

MANDATES COMMISSION DISCUSSES PATRONAGE PRIVILEGE OF MANDATORY

Matters Affecting Palestine Purchases Considered in Closed Session
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Geneva, Nov. 12.—The question of patronage in mandated territories will be brought to the attention of the Council of the League of Nations as a result of the policy of the British government to make the purchases necessary for the development of the Haifa harbor only in England.

This question loomed large at a private session of the Permanent Mandates Commission which yesterday began its work of preparing this year's report on the progress in the mandated territories which are under its control.

The question was raised as to whether the policy of mandatory powers to restrict the purchases of the mandated territories to the area of the administering government, is compatible with the principle of economic equality for all the members of the League of Nations.

The matter mainly affects the purchases for the construction of the Haifa harbor and other public works which will be made with the funds of the \$4,300,000 loan recently floated by the Palestine government.

FIVE-DAY TRAIN SERVICE BETWEEN LONDON AND HAIFA TO BE STARTED THIS MONTH

London, Nov. 12. — Regular train service between London and Haifa and Cairo, covering a distance of 3,000 miles, will be inaugurated this month.

With the exception of the ferry crossing between European and Asiatic Turkey and the six hour motor journey between Tripolis and Haifa, the entire journey from Calais to Haifa and Cairo will take five days and will be made in luxurious sleeping cars. When the railway between Tripolis and Haifa will be completed soon the entire journey will be made by rail.

ROTHSCHILD COLLECTION GOES TO FRANKFURT LIBRARY

Frankfurt a/Main, Nov. 12.—The collection of valuable books and manuscripts, the property of the Rothschild family here, has become a part of the Frankfurt city library.

The collection, numbering 93,000 volumes, is valued at 700,000 marks. The Education Committee of the Frankfurt municipality today confirmed the decision to take over the collection.

OSCAR SLATER'S RELEASE VICTORY FOR CONAN DOYLE, FAMOUS BRITISH WRITER

Interesting Case Reopened Following Sacco-Vanzetti Agitation
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

London, Nov. 12.—A public inquiry to establish the innocence of Oscar Slater is now being demanded by Sir Arthur Conan Doyle and Ramsay MacDonald.

Slater's release is expected during the middle of next week. In view of the fact that Slater has no relatives, the Jewish community of Glasgow has decided to lend him assistance upon his release.

London, Nov. 12.—The release of Oscar Slater, who served eighteen years of a life sentence for the murder of Miss Marion Gilchrist, an aged Glasgow woman, in December, 1908, is expected soon, according to an announcement made in Parliament by Sir John Gilmour, Secretary of State for Scotland.

"I have felt justified in deciding to authorize Slater's release as soon as suitable arrangements can be made," Sir John said.

Slater's trial caused widespread interest both in Great Britain and America.

N. Y. CONTRIBUTORS TO DATE PAID \$4,200,000 TOWARD UNITED JEWISH CAMPAIGN

The sum of \$4,200,000 has been paid in to date by New York City subscribers to the quota of \$6,000,000 assigned to Greater New York in the United Jewish Campaign during May 1926.

In making this announcement, Paul Baerwald, treasurer of the New York drive, pointed out that the original quota assigned to this city was \$4,000,000 and was raised to \$6,000,000 on the initiative of William Fox. The management of the drive was directed by David M. Bressler, as acting chairman, and Jonah J. Goldstein, as vice-chairman. The Brooklyn sub-committee was headed by Judge Grover M. Moscovitz, chairman, and Hugh Grant Straus, treasurer.

"It is noteworthy that although the drive in New York, as all over the country, was predicated on a three-annual payment basis," said Mr. Baerwald, "30,000 of the 42,000 individual subscribers of the \$6,000,000 fund have already redeemed their pledges in full. Of the remaining 12,000, the majority have met both the 1926 and 1927 payments and have only to meet their 1928 payment in due course."

ANTI-SEMITES MOBILIZE FORCES AGAINST MODIFICATION OF NUMERUS CLAUSUS

Poster Placed in Budapest With Count Teleky's Cooperation
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Budapest, Nov. 11. — All the dark forces of anti-Semitism, racial and religious bigotry, are being mobilized to combat the proposed modification of the numerus clausus law limiting the number of Jewish students.

In a poster placarded today on the streets of Budapest the anti-Semitic student body declares that the retaining of the numerus clausus is a condition sine qua non for the Hungarian nation. It is interesting to note that the poster was distributed with the cooperation of Count Teleki.

The bill for the proposed modification of the law was considered yesterday at a meeting of the Council of Ministers. The bill provides for the creation of several categories of students who are to have preference for admission to the universities. Children of government officials will belong to the first category, children of war veterans and army officers will constitute the second. The third category will include the children of peasants and of the small artisans.

OSCAR WASSERMANN, JEWISH AGENCY COMMISSIONER, CON- CLUDES PALESTINE SURVEY

Jerusalem, Nov. 12.—Oscar Wassermann, well known German financier and one of the Commissioners of the Jewish Agency, concluded his survey of Palestine conditions today after spending several weeks in the country.

Speaking to press representatives, Herr Wassermann stated that he found the Jewish colonies established on a sound economic basis. The industries of the country, particularly in and around Tel Aviv, are developing along normal lines. The present economic crisis should not discourage anyone, he stated.

SUICIDE WAVE SPREADS AMONG HUNGARIAN JEWS

PROFESSOR WEO PREACHED ANTI-SEMITISM CALLED BE- FORE DISCIPLINARY BODY (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Berlin, Nov. 12.—"Soviet Jews," was the subject of another anti-Semitic lecture delivered by Professor Moeller in the Law School of the University of Berlin. "The Jews have ruined Russia," he told his students.

Representatives of the Jewish students submitted a complaint to the Dean of the University and it was stated that Prof. Moeller will be called before the Disciplinary Council of the University to explain his action in introducing political agitation into the Law School.

The Socialist organ, "Vorwaerts," urged the authorities today to put an end to the anti-Semitic preaching in the University.

MME. LUPESCU DENOUNCED AS JEWESS BY ROMANIAN GOVERNMENT DOCUMENTS (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Bucharest, Nov. 12.—Madame Lupescu, because of whom Prince Carol announced his right to the Romanian throne, was identified as a Jewess in official government papers made public here today.

The government published the text of the correspondence with the former Crown Prince concerning his renunciation of the throne. The papers refer to Carol's notorious liaison with Madame Lupescu who is termed "a Jewish woman, Lupesky, wife of a Roumanian captain."

LAVANBURG ESTATE LEFT FOR BETTERING HOUSING AMONG NEW YORK'S POOR Bulk of \$4,000,000 Goes to Foundation He Established

The bulk of his \$4,000,000 estate was left by Frederick L. Lavanburg to the foundation he established for bettering housing conditions among the poor of New York according to his will, filed for probate. Mr. Lavanburg died Nov. 5. Always active in charitable work, his benefactions during his last six months are said to have totaled \$1,600,000, and in years previous to have been more than \$1,000,000.

The Hannah Lavanburg Home for Immigrant Girls, at Struyvesant Park, which he founded fifteen years ago in memory of his mother, receives \$500,000, and \$50,000 is divided among fifty employees who were working for Mr. Lavanburg at the time of his death. Nearly \$1,000,000 is bequeathed to "all persons to whom I feel bound by kinship or other ties."

Alumnae associations of the Nurses Training Schools of nine hospitals in New York receive \$500,000 each.

The largest personal bequest is \$300,000 to his sister, Mrs. Oscar Straus, wife of the late Oscar Straus.

In his will Mr. Lavanburg said: "Having no children and desirous of perpetuating my name in connection with philanthropic work, I have come to the conclusion in recent years that the betterment of living and housing conditions is the most important objective of charitable endeavor."

SCHWARTZBAUM TRIAL SHOULD BE RELEGATED TO PAST, CORALNICK SAYS

Dr. A. Cornalnick, member of the editorial staff of "The Day," returned to New York in the steamer Aquitania following a several months tour in Europe. During his stay abroad Dr. Cornalnick attended the Schwartzbaum trial, the Conference on Jewish Rights in Zurich and the Zionist Congress in Basel.

To press representatives Dr. Cornalnick praised the work of the Federation of German Jews for their assistance in bringing witnesses for the Schwartzbaum trial. He added, however, that the only thing that should be said about the Schwartzbaum trial is that "it should become a matter of the past."

A sensational report to the effect that Fetha was of Jewish origin was published in a cable from Warsaw to the "Jewish Morning Journal."

The cable quotes a letter from Moses Reis, a mechanic of Pressburg, addressed to the Yiddish daily, "Moment," in Warsaw. Mr. Reis claims that during his boyhood he was a chum of Fetha's and he knew that Fetha was the son of a rich Jewish merchant. In his youth Fetha accepted Christianity in order to be able to enter the University at Odessa. Mr. Reis was formerly a member of the Russian Social Revolutionary party.

PALESTINE COMMUNITIES ARE GRANTED AUTHORITY TO SUPERVISE SCHOOLS Municipalities Empowered to Impose Education Tax

Jerusalem, Nov. 2. A draft Ordinance being the product of serious considerations by Government circles during years, has just been published in the Official Gazette. The Ordinance relates to the management of educational institutions and contains two parts. The general part establishes regulations concerning the registration, opening of schools and closing of schools and licensing of teachers. The second part of the Ordinance proclaims the Municipal and Local Councils as local education authorities and entitles them to impose an education tax on the population. The respective articles read as follows:

II. 1) Every Municipal Council and any such Local Council as the High Commissioner shall order shall be a local education authority and shall form a Committee for the purpose of education in the area of the Council. A Committee shall be composed of members of the Council forming it, such Government Officers as may be prescribed by Regulation hereunder, and such other persons as the Council, with the approval of the District Commissioner, may think fit.

(2) In a village where there is no Local Council, but where at the date of this Ordinance a school other than a community or private school exists, or where at any time the Director is of opinion that a school should be established, the Village Authority shall be the local education authority for such village.

(3) Any local education authority may enter into an agreement with any Committee of a Community for the purpose of maintaining a community school.

12. (1) A local education authority shall, when required by the Director, be responsible for opening a new school and for maintaining wholly or in part existing schools in its area other than community schools or private schools.

(2) A local education authority may impose a rate on the inhabitants of its area for the purposes of education according to Regulations to be prescribed by the High Commissioner in Executive Council.

(3) If a local education authority fails to collect a rate adequate to maintain the school or schools within its area, the High Commissioner in Executive Council shall have power to impose and to enforce payment of the necessary rate as if it were a Government tax.

(4) Where a separate community school exists within the area of a

BROOKLYN FEDERATION STARTS CAMPAIGN FOR \$100,000 AT CHARITY BALL

Two thousand prominent Brooklyn Jews paid \$50 a plate at the third annual Charity Ball of the Brooklyn Federation of Jewish Charities at the Hotel Astor on Armistice eve, realizing \$100,000 for the support of the twenty-four societies affiliated with the Brooklyn Federation.

Federal Court Judge Grover M. Moscovitz, Chairman, said the object of the Charity Ball was to weld the scattered communities of the Borough of Brooklyn into a cohesive unit, in order that the Federation attain its object. He pointed out that Justice Edward Lazansky conceived the idea of an annual ball in order to bring Brooklynites together socially in behalf of the Federation. Judge Moscovitz said that he viewed with alarm and dissatisfaction the state of the Jewish charity situation in Brooklyn, containing 750,000 Jews.

"Our 1927 budget is \$671,218. We have secured subscriptions from 10,400 people. Only one and one-half per cent of the Jews of Brooklyn gave to Federation. We have the lowest per capita participation in Federation of any city of the United States. I know, however, that there are 50,000 Jews in Brooklyn, who are financially able to give to Federation. We must reach every Jew of means in the borough. Likewise, we must obtain the affiliation of the Jewish institutions who are to-day outside of Federation."

Justice Mitchell May, President of the Federation, stated that the recollections on Armistice Day should provoke Brooklyn Jewry to the building of monuments of peace, which the work of Brooklyn Federation of Jewish Charities accomplishes in the manifold activities of its institutions. "We have much want, suffering, and starvation here, but we should not forget those unfortunates beyond the seas, who look to the favored Jewish community of America for help."

COMMITTEE SEEKS \$75,000 FOR ZIONIST PRISONERS

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Warsaw, Nov. 12.—A committee was formed here to assist Zionists who are imprisoned or banned in Soviet Russia to leave the country and settle in Palestine.

Deputy Gruenbaum, explaining the work of the Committee to press representatives, dwell on the hardships endured by the imprisoned and exiled Zionists in Soviet Russia. The Soviet Laws, he said, give an opportunity for these Zionists to leave Russia and go to Palestine. It was also an easy matter to obtain the necessary certificates for them from the Palestine Government, in spite of the Palestine immigration restrictions, because they are regarded as political refugees. This needs large sums of money. The Soviet foreign passport and the travelling expenses from those distant parts of the country where the exiles are kept run to a large amount.

Dr. Dabkin, the representative of the Heholuz Organization said that according to the figures in the possession of the committee there are about 500 Zionists in exile. At least \$75,000 must be raised this year, he said, on behalf of the exiled Zionists in Soviet Russia.

MUNCACZ POLICE GIVES PROTECTION IN CHASSIDIC FEUD

Prague, Nov. 12.—The Muncacz police found itself obliged to provide protection for the buildings and property of the Jewish community there because of the pending feud between two sections of the Chassidic movement.

The feud between the Chassidim of Belz and those of Muncacz is of long duration and has lately resulted in the decision to legally separate the two sects, establishing two independent autonomous Kehillahs in Muncacz. Both parties, however, claim the property and the institutions of the Kehillah.

Guards have been placed to prevent seizure of the property by either of the parties.

EXHIBIT OF ANTI-SEMITIC LITERATURE DENOUNCED

Vienna, Nov. 12.—An exhibition of anti-Semitic publications in one of the halls of the University of Vienna called forth numerous protests in the liberal press, as well as on the part of many Christian students.

The exhibition was arranged by a group of anti-Semitic students of the University and includes several editions of the "Protocols of the Elders of Zion." The press and the students have demanded that the University authorities order the removal of the anti-Semitic literature.

BALFOUR DECLARATION NOT MERELY A WAR MEASURE

GENERAL JAN SMUTS SAYS

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Cape Town, Nov. 12.—"The Balfour Declaration is one of the notable events in history, and its true importance will be realized more and more in decades to come, when much else in the history of the Great War will have become but a dim memory," General Smuts, the South African ex-Premier, writes in a foreword to a special pamphlet published by the South African Zionist Federation in commemoration of the tenth anniversary of the Balfour Declaration.

"For though it is not as spectacular as some of the other Peace settlements," he proceeds, "neither is it, like many of them, vitiated by injustice and war passion. On the contrary, it is based on historic justice, it constitutes a great act of historic reparation, and renews once more the promise which is basic to Jewish history."

"Throughout the long centuries Palestine remained for the Jews a foreign land, and the promise remained in abeyance. Then came the Great War, in which their historic oppressors suffered crushing defeat even to the verge of extinction. And from that awful judgment seat of history came at last the pronouncement known as the Balfour Declaration. It was apparently a minor incident in the midst of world-shaking events, but in reality one of the remarkable events of history. For it was a renewal and fulfillment of the promise, and it showed historic justice triumphant at last across the long stretch of centuries. From the human point of view, from the high spiritual point of view, there is nothing more dramatic or more significant in history. What an argument Job would have founded on this great act of fulfillment after almost two thousand years of doubt and denial! View it as we like, the Balfour Declaration in its great setting of history is one of the most wonderful confirmations of the moral and spiritual principle in human affairs."

London, Nov. 12.—A cabled message from the Shanghai Zionist Association was received by Lord Balfour.

"On the tenth anniversary of the promulgation of the historic declaration heralding the return of Israel to Zion, we convey to its illustrious author our humble tribute of respect and gratitude," the message reads.

He was arrested in New York as he stepped off the Lusitania. He waived extradition and returned to Glasgow voluntarily for trial. He was convicted largely on the evidence of three "identifying" witnesses, out a girl of 15.

The Sacco-Vanzetti case in Massachusetts caused renewed interest in Slater's case. The girl witness, who now is a woman of 34, swore in an affidavit recently that she had never meant to identify Slater positively, but had been influenced by the prosecutor.

Slater was convicted in 1909 and sentenced to be hanged, but public opinion became so strongly aroused over the case with many doubting he had been proved guilty, that his sentence was commuted to life imprisonment two days before he was to be executed.

Frequent attempts have been made to obtain Slater's release, but heretofore they have been fruitless. Sir Arthur Conan Doyle wrote a book condemning his imprisonment.

Robbery was the supposed motive for the crime, but the evidence was regarded by many as so flimsy that 20,000 persons in Glasgow signed a petition asking for commutation of Slater's sentence.

The release of Slater is a victory for Sir Arthur Conan Doyle who was assisted by William A. Goodhart, Baltimore attorney.

DR. WEIZMANN WILL VISIT UNITED STATES IN MARCH

London, Nov. 12.—The president of the World Zionist Organization will not come to the United States before March.

Dr. Weizmann is proceeding on Tuesday to Berlin and Bucharest. He will be accompanied by Mrs. Weizmann who will visit the groups of the International Women's Zionist Organizations.

MEETING OF HEBREW UNIVERSITY COUNCIL POSTPONED

Berlin, Nov. 12.—The meeting of the Academic Council of the Hebrew University, which was to have been held here tomorrow under the chairmanship of Dr. Albert Einstein, has been postponed.

Dr. Judah L. Magnes, dean of the University, who is now in America, requesting the postponement of the meeting until he will be able to attend.

Preparations have been concluded for the opening of the Jewish National Workers' Alliance Institute in Atlantic City, N. J., on Nov. 18.

While the institute will not be dedicated until next week it is already functioning with a number of pupils.

4 IMMIGRANT CATEGORIES ADMITTED TO PALESTINE

Jerusalem, Nov. 12.—According to the new regulations, only four categories of immigrants are now admitted into Palestine:

The four categories are: Wives and minor children of Palestine residents; students for whose maintenance the educational institutions in Palestine will undertake responsibility for a period of three years at least; wealthy persons whose activity might be useful to the country; political emigrants from Russia.

MORE JEWISH COMMUNISTS ARE EXPELLED FROM PARTY

Moscow, Nov. 12.—Alsky, former Soviet Commissar of Finance, and Wilensky, well known writer, were expelled from the Communist party, along with 76 other members.

They were accused of being organizers of the oppositional movement. The specific charge was that they arranged secret meetings at which Trotsky and Kamenieff spoke.

ARABS IN AMERICA FORM AN INDEPENDENCE PARTY

(J. T. A. Mail Service)

Jerusalem, Nov. 2.—Arab residents in America who come from Palestine, Syria and the Lebanon, have founded a party named "The Party of Freedom of the Arab Countries," according to the Arab paper, "Yarmuk." The party intends to work for the independence of Palestine, Syria and the Lebanon, and their constitutions as free Republics, the paper states.

More than \$20,000 was expended by the Oakland, Cal. Jewish Federation during the past ten months, a report issued by Harry J. Sapper shows. Of this \$17,000 has been spent for relief work in Oakland, \$7,000 for recreation and culture; \$1,000 to aid ruber-cultar parties.

The Free Loan Department of the Oakland Jewish Federation made close to 100 loans this year, approximating \$8,000. The fund contributes toward the support of 55 agencies.

The cornerstone of the new club house for the Jewish Alliance, Los Angeles, Cal., was laid last Sunday. George Massbacher president of the Federation of Jewish Welfare Organizations, presided. Rabbi Edgar P. Maguin pronounced the invocation. D. A. and M. A. Hamburger, and their sisters Miss Evelyn Hamburger, Mrs. P. Nathan and Mrs. Ralph Marx presented the structure to the Alliance as a memorial to Asher and Hannah Hamburger, their parents, Los Angeles pioneers. The club house will have accommodations for fifty girls.

ORDINANCE PROVIDES FOR COMMUTATION OF TITHES

Jerusalem, Oct. 18.—The draft Ordinance for Commutation of Tithes was published in the Official Gazette of October 10. The essential point of the Ordinance is contained in Article 3 which reads:

"The High Commissioner may, by Order published in the Official Gazette, declare that, in lieu of the time payable by cultivators under the law in force relating to the payment of tithes at the date on which this Ordinance becomes operative in virtue of such Order, there shall be payable annually by the reputed owners of lands within the boundaries of the village or villages prescribed in such Order a fixed amount in money (hereinafter called 'commuted tithes') which shall be assessed and paid in accordance with the provisions of this Ordinance."

The Ordinance further lays down that after the above Order has been made, the District Commissioner shall constitute an "Assessment Committee" for every village affected by the Order. Revising Committees for hearing objections to assessment lists will also be constituted.

Construction work has begun on the new community building which is being erected by members of Temple B'nai B'rith, Galveston, Texas, as a testimonial to Dr. Henry Cohen rabbi of the temple, for his four years of service with the congregation. A permit for a building to cost \$56,000 was issued.

The structure which is to be of hollow tile and concrete will adjoin the present temple and in addition to classrooms and a library on the first floor will contain a large auditorium.
