the assembly on September 10, 1927 and copies were circulated among all the members.

With regard to the numerus clausus, Mr. Wolf called attention to the nonobservance by Hungary of the pledge given to the Council by Count Klebels-Clausus Law.

pit said, even as it says today: 'God pity and forgive Henry Ford; God . . . keep America true to the American hope of good-will and brotherhood among men'. "What shall be the attitude of Jews with respect to their defamers and op-

pressors, and, in the case of Henry Ford, publication was and is an act of defamation as it is ofttimes of the direst torms of oppression. I have an abhorrence of these Jewish politicians, in and out of the pulpit, who are forever, making capital, chiefly for themselves, out of every petty and obscure anti-lewish incident, whether it be the stupid jest of a fire-commissioner or the chance gesture of the exclusion of some Jew from a school or club or hotel. On the other hand, I have still a deeper abhorrence of those of my fellow-Jews, whose attitude to all insult and hurt to the Jew is sheer nihilism, not the quietism of high forbearance but the acquiescence of base indifference," Dr.

"From the beginning, I believed and declared that Mr. Ford was not only sadly misguided but wantonly misled. Some of my fellow-Jews chose to be silent on various grounds, adequate to themselves, such as: "Why advertise him?" One only spreads his libels. "The best thing is to ignore him." In the meantime, the "Protocols of the Elders of Scion-were going round the world, and probably material help from Marchad and the propaganda machinery associated with his name.
"Then one brawe soul arose, and he

put Henry Ford to the test. I do not go so far as to say that Aaron Sapiro put penitence into the heart of Henry Ford, but I will say that penitence and the retraction followed providentially upon the time when Sapiro insisted upon getting Mr. Ford to prove his charges to be true or else pay the penalty of their li-belous circulation. Well, Mr. Ford has withdrawn fully and it were unworthy to seek to ferret out motives. Whatever the circuitousness of the motivation, Aaron Sapiro's downright action had no small part in bringing something quite new into the age-old story of hurt done to the Jew; namely a complete and unreserved withdrawal of all charges, plus a sincere and ungrudging expression of repentance. Mr. Ford being one of the few foes and libellers of Israel, who has retracted.' "

PROFESSOR MOORE, FAMOUS AMERICAN BIBLE SCHOLAR, SEVENTY-SIX ON OCT. 15

Jewish scholars throughout the world will extend felicitations to Prof. George Foot Moore on October 15, when he

will attain his seventy-sixth birthday.

Since 1904, Prof. Moore has occupied the Chair of History of Religions at

the Chair of History of Religions at Harvard University.

Besides scores of scholarly studies on

Besides scores of scholarly studies on the Old Testament, Prof. Moore is the author of "Literature of the Old Testament." His monumental work, "History of Religions" was published several years ago.

His newest work, "Judaism in the First Centuries of the Christian Era, the Age of Tannaim", has recently been published by the Harvard University Press. This work is the outcome of studies extending over a period of thirty years and presents the problem in a new light, independent of the established doctrine of the superiority of Christianity over the contemporary religion of the Pharlases. Prof. Moore's "Judaism" is likely to destroy many of the current prejudices and misrepresentations concerning Rabbinto Judaism.

Jews are not sufficient. A commission has to institute an inquiry and issue a certificate to the Jews that they do not want to dominate the world, that they do not rule over the Christians, that they do not bleed the American farmers.

"The trouble with Dr. Wise is, with a considerable number of American Jewish leaders, that they still suffer from an inferiority complex in relation to the Christian world. Those Iews, however, who do not bow down when they come in contact with the non-Jewish world, are too proud to start a diamate with Henry Ford or with any other anti-Semite concerning the veracity of his libels. The Jews do not feel themselves accused and they have no reason to excuse themselves or to prove their innocence. Henry Ford has publicly recanted his anti-Semitic charges. He publicly stated that his anti-Jewish libels have no basis in fact. Jews have nothing more to do with this. By this act he has not become their brother, nor do they now consider him their enemy.
