

**LITHUANIAN PREMIER WON'T  
SEE JEWISH DELEGATION WHO  
ASKED PROTECTION FOR JEWS**  
18 Students and Workers Arrested on Charge of Communism  
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Kovno, Nov. 5. — Eighteen Jewish students and workers were arrested today on the charge of holding membership in a secret Communist organization, an official statement issued by the authorities here declares.

Fearing in the country runs high and excitement is prevalent in many cities. Rumors are afloat that preparations are being made for an anti-Jewish pogrom in the city of Schavel. A delegation of the Schavel Kehillah called on the Prime Minister, asking for an audience in order to urge the government to take measures to prevent riots. The premier refused to receive the delegation.

**FULLER PUTS JEWISH WOMAN  
ON MASSACHUSETTS COUNCIL**  
(Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Boston, Mass., Nov. 3.—Mrs. Esther Andrews, for the last twenty-five years an outstanding political figure in the state, was appointed by Governor Fuller to a seat on the Governor's Council.

Governor Fuller appointed Mrs. Andrews to fill the vacancy caused by the death of Charles Sumner Smith. Mrs. Andrews polled the second highest vote to Councillor Smith in the last Council election in the Third District. She is the first woman to receive this nomination.

Mrs. Andrews served as a member of the advisory board to the bureau of prisons under the then Governor Coolidge, and acted as its chairman in 1919. She was active in the development of juvenile delinquency laws in this State and was mainly responsible, while chairman of the Council of Jewish Women in 1906, in having the Boston Juvenile Court established in that year.

**SOVIET COURT FINES GRAND-  
PARENTS FOR CIRCUMCISING  
CHILD DESPITE PARENTS' WISH**  
Tragedy of Jewish Life in Russia Unfolds Before Court  
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Moscow, Nov. 5.—One of the stirring tragedies of Jewish life under the Soviet regime was unfolded in court yesterday when a son and daughter sued their parents for bringing the grandson into the "Covenant of Abraham."

His wife, Riva, non-partisan, summoned his parents, Abba Lipman, a shoemaker, and his wife Henye, both 50; and the wife's parents, Moses Fishman, a barber, 62, and his wife, Tolze, 60, to court for having their grandchild circumcised secretly two weeks after his birth.

It developed in court that the grandparents on both sides had urged their son and daughter to have the newly born son circumcised. The parents, however, refused. One day when Lipman was at work and his wife had gone to market, the grandparents brought a Mohel and had the circumcision performed according to ritual.

The Soviet court fined the elder Lipmans 40 roubles and the Fishmans 60 roubles. The grandparents confessed to the act, declaring that they did not consider it a crime but a religious duty. When asked to divulge the name of the Mohel they refused, offering the explanation that they had found him in the synagogue and paid him 3 roubles for his services.

**HOLLAENDER, GERMAN JEWISH  
LEADER, CONDEMNS 'KING OF  
KINGS' FILM; JEWISH MENACE**  
Showing of Picture in Eastern Europe Will Lead to Violence  
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Berlin, Nov. 5.—The exhibition of Cecil de Mille's moving picture, "King of Kings" in East European countries will be fatal for the safety of the Jewish population. This is the opinion of Dr. Ludwig Hollaender, director of the Central Verein Deutschen Staatsburger des Juedischen Glaubens, writing today in the "C. V. Zeitung."

The showing of this film will increase the danger of the growth of anti-Semitism in Eastern Europe and will incite the ignorant population to violence, Dr. Hollaender declares. He comments in particular on what he terms the shameful fact that the Schildkrauts, father and son, are playing in the picture, in the roles of Caiphas and Judas.

**JEWISH STUDENTS, SMART-  
ING UNDER INSULTS, CHAL-  
LENGE MAGYARS TO DUEL**  
Anti-Semites Leave As Jews Return at Government's Invitation  
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Budapest, Nov. 5.—The first day after the return of Jewish students to their classes in the Budapest University and other Hungarian colleges at the invitation of the government found the situation as uncertain as it was before.

Notwithstanding the disciplinary measures threatened by the heads of the colleges, the Hungarian students walked out of the lecture rooms on Friday, leaving the Jewish students alone.

Two duels fought successfully by Jewish students and 8 more duels which are to follow are the result of the anti-Semitic agitation carried on by the Hungarian students in protest against the proposed modification of the numerus clausus law.

Following the recent anti-Semitic manifestations arranged by the Hungarian student organization, Turul, two Jewish students, Bela Glasner and Stefan Kiraly, in typical Magyar fashion, challenged the Turul to delegate two of its members to fight a duel with them because of the insults to the Jewish students. The Turul asked its chairman, Ladislaus Philipp and Franz Bence, to accept the challenge in defense of the organization's honor. Philipp fought Glasner and Bence, Kiraly. Glasner inflicted a sabre blow on Philipp's head, cutting his face from forehead to chin. The duel between Kiraly and Bence ended in a draw, although Bence was slightly wounded. Encouraged by this outcome, 8 Jewish students issued challenges to the Turul. These challenges have been accepted.

**ANTI-SEMITIC PLOT BARED  
WITHIN COMMUNIST BODY**  
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Moscow, Nov. 5.—A secret group called the "Russian National Union," having the spread of anti-Semitism as its purpose, existed within the Komsomol, the Communist youth organization. This was disclosed in the course of the All Union Conference of the Jewish Sections of the Communist Party.

It was learned that the program of the "Russian National Union" was to combat the policy of the Communist party with regard to non-Russian nationals and specifically to fight Jews in Russia and Jewish influence in the Union of Socialist Soviet Republics.

**RATSKESKY GIVES \$200,000 TO BOSTON JEWISH HOSPITAL**  
 Jewish Daily Bulletin:

Boston, Mass., Nov. 5.—C. Ratskesky, who last year gave \$100,000 to the Beth Israel Hospital fund, contributed a sum of \$200,000 at the "Victory Dinner" of the hospital held at the Hotel Statler. Mr. Ratskesky's gift is for a building of the hospital in memory of his brother, I. A. Ratskesky.

Eleven hundred guests paid \$250 a plate at the dinner launching the hospital's campaign for \$300,000.

The building to be erected with a gift of Mr. Ratskesky, will be known as the "Ratskesky Home." It will provide for about sixty private patients; it will also make it possible to devote the twenty-one private rooms in the new Beth Israel Hospital exclusively to maternity cases.

Governor Fuller, the principal speaker at the dinner, characterized the hospital as "the most significant enterprise ever conducted by the Jewish people of this Commonwealth, one that fills a crying need in this city." Henry Penn was toastmaster.

A course in Comparative Religion will be given by Dr. Dora Askowitch at the Jewish Institute of Religion, New York, on Sunday afternoon.

The course will comprise a study of the origin, development and historical evolution of the various religious systems from primitive times to the present time. Special emphasis will be placed upon the comparative study of religious material gathered by Dr. Askowitch during her research work abroad, especially in Palestine.

**YIDDISH LANGUAGE CHAIR ENDOWED AT HEBREW UNIVERSITY BY 'DAY,' N. Y. PAPER**  
 Dr. Magnes Accepts Chair on Behalf of Trustees at Dinner

A chair in the Yiddish language and literature is to be established at the Hebrew University in Jerusalem through the efforts of "The Day," New York Yiddish newspaper. This was announced at a dinner given last night at the Hotel Commodore.

Dr. Joseph L. Magnes, Cancellor of the Hebrew University, accepted the chair on behalf of the trustees of the University.

A fund of \$100,000 is to be raised by "The Day" through public subscription to endow the chair at the University. A sum of \$50,000 has been guaranteed by the newspaper.

David Shapiro, publisher of "The Day" opened the fund with a donation of \$10,000. The speakers at the dinner besides Dr. Magnes were Reuben Brainin and David Pliskin. Dr. Samuel Margoshes, editor of "The Day" acted as toastmaster.

In accepting the chair for the Hebrew University Dr. Magnes said: "I have been asked the question here and I am confident that it will be asked in Palestine why the Hebrew University is desirous of having a chair in the Yiddish language and literature. It will be sufficient explanation to say that Yiddish is the language of a large part of the Jewish people today and that it has been the language of large numbers of Jews in Central and Eastern Europe for many centuries. This fact alone would make Yiddish an interesting and important subject of study in any university. That it has not thus far been granted its proper place in any university shows again how greatly the materials and documents of Jewish culture have been neglected by scholarship."

The New Orleans Community Chest of the Agencies, including Protestant, Catholic, and non-sectarian organizations, has approved the Jewish Federated Agencies Budget of \$12,000. The total Budget of the Chest is \$22,400. It was estimated that the Jews of the Community last year contributed \$20,000 to the Chest.

Max Reinhardt and his company of celebrities came, including Alexander Moisey, Lita Doraz, Salena, Harmann and Hans Theilmann, Paul Hermann, Hans Moser, and Dagna Ferras, sailed for New York on the "Deutschland." They will open the Max Reinhardt Season of repertory November 15th at the Century Theatre.

Bernard G. Richards, secretary of the American Jewish Congress, has sailed for New York after spending three months in Europe. While abroad Mr. Richards established the office of the Council on Jewish Rights and was present at the Schwarzhart trial for the American Jewish Congress.

**'LET JEWS JUDGE ME BY MY FUTURE ACTS,' FORD SAID WHEN HE SIGNED APOLOGY**  
 Affixed His Signature Without Reading Document, Palma Reveals

Henry Ford signed his retraction of his anti-Jewish charges without even having read its contents, declaring "No matter how strong it is, it could not be too strong." This was revealed by Joseph A. Palma, Chief of the Government Secret Service, who addressed the congregation of Shul Temple the Bronx, New York, on events which led up to Henry Ford's apology.

Mr. Palma had told of the part he played in bringing about the apology from Mr. Ford and conferees he had had with Louis Marshall and others, on authority from the inventor, which led to the drawing up of the apology by Mr. Marshall.

"When I took the unsigned retraction to Mr. Ford in his plant in Detroit," Mr. Palma went on, "I said to him: 'Mr. Ford, this is pretty strong and I suggest that you read it over carefully before you sign it.' Mr. Ford took it from me, and, as he started to sign it without even reading it, he said: 'Joe, no matter how strong it is, it could not be too strong.' Then he told me that he wanted to convey to the Jewish people his sincere desire to undo a great wrong. 'Let the Jews judge me by my acts in the future,' he said."

Mr. Palma said that he first became acquainted with Mr. Ford in 1917 when Mr. Palma was in charge of the Western Division of the Secret Service. The Government had seized 45,000 bushels of wheat for war purposes in the Ford farm at Dearborn. He went on, but there had been some question regarding how it was to be gotten off the farm without trespassing on an adjoining farm. The speaker said that he had obtained the consent of the adjoining farmer after having appealed to his patriotism. Later, he said, when he met Mr. Ford for the first time in his plant and told him of how he had induced the farmer to permit the movement of the wheat, Mr. Ford became excited and started to upbraid him.

"We had a hot argument, and then he cooled down, saying, 'Joe, we ought to be good friends—both of us are of the same temperament.' I didn't see him again until years later when I had to call on him about something that was published in his paper in connection with the personnel of my department. I had made an investigation of the complaint of a disgruntled discharged employe and when I saw Mr. Ford in Detroit I complained that I felt an injustice had been done."

## STUDENTS ENROLL AT JEWISH THEOLOGICAL SEMINARY

All of the students of the Jewish Theological Seminary who received the Rabbinical Diplomas last June have been elected to positions, Dr. Cyrus Adler, President, reported to the meeting of the Board of Directors held this week.

The report showed that 32 students were admitted into the Rabbinical Department of the Seminary, making a total registration, exclusive of the Post Graduate Department, of 82. There are now enrolled 28 candidates for the degree of Doctor of Hebrew Literature and 2 for the Rabbinical Degree.

In the Teachers Institute of the Seminary, where registration is still taking place, and final figures are not available, there is at present an enrollment of 391 students, divided as follows: In the Main Department, 171, 79 of whom are new students; in the Post-Graduate Department, 16; and in the Israel Friedlaender Classes, 200.

The seminary received bequests totalling \$13,750.

He replied: 'Whatever you say, I'll do.'

### Quebec Jewish School Question Comes before Privy Council

(By our Montreal Correspondent)

Montreal, Nov. 3.—The legal representatives who are arrayed to defend various issues in the argument before the Privy Council on the appeal regarding the rights of Jews in the Protestant and other schools of the Province of Quebec, have left for England. It is expected that the Privy Council will hear the case about the middle of this month and reach a decision in time so that any necessary legislation may be passed at the next session of the Quebec Legislature, which meets in Quebec City in January.

The appeal has been taken by the majority of Jewish members of the Special Commission appointed by the Lieutenant-Governor of Quebec three years ago to report upon educational matters in Montreal. These members are represented by Peter Bercovitch, K. C., M. L. A. and Louis S. St. Laurent, K. C. With them will be associated Sir John Simon, K. C., outstanding member of the British Bar, and Frank Gahan, British barrister.

The respondents upon the appeal, the Protestant and Catholic Board of Commissioners, are represented by George A. Campbell, K. C., J. J. Creelman, K. C., and D. N. Pritt, London barrister, for the Protestant Board; and Antonia Perrault, K. C., for the Catholic School Board.

Louis Fitch, K. C., will represent Alderman Schubert, who filed a minority report when the Special Commission made its findings. Mr. Fitch will contend the right of Jewish tax-payers to have a third panel which would control and administer a separate system of schools for Jewish children.

The Protestant Board of School Commissioners, in whose schools Jewish children of Montreal are educated, are mainly concerned about Protestant control of Protestant education in the Province of Quebec. They urge what the Act of the Quebec Legislature passed in 1903 to give to Jews the same rights and privileges as Protestants in the matters of education was unconstitutional as invading the rights of Protestants to control their own educational system. This right was secured to them at Confederation, they claim, and the Quebec Act violates the provisions of the British North America Act.

The Catholic School Board is concerned in the right of the Provincial Legislature to establish a third school panel which is neither Roman Catholic nor Protestant. It opposes the right of the Provincial Legislature to pass such an act, which it also claims would vio-

Dr. Wise stated further that the Congress was represented at the Schwartzbard trial by Mr. Bernard G. Richards, executive secretary of the American Jewish Congress.

late the provisions of the Constitution.

A fourth party which will participate in this very interesting and vital case will be the Attorney-General of Quebec, who will be represented by Charles Lancot, K. C., Deputy Attorney-General. The Provincial Government takes no sides in this issue, but seeks to have the Privy Council tell what kind of legislation can be properly passed in educational matters.

The Protestant Committee of the Council of Public Instructions, which did not take any part when the case was up in the Canadian Courts, has, however, obtained permission to intervene in the discussion before the Privy Council. This Committee is concerned with the right of Protestants to exclusive control of Protestant schools and education. Eugene Lafleur, K. C., will represent the Protestant Committee.

The rulings of the Privy Council will decide whether or not Jewish tax-payers have a right of representation on the Protestant Board of School Commissioners, in whose schools Jewish children are being educated; and also whether or not the Provincial Government has a right to create a third school panel, a Jewish panel, which would control and administer a separate system of schools for Jewish children.
