## POGROM LEADER OFFERS TO RETURN HOLY SCROLLS FOR 60,000 LEI; IS ARRESTED

Cluj Editor to be Tried; Six Jassy Students get Prison Terms  
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Bucharest, Jan. 28.—Three more persons were arrested by the Clausenburg police on charges of complicity in the recent anti-Jewish excesses there. They will be tried by the military court.

Among the three is the editor of a student newspaper who sent an offer to the Kehliah that the stolen Holy Scrolls would be returned for a consideration of 60,000 lei.

The Kehliah refused to pay the amount and notified the police who secured the return of the Scrolls to the community.

Jassy, Jan. 28.—The trial of six Roumanian students charged with participation in the anti-Jewish excesses in Jassy was ended here today.

Four were sentenced to one month imprisonment each, two to two months. The latter went on a hunger strike.

## MIZRACHI URGES ORTHODOX ELEMENTS BACK PALESTINE COMMUNITIES' ORGANIZATION

Jerusalem, Jan. 28.—An appeal to the Orthodox elements of the Jewish community in Palestine to disregard the promptings of the ultra-Orthodox Agudath Israel and to stand united behind the Palestine Communities Ordinance, seeking to establish a single community, was issued by an All Palestine Conference called under the auspices of the Mizrahi organization.

The conference, which concluded Friday, in its appeal urges all Palestine Jews to actively participate in the organization of the new communities and in the forthcoming elections to the Vaad Lemmi, the National Council of Palestine Jewry, as provided in the Communities Ordinance.

## RELEASE OF RATHENAU'S MURDERER IS DEMANDED BY GERMAN ANTI-SEMITES

Berlin, Jan. 28.—The release from prison of Oberlieutenant Brandt, sentenced three years ago to a four year imprisonment term for the murder of Walter Rathenau, German Jewish statesman, was demanded in the Reichstag Friday during the debate on the budget of the Ministry of Justice.

## SEMITIC INSCRIPTIONS FOUND IN FRANCE SIMILAR TO SINAITIC SCRIPT

Hebrews had Trading Center in Gaul 1,500 Years before Christian Era; Discovery Startles Scholars  
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Zurich, Jan. 28.—Further clues as to the character of the script claimed to be the first form of the alphabet, invented by the Hebrews and contained in the Sinai tablets found by Sir Flinders Petrie on Mount Sinai, were discovered on tablets unearthed at Glozel, near Tours, France.

The tablets which were tombstone inscriptions are a part of the find made recently at Glozel. Scholars were unable to decipher the inscriptions. Professor Volten, famous Swiss archaeologist, has now come forward with a statement in which he declares that he has succeeded in deciphering the inscriptions. According to Dr. Volten the language of these inscriptions is identical with what is termed "old Hebrew" and the script is similar to the inscriptions found by Sir Flinders Petrie in the copper mines on the Sinai peninsula, dating back to the reign of the Egyptian Pharaohs, Hatchopsok and Thutmoses.

The Glozel tablets are a part of a collection of pre-historic antiquities which had enarced the attention of the entire scientific world and have been declared to be genuine by many French scientists, including the well known French Jewish scholar, Solomon Reinach. A subsequent inquiry of other students of archaeology, however, has developed doubts as to the authenticity of the tablets.

According to Dr. Volten, the Glozel tablets date back to the end of the Neolithic period and are probably the records of the settlement of Semites from the Sinai Peninsula at Glozel, where they had established a trading center.

## AMERICAN ATTORNEY WILL PROCEED TO LONDON FOR OSCAR SLATER'S RETRIAL

London, Jan. 28.—The new trial for Oscar Slater, who spent eighteen years in Peterhead prison on the charge of having murdered an aged Glasgow woman, will begin here in a few weeks.

Despatches from America state that William Goodhart of Baltimore who was Slater's counsel during the extradition proceedings in New York in 1909 and Mr. Mills, his associate in the proceedings, have volunteered to come to London at their own expense to conduct the re-trial to establish Slater's innocence.

## MOVE MADE IN WARSAW CITY COUNCIL TO ENACT LEGISLATION AGAINST SCHECHITA

Measure Viewed as Election Stunt of Anti-Semites  
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Warsaw, Jan. 28.—The move of Polish nationalist elements in the Warsaw City Council to bring about the prohibition of Schechita, the Jewish method of slaughtering animals, is considered here an election measure calculated only to have a political effect, it being extremely doubtful whether sufficient support would be found to put the measure through.

The move was made at a meeting of the budget commission of the Council when it considered the estimates concerning the administration of the city slaughter houses. The proposal was introduced by Dr. Zawadzki, a Warsaw physician of Jewish extraction affiliated with the national Democratic Party. The resolution urged that the schechita be prohibited and instead electric stunning of animals be made obligatory. The Jewish members of the commission protested against the introduction of the resolution, arguing that the system of slaughtering has nothing to do with the budget question. The proposal, however, was carried by a majority vote.

When the resolution was adopted, the Jewish members representing the middle classes left the session as a sign of protest. The councillors representing the Jewish labor groups Bund and Poale Zion remained. The resolution would have to pass the plenum of the city council and be ratified by the Ministry of the Interior. It was stated on good authority that the measure has no chance of being passed.

## SEEK TO CREATE UNITED JEWISH BLOC IN ROUMANIA

Bucharest, Jan. 28.—Negotiations are in progress for the establishment of a united Jewish bloc including all the Jewish parties and organizations throughout Roumania to contest the next Parliamentary elections which are to take place shortly.

The leaders of the Jewish parties in Old Roumania and the Provinces of Bessarabia and Bukovina are discussing the organization of the bloc. The Jewish parties of Bukovina have already formed the Bukovinian Section of the bloc which will as a whole join the larger bloc comprising the Jews of the entire country.

### San Francisco Jews Lead in Community Chest Campaign

(By our San Francisco correspondent)

San Francisco, Jan. 23.—In the plans for the San Francisco Community Chest's annual financial campaign next month, Jews of this city again are taking a position of leadership in keeping with the important part they have played for years in local social service and philanthropic work.

Jewish men and women are members of the various committees handling important details incident to the drive which the Chest will make for support of the 104 charitable and welfare organizations of all creeds which it supports.

Back of this fact lies one of far more significance—a fact often pointed to with pride by local Jewish leaders. It is that Jewish charities of San Francisco, fully two decades ago, actually set the example for a Community Chest by combining under the banner of the San Francisco Federation of Jewish Charities.

In the Federation are seven constituent welfare and philanthropic bodies, each performing a widely different function, but operating under a consolidated administrative organization managed by the federation. These are the Eureka Benevolent Society, now the central charity and social service institution, Mount Zion Hospital and Nurses Training School, Pacific Hebrew Orphan Asylum and Home Society, Emanu-El Sisterhood, the Hebrew Home for the Aged Disabled and the Free Loan Society (Chevra Gemilus Chasodim).

Combining these organizations into the Federation of Jewish Charities set an example for economical and efficient organization and administration which was cited with much emphasis when the plan for merging all of the city's institutions into the Chest was first broached.

With the institution of the chest six years ago, Federation became a part of it and its leaders participate actively in the financial drives of the chest organization. The Chest allocates between \$250,000 and \$300,000 yearly to the Federation of Jewish Charities. Of this amount \$90,000 goes to the operation of the Eureka Benevolent Society.

The background being as it is, it is only fitting that Jewish leaders should play an important part in the chest campaigns which are headed by men and women leading in every field of the city's endeavor.

Judge M. C. Sloss, formerly associate justice of the California State Supreme

Court, has been one of the leading figures in Chest affairs and now is playing one of the foremost parts in the lineup of organization work for the coming campaign.

Mrs. Sloss is one of the principal women in chest organization, heading a committee which aims at scientific exploitation of the purposes and needs of the Community Chest.

Dr. Samuel C. Kohs, social service director of the Eureka Benevolent Society, likewise is active in Chest affairs, as is Supervisor Jesse C. Colman and Mrs. Leo Clayburgh, who heads a publicity committee of the entire organization.

## BALTIMORE CLOSES UNITED JEWISH APPEAL SHORT OF ITS QUOTA; \$520,000 SUBSCRIBED

Baltimore, Md., Jan. 28. — With \$520,000 subscribed, the campaign of the United Jewish Appeal, embracing the United Jewish Campaign and the United Palestine Appeal, was formally brought to an end on January 26. Baltimore's quota was set at \$750,000. The books will not be closed, however, until several prospective contributors who have indicated they would donate large sums return to the city. It was asserted that several wealthy Baltimore Jews visiting in Europe or touring in this country would add materially to the total received when they come back.

The outcome of the campaign was quite satisfactory, executives said. Some of the 1,000 volunteer workers who canvassed the city, however, expressed disappointment that a greater amount had not been realized.

At the final luncheon of the works held at the Southern Hotel Rabbi William Rosenau, of the Eutaw Place Temple, praised the work of L. Manuel Handler, general chairman of the campaign.

## RABBI TOBIAS HOROWITZ HERE, SEEKS FUND FOR ORTHODOX GIRLS SCHOOLS IN POLAND

Rabbi Tobias Horowitz of Rzeszow, vice-president of the Agudath Israel in Poland and member of the executive of the Union of Polish Rabbis, is in this country in the interest of the Orthodox girls' schools in Poland, known as the Beth Jacob schools.

Prior to his arrival in the United States Rabbi Horowitz visited England where he succeeded in interesting Bernard Barn in the work of the schools.

The movement was initiated in Cracow in 1927 and has spread greatly. Today there are eighty-seven schools in as many towns with an enrollment of close to 11,000 girls. The schools are under the administration of the Keren Ha'Torah with offices in Vienna, Warsaw and Cracow. Committees for the support of the movement were formed in many countries, including France, Holland, England, Germany and South Africa.

The purpose of Rabbi Horowitz's visit to the United States is to raise a fund of \$25,000 for the completion of a seminary for the training of women teachers for the schools, now being erected in Cracow.

## EIGHT JEWISH PARTIES TO CLIMENT IN POLISH PARLIAMENT ELECTIONS

### Lack of Unity Endangers Strength of Representation in Sejm

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Warsaw, Jan. 28 — Eight Jewish parties will solicit the political support of the Jewish population in the Republic of Poland in the forthcoming elections to the third Polish Sejm, which take place on February 22. Thirty four Polish parties have filed their lists with the election registration board. Eight Jewish lists were presented.

The Jewish lists that will split the Jewish vote are the following: 1. The Jewish national bloc within the bloc of national minorities, headed by Isaac Gruenbaum; 2. The list of the Right wing of the Jewish labor party, Poale Zion; 3. The list of the Left wing of the Poale Zion; 4. The list of the Orthodox Agudath Israel combined with the Volkist party headed by Noah Prilutzki, under the name Jewish National Bloc; 5. The list of the Jewish labor party, Bund; 6. The list of the Zionists in Galicia, headed by Dr. Leon Reich and Dr. Osias Thon; 7. The list of the Zionist democratic workers and 8. The list of the Hitachduth, Zionist labor group.

In addition, several Polish parties are presenting Jewish candidates on their lists, particularly in Galicia. The former deputies Wisicki and Kirschbraun have joined the non-partisan bloc which is campaigning under the slogan of co-operation with the Pilsudski government. These lists will also make an appeal to the Jewish population.

The split of the Jewish vote will thus be unavoidable, seriously endangering the strength of Jewish representation in the third Sejm. It is predicted that in the best of cases eight or ten Jewish deputies will be elected, while the strength of the Club of Jewish Deputies and Senators in the previous Sejm and Senate amounted to 46. All endeavors to bring about unity among the Jewish factions failed. The Jewish bloc within the bloc of the national minorities will carry on a desperate fight with the Zionists in Galicia under Dr. Leon Reich.

Although there is still nearly a month before the election, Jewish life in Poland is bubbling with political activity. The campaign, it was estimated, will cost Polish Jewry several hundred thousand Zlotys.

Many arrests were made in Warsaw yesterday. The election appeal issued by the Jewish labor party, Bund was confiscated by the authorities.

## JOHNSON BILL WOULD MAKE ALIEN DEPORTABLE FOR VIOLATION OF PROHIBITION LAW

Washington, D.C., Jan. 28.—Drastic clauses are contained in the Johnson Deportation Bill which was introduced into the House on January 26 with the approval of the House Immigration Committee.

The bill provides for the deportation of aliens who violate the prohibition, narcotic, or white slave laws and repeals the present law requiring the deportation of aliens convicted of "moral turpitude," but does not affect the law barring aliens from entry where the last named offense is concerned.

Deportation also of convicts as soon as they serve their sentences is provided and an alien serving a sentence of one year or more is subject to deportation.

The section of the deportation bill outlining the classes of aliens subject to deportation includes: An alien who at the time of entry was a member of one or more of the classes excluded by law from admission to the United States—at any time within five years after entry.

An alien who entered the United States at any time or place other than as designated by immigration officials, or who eluded examination or inspection, or who obtained entry by a false or misleading representation—at any time after entry, unless the entry was before July 1, 1924, in which case at any time within five years after entry.

An alien who remains in the United States for a longer time than authorized by law or regulations made under authority of law—at any time after entry, unless the entry was before July 1, 1924, in which case at any time within five years after entry. An alien seaman not admitted to the United States for permanent residence shall be considered as having remained in the United States for a longer time than authorized by law if he is found engaged in any occupation in the United States other than that of a seaman on a vessel arriving from or bound to a foreign port or place.

An alien who at any time within five years after entry is a public charge from causes not affirmatively shown to have arisen subsequent to entry—at any time after entry.

An alien who at any time within five years after entry, from causes not affirmatively shown to have arisen subsequent to entry, is an idiot, imbecile, feeble-minded persons, epileptic, insane person, person of constitutional psychopathic inferiority, or person with chronic alcoholism—at any time after entry.

An alien who is convicted of any offense (committed after the enactment of the Deportation Act of 1928 and within 10 years after entry) for which he is sentenced to imprisonment for a term of one year or more—at any time after entry, but not after the expiration of three

In raising this demand, Deputy Frick, member of the Hitlerist group, attacked the memory of the late German Jewish statesman. This attack called forth a great tumult. Deputy Graef, member of the Deutschnazionale party and vice-speaker of the House, was in the chair. He took no measure to secure order.

An anti-Semitic demonstration was arranged yesterday by the National Socialists on the occasion of ex-Kaiser Wilhelm's birthday. The demonstration ended in riots, during which a German newspaperman, mistaken for a Jew, and fifteen others were beaten and thrown out of the hall.

The Supreme Court of Leipzig imposed a four year prison sentence on Oberlieutenant Brandt on June 27, 1925, for his implication in the murder of Walter Rathenau. The court sentence stated that Brandt would not lose his civil rights. Herr Kuechenmeister, who was the owner of the automobile used by the murderers, was acquitted.

**NEW COMPANY FOR PALESTINE DEVELOPMENT IS ORGANIZED**

London, Jan. 28.—A new company, the Anglo-Binyan Hayishuv of Palestine, Ltd. has just been organized here. The company which will seek to develop urban and rural settlement in Palestine by the acquisition of land which it will develop and sell to private individuals and small groups on easy terms, has an initial capital of £3,000. The first directors are J. Rivlin, M. Levine, M. Chaikin, H. Aaronsohn and I. Rivlin.

The company will also undertake the plantation of orange and banana groves, and the management of small farms, giving an opportunity to Jews who are at present unable to settle in Palestine, the means for preparing themselves to do so after some years.

The Anglo-Binyan Hayishuv plans also to arrange agrarian credits for those who wish to build or plant on the land purchased from the company.

The first research by the Lasker Foundation for Medical Research established by Albert D. and Flora W. Lasker, contributing 21,000,000 will be a study of Bright's disease. It was announced. The foundation was established to study degenerative diseases.

The Advisory Committee is composed of Dr. F. C. McLean, Chairman of the Department of Medicine at the University of Chicago; Dr. D. B. Phenster, Chairman of the Department of Surgery; Dr. A. J. Carlson, Chairman of the Department of Physiology; Dr. H. C. Wells, Chairman of the Department of Pathology. Alfred E. Cohn of the Rockefeller Institute, and Mr. Lasker.

**PIERCE, HEAD OF PALESTINE ORANGE GROWERS CORPORATION, LEAVES FOR PALESTINE**  
Well Known Businessman of Canada Honored at Dinner

A dinner in honor of Asher Pierce, vice-president of the Gan Chaim Corporation, a company formed by American Jews to promote the citrus growing industry in Palestine, was given by Mr. Israel Matz, treasurer of the Corporation, at the Astor Hotel, before his departure for Palestine.

While in Palestine, Mr. Pierce, who is well known in Canada as a leading businessman and farm owner, will take charge of the operations of the corporation which was formed a short while ago by a group of leading American Zionists to promote the orange growing industry. The company is capitalized at \$500,000 and has already purchased an area of land near Chedera, where orange groves are being planted.

The company was named Gan Chaim in honor of Dr. Chaim Weizmann. Plans for its further activity were discussed at the dinner which was addressed by Mr. Matz, Robert Szold, Itamar Benavi, Dr. Knowles Rverson of the United States Department of Agriculture, a member of the Jewish Agency experts' commission.

Max Shoolman of Boston is president of the corporation, Laurence N. Levine Secretary.

**CONFISCATE PAPER URGING NATIONAL MINORITIES BLOC**  
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Warsaw, Jan. 27.—The Sabbath issue of "Der Hahnt," Yiddish daily, which is supporting Gruenbaum's policy urging the Jewish population to vote for the bloc of national minorities, was confiscated today by the authorities.

The Federation of Temple Sisterhoods with the cooperation of the Department of Synagogue and School Extension, through a Committee on Literature for the Jewish Shtetlens of which Mrs. Oscar Silverschmidt is chairman, is making it possible for Jews who have lost sight to become familiar with religious literature. Following a survey of institutions to ascertain the number of Jewish adult blind in them, steps have been taken for the transcription of the Union Prayerbook in Braille. Forty-two Sisterhoods have appointed chairmen and committees to study Braille. Each committee will transcribe at least one part of the Prayerbook in Braille. This will be followed by the transcription of a number of tracts issued by the Department of Synagogue and School Extension, it is planned.

The first tract that will be transcribed into Braille will be "What Do Jews Believe?" by Dr. H. G. Enelow.

Among more than 200 children who came to his attention during the year as superintendent of the Stevens-Swan Humane Society, not one was of Jewish extraction. Harry J. Gourley declared in an address to the Harmon Club, Utica, explaining his work in examination into cruelty to children, Mr. Gourley praised Jewish parents and pointed out that the Jews of Utica cost the city less than any other nationality for charity, number for number.

An alien who is convicted of any offense (committed after the enactment of the Deportation Act of 1928 and within 10 years after entry) for which he is sentenced to imprisonment for a term which, when added to the terms to which sentenced under two or more previous convictions of the same or any other offense (committed after the enactment of the Deportation Act of 1928) amounts to two years or more—at any time after entry, but not after the expiration of three years after the termination of the imprisonment.
