## PRUSSIAN STUDENTS CLASH WITH EDUCATION MINISTER ON 'ARYAN THEORY' ISSUE

Minister Bars Student Society Which Excludes Jews

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Berlin, Dec. 1.—The conception of Aryanism as the principle upon which German students are to organize in inter-university federations, is the bone of contention between the Prussian Students Organization and Minister of Education Becker.

Herr Becker recently rebuked the students for their plan to form inter-university federations on the Aryan principle, excluding Jewish students. The purpose of student organizations is not to promote racial hatred but intellectual cooperation and understanding, the Minister told the students. Notwithstanding this opinion, the students submitted a plan of organization in accordance with the Aryan principle. This plan was rejected by the Minister.

## DR. WEIZMANN ARRIVES IN ROUMANIA, WELCOMED BY JEWISH LEADERS AND PUBLIC

Bucharest, Dec. 1.—Zionists in Roumania, joined by non-Zionist Jewish leaders, accorded a most cordial reception to Dr. Chaim Weizmann, president of the World Zionist Organization, upon his arrival here today.

At all stations leading to the capital large crowds gathered to greet the Zionist leader. Adolf Bernhardt, president of the Zionist Organization of Roumania, met Dr. Weizmann at Ploeschti. He was accompanied by Senator Horia Carp and delegations of the various Zionist factions. At the Bucharest depot Dr. Weizmann was greeted by a large crowd and many delegations including the president of the Bucharest Kehillah, Elly Bercovi. The Roumanian press commented favorably in editorials on the occasion of Dr. Weizmann's visit to Roumania.

## GENERAL LUDENDORFF SUES JEWISH WRITER FOR LIBEL

Berlin, Dec. 1.—General Ludendorff instituted a libel suit against Botho Laserstein, a Jewish writer, who published a pamphlet parodying an anti-Jewish and anti-Freemason leaflet by General Ludendorff. General Ludendorff charges that Laserstein ridiculed him in the pamphlet.

## NOVOMEJSKI, TULLOCH WILL GET DEAD SEA CONCESSION. BRITISH GOVERNMENT SAYS

More Light Shed on Subject as Question is Raised in British Parliament

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

London, Dec. 1.—The concession to exploit the salts of the Dead Sea has in principle been granted to Novomejski, Jewish engineer, and Tulloch, British engineer, provided they will furnish satisfactory financial guarantees, was the statement made in the House of Commons today by Major Ormsby Gore, Under-secretary for the colonies.

Negotiations are still proceeding, the secretary stated. He is unable to say now what provisions the concession will include, but no proposal is included for the British government to obtain a controlling interest by a purchase of shares in the concessionaire company.

Whatever the salts may be worth, Major Ormsby Gore declared, the process of extracting the salts and marketing is experimental and is still of a speculative nature.

It is therefore inadvisable to ask the British taxpayer to invest money in the enterprise at this stage. The government will see that the concession will only be a leasehold and not a concession for all time, he declared.

The question of the Dead Sea concession was raised in the House of Lords by Sir John Islington who is anxious that a British company secure the contract to exploit the salts of the Dead Sea, the government participating as in the Anglo-Persian Company, to protect the British

## DYMOWSKI, POLISH BOYCOTT LEADER, ARRESTED ON LOSS OF PARLIAMENTARY IMMUNITY

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Warsaw, Dec. 1.—Tadeusz Dymowski, leader of the anti-Semitic boycott organization, Rozwoj and formerly a member of the Polish Sejm, was arrested and placed in solitary confinement in the Warsaw prison by an order of the district attorney yesterday.

Criminal charges of fraud were pending against Dymowski in connection with the operations of his boycott organization. The prosecution could not proceed, however, because of his immunity as member of parliament. Following the dissolution of the Sejm, a warrant was issued for his arrest. Among the charges proffered against him are also items pertaining to swindling Jewish merchants.

## PALESTINE LOAN, HEAVILY OVERSUBSCRIBED, IS WITH- DRAWN FROM LONDON MARKET

Lists Closed Before Date Set; Press Comments Favorably

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

London, Dec. 1.—The lists for subscription in the Palestine £4,475,000 loan were closed at 11:30 Wednesday morning, the loan being heavily oversubscribed. The lists were due to be closed on Friday but the oversubscription of the loan caused it to be withdrawn before the date set.

Almost all trading on the London market yesterday was concentrated on the Palestine stock. In press comments the stock was pointed to as an exceptionally favorable and attractive investment. Having the British government guarantee, it is virtually a British government loan, giving a yield even slightly in excess of that obtainable from the British war loan.

Wall Street bankers were interested to learn of the new loan to Palestine, which has been guaranteed by the Bank of England, the "New York Times" writes in its financial section. The loan carries an interest rate of 5 per cent, and is priced at 105, which places the credit rate

## DANZIG ANTI-SEMITES FAULT AT ELECTIONS, LOSE 6 SEATS

Danzig, Dec. 1.—The German National Socialist Party of Danzig, a militant anti-Jewish organization headed by Knuettel-Kunze obtained only one seat in the Danzig Diet at the election here.

At the last elections in 1923 it polled nearly 10,500 votes and obtained seven seats in the Diet. The German National Peoples Party, which had 33 seats in the Diet, secured only 25. The Social Democratic Party, which had 30 seats in the previous Diet, now has 42.

## JAFFA SYNAGOGUE WILL GO ON AUCTION BLOC, IS REPORT

London, Dec. 1.—The great Jaffa synagogue will be sold at auction due to the financial difficulties resulting from the economic crisis, according to a report in the London "Morning Post" today.

The correspondent states that the decision of the trustees has caused a painful impression among the Jewish population and that demonstrations were held against the sale.

### AGUDATH ISRAEL LEADER EXPLAINS REASON FOR SEPARATION OF COMMUNITIES

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Jerusalem, Dec. 1. — The reasons which compel the ultra-Orthodox Jews in Palestine under the auspices of the Agudath Israel to take advantage of the clause in the Palestine Communities Ordinance allowing thirty dissenters to form a separate community, were stated to the Vaad Leumi, the National Council of Palestine Jews, at its session yesterday, by Dr. Pinchas Kohn, president of the Agudath who is on a visit here.

The Agudath leader declared that the ultra-Orthodox are forced to this course of action because of the question of women's suffrage in the communities, the Orthodox being opposed to granting women equal rights in the administration of Jewish communal affairs.

Another reason for the dissent is the difference of views obtaining between the Orthodox and the Vaad Leumi on the question of education in the Palestine Hebrew schools.

Contrary to previous practice the discussion between the Agudath leader and the Vaad Leumi was conducted in a friendly manner and it was stated that the discussion will be continued, with a view to seeking a way to smooth out the difficulties.

Half the costs of \$111,000 being sought by the Jewish Federation for Social Charities of Buffalo was raised at the opening banquet of the campaign at the Hotel Statler. Dr. Isaac S. Rabin is chairman of the campaign. Approximately \$55,000 was subscribed at the banquet.

### JACOB DE HAAS, ADDRESSING BOSTON ZIONISTS, SPEAKS ON "BACK-TO-HERZL" MOVEMENT

Says Brandeis Could be Brought Back to Leadership; Criticizes  
Deery Defeatism

(Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Boston, Dec. 1.—The views of the sponsors of a "Back to Herzl" movement among American Zionists was presented to a Zionist audience of 250 by Jacob de Haas in an address he delivered last night at the Temple Ohabei Shalom.

The meeting was arranged under the auspices of the Zionist Organization of Boston. Albert Hurwitz presided.

Contending that the Herzlian idea of Zionism, embodied only in a program of mass colonization, is the only possibility of realizing the Zionist program. Mr. de Haas severely criticized the Zionist administration during the past seven years.

To several of his conclusions, particularly the assertion that the Chafetzim were misfits, strong objection was taken in the discussion which followed, participated in by Dr. Morrison, Joseph Shulow, Miss Oppenheim and others. Charges were made against the leadership of Boston Zionists for arranging the lecture, the opponents claiming that "defeatism may impair the United Palestine Appeal which is about to be launched in Boston."

The name of Justice Louis D. Brandeis was brought into the discussion when Mr. de Haas expressed the belief that Zionist public opinion could bring Brandeis back to leadership.

Robert Silverman, who attended the Zionist Congress, denied the statement of Abraham Tulin that the Zionist Executive did not make demands to the British government and declared that Dr. Wise's attitude at the Congress was not consistent in proposing a political commission

### JEWISH HOME WINS RIGHT TO BUILD IN RESTRICTED ZONE

(Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Washington, D. C., Dec. 1.—The attempt of University Heights, a suburb of Cleveland, O., to bar the Cleveland Jewish Orphan Home from the village was again unsuccessful.

The village was refused a review of its zoning ordinance, involved in the case won in the Lower Courts by the Cleveland Jewish Orphan Home.

The home purchased a site in the village and applied for a permit to erect a central administration building, a central heating and power plant, with a cluster of cottages. A permit was refused because the site was in a restricted zone.

Contending the refusal was based on the commission's unwillingness to have any part of the village used for charitable purposes the orphan home appealed to the Federal Court, which held the village did not have the power to prohibit the construction.

Elihu M. Stone, president of the New England Zionist Region, was present last night but declined to make a statement. He will make an announcement later, he said.

After his address, Mr. de Haas, in reply to a question, admitted that Zionists must support the fund raising activities until a new change in policy is effected. He declared that he is ready to take the lead in organizing new Zionist leadership, although he was not ready last summer.

"It is obvious that this Herzlian project could not be based on charity, because benevolence cannot raise the capital required," Mr. de Haas declared in his address. "But the most difficult phase is that charity calls for no individual enterprise—it lacks the personal effort to make success. It is generally argued that a charity to be a success must have a deficit. But if a man has an increasing deficit he faces bankruptcy and if a nation has a perpetual deficit it has no credit."

"Herzl wanted to solve the Jewish problem. That problem still requires solution. And if not for that end wherefore the labor of building up Palestine. Therefore he thought in terms of mass settlement. He had to think in those terms because only in masses can you balance the factors that our mutual dependence creates. Here and there a single craftsman earns a good living, but even his livelihood depends upon the existence of a wealthy class who in their turn gain from a mass of people. One poultry farmer in Palestine cannot earn a living—a hundred could succeed. Even a peddler needs a certain minimum population to earn his pittance. Therefore it is not only a question of mass settlement to solve the Jewish Question, but a question of numbers to make any settlement a possible success. And this is more true in 1927 than it was in 1897 for now the whole world is run on mass production lines. If we ignore the mathematics of the problem of settlement we forcibly handicap the individual settler. We practically predicate his failure. Practical development therefore lies entirely the other way. The Herzlian policy is economically sound. 'Back to Herzl' implies that it should be attempted," the speaker declared.

"There is one difficulty about the Herzlian program. It involves the personal equation not only in intelligent administration and economic leadership but it pre-supposes Jews willing to throw in their lot with Zion in order to make of it a real Homeland. Herzl had no idea of being a peripatetic leader, nor of administration from afar. He saw himself settling in Palestine with his people, and he believed you and I would go along with our abilities and brains, taking with us that great nonpossessing proletariat that is ours. Even in this I am optimistic enough to believe that once we set

# 'KING OF KINGS' WILL NOT BE REVISED, DE MILLE'S REPRESENTATIVE DECLARES

Los Angeles, Dec. 1.—"No revisions are planned to be made on the film, 'King of Kings.' There is no opportunity for any revisions," declared H. McMahon, publicity manager for Cecil De Mille, to the correspondent of the Jewish Daily Bulletin.

Mr. McMahon also denied that John Flinn of the New York office of the De Mille organization, who has just arrived in Hollywood, is here to confer with Mr. De Mille on revising the "King of Kings," "Mr. Flinn came here to confer with Mr. De Mille on our film output of 1928," Mr. McMahon stated.

Contrary to the belief expressed by some, Cecil B. De Mille, does not deny his Jewish origin, it was stated in Hollywood. While the film was in the process of making he frequently spoke of his Jewish mother to various actors whom he had known to be Jews, always saying that he was proud of having Jewish blood in his veins. In a statement issued some time ago the publicity department of De Mille Studio designated Mr. De Mille's mother as "Mathilda Beatrice Samuels, an English Christian Jewess, a teacher at Lockwood Academy for Girls in New York."

Henry De Mille, Cecil's father, was an instructor at Columbia University and a close friend and collaborator of David Belasco. De Mille's publicity department states: "Always incisive, critical, direct, Miss Samuel was undoubtedly responsible for changing Henry De Mille to the writing of plays from his intention of becoming a minister of the Protestant Episcopal Church."

### Pittsburgh Police on Trail of Synagogue Desecrators

Pittsburgh, Dec. 1. — 1,482 persons have been added to the membership roster of the Young Men's and Women's Hebrew Association of Pittsburgh, as a result of a two weeks' drive held recently, according to Eugene Herzog, chairman of the enrollment campaign. This unanticipated success added approximately \$24,000 to the "Y" treasury.

Police and private detectives of this city are searching for the thieves who, sometime last week, entered and ransacked the Congregation Poale Zedeck, damaging the synagogue to the extent of \$1,700. The rear door behind the altar was chopped out, prayer books, and pews destroyed, and talismans valued at \$700 stolen. For the last six months similar occurrences have been reported to the police.

Miss Anna B. Heldman, for twenty-five years a worker in the Irene Kaufman Settlement of Pittsburgh, and at present head of the Personal Service department of that institution, was tendered a reception recently in honor of her untiring efforts in the interests of the social center. Messages from all over the United States were received by Miss Heldman. Miss Heldman was one of the pioneer social workers of the city.

### MAGNES SPEAKS TO JEWISH MINISTERS BEFORE SAILING

The New York Board of Jewish Ministers adopted a resolution pledging "moral support to the Hebrew University and the cause of education in Palestine," at a luncheon given in honor of Dr. Judah L. Magnes, Chancellor of the Hebrew University before his departure on Wednesday for London.

Dr. Magnes was introduced by Dr. Schulman, who asked for the support of American Jewry for the institution. Fifty rabbis were present.

### JEWISH CHAUTAUQUA OF SOUTHWEST HAS SESSIONS

Tulsa, Dec. 1.—The fourth annual Assembly of the Southwestern Jewish Chautauqua, including Texas, Louisiana, Arkansas, Missouri and Oklahoma, closed its four days sessions here. Rabbi David Lefkowitz of Dallas, Texas, was chosen honorary president and Rabbi Harra A. Merfeld of Fort Worth, was elected president. Houston, Texas was selected as the place for the next session.

### 1534 JEWISH IMMIGRANTS ENTERED CANADA IN PAST 7 MONTHS; 178 ARRIVE IN NOV.

Montreal, Dec. 1.—A report of the activities of the Jewish Immigrant Aid Society of Canada at the port of Quebec has just been issued. The report covers activities from April 22 to November 22, 1927. During this period 1,534 Jewish immigrants entered the country.

During the summer season 163 boats arrived at the port of Quebec, with a total of 91,841 passengers of all nationalities. Of these the Jewish passengers numbered 1,534 or approximately 1.67 per cent., consisting of 624 men, 620 women and 290 children.

They were destined for provinces as follows: Quebec 669, Ontario 641, Manitoba 86, Saskatchewan 63, Alberta 19, British Columbia 39, Nova Scotia 11 and New Brunswick 6.

The Jewish arrivals each month during this period were 40 during April, 156 in May, 218 June, 296 July, 181 August, 208 September, 257 October and 178 in November.

Of the total Jewish arrivals at this port, 1505 were admitted immediately on first examination, while 29 or 1.92 per cent. were detained. Of the 29 detained immigrants during the season, 3 were deported, 23 were released through the intervention of our legal aid department.

During this period, the representative of the society sent out 267 telegrams to the relatives of the incoming immigrants.

Quebec, Dec. 1.—During the month of November, 11 boats arrived at the Port of Quebec, bringing 4,230 passengers of all nationalities for Canada. Of these the Jewish passengers numbered 178 or approximately 4.21 per cent. consisting of 61 men, 77 women and 40 children.

The Jewish arrivals' destinations in the provinces were: 85 Quebec, 67 Ontario, 8 Manitoba, 8 British Columbia, 7 Saskatchewan, 2 Alberta and 1 to Nova Scotia.

### CONFERENCE OF ROMANIAN ZIONISTS IS OPENED TODAY

Bucharest, Dec. 1.—The conference of the Romanian Zionist Organization will open here tomorrow and continue its sessions through Sunday.

Eighty representatives of the center group, including eight members of the administration, will participate in the deliberations. The Radical Zionists will be represented by 35 delegates and the Revisionists by 16. As this is the first time that the oppositional factions are participating in the Romanian Zionist conference, a lively discussion is expected.

# NEW YORK COMMITTEE WILL COOPERATE WITH I.O.B.B. IN WIDER SCOPE CAMPAIGN

A New York City committee to cooperate with the Wider Scope Committee of the Independent Order of B'nai B'rith was organized. Abram I. Etkus, is honorary chairman of the committee, Maurice P. Davidson, chairman of the Wider Scope Committee for District No. 1 of the I. O. B. B. presided at the meeting at which the committee was formed. Dr. Boris D. Bogen, secretary of the order, and James N. Rosenberg were among the speakers.

## JERUSALEM IMMIGRATION OFFICE OF Z. O. IS CLOSED (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Jerusalem, Dec. 1. — In connection with the economy activities of the Palestine Zionist Executive, the Immigration Office of the Palestine Zionist Executive in Jerusalem has been closed down. In addition to the ten clerks in the Immigration Department of the Palestine Zionist Executive, who have been dismissed for reasons of economy, about twenty more employees in other Departments will go.

The committee of the employees of the Palestine Zionist Executive, who were eighty in number, is negotiating with the Executive with a view to obtaining compensation for the dismissed clerks.

By a resolution of the Chamber of Commerce of Goldsboro, N. C. all the business establishments, offices and banks in the town were closed during the funeral of Joe Rosenthal who died on Sunday. Mr. Rosenthal was last year appointed by Governor McLean member of a committee to organize a cotton finance corporation in North Carolina. He was a member of the board of trustees of the North Carolina College for Women and of public and charitable institutions throughout the state.

# SUGGESTS WORLD CONGRESS OF JEWISH MEDICAL MEN (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

London, Nov. 20.—The convening of an International Congress of Jewish medical men was urged by Dr. J. Snowman, speaking at a meeting of the council of the Jewish Health Organization of Great Britain held here.

The council decided to proceed with a plan for the anthropometric investigation of Jewish adolescents. The chairman reported that Dr. I. Cohen had consented to act as investigator. The Statistical Committee had been instructed to submit a plan of the investigation and to prepare a scheme of researches for the session. Among the questions the scheme is intended to cover is the comparative intelligence of Jewish and non-Jewish adolescents. The researches will also be extended to physical characteristics among children and adolescents. Another enquiry envisaged by the scheme deals with the incidence and mortality of Jews from tuberculosis and the course run by the disease.

A report on the condition of vision among Jewish children was submitted by Dr. A. Sourasky.

## RABBI HELLER HEADS OHIO JEWISH EDUCATION ASSN. (Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Cincinnati, O., Dec. 1.—Rabbi James G. Heller, of the Plum Street Temple, Cincinnati, was elected President of the Jewish Religious Education Association of Ohio at the final session of the three-day meeting held in Cincinnati November 24 to 26. Rabbi Heller succeeds Rabbi Barnett R. Brickner of Cleveland. Other officers elected included, Miss Della Simon, of Youngstown, vice president; Lewis Stricker of Cincinnati, secretary, and Miss Loretta Oppenheim, Toledo, treasurer. Youngstown was selected as the meeting place for 1928.

interests and also to avoid a continental potash monopoly. Major General Simon Lovat speaking for the government replied that the concession has been granted only in principle, that nothing had been signed or sealed.

The group which is seeking to obtain the concession must, according to the provisions, work independently of other syndicates or companies.

The Palestine and Transjordanian government must share in the profit. The Government is fully aware of the strategic importance of the deposit, but the value of the Dead Sea potash is not yet fully established. The government is watching the political and economic aspect of the matter, he declared.

# BREAK GROUND FOR RODIN MUSEUM, MASTBAUM GIFT (Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Philadelphia, Pa., Dec. 1.—Ground will be broken next Tuesday afternoon for the Jules E. Mastbaum, Rodin Museum to be erected here. The museum to house a Rodin collection was bequeathed to the city by the will of the late Jules E. Mastbaum.

Mayor W. Freeland Kendrick and the French Consul in Philadelphia, Rene Weiller, will be the speakers.

Construction on the building will be begun immediately. The museum will be one story in height and will occupy a site of one hundred by eighty feet. The facade will be constructed of marble to be carved and cut in France before shipment here. The building will be set in a garden, in the center of which will be a pool to reflect Le Porte D'Enfer. Rodin's Conception of Adam and Eve will also be placed near the entrance. This arcade is a reproduction of the Rodin Memorial Archway in France.

ting of Palestine on a par with that of some of the largest and strongest nations in Europe.

Although the bonds based on the loan are intended for sale in Europe, it is considered likely that a portion of them will reach the American public through purchases and resales by New York bankers. In the financial district the loan arrangement was accepted as evidence of the success of the Palestine venture, which was undertaken shortly after the signing of the Versailles Treaty, and which has been marked by ambitious expansion projects under Jewish leadership.

The guarantee by the Bank of England created interest here, as it has been rarely that such guarantees have been given except during the war period.

Moses Ottensheimer has been appointed a member of the Baltimore Jail Board by Mayor William F. Broening.
