JEWISH STUDENTS LEAVE CLASSROOM WHEN TEACHER PREACHES ANTI-SEMITISM

Action of Berlin Professor Denounced
By Liberal Press

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Berlin, Nov. 10.—An incident in the Law School of the University of Berlin recalling the events at the Hungarian universities, has attracted wide attention in the German press.

During his lecture, Professor Moeller urged that both the Catholic and Protestant students join a movement aiming to expel the Jews from the fatherland. The Jewish students left the hall in protest against the Professor's remark, whereupon the professor shouted after them: "Don't return."

The liberal newspapers demand that the authorities do not suffer a situation similar to that in Budapest.

LOS ANGELES COMMUNITY CHEST IS SUPPORTED BY CLERGY OF ALL CREEDS (Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Los Angeles, Nov. 10.—The clergy of Los Angeles has united in the support of the \$2750,000 Community Chest drive now in its full swing in this city, its object being to secure the 1928 minimum budget for 150 welfare agencies of Los Angeles, Jewish organizations among others.

A proclamation, signed by church heads of the city, has been issued urging support of the Chest. Dr. E. P. Ryland, executive secretary of the Church Federation of Los Angeles, Rt. Rev. W. B. Stephens, Episcopal bishop coadjutor of Los Angeles, Rt. Rev. J. J. Cantwell, Catholic bishop of Los Angeles and San Diego, and Rabbi Edgar F. Magnin of Temple B'nai B'rith are the signers of the proclamation with its plea for unity of faiths and denominations in humanitarian work.

NATIONALITIES' PALACE CORNERSTONE IS LAID

Moscow, Nov. 10.—The cornerstone for the nationalities palace, a building designed to exemplify the cultural achievements of the national minorities in Soviet Russia, was laid yesterday as a part of the celebrations of the tenth anniversary of the Bolshevik revolution.

The building is to be the headquarters for the cultural organizations of the various nationalities and for the representations of the various auto-

RIGHT OF KEHILLAHS TO IMPOSE PALESTINE TAX TO BE DECIDED AT TRIAL

Jewish Consistory of Bulgaria Quotes
Minority Treaty

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Sofia, Nov. 10.—Great interest is displayed throughout the Jewish communities of Bulgaria in the forthcoming trial against the Kehillah of Philopolis instituted by non-Zionist members on the question whether or not the Kehillah has the right to impose a tax for the Keren Hayesod.

The Kehillah had refused to permit its functionaries to officiate at circumcisions, marriages and burials in the families of the members who refused to pay the tax for the Keren Hayesod imposed by the Kehillah Board which has a majority of Zionists. The charge is abuse of power and if found guilty the members of the board are liable to imprisonment.

The Attorney General demands dismissal of the kehillah and election of a new board. The Jewish Consistory, on the other hand, maintains that the kehillahs were reorganized by the Bulgarian government in accordance with the international treaties for the protection of the minorities, according to which the kehillahs have the right to raise funds among their members for Jewish communal and national institutions.

RABBI STOLZ PREACHES LAST SERMON, AFTER 40 YEARS WITH CHICAGO TEMPLE (Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Chicago, Ill., Nov. 10. — Dr. Joseph Stolz, oldest Reform Rabbi in Chicago, preached his farewell sermon at the Temple Isaiah-Israel, on Saturday, after more than forty years service in this city. He spoke on "Be Thou a Blessing."

Dr. Stolz was elected rabbi for life by the congregation fifteen years ago, but after completing forty years of service, he requested his release and was elected Rabbi Emeritus. He plans to devote himself to literary and educational work. Dr. Stolz is a graduate of the University of Cincinnati and the Hebrew Union College. He served three years as rabbi in Little Rock, Ark., before coming to Chicago in 1887.

"When I came to Chicago forty-three years ago, my work was chiefly with Russian refugees," said Dr. Stolz. "Our most vital need still is religious education for the children. Without it there is degeneration and one of the most hopeful

U. S. CENSUS FIGURES REFUTE JOHNSON'S ACCUSATION OF CRIME AMONG IMMIGRANTS

Congressman Celler Presents Convincing
Argument Based on Statistics

(Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Washington, D. C., Nov. 10.—Crime among immigrants is no greater than among natives, relatively in point of numbers, if Census Bureau figures are properly evaluated and interpreted, Representative Celler, of Brooklyn, N. Y., said in a letter to Richard Washburn Child, acting chairman of the Washington Conference on Prevention of Crime which has just been made public. His statement was in response to a letter of Representative Johnson, of Wash., chairman of the House Committee on Immigration, regarding aliens.

"All right-thinking people desire to reduce crime among aliens as well as among natives," Mr. Celler said. The letter continues:

"Of course, all agree that criminal aliens should not be permitted to enter the United States, and it is well that in your deliberations and studies, crime be considered along with the subject of immigration. It is hoped, however, that scant consideration will be given to opinions of men who have axes to grind. I am sure it were better to consult real students on the subject of crime and immigration.

"Noted sociologists and criminologists are agreed that it is highly unfair and misleading to proclaim that the foreign-born have a greater number of criminals (guilty of misdemeanors and felonies) in their midst than their proportion of the total population should allow. For example, Dr. Edwin H. Sutherland, Professor of Sociology, University of Illinois, points out that the Census Report of 1910 on prisoners shows that for the entire United States the number of alien white persons committed as prisoners may have been twice as large in proportion to their entire population as for the native-born whites, but Dr. Sutherland goes

DR. JOSEPH ROSEN RETURNS TO RUSSIA TO RESUME WORK Will Settle 2,000 Additional Families on the Land

Dr. Joseph A. Rosen, head of the Agro-Join, the agency of the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee in Russia, sailed on the "Mauremanka."

Before his departure Dr. Rosen said that he was returning to Moscow to arrange for the settlement of 2,000 additional Jewish families on the land. "The largest proportion of these new farmers," Dr. Rosen said, "will be established in the Crimea, on a stretch of some 150,000 acres allocated for that purpose by the Russian Government as far back as last summer. This land is in close proximity to the Jewish colonies that have been established in the Crimea during the past three years. The balance will be settled in the Krivoy-Rog district of the Ukraine."

Dr. Rosen said that he will also give his attention to another settlement of Jews as farmers which was initiated spontaneously during the past year in the region between Sebastopol and Balaklava, and also to the expansion of the vineyards that have been planted by Jews on the sandy banks of the Dnieper.

"We shall endeavor to introduce the American sweet potato in the last named section," Dr. Rosen said. "This pure American vegetable is practically unknown in Russia, and so far has not been grown anywhere in that country except in a few isolated places in the Caucasus. The soil in the region I have in mind is, I believe, especially

PALESTINIAN CONSIDERED ALIENS UNDER BRITISH IM- MIGRATION LAWS OF 1920 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Jerusalem, Nov. 10.—Palestinian citizens who wish to travel in the United Kingdom must obtain visas on their Palestinian passports from the Immigration and Travel Section at Jerusalem, an official notice published here today.

Applications must be submitted to the Chief Immigration Officer through the Immigration or Police Officer of the district in which the applicants reside.

The Immigration Officer at the port of arrival in the United Kingdom, before granting permission to land, must be satisfied that the applicant complies with the British immigration laws and regulations. In addition to the visa, the traveler must be in a position to produce documents showing the object of his visit, the proposed length of his stay and his means of support in the United Kingdom.

On obtaining leave to land, Palestinian citizens must comply with the regulations applying to aliens in the United Kingdom. Requests for exemption from registration under the Aliens Order, 1920, should be made to the Home Office.

MIRABCHI DELEGATION ON WAY TO UNITED STATES (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

London, Nov. 10.—A delegation of Mirabchi leaders to inaugurate the \$500,000 campaign of the American Mirabchi sailed for New York yesterday on the steamer Olympia. The delegation consists of Rabbi Meyer Berlin, Rabbi J. L. Fishman, Rabbi Benjamin Uziel, Chief Rabbi of Jaffa, and Feor Herman Srook.

adapted for the culture of sweet potatoes.

"The Agro-Join will endeavor this year scientifically to drain the swamp-lands of White Russia on which Jews are endeavoring to settle. The drainage methods so far have been extremely primitive and costly. Modern machinery will be supplied to the Jewish settlers in White Russia for clearing and ploughing the land which the Government has allocated for them.

"It is my hope that it will be possible during the coming year to establish the proposed 'Agro-Kos' Bank, in which will be concentrated all the credit cooperatives which have been and are being established in Russia by the Joint Distribution Committee, to enable the Jews in that country who have been wiped out as merchants and traders by the economic philosophy of the present regime, to rehabilitate themselves either as farmers or artisans," Dr. Rosen said.

EDUCATIONAL CAMPAIGN TO COUNTERACT EFFECTS OF 'KING OF KINGS' FILM URGED (Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Los Angeles, Nov. 10.—"The 'King of Kings' is leaving Los Angeles, much to the relief of a goodly number of Jews, who have considered the screened version of the life of Christ, as depicted by the Cecil De Mille mind, something that might cause an immense conflagration of hostility toward the Jew, and by other Jews to whom this picture was nothing but a tiresome and horridly spectacular presentation of miraculous scenes, and who saw therein no danger whatever to the Jews," writes the "California Jewish Review," Los Angeles weekly.

"As a general rule the press throughout the country has refrained from making any editorial comments on this motion picture story, and from the pulpit of the land there were only occasional protests. And yet this picture, especially in Los Angeles Jewry, has been the occasion of some of the bitterest disputes, the cause of aroused animosities, and the origin of some of the most vicious charges."

Writing in the same paper, Dr. George J. Sayin, suggests that an educational campaign to counteract the effect of the film should be undertaken.

"I submit that to neutralize the anti-Jewish feeling engendered by the nature of the film and to point out the lack of emphasis it lays upon the historical background vindicating the Jew, is of primary importance," Dr. Sayin writes. "All other considerations are not even of secondary moment and will merely give rise to a boomerang affecting Jewish life unfavorably wherever the film will be exhibited. Therefore, a Jewish educational campaign dealing with the history of the period upon which the King of Kings is based and the unfairness of its producers in according the fundamentalist viewpoint in a measure, counteract the poison which the King of Kings, undiluted, is now spreading among the ignorant and gullible masses.

"How is it to be accomplished? The Anglo-Jewish press, for one thing, is read and supported by a large and selected class of Gentiles whose influence is momentous and far reaching. The liberal non-Jewish press would soon take up the matter and help create a general sentiment not alone against the dogmatic and fundamentalist nature of the film but against the injustice and immorality in permitting the film, in its present form, to be exhibited at all, and particularly in countries where it is likely to lead to pogroms and the shedding of human blood. In any event, even the credulous person who would view the film would thus come in contact with the other side of the story.

"Cecil de Mille could not, no less than did Henry Ford, resist the criticism of his own kind—the Drishmanes, the Spargos, the Elites and multitudes of others.

INFORMATION SERVICE FOR IMMIGRANTS' RELATIVES IS ESTABLISHED BY HIAS

An information service for the American relatives of prospective immigrants has been instituted by the Hias, Hebrew Immigrant Aid and Sheltering Society.

Migrants, before leaving for their destinations, are registered with the Hias offices located in 10 cities of Poland, 4 cities in Roumania, one in Lithuania, two in Latvia, in Paris, Danzig and Berlin. Prior to the sailing of the boat, a cable giving the names and addresses of the American relatives is sent to the New York office of Hias. This is done so that Hias in America may immediately inform the relatives on which steamer their friends will come and the date of arrival. The relatives are further informed where and at what time the boat will dock so that they may be on the pier when the passengers are discharged.

The representatives of Hias meet incoming steamers docking at the port of New York and elsewhere. Immediately a steamer docks and the immigration authorities board the vessel, a Hias representative goes on board and remains on the ship until all passengers are discharged, taking care of the Jewish immigrants. If the relatives are on the pier, Hias transfers the immigrants to them. If they are not, the Hias representative brings them to the Hias Building, at 425 Lafayette Street, where after they are registered, the relatives are informed that they have arrived and that they should call for them. If the immigrants are going to another city, the relatives here are telegraphed to and the time and route of departure from New York City is given.

During the nine months of 1927 ending September 30th, there docked in New York City, 453 steamers carrying Jewish immigrants; 108 with Jewish immigrants at the ports of Boston and Providence and 179 at ports on the Pacific Coast, where there are Hias Branches.

Approximately a thousand Jewish immigrants a month who come here to settle permanently are met. With the number who come here temporarily, the Hias guides care for approximately 1400 new arrivals every month.

The contention, therefore, that publicity of that sort will add to the coffers of the producers is sheer nonsense, rubbish and altogether irrelevant in the urgency to frustrate the false and noxious impressions created by the film. To delay, in my opinion, is well nigh criminal, inexcusable. The story of Henry Ford is direct evidence in favor of a more firm and militant attitude towards our defamers and traducers provided truth and justice are on our side."

on to say that this is very misleading if taken as it stands. He showed that almost all immigrants are adults, and that in 1910 only 57 per cent. of the foreign born were under 15 years of age, as contrasted with 36.6 per cent. of the native-born whites.

"If the adult offenders alone are compared in proportion to the population in each group 15 years of age and over, the foreign born whites had only 1.3 times as many commitments as native born whites. In the second place, almost all immigrants settle in the cities and cities have higher rates than the rural districts for arrests, convictions and commitments. It is possible, therefore, that the immigrants have higher rates than the rural districts because they live in cities rather than because they are immigrants.

"The conclusion has been justified that the foreign born in cities have lower rates than the native born for arrests, convictions and commitments. The Immigration Commission of 1910 came to that conclusion from a study of the statistics of several cities and Miss Edith Abbott proved it for Chicago in 1913. It has recently been demonstrated beyond a doubt that for all parts of the States of New York and Massachusetts that in proportion to the population, 15 years of age and over, the foreign born whites have lower rates than the native born whites. It is evident that the native born generally have higher rates, varying from almost the same to almost twice as high as the foreign born.

"Dr. Sutherland goes on to say that when it comes to the more serious crimes, the situation is the same. The Census Report shows that for crimes of felonious homicide, burglary, robbery, rape, etc., the native born have more proportional commitments than the foreign born, over 15 years of age.

"When the two groups are compared for identical urban districts, the foreign born generally have lower rates than the native born, for felonies as well as misdemeanors. Adult native born whites in Chicago in 1920 had 1.09 times as many arrests for felonies and 2.2 times as many arrests for misdemeanors as the adult foreign born.

"I simply desire to point out, primarily, that if the Census figures are properly evaluated and properly interpreted, crime among our foreigners is, at least, not greater than the amount, to which their numbers entitle them."

TEN AVIS HERE TO SEEK AND FOR BENJAMIN

Isaac Ben-Avi, editor of the "Dor" Hebrew paper of Jerusalem and David Ben-Avi, secretary of the Benai Benjamin Organization of Palestine, arrived in New York in the steamer "De Grasse." The visitors have come to the United States in the interests of the Benai Benjamin, the organization of the sons of the pioneer Jewish colonists. The Benai Benjamin was formed for the purpose of aiding the native sons of Palestine or exile in the land. The organization has a bank which was initiated by Mrs. Mary Fels' contribution of \$40,000.

Mr. Ben-Avi is the son of Eliezer Ben-Yehuda, the Hebrew lexicographer, the first Palestine teacher to reintroduce Hebrew as the spoken language in daily life.

QUEEN MARIE PLANS VISIT TO PALESTINE NEXT SPRING

GERMAN COURT GRANTS RUBINSTEIN INJUNCTION AGAINST SLUBBING PLAY

Berlin, Nov. 10.—An injunction prohibiting his portrayal in Alexei Tolstoy's drama "Rasputin" which is to open here to-night, was granted Dr. Dimitri Rubinstein, Russian Jewish emigre in Paris.

Dr. Rubinstein obtained the injunction against Erwing Piscator, founder of the Communist Theatre, who is to produce the play.

Before the Russian revolution Rubinstein was a rich merchant in Petrograd, where he was important in financial and social circles. In the play "Rasputin" he is represented as an adventurer and a German spy. In the fourth act in which Rasputin, the mystic who once swayed the Czar through the Czarina, is shown staging a drunken orgy, the portrayed Rubinstein, one of the guests, cries: "My millions are ruined. With them I can do everything."

Rubinstein agreed that his social and economic position in France would be injured. He first requested Piscator to eliminate the Rubinstein role from the play. When the producer declined Rubinstein brought action. The court issued a preliminary injunction against Piscator, with the decision that the producer and his theatre would be fined 10,000 marks for each performance in which Rubinstein was impersonated.

Piscator entered suit for infringement of the injunction on the grounds that Rubinstein is a historic and public character, but said he would strike out the part until the case was decided.

The suit against Piscator was brought under a law promulgated by the former Kaiser in 1907, providing that a likeness of a person may not be reproduced without the consent of that person.

The Jewish students of the University of North Carolina, under the auspices of the Carolina Jewish Society, inaugurated a course in Jewish history, to be conducted by the Rabbi in the State. The first lecture was given this week by Rabbi Isaac L. Freund of Goldsboro. There are 71 Jewish students on the campus.

A bequest of \$5,000 to local charities is included in the will of Ben Davidson, pioneer State City merchant, who died last week. The will disposed of its assets estimated at \$1,200,000.
