"Manchester Guardian" Takes Sympathetic View of Zionists' Complaints on Mandatory's Attitude

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

London, Nov. 2.—The results of the Cleveland United Palestine Appeal conference and the lashing criticism of Dr. Stephen S. Wise against the British policy in Palestine, as well as the tenth anniversary of the Balfour Declaration today are being widely commented upon in the British press.

The "Manchester Guardian," commenting on the U. P. A. conference, remarks that the resolution adopted gives expression to the feelings agitating many Zionists. Weizmann has found on his present tour perplexity among Zionists and the Jewish colonists in Palestine over the lukewarm attitude of the Palestine government, the paper states. The Jews of Palestine are particularly dismayed because of the Syrian trade agreement which is driving Zionist industries from Palestine. They are also perturbed because of the fact that Palestine was not given Imperial preference. Palestine is treated as a Crown Colony without colonial advantages. Further, the non-allotment of state lands for Jewish colonization, the recent immigration ordinance, the communities ordinance and other problems are increasingly agitating the Palestine colonists.

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JEWISH ORIGIN OF MADAME LUPESCU IS EXPLOITED BY ANTI-CAROLIST MOVEMENT

Vienna, Nov. 2.—The Jewish origin of Madame Lupescu is a dominant argument in the propaganda of the anti-Carolists in the present turbulent days in Roumania, according to reports received here from Bucharest.

In newspapers and pamphlets campaigning against ex-Crown Prince Carol, it is being argued that a man who left his fatherland and renounced the crown because of his love for a Jewess is not worthy to ascend the throne.

Madame Lupescu issued a denial that she is of Jewish origin. Notwithstanding this, rumors of her being Jewish are spread among the peasants in Roumania.

AMERICAN JEWS INVESTED OVER \$67,000,000 IN SYNA- GOGUES SINCE 1925, IS CLAIM

Writer Says Value of Jewish Religious Edifices Has More than Doubled Since 1919

That American Jews have spent \$67,462,640 for erection of synagogues and temples since January 1925 is asserted in "The Reflex," in an article by Uriah Z. Engelman.

This sum, according to the article, is more than twice the total value of all the Jewish religious edifices in the United States in 1919 when the last religious census was taken. In 1919 the total value of the 874 Jewish religious edifices recorded by the census amounted to \$31,012,576. The sum of \$67,462,640 does not account for all synagogues and temples erected as information from 15 states was not available.

What is the reason for this enormous outlay in view of the known decline of religious enthusiasm among the American Jews? asks "The Reflex" writer. "The answer," he says, "is in the changed function of the synagogue and temple. The latter is no longer the old-fashioned place of worship. It has become the rich man's club. The synagogue has ceased to be a place to commune with the Maker. Like the exclusive club its purpose it to provide the proper back-

DINNER TO LORD BALFOUR ON DECLARATION ANNIV- ERSARY POSTPONED TO NOV. 10

London Weekly Urges Statesman to Interpret Document; Disappointment in Present British Policy Voiced

London, Nov. 2.—The dinner which the Anglo-Palestine Club arranged to mark the Tenth Anniversary of the Balfour Declaration, with Lord Balfour as the guest of honor, has been postponed from tonight, the anniversary of the Declaration, to November 10th, so that Dr. Weizmann, who is in Palestine, may attend.

Among those expected to be present at the dinner are the Marquis of Reading, Sir Herbert Samuel, Major Ormsby Gore, Sir Alfred Mond, Sir Gilbert Clayton, Sir Wyndham Deedes, Philip Snowden, Colonel Josiah Wedgwood, Commander Kenworthy and J. L. Garvin editor of the "Observer." James de Rothschild will preside.

Commenting on the dinner in honor of Lord Balfour, the London "Jewish Chronicle" writes:

"The Anglo-Palestinian Club proposes to celebrate the Tenth Anniversary of the Balfour Declaration by entertaining to dinner the author of that historic document. Nothing could be more appropriate, and nothing besides could be more in accord with Jewish sentiment than this mark of appreciation to a Statesman who, approaching the Jewish question from, naturally, the non-Jewish point of view, perceived the anomaly of the present Jewish position and the value to humanity of Jews becoming once again a nation in the political sense. 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ARTHUR SAMUEL, SCION OF OLD ANGLO-JEWISH FAMILY, APPOINTED TO HIGH POST

London, Nov. 2.—Arthur Samuel, Minister of Overseas Trade, was appointed financial secretary of the treasury. Mr. Samuel succeeds MacNeill who was appointed to fill Lord Cecil's post.

Mr. Samuel now becomes Churchill's first lieutenant and this new position is invariably regarded as a stepping stone to the cabinet.

The London press comments favorably on the appointment, all praising Samuel's ability and referring to his being of an old Jewish family, in which he takes pride. The family dates back to the time of Cromwell's readmission of the Jews to England.

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JEWISH FLORIST NAMES NEW SPECIES "COOLIDGE ROSE"

Chicago, Nov. 2—Years of toil were consummated the other day with the presentation by Alexander Shapiro of Shapiro and Daskal, a Chicago firm of florists, to President and Mrs. Coolidge in Washington, of a new species of rose. The rose has been named after the president.

The development of the "Coolidge Rose" started accidentally. Several years ago Mr. Daskal and Mr. Shapiro discovered an exceptionally beautiful rose and they decided to take cuttings for a new plant. At that time they had no intention of perfecting a new species. But the growth of the rose bush was so beautiful, that they decided to experiment with it. Many of their choicest experiments "reverted to type," the bane of botanists. But some of the plants went "true" and using these as a basis, a new species of rose was developed. Years of work, the strengthening of the strain so that it could be transplanted from the hot house to the outdoors was finally crowned with success. The two florists decided to dedicate the rose to the executive and first lady of the land.

When in Washington attending a recent convention of florists, Mr. Shapiro visited the White House and presented the rose to President Coolidge. Mr. Shapiro was thanked by the president and it is expected that a choice "Coolidge Rose" bush will be planted in the hot house attached to the Executive mansion.

TWO CHICAGO TEMPLES WILL BE AMALGAMATED

Chicago, Ill., Nov. 2—Rabbi Abraham Hirschberg of Temple Sholom verified a report that an amalgamation is being considered by the two largest and wealthiest Jewish congregations in Chicago; his temple, which is situated on the north side of the city, and Sinai Temple, located on the south side, of which Dr. Louis Mann is rabbi.

The rabbi said that although nothing definite has been done, board members of both congregations are considering the sale of the present sites of their two temples and the building of a magnificent structure in the loop or the near North side for the joint use of the north and south side Jews.

It is understood that each congregation is to have its own community house and other services, one group north and the other south, with all Sabbath and Holiday services in the downtown temple.

These plans come as a surprise particularly as far as Temple Sholom is concerned. That congregation has just completed work on its new \$250,000 temple and community center. The desire of Sinai temple to move is not unexpected. The present temple and community center is situated on Grand Boulevard in the center of what is now the negro district of Chicago. Negotiations have been going on for some time with negro groups for the sale of the buildings. It was understood that Sinai congregation, of which Julius Rosenwald is one of the leading members and officers, would erect a series of buildings in the South Shore districts several miles south and east of its present location.

The two congregations, the wealthiest in Chicago, are in a financial position to acquire an expensive loop site and erect one of the finest temple-office buildings in the world.

DR. WEIZMANN EXPECTED IN LONDON ON FRIDAY

London, Nov. 2—Dr. Chaim Weizmann, president of the World Zionist Organization, is expected to arrive here on Friday.

It was stated that he will report to the Executive on his negotiations with Lord Plumer, Palestine High Commissioner, concerning the Syrio-Palestine agreement. Palestine Jewish manufacturers have complained that the agreement will affect adversely the industries of Palestine.

Louis Marshall, Rabbi Stephen S. Wise and Samuel Untermyer have endorsed the candidacy of Henry L. Sherman, Democratic nominee for Supreme Court Justice, it was announced.

BACK-TO-LAND MOVEMENT IS FURTHERED IN GERMANY

Berlin, Oct. 16 — A mass meeting under the auspices of the Union of Jewish Ex-Soldiers in Germany was held here last night in connection with the campaign of the Union for the settlement of German Jews on the land in Germany.

Representatives of many Jewish organizations were present, including Professor Tuerk, Eugen Caspary, and others representing the Board of the Berlin Jewish Community, Leo Wolf, President of the Federation of Jewish Communities in Prussia, Dr. Alfred Neumeyer, President of the Federation of Jewish Communities of Bavaria, Dr. Martin Rosenbluth, Vice-President of the German Zionist Federation, Dr. M. Wishnitzer, Secretary of the Hilfsverein der Deutschen Juden, Wilhelm Graetz, President of the Ort in Germany, S. Adler-Rudel, of the Jewish Emigrant Welfare Centre, as well as representatives of the Central Union of German Citizens of the Jewish Faith, the Joint Distribution Committee, the Jewish Health Federation Ore, the Union for Combating anti-Semitism, the Jewish Students' Federation, the German Federation of Rabbis, the Federation of Jewish Teachers, a number of Jewish fraternal societies, Jewish youth organizations, etc., as well as many Jewish farmers.

Dr. Leo Loewenstein, President of the Union of Jewish Ex-Soldiers, who was in the chair, said that the German Jews had fought and bled for the German soil and had a right to settle on it. The Union of Jewish Ex-Soldiers stood in the van of the fight against anti-Semitism and for full equal rights for the German Jews. All sections of German Jewry were united in favor of the idea of Jewish land settlement on German soil.

Professor Franz Oppenheimer, who delivered the principal address, said that the German Jews had paid heavily for their German soil. 12,000 Jews had laid down their lives during the war fighting for Germany. The Jewish soldiers went to the front as Germans to defend their native land, but after the war hatred of the Jews had grown more intense than ever. The Jews had been settled in Germany longer than the Germans. Whatever the Jews received in Germany, they repaid a thousand-fold in spiritual values. The task for German Jewry now was land settlement. The troubles of the world had arisen as a result of the movement away from the land to industry, and the results were competition and imperialist complications. By settling on the land the Jews would be helping to solve a German problem and also to maintain Judaism. The Jews did not want to die out as people.

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ground on which to set off the changing economic status of the American Jew."

The records to which Mr. Engelman has had access show that 274 such edifices have been erected since 1924. Distributing the new buildings according to states and cities, he writes, "we find New York State heading the list with 77 new houses of worship. Pennsylvania follows with 30; New Jersey with 23; Illinois records 19; Massachusetts 17; Ohio 12; Maryland and Florida each 10; California 9; Connecticut and Virginia each 8; Texas 6; the other states four, three or less.

"Of the cities, New York carries off the honors with 25 new synagogues and temples, Brooklyn, including Long Island, follows next with 22 new houses for religious services. Philadelphia comes third with 10, and Baltimore fourth with five. The fifth place is claimed by New Orleans with four temples. The sixth place is shared by a group of cities, none of which had built during this period more than 3 temples or synagogues. In this group, are included Cleveland, O., Stamford, Conn., Los Angeles and San Francisco, Cal., Passaic, N. J., Utica, N. Y., Boston, Mass., Miami and Jacksonville, Fla. The rest of the cities claim only one or two new temples to their record."

Of the \$40,180,000 recorded spent on 162 new temples during the last two years and eight months, New York State contributed \$16,915,000, or 42.1 per cent. of the total amount spent by American Jewry. New York City alone spent \$11,325,000 or 68.1 per cent. of the state's expenditure; Brooklyn, \$2,810,000 or 16.6 per cent; Long Island, \$1,160,000 or 6.9 per cent; while the other 11 cities in New York State which reported new religious edifices, have spent only \$1,420,000 or 8.4 per cent. of the amount spent by the state.

Next in importance comes the state of Pennsylvania with an expenditure of \$4,470,000 or 11.1 per cent. of the national total. Of the amount spent by the state, Philadelphia contributed \$2,875,000 or 64.3 per cent. Illinois follows a close third with an expenditure of \$4,335,000 or 10.78 per cent. of the national total. Almost the entire amount was spent by Chicago Jews, only \$250,000 or less than six per cent.

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amous letter to Lord Rothschild which stirred Jewry to the very depth of its soul—or at least so much of Jewry that really matters—little has been done in laying the foundations of the contemplated National Home for the Jewish people, and that little but doubtfully, cannot rightly be blamed upon the man chiefly responsible for the promise he conveyed to the Jews.

"What precisely he meant by that promise, or what the Government in whose name he wrote, wished to be understood by it is now of little more than academic consequence. Certainly the Churchill Memorandum which was as much a defeat of Lord Balfour's expressed policy as it was a set back to Zionist aspirations, cannot be the answer. Yet the Memorandum is law to the Mandatory administration in Palestine. Not the constitution as a nation in the political (or for that matter any other) sense of Jews in Palestine, but their recognition there just as everywhere else as a religious community, seems to be the idea to which the Balfour Declaration and the Mandate have been whittled down. For that the British Government, though by no means entirely, is largely responsible; and it therefore would be of great advantage if Lord Balfour, who is a member of the Government, could be induced to take the opportunity of the forthcoming gathering to explain how he thinks things will be got back to the level of ten years ago in respect to the Jews in relation to Palestine. For as matters stand the prospects are not very brilliant, even to those who, like ourselves, nourish the belief that Jews are just as capable as are Englishmen of muddling through somehow.

"It may be that our suggestion would involve far too heavy a task to be imposed upon an honored guest at a complimentary dinner. But someone ought to endeavor to make the point clear, and there is, of course, no one who is likely to be so able to do so as is Lord Balfour. In any case the festive reunion of the Club should not induce anyone to ignore the real condition of the Jews in Palestine.

"The facts show that the crisis in Palestine is much more Jewish than general, and render it very questionable whether we have a right to regard as so many of us do the Balfour Declaration. Was it something substantial and tangible, a real permanent light in the political heavens, and does it so still exist? Or was it but a nebula that illumined the sky ten years ago but is now fast resolving into mere gaseous haze? As a tribute to a great and honored personality, a rare and true friend of our people, the dinner that is to be given to Lord Balfour is ad-

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hailed with so little enthusiasm as the one occurring today, the 'Manchester Guardian' declares.

The London 'Morning Post' takes this occasion to continue its anti-Zionist campaign. The 'Post' declares that Zionism after ten years, when hopes ran high, is bankrupt. In 1917 the Jews thought that they were becoming an emancipated people in a country where they were the rulers by right and fact. The interval has unfolded a cruel tale of infinite disappointment. Even in 1925 it seemed possible that the Jews would outnumber the Arabs even during the present generation. Sensible Zionists now realize that the Jewish National Home was built on insecure foundations. Resentment is therefore being manifested in Palestine, America and elsewhere against the government which has granted the Balfour Declaration. Few good words are heard today for the Mandatory power from unofficial Zionists in Palestine. Despair has seized most of the colonists, the paper declares.

Commenting on the editorial of the 'Manchester Guardian,' Dr. Wise stated to the representative of the Jewish Daily Bulletin.

"However distressing the whole business be, it is satisfying to find that the 'Manchester Guardian,' which, by its great editor, C. P. Scott, and his cooperation with Weizmann, did more than any other organ of public opinion in England for the Zionist cause, revealing so clear an understanding of the problems and the perplexities which face the Jewish settlers of Palestine and Zionism throughout the world at this time. I might have cited many illustrations in the course of my address at the Cleveland conference, such as the Syrian Trade Agreement, to which the 'Manchester Guardian' understandingly and sympathetically refers. The truth is, with respect to the Syrian trade agreement, as was disclosed by a series of sessions of the political commission of the Zionist Congress at Basle, there are only two alternatives, one that the British government is acting wholly without regard to the economic necessities of Palestine and its infant industries or else that our representatives in and out of Palestine have not presented the Zionist case with intelligence and firmness.

"Nothing expresses the case more clearly than the word of the 'Guardian': 'Palestine is treated as a Crown Colony without colonial advantages.' Palestine does not wish to be treated as a Crown Colony with colonial advantages. Surely, it must not be treated as a Crown Colony without colonial advantages and that is substantially what is happening today. It may be that the political leadership in England feels it is equal to the necessities of the situation, without the proffered cooperation of Zionists in other lands. I do not believe it is. If I had to summarize the situation in one sentence on this tenth anniversary of the Balfour Declaration it would be: 'The British government has not done enough to facilitate the establishment in Palestine of a Jewish Homeland; the political leadership of the Zionist movement has not done enough to move the mandatory government to fulfill in spirit the terms of the Balfour Declaration; the Jews of the world have not done enough for our fellow Jews in Palestine, whom, politically morally and materially we have left unsustained by the full resources of the Jewish people in the supreme hour of opportunity and of challenge.'" Dr. Wise declared.

American Jews Invested \$67,000,000 in Synagogues Since 1925

California's investment of \$3,085,000 (7.7 per cent of the national total) is almost entirely divided between San Francisco and Los Angeles, the former city \$1,625,000, and the latter \$1,410,000. Among the states whose expenditures are above the million mark, are included Massachusetts with an expenditure of \$1,500,000 of which Boston claimed \$1,040,000; Ohio with an investment of \$1,225,000 of which Cincinnati spent \$800,000; New Jersey with an expenditure of \$1,015,000 of which Passaic spent \$420,000, and Connecticut with an expenditure of \$1,005,000 of which New Haven spent \$300,000.

Work will start immediately after the breaking of ground for the construction of a school building to cost \$50,000 next door to the Temple Beth Israel of Albany Park, Chicago. The congregation voted for the three-story structure which will contain in addition to class rooms, a reception hall, kitchen, library, and an assembly hall capable of seating 200 persons. At the recent Tom Kipper services, upon the appeals of Rabbi S. Felix Mendelsohn and Mr. Lee E. Lowitz, president of the congregation, the members subscribed the final \$20,000 necessary to assure the erection of the building. Temple Beth Israel is the oldest Jewish congregation in Albany Park, a district situated in the northwest section of Chicago. It was formed in 1917.

LONDON BOARD TO PETITION LEAGUE FOR STAATENLOSE (J. T. A. Mail Service)

London, Oct. 23. — O. E. d'Avigdor Goldsmid, President of the Jewish Board of Deputies, presided at the meeting of the Board today.

The Joint Foreign Committee submitted a report on Lucien Wolf's mission to Geneva during the Eighth Session of the Assembly of the League of Nations and the Forty-sixth Session of the Council which were held concurrently in Sept. Among the matters dealt with by Mr. Wolf were the question of the Staatenlose and the Hungarian Numerus Clausus Law. No satisfactory plans have yet been proposed for remedying the position of the Staatenlose, because the question was complicated by the presence of the Minority States. Mr. Wolf advised a petition to the League under the Nationality Clauses of the Minorities Treaties.

With regard to the Numerus Clausus in Hungary, a letter was addressed to the League of Nations calling attention to the failure of Hungary to fulfill the obligations into which she entered in December 1925.

Mr. Wolf stated that in the meantime he had been informed that the Hungarian Government agreed to submit to Parliament a Bill for eliminating paragraph 3 of the Numerus Clausus Law.

The fourth annual campaign of the Jewish Community chest of Vancouver, B.C. was launched on Oct. 23. Under the leadership of William N. Zimmerman and William J. Levin, they are aiming to collect more than \$15,000 this year.

There are more than 20 charities that the chest donates to, among them are: Vancouver Hebrew Aid, Talmud Torah, Winnipeg Jewish Orphanage and Old Folks Home, Denver Consumptive Home, Rabbi Isaac Elchanan Theological Seminary in New York and also Palestinian societies. This year an added beneficiary to the chest will be the United Jewish Campaign which will receive a large donation. For the past three years since the chest was organized, it has proven satisfactory to Vancouver Jewry. More than \$12,000 in cash has been collected annually.

For saving the lives of two women from drowning last summer, Samuel Zacks, nineteen year old Jewish boy, of Vancouver, B.C. was presented the Royal Humane Society's Parchment Certificate for bravery.

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
