ROMANIAN AGENCY SEEKS TO MINIMIZE ANTI-JEWISH POGROM IN ORADEAMARE

Further Excesses by Anti-Semite
Students are Reported

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Bucharest, Dec. 8.—An attempt to minimize the anti-Jewish and anti-Hungarian riots was made by the Roumanian news agency which issued a report stating that only "insignificant incidents took place in Oradeamare provoked by Hungarian Communists." General Moscu restored order, having the full cooperation of the Jewish population, which had provided lodging for the guests and delegates to the Students Congress.

The Roumanian government has suppressed all news concerning the real significance of the riots. Reports received here from Oradeamare state that the Jewish community there remains without a house of worship since both synagogues were demolished by the Roumanian students. Other reports state that the excesses in Oradeamare continued yesterday. Three Jews were killed and many Jewish houses were ransacked.

The students led by girls took the furniture out of Jewish houses and made a bon fire of it in the streets.

CORNERSTONE LAID FOR RODIN MUSEUM IN PHILA.

Philadelphia, Pa., Dec. 8.—The cornerstone for the Rodin Museum, the gift to the city of Philadelphia of the late Jules E. Mastbaum, was laid yesterday, the first anniversary of the death of the philanthropist.

Eulogies were delivered by Mayor W. Freeland Kendrick, Charles B. Hall, President of the City Council, Dr. Marcel Knecht, representative of Le Matin, Rene Weiler, French Consul in this city and Rabbi Leon H. Elmaleh of the Congregation Mikveh Israel.

Two cables were read from former Premier Edouard Herriot of France and Jean Sapene, Director General of "Le Matin."

The museum will house the Rodin collection left to the city by Mr. Mastbaum.

JAPANESE DELEGATION ARRIVES IN PALESTINE

Jerusalem, Dec. 8.—A Japanese commercial delegation arrived here today. The purpose of the delegation is to make a study of the Zionist work in the country.

TRANSJORDANIA WILL LOSE MANDATE STATUS THROUGH NEW TREATY WITH BRITAIN

Independent Emirate Similar to That
in Iraq Planned

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

London, Dec. 8.—Transjordan which is now ruled as a mandated territory under the provisions of the Palestine mandate, will lose its present status and become an independent Emirate as soon as the new treaty between Great Britain and Transjordan will be concluded, states a report of the correspondent of the "Financial Times" now travelling in the Middle East.

Under the new arrangements a regime will be created in Transjordan similar to that obtaining in Iraq. Lord Plumer, who will be the High Commissioner of Transjordan, will be represented by a British Resident at Amman, the capital of Emir Abdullah.

WEIZMANN MAY RESIGN TO HEAD HEBREW UNIVERSITY

London, Dec. 8.—A rumor that Dr. Chaim Weizmann will resign from his post as president of the international Zionist Organization to become the Chancellor of the Hebrew University on Mount Scopus as soon as the Jewish Agency is constituted was reported today by the "Jewish World." Anglo-Jewish weekly.

According to the newspaper, Dr. Weizmann intends to accept the suggestion made to him some time ago to become the Chancellor of the University.

LEAGUE MINORITIES DEPART- MENT HEAD GETS NEW POST

Geneva, Dec. 8.—Eric Colban, director of the League of Nations Department for the affairs of the National Minorities since the formation of the League, was appointed director of the Disarmament Section.

No candidate to succeed Mr. Colban in the direction of the minorities department has as yet been named.

JEWISH CEMETERY DESE- CRATED IN PALESTINE

Jerusalem, Dec. 8.—Palestine Arabs have taken to demolishing gravestones in Jewish cemeteries, for long the favorite method of the anti-Semites in Germany and other European countries.

Four gravestones were demolished by Arabs in the Jewish cemetery in the colony of Beer Toviya, to the south of Gedera and Rehoboth.

ANTI-SEMITISM IN RUSSIA MUST BE ACKNOWLEDGED IN ORDER TO COMBAT IT

Statement Made by Secretary of White
Russian Communist Party

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Moscow, Dec. 8.—A frank admission of the existence of anti-Semitism among the workmen in Soviet Russia is essential in order to combat it successfully by an educational process.

This was the opinion expressed by Knorin, secretary of the White Russian Communist party, in his report submitted to the party conference which is now in session in Minsk. It is dangerous to deny the existence of a growing anti-Semitism among the working classes, not only in White Russia, but also in Moscow, Leningrad and throughout the country. This is due to the lack of education among the masses. The danger exists, lest this growing anti-Semitism join hands with the old contra-revolutionary anti-Semitism, he stated.

At the same conference the demand was voiced that the Soviet authorities withdraw the legalization of the Communist Poale Zion party. The attack on the party was made by Belfin, secretary of the White Russian Jewish section of the communist party. The Poale Zion are a contra-revolutionary element. They are carrying on an agitation among the Jewish workers, which has no place in Russia. They must go to Palestine, he urged.

EDUCATION MINISTER OF PRUSSIA STAYS ADAMANT ON RACE PREJUDICE ISSUE

Berlin, December 8.—Prussian Minister of Education Becker, criticized in the Diet for his stand in prohibiting students organizations to adopt as their principle the theory of anti-Semitic Aryanism, excluding Jews from membership, remained adamant in refuting the attack.

Urged by the Voelkische deputies to withdraw the order, Becker stated that he will not do so as he believes that to permit the students to organize on the basis of racial prejudice would be contrary to the spirit of the constitution.

MOSES SITRUK, TUNISIAN CHIEF RABBI, DIES AT 85

Tunis, Dec. 8.—Rabbi Moses Sitruk, Chief Rabbi of Tunis, died here at the age of 85.

Rabbi Sitruk was the first Tunisian Jew to be given the title Knight of the Legion of Honor.

FIRST SHOWING OF 'KING OF KINGS' PLANNED TO BE GALA AFFAIR IN LONDON Objectable Film is Subjected to Criticism in France

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

London, Dec. 8.—The much criticized
"King of Kings" film will be presented
for the first time in London on Decem-
ber 14 at Covent Garden Opera House.

The first two performances are be-
ing arranged as gala affairs by the
exhibitors who have invited several
hundred clergymen of all denomina-
tions, representatives of the press and
leading personages.

Paris, Dec. 2.—The discussion of the
film "King of Kings" has its repercus-
sion in France. The picture is being
shown at the Champs Elysees theatre.

The "Univers Israelite," French Jew-
ish weekly, criticizes the film and adds:
"It is difficult for a modern Jew liv-
ing in a civilization saturated with
Christian atmosphere not to make any
allowances for Jesus. The cinema
forms a kind of publicity and visual
obsession from which it is difficult to
escape. There have been several films
presenting the figure of Jesus. There
were 'Christus,' 'Ben Hur,' and now we
have the 'King of Kings,' the presenta-
tion of which at the Champs Elysees
Theatre has caused a sensation. This
American film has been very much dis-
cussed by the Jewish press in the Uni-
ted States, England and Germany. The

J.D.B. NEWS LETTER

Various New Bills on Immigration Introduced in Congress; Johnson Insists on Further Restrictions

(By Our Washington Correspondent)

Washington, Dec. 8.—Numerous bills
proposing changes in the immigration
law have been introduced in the House
of Representatives since Congress en-
tered into session Monday. Bills cannot
be introduced in the Senate until that
body formally organizes after disposition
of the pending election contests.

Chairman Johnson, of the House Im-
migration Committee, has introduced a
bill providing for the reduction of im-
migration quotas at the rate of ten per cent
per year for the five years commencing
July 1, 1928, after which the annual quota
of any nationality shall be one percent of
the number of foreign born individuals of
such nationality resident in the United
States as determined by the 1890 census,
provided, that during this five year period
the minimum quota of any nationality
shall be one hundred, and thereafter fifty.
The bill provides further that during the
fiscal years 1929 and 1930 quota allowan-
ces equaling one half of the ten per cent
reduction shall be set aside for unmar-
ried children under twenty-one and the
wives of aliens lawfully admitted to the
United States and married prior to July 1,
1924, and that after July 1, 1928 the
maximum quota for any country shall be
25,000. The effect of this bill would be
to greatly decrease the total immigration
to the United States. It is doubtful
however, whether Congress will entertain

TORRES WILL PUBLISH BOOK ON SCHWARTZBARD CASE

Paris, Dec. 8.—A book on the
Schwartzbard case, containing a record
of the trial and important material of the
Ukrainian massacres as its background,
will be issued soon by Henri Torres,
Schwartzbard's counsel.

M. Torres returned yesterday from a
tour in Belgium, where he lectured on the
anti-Jewish pogroms in the Ukraine.
King Albert, who was invited to one of
the lectures, sent a message regretting
his inability to be present.

The book is to include in extenso
Torres' pleas before the Court of Assizes,
much of the evidence of witnesses who
were not called, the testimony of Hei-
nrich Sliosberg, Dr. Goldstein and Pro-
fessor Langevin, as well as Schwartzbard's
letters written to friends from his prison
cell.

Chairman Johnson's proposal.

Congressman Blanton, of Texas, in-
troduced a bill proposing complete sus-
pension of immigration until January 1,
1935, except for accredited officials of
foreign governments, actors, artists, lec-
turers, singers, nurses, ministers of any
religious denomination, professors or stu-
dents of colleges and seminaries, persons
belonging to any recognized learned pro-
fession, travelers for pleasure or business,
and the wives, parents and unmarried or
widowed daughters, or any son not over
eighteen, and providing that emergency
farm and ranch labor may be imported
for temporary periods. The bill also pro-
vides for registration of all aliens on the
date that immigration is suspended, with
deportation as a penalty on failure to do
so, also for the creation of a Board of
Americanization for the promotion of
Americanizing education among aliens,
the Board to make an annual report of
conditions of the alien population. Blanton's
bill would also deport all aliens who
withdrew their declaration of intention
to become citizens in order to avoid the
draft during the World War.

Congressman Selvig of Minnesota and
Douglas of Massachusetts, both intro-
duced bills for the repeal of the national
origins plan.

Chairman Johnson also introduced two
other bills; one regarding deportation and
another with respect to naturalization
of aliens. The deportation bill includes
the following grounds for deporting
aliens: (1) sentence to imprisonment for
a term of one year or more for any of-
fense committed within ten years after
entry; (2) similar sentence and conviction
thereafter of the same or any other
offense; (3) prison sentences for any of-
fenses together aggregating eighteen
months; insanity, "constitutional psycho-
pathic inferiority", and chronic alcohol-
ism; (4) becoming a public charge at any
time within seven years after entry; (5)
prostitution.

Congressman La Guardia introduced
a bill providing for preference in the
issuance of immigration visas to
brothers and sisters of citizens, the un-
married children under twenty-one,
brothers and sisters of aliens who have
resided in the United States for at
least three years, such preference not
to exceed seventy-five per cent. of the
annual quota for each nationality, and
also for the complete exemption from
the quota of unmarried children under
twenty-one, husbands and parents of
American citizens, or the unmarried
children under eighteen years of age
and the wife, husband, parents of an
alien who has resided in the United
States for three years and declared his
intention to become a citizen.

In his message at the opening session
of Congress, President Coolidge recom-
mended: "Some further legislation to
provide for reuniting families when
either the husband or the wife is in
this country."

"TIMES" URGES INTERVENTION BY LEAGUE IN ROUMANIA AND HUNGARY FOR MINORITIES

Comments on American Committee's Report on Anti-Jewish Excesses

It is the duty of the League of Nations, as the legal and moral guardian of the national minorities in Europe, to take steps to prevent the further commission of injustice and discrimination against the minorities in Roumania and Hungary, is the demand voiced editorially by the "New York Times" commenting on the report of the American Committee on Religious Minorities. The paper writes:

"A depressing picture of injustice and folly emerges from the preliminary report submitted to the American Committee on the Rights of Religious Minorities by its investigating deputation in Roumania. In that country Jews, Baptists, Lutherans and Roman Catholics are the victims of an excited nationalism, directly stimulated or connived at by a majority of the old ruling class. The minority rights stipulated in the peace treaties by which the new Roumania came into being are inscribed in the Constitution but are largely violated in practice. Patriotic "defense" organizations, animated by religious or racial hatred, are sanctioned by the Government. The old pre-war policies of Russification against many subject races of the Czars, of Germanification against the Poles, are now in force, and with a ruthlessness of procedure that the old methods did not always attain. In the universities, in the schools and courts of law, in various fields of administration, the investigators found a state of inequity which moves it to speak out with a vigor that refuses to take account of international 'etiquette'."

"Roumania is not the only guilty party in Central and Eastern Europe. There is tragic irony in Jew-baiting campaigns in Hungary, followed by Hungarian protests against anti-Hungarian riots in Roumania. But the case of Roumania is the worse of the two. Roumania cannot plead the sense of defeat and humiliation which may be responsible for Magyar pogroms. Roumania came out of the war enormously augmented in area and population. Her duty, even her self-interest, is to consolidate what she has won. But the poorest conceivable way of cementing a new nation together is by intimidation and the denial of legal and moral rights. As the deputation points out, the new nations in Europe need all the talents and loyalties they can muster to deal with their new problems. Instead, they are engaged in rebuffing talent and fomenting embitterment. The forces which wrecked two great empires and helped to defeat a third are again in play.

SABATH INTRODUCES BILL PROPOSING CHANGE IN PRESENT QUOTA LAW BASIS

(Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Washington, Dec. 8.—Congressman Sabath of Chicago, introduced a bill in Congress yesterday for changing the basis of the present quota law from the 1890 census to the 1900 census, exempting from the quota husbands, wives and unmarried children up to twenty one of declarants who have resided in America over three years, as well as the parents of American citizens. To meet the objection that his bill would increase the total immigration, Congressman Sabath provides that Canada, Mexico, Newfoundland, Haiti, the Dominican Republic, the Canal Zone and Central and South America, whose nationals are not now subject to the quota, be placed in that class. He declared that this would decrease the total immigration about 100,000.

On the other hand, it would increase East European immigration about 75,000 during the first year, after which this number would grow less. It is understood that Congressman Sabath's new plan has called forth comment from those circles interested in bringing in Mexican and Canadian labor.

Mr. Sabath also introduced a deportation bill to serve as a substitute for Chairman Johnson's proposal. Congressman Sabath's bill would restrict deportations to those sentenced for felonies, gunmen, habitual gamblers, habitual criminals, narcotic peddlers and aliens convicted of crimes twice before. Sabath explained his purpose in introducing the deportation bill is to show that he is in favor of deporting real criminals and undesirables but to avoid the extreme harshness of the Johnson bill.

\$30,000 FOR K. H. ON FIRST DAY OF CAMPAIGN IN ROUMANIA

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Bucharest, Dec. 8.—The first day of the Keren Hayesod campaign in Roumania, stimulated by the visit of Dr. Chaim Weizmann, resulted in the raising of close to \$30,000.

The amount of \$4,000 was raised in Bucharest and £2,000 in Jassy.

Nations to speak out if the peace of the Continent and the well-being of the nationalities themselves are not to be undermined. The League has the legal right under the treaties. WALTER HURT ABANDONS HIS PLAN FOR GOODWILL MAGAZINE BECAUSE OF CRITICISM

Chas. Joseph Scores Feature Syndicate for Irresponsible Charge

Walter Hurt, well known journalist who announced his intention to start the publication of a magazine entitled "Gladiator" devoted to the promotion of good will and better understanding between Jew and Gentile, has given up the plan because of criticism levelled against him, according to a letter of Mr. Hurt made public by Charles A. Joseph in his "Random Thoughts" a syndicated feature in the American Jewish weeklies.

Mr. Hurt, who is a non-Jew, was accused in an article entitled, "It Doesn't Pay" released by a New York concern operating under the title Seven Arts Feature Syndicate, of "angling for Jewish money." The article was under the signature of Robert Stone.

Replying to a communication from Mr. Joseph, Mr. Hurt wrote:

"The organized cliques are able to engender anti-Semitism more rapidly than any forces friendly to inter-racial harmony possibly can dissipate it. If I must fight the Jews themselves I have no stomach for going ahead with a work where Jewish interests, Jewish well-being (even Jewish destiny), are so largely involved.

"This hostile article is not particularly important in itself; the important thing is the attitude of Jewry as indicated by the fact of its publication presumably by a major portion of the Jewish press—which, it is reasonable to assume, knows its business and its audience. As for the effects upon me, the harm it has done is impossible of reparation. I no longer have any heart for the work that for so long has been the greatest interest of my life. The enthusiasm I kept alive and active under many difficulties through the years of my self-delusion, has been destroyed in an hour. 'Fini' has been written to my participation in Jewish affairs. . . . That you may understand the finality of this, I am returning all the remittances that came to me for 'Gladiator' subscriptions. Why should I waste the remnant of my life in striving to benefit those who resist such service, and who doubtless would persist in harassing and hampering and opposing me, and continue to heap upon me base and baseless slanders, and in the end render my labors frustrate?"

Mr. Joseph urged Mr. Hurt to disregard the criticism from an unrepresentative source, adding:

"I consider it a most unfortunate and tragic incident, and one which reflects little credit upon those of our faith who have attacked a faithful friend and devoted champion of our people and our faith.

"Walter Hurt, you are doing yourself an injustice, and the Jewish people of the United States an even greater injustice."

LOUIS BLOCK, JEWISH EDUCATOR, INJURED IN ACCIDENT

Chicago, Dec. 8.—Louis J. Block, former principal of the John Marshall High School, nationally known Jewish educator, was seriously injured when struck by an automobile in Oak Park, a suburb of Chicago. Mr. Block's skull was fractured and he suffered serious internal injuries. Because of his advanced age little hope is held out for his recovery.

Mr. Block, who is 74, until two years ago had been at the school since it was opened in 1895. Besides his educational activities he is a poet and musician of note.

POLISH PRESIDENT HONORS JEWISH SOCIAL WORKERS

Warsaw, Dec. 8.—One rabbi and two Jewish social workers were awarded honorary membership in the Order of the Golden Cross by President Moscicki for their contribution to social welfare work.

The honors were conferred upon Rabbi Gedaliah Rosenman of Bialystok, Madam Rachel Robinowitz and Zalman Weinik. The two laymen were awarded the honor because of their work in the Bialystok Jewish society for the care of the sick, Linath Cholim.

MONUMENT TO VASZONYI IS UNVEILED IN KEREPES

Budapest, Dec. 8.—A monument to the memory of Wilhelm Vaszonyi, who died a year ago, was unveiled over his grave in the Jewish cemetery in Kerepes. Deputy Karl Huszar, Vice-President of the Chamber of Deputies, representatives of the Government and of the City of Budapest and a large number of Deputies attended the unveiling ceremonies. The Budapest Jewish Community was represented by its President, Dr. Alexander Lederer and its General Secretary, Dr. Julius Gabor.

A large number of wreaths sent by the Government and the various political parties were deposited on the grave.

IMMIGRATION CONGRESS TO BE HELD IN ARGENTINE

Buenos Aires, Dec. 8.—The Jewish Immigrant Aid Society here has decided to convoke a Jewish Immigration Congress in the Argentine in 1928. A committee has been elected which will draw up the agenda and make preparations for the Congress.

Franz Molnar, noted playwright and journalist, arrived in New York Wednesday from Budapest on the Olympic. This is his first trip to America. His only public appearance in the United States will be next Wednesday, when he will deliver a lecture at Columbia University.

PHILADELPHIA FEDERATION TO LAUNCH \$1,650,000 DRIVE

Philadelphia, Dec. 8.—The drive for \$1,650,000, the largest sum ever sought by the Federation of Jewish Charities in this city will be launched on Jan. 15.

Louis Wolf, for twelve years president of the Federation and now honorary president, is chairman of the campaign. Mrs. Frank A. Pfaltz will head the women's division. Fifty three institutions are affiliated with the Federation.

COMMUNICATION TO THE EDITOR:

Sir:

The release which has appeared in the press, stating that I am undertaking work in connection with the National Community Foundation in the field of adult education may be misleading to those of my friends and associates in various parts of the country with whom I have been working in the goodwill movement. Someone may raise the question of my continuance in the work. I therefore write to say that no such separation is taking place. I am not to serve as Executive Secretary of the Committee on Goodwill between Jews and Christians, but am assuming instead the responsibility of Chairman of the Committee on Direction.

The goodwill program is going ahead with an enlarged program and enlarged staff. Several reinforcements are to be added to its leadership in the near future.

The work that I am undertaking with the National Community Foundation is in the nature of concentration on the kind of educational work carried on by the conference for some time past, and is a necessary specialization of effort which is in harmony with the enlarged goodwill educational program in which the individual leaders will be assigned special fields of work.

I think that our friends and supporters ought to know that the goodwill program has moved beyond its early stage, and calls for trained, concentrated endeavor in a half dozen branches of effort that have become increasingly clarified in the past three years.

JEWISH EDUCATORS HOLD CONFERENCE IN ENGLAND

(J. T. A. Mail Service)

London, Nov. 21.—About 200 persons attended a conference held in Manchester, arranged by the Central Committee for Jewish Education, whose activities form part of the work of the council of the Jewish War Memorial.

Dr. A. Eichholz presided. Professor S. Brodetsky, of the University of Leeds, read a paper on the aims and objects of Jewish education. Rabbi M. Gollop dealt with the training of teachers. Dr. A. Cohen presented a paper on the Jewish education of girls.

The evening session was devoted to questions brought forward by area committees, including the suggested appointment of assistant directors of education for the different provincial areas, and the question of suitable publications for adolescents introduced by the representatives of the North Midlands area and two other subjects introduced by the Leeds Area Committee, that the Central Committee for Jewish Education should arrange periodical public meetings to encourage Hebrew education and that the papers to be read at annual conference should be on practical subjects in preference to academic topics.
